THERE'S NOBODY LIKE THE TEXAS RANGERS! LET'S EXPLORE SOME OF THE TRUTHS AND MYTHS SURROUNDING THIS ELITE FORCE IN A CONTINUING FEATURE DURING JUNE 2020.

"The history of the Texas Rangers is as complicated as Texas history itself" is a quote from the website of the Bob Bullock State History Museum, which opened in 2001 as the official history museum of the State of Texas,

located at 1800 Congress Avenue in Austin, Texas.

"The history of the Texas Rangers spans nearly 200 years. Thousands of Rangers patrolled the frontier, fought in military battles, and arrested cattle rustlers. Their story contains heroic acts of bravery, but also moments that challenge our idea of the Rangers as noble lawmen. They protected settlers and enforced laws, but also sometimes executed thieves without a trial, drove Native American tribes from their homelands, and some Rangers even lynched Mexicans and Mexican Americans along the Texas-Mexico border. Colonel Homer T. Garrison, Jr. stated "they were men who could not be stampeded". Historically, this elite law enforcement group has fostered pride in the hearts of Texans. Today, their place of honor is questioned, and the badges tarnished which they loyally wore. However, this is not the first time in Texas history that the image of the Texas Ranger has been called into question. Here is fascinating timeline information from the The Texas Ranger Story on the museum website which may spark your interest in today's controversy.

Rangers for the common defense

In 1823, empresario Stephen F. Austin announced he would supplement the Mexican government's militia patrols with his own force of ten men, whom he paid out of his own pocket. Thus, the Texas Rangers were born.

**Patrolling the Frontier** 

After the 1836 Texas Revolution, a wave of new settlers headed to Texas enticed by acres of land offered for little money. This increased settlement led to conflicts with American Indians who already occupied the territory and a renewed desire to send the Texas Rangers out on patrol.



Each [Ranger] was armed with a rifle, a pistol, and a knife. With a Mexican blanket tied behind his saddle and small wallet in which he carried salt and ammunition and perhaps a little panola or parched corn, spiced and sweetened – a great allayer of thirst – and tobacco, he was equipped for a month. The little body of men, unencumbered by baggage

wagons or pack trains, moved as lightly over the prairie as the Indians.

Rangers as Soldiers

On December 29, 1845, Texas became part of the United States. The boundaries established led directly to a war with Mexico. Many current and former Rangers joined the fight. Using the skills they had honed battling American Indians in Texas, the Rangers quickly made a name for themselves as bold fighters during the U.S.-Mexican War (1846-48). Their scouting and tracking skills also helped locate Mexican camps and guerilla fighters both during and after the war. The Rangers' prowess in battle was striking, and by the end of the war the words "Texas Ranger" evoked images of fierce fighters and expert trackers around

the world. Some Mexicans even gave them the nickname "los diablos Tejanos": the devil Texans. Unfortunately, the Rangers' behavior in other areas would directly contradict their heroic battlefield reputation. After the Battle of Monterrey, one group of Rangers burned homes and killed as many as 100 civilians. Others stole whiskey and livestock from Mexican peasants. General Zachary Taylor said of the Rangers While out on patrol the under his command, "There is scarcely a form of Rangers camped in tents crime that has not been reported to me as committed just as they had done for by them."



We will continue this fascinating journey through the history of the Texas Rangers next week. Til then, let's be good to our neighbors, fly our flag and pray for peace. I will watch and wait for you at the corral gate.





## ICE CREAM WITH WEST TEXAS FLAVORS

"It's hard to be mad when you're enjoying an ice cream." Those words from JP Hearn of Midland apply to just about everybody. Ice cream soothes the savage beast within us all. No matter whether it's summer or winter or whether you're 80 or 8, ice cream takes the edge off and makes things smooth. JP has an ice cream parlor called Fountainville, a one of a kind store, not a franchise. It's a fountain of blessings to his customers.

"We make our ice cream from scratch and we kind of like to feature flavors that represent where we're from. One of our top flavors is Tumbleweed. We do Black Gold, which is a black ice cream that has the flavor of local honey and graham cracker. Other flavors are Sandstorm, Caliche, you know, really fun flavors that reflect where we're from."

Fountainville has 20 flavors of ice cream. Black Gold is the best seller.

"The color comes from coconut charcoal and the flavor, with that graham cracker and honey taste, is a twist on the flavor. That's by far our number one seller. Some customers come in and it's Black Gold or nothing. Sometimes we sell out and they'll say that they'll keep watching until we have it or they'll call before they come. Fans can only go a week or so without ice cream."

I prefer the Tumbleweed flavor.

"It's got caramel and chocolate and toasted coconut. The color is kind of a toasted coconut color with some chocolate and caramel mixed in."

JP went to culinary school and has a degree in pastries and desserts. He had an oil field catering business and took a big trailer to the oil patch so the workers could go through a buffet inside. He opened Fountainville 4 years ago.

"People love ice cream and I thought West Texas needed its own ice cream. That's how Fountainville came about. Of course we have a soda fountain from the 40s and have homemade soft drinks and other items. We make our own waffle cones. We serve our ice cream in cones and bowls in different sizes." He has made 50 tons of ice cream since opening and now has 2 locations.

"We just recently became a Go TEXAN certified ice cream shop, the only one in West Texas. We were selected because we use local ingredients and we make our own base and things like that. We love to represent West Texas with our

He'll spend 6 hours getting a new batch ready. Ingredients include 30 gallons of milk, 21 gallons of heavy cream, 16 pounds of dry milk, 80 pounds of sugar, a gallon of corn syrup and a little bit of stabilizer to hold it all together. Special equipment heats and cools the mixture.
