MONTGOMERY-Securities Commission (ASC) recently released its annual list of top investor threats

and urged investors to use caution when approached with unsolicited investments, especially those involving promissory notes, oil and gas deals, and real estate investment opportunities, including nontraded real estate investment

"Education and information are an investor's best defense against investment fraud," ASC

Director, Joseph Borg, said.

The top threats to investors were determined by surveying members of the North American Administrators Securities Association, of which the ASC is a member, to identify the most problematic products, practices or schemes. The following were cited most often in North America and Alabama:

1. Unregistered Products/

Unlicensed Salesmen:

The offer of securities by an individual without a valid securities license should be a red alert for investors. Con artists also try to bypass stringent state registration requirements to pitch unregistered investments with a promise of "limited or no

I recently served as a juror in an automobile accident case. During the trial, the jurors were never told if the driver who caused the accident had insurance. When we started deliberations, we asked the judge if the driver who caused the accident had insurance and we were told that he could not tell us. I wanted to find for the lady who had been injured in the accident but was concerned about making the other driver pay for her damages out of his own pocket if he didn't have insurance. Why couldn't the jurors have been told whether or not the driver had insurance?

First, let me thank you for your willingness to serve as a juror. Serving as a juror requires sacrifice, but it is the only way our legal system functions properly. Secondly, let me thank you for your obvious attentiveness during the trial

and your desire to learn more about our civil justice system. Without hesitation, I can assure you that the driver who caused the accident had liability insurance. How can I be so sure? The reasons are numerous.

First, attorneys such as Tom and I who practice personal injury law represent our clients on a contingency fee basis. This means that if we do not recover money for our clients, we do not get paid. Practicing law is an honorable profession but it is also a business. Employees must be paid, the light bill comes, copier paper must be purchased, the phone bill has to be paid, and so on and so on. Although Tom and I do handle some cases for free, we have a business to run. If any attorney is trying an injury case to a jury, you better believe the other side has insurance coverage. Otherwise, the injured party and the attorney are just wasting time.

Secondly, if the other party is represented by an attorney, you can bet that they have insurance. With the average hourly cost of defense attorneys in the range of \$200.00 per hour and the fact that it takes approximately a year to two years to get a case set for trial, it is not hard to imagine the fees generated by the defense attorney. For example, let's say that it takes 2 years to get an automobile accident to trial. That is 104 weeks (52 weeks + 52 weeks = 104weeks). Say the defense attorney works 5 hours a week on that file, that is 520 billable hours (104 weeks x 5 hours = 520 hours). Multiply 520 billable hours times the rate per hour, \$200.00, and the total charge is \$104,000.00. Heck, I am attorney and at that amount I couldn't afford myself!

As a juror, you are led to believe that you receive complete disclosure of all the facts necessary to properly and fairly reach a decision. A juror, however, is provided only that evidence which the law allows the trial attorneys to present. The law in Alabama does not allow the attorneys or the judge to tell the jury whether the at-fault party has liability insurance. The rationale behind this decision is that law wants the jurors to make a decision based solely upon the facts pertaining to how the accident happened. The fear is that if the jury learns that there is insurance coverage for the accident, they may be more willing to compensate an injured party because it is the insurance company who is spending money and not the person who caused an accident

The next time you sit down in a jury box in a civil injury case, just remember it's the insurance company sitting at the defense table and it's the insurance company's money on the line!







Scammers Among the Bottom Feeders

he Better Business Bureau launched its BBB Scam Tracker in 2015. They expected tax-related shams to be among the most prevalent on the year's long scam list.

Listed as 24% of all reported scams, tax scams were pinpointed more than the next three categories combined - debt collection, sweepstakes, and tech support scams.

The rest of the top ten were

The rest of the top ten were government grant scam, advance fee loans, credit cards, work from home, fake check/money order, and lottery. About 85% of those reporting scams to BBB recognized them as frauds before any money was stolen, However, over \$1 million was lost by unwary victims.

The con men and women sometimes appear as government agents, lawyers, debt collectors, or police officers. Many of the fraudulent calls include intimidation or scare tactics which often result in hasty decisions. Targets are often those who are alone and older from a generation that could leave its doors unlocked at night and that still trusts people to be honest. Unfortunately, our deteriorating morals and ethics means that time of our lives is gone.

BBB officials often describe organized scammers as "imposters." That is far too nice a term. A clown or a Santa Claus is an imposter. Scammers are low-lives; bottom-feeders who





risk" and high returns. 2. Promissory Notes: In an environment of low interest rates, the promise of high-interest-bearing promissory notes may be tempting to investors, especially seniors and others living on a fixed income. Promissory notes generally are used by companies to raise capital. Legitimate promissory notes are marketed almost exclusively to sophisticated or corporate investors. Short-term notes that appear to be exempt from securities registration have been the source of most of the fraudulent activity

involving promissory notes identified by regulators.

3. Advance Fee Loan
Schemes and Non-Existent Credit Documents: In a tight credit environment, small and medium business owners are seeking credit and capital from non-traditional sources. Financial con artists and fraudulent promoters have approached capital hungry businesses with schemes ranging from Advance Fee to promises of major cash/ capital infusion.

4. Fleecing the Flock: Church is one of the most common places for Alabama citizens to be scammed. Thieves find ways to worm into the church community and work hard to build trust among leaders, i.e. ministers, elders, and deacons. The thieves then use the church leadership to convince members of the congregation to invest their hard earned dollars into a bogus venture that does not exist and is often simply a Ponzi scheme.

5. Oil/Gas Investments: Many oil and gas investment opportunities, while involving varying degrees of risks to the investor, are legitimate in their marketing and responsible in their operations. However, as in many other investment opportunities, it is not unusual for unscrupulous promoters to attempt to take advantage of investors by engaging in fraudulent practices. Fraudulent oil and gas deals frequently are structured with the limited partnership (or other legal entity) in one state, the operation and nysical presence of the field in a second state, and the offerings made to prospective investors in states other than the initial two states. As a result, there is less chance of an investor dropping by a well site or a nonexistent company headquarters. Such a structure also makes it difficult for authorities and victims to identify and expose the fraud.

6. Real Estate-related **Investments:** Troublesome real estate-related investments identified by securities regulators included non-traded real estate investment trusts (REITs), timeshare resales, and brokered mortgage notes. These types of products often carry higher 7. Ponzi Schemes:

The premise is simple pay early investors with money raised from later investors. The only people certain to make money are the promoters who set the Ponzi in motion. "Investors should always be wary of unsolicited financial advice or investment opportunities," Borg said.







A Missing-Dog Story Has a Happy Ending Thanks to an Identification rag

't's one of the most alarming phone calls a pet owner can receive: "Hello? I've found a dog. His tag says 'Thornton' on it, and it has Lthis phone number.'

That was the call I received last month while I was in Oklahoma, visiting my parents. My husband was recovering from surgery and had a cold, so we placed the dogs with a pet sitter who had kept them many times previously.

I was stunned and frightened. Had all the dogs escaped the sitter's home, or just this one? Were the other two still running loose somewhere? I rummaged for a pen and some paper so I could take down the caller's name and phone number. I called my husband to alert him that he needed to call the person and arrange to get our dog. I wasn't sure which one it was, since Keeper and Harper both have brown-and-white coloring.

Then I called the pet sitter. "Do you have my dogs?" He admitted that Keeper was missing — he had somehow slipped out of the house unseen. They were searching for him. Happily, Harper and Gemma were still there. I let him know that Keeper had been found — turns out he was just next door — and that my husband would be by soon to pick them all up.

You might say that I'm a little obsessive when it comes to the amount of information I put on my pets' identification tags. They are engraved with our last name, our home phone number, two cellphone numbers and our veterinarian's phone number. Of course, my dogs are also microchipped, but an ID tag is the first and easiest option for recovery. All the finder has to do is read the tag and call the phone number on it.

In our case, the man called our house phone first but didn't leave a message. My husband didn't recognize the number, so he didn't pick up the call. I had my phone on silent because my parents and I had just gotten out of the movies, but luckily I felt it vibrate. I didn't recognize the number either, but it was an Orange County area code, so

In addition to their ID tags, my dogs wear tags from HomeAgain and the American Kennel Club's Reunite service. The microchips are registered with those organizations, so if the man had called either of those numbers, we would have been notified. And of course they all have their license tags from the county. Those tags don't have phone numbers, but if the finder had called Orange County Animal Control, they would have been able to identify Keeper and get in touch with me.

Accidents like Keeper's escape can happen to anyone. He's very good at home about not running out the door, and I would not have expected him to escape in such a manner, but you never know what a dog is going to do.

You can never prevent your dog from becoming lost, but you can take easy, inexpensive steps to increase the likelihood that he il come home safely:

- Keep a collar with an up-to-date ID tag on him.
- Put multiple phone numbers on the tag.
- Check the tag regularly to make sure the engraving hasn't faded.
- Microchip him.
- License him.
- Register his identification with an organization such as the American Kennel Club's Reunite service.

And remember: If you find a lost dog, be sure to leave a message at all the phone numbers.

An identification tag helped ensure that a lost dog was returned quickly to his owners.

"Test-tube" Puppies **Yield Hope for Dog** & Human Health

· Researchers at Cornell recently whelped a litter of beagle-cocker spaniel puppies using in vitro fertilization, a scientific first. The technique lays the foundation for conserving endangered wild dogs and rare dog breeds, and using gene-editing technologies to eradicate heritable diseases in dogs. It also provides a powerful tool for understanding the genetic basis of diseases, says Alex Travis, associate professor of reproductive biology in the Baker Institute for Animal Health in Cornell's College of Veterinary Medicine. The study describing the effort was published online in the Dec. 9 issue of the journal PLOS One.

· If you have muscle or joint pain and use a topical pain medication containing the nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) flurbiprofen, your pet could be at risk if he licks your skin or otherwise ingests the drug. The Food and Drug Administration received reports of five cats in two households who became ill or died after their owners applied the cream or lotion to themselves. Even small amounts of the drug can be dangerous to pets, so it's important to store the medications out of their reach, discard applicators or gloves used to apply the medication in a place where pets can't get to them and prevent pets from licking skin of people who use the drugs.

· Vaccinating dogs for rabies may help to eliminate the disease in humans. According to the World Health Organization, approximately 80 percent of people at risk for the disease live in poor, rural areas in Asia and Africa. "Vaccinating 70 percent of dogs regularly in zones where rabies is present can reduce human cases to zero," says OIE (World Organisation for Animal Health) director-general Dr. Bernard Vallat. It's easier and less expensive to vaccinate dogs for the disease than it is to treat humans bitten by rabid dogs.

"The best way to avoid a misunderstanding is to have a good understanding."

I heard this phrase some time ago and remind myself of it almost daily. Some of the biggest problems that arise in a real estate transaction can single-handedly be tied to a miscommunication or misunderstanding between the two parties involved. In the real estate business, you can't stress enough the importance of making sure everyone involved is on the same page.

This is why it is best to make offers, request repairs, agree to repairs and enter into any other agreement in writing rather than verbally. Does this mean that you shouldn't listen to a verbal offer? Of course not, but be sure that you understand all of the terms involved, not just the price. You should also be sure everybody understands that whatever is agreed upon verbally is subject to seeing all of the terms and conditions in writing. One of the most common areas where a misunderstanding can take place in a real estate transaction is the negotiation of repairs based on an unsatisfactory home inspection. For example, if the inspection report reveals that a window in the hall bath has lost its thermal seal, you wouldn't ask the seller to "fix window," you'd ask the seller to "replace the glass in the window in the hall bath," or whatever it is you want them to do specifically. The word to remember here is "specific." You want to be very specific in any request you make.

Another great example would be asking the seller to pay the buyer's closing costs. You wouldn't ask "Seller to pay closing," instead you would be very specific and ask "that the seller pay the buyers closing costs up to but not to exceed \$2500.00" and even further would specify whether would be well as the further, you'd specify whether or not this includes prepaid items such as homeowner's insurance.

We all have busy lifestyles and are always on the go mentality. If you buy and sell property more than once you almost always find yourself negotiating at least some portion of a deal verbally, even moving a closing date or time for example. Always be sure you fully understand what you are agreeing to. Don't be afraid to ask questions to clarify if necessary. Have a good understanding of every detail and don't assume anything and you'll avoid frustrating misunderstandings. -mr

are too dishonest to find legitimate work. Instead they always look to take advantage of another human being and make easy, dirty money at their victims' expense. They prey on the elderly, the hard-of-hearing, the lonely, and the trusting. They often look to con those on a fixed income, relying on intimidation, threats of arrest, lawsuits, repossessions, or other frightening actions.

Scammers build a rapport and a relationship with the victim by phone, online, or face-to-face. They associate with credible companies, fake web sites, or government agencies. They often play on emotion and timing.

Our best bet to avoid being scammed is to hang up the phone, shut the door, or delete the email.

• Don't be pressured into making fast decisions.

• Take time to research the organization. Check them out on bbb.org, search online, etc.

• Never provide your personal information (address, date-of-birth, banking information, ID numbers) to people you do not know.

• Don't click on links or attachments from unsolicited email or text messages.

• If you are unsure about a call or email that claims to be from your bank, utility company, etc., call the business directly using the number on your bill or credit card.

 Never send money by wire transfer or prepaid debit card to someone you don't know or haven't met in person.

- Never send money for an emergency situation unless you can verify the emergency.
- Generally speaking, don't pay for work in advance.


