

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

A few years ago, we received a call from a person who was concerned about a dog that was in a backyard. When we visited with the owner, he confirmed that the dog had been in a dog lot for 15 years, with no relief except for the two times he had escaped.

"That's so sad," escaped my lips before I even knew it. He agreed it may seem sad, but he said he fed and watered the dog every day.

The lot was homemade and small. What was the most disturbing was that mattresses and other items had been attached to the pen, so the dog had no view of the outside world. His entire world consisted of the small area inside the lot. There was no gate, and no way for anyone to enter the lot. Even his view of the sky was obscured by trees. He, of course, was not socialized.

We recognized the empty, hopeless look in his eyes. We had seen the same look in a cat that had been kept for many years in a rabbit hunch that was surrounded by plastic. We had seen the same look in a dog that had never been off a chain for twelve years, wearing down a perfect circle in the ground about a foot deep. These are the animals who have given up on life, and the only reason they weren't dead is that their hearts kept beating.

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

DAHS Accepting Scholarship Applications for 2020 Awards

Danville, Va., June 16, 2020 — The Danville Area Humane Society (DAHS) is accepting applications for the two scholarships it launched in partnership with local families last year.

The first award, named for Margot Mayhew of Gretna, was created by her grandson, Bobby Allen Roach, to honor her during her final stages of glioblastoma brain cancer before passing away on May 2, 2019. The scholarship totals \$500 and is funded through family donations and the DAHS. The Margot Richter Mayhew Scholarship for Professional Studies will be awarded to a Pittsylvania County student who plans to pursue a career helping animals. Primary consideration will be given to a student who will study at a college or university in the Dan River region.



"My family and I continue to be so grateful for the tremendous generosity of Paulette Dean and the Danville Area Humane Society," Roach said. "What DAHS does for our community often goes unrecognized, but so many lives—animals and people—are made better for the humane society's exhaustive efforts. Coping with the terrible loss of my grandmother, I feel supported by DAHS and Paulette, and I am glad that Noni's legacy continues through this award."

The \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to a resident of Pittsylvania County.

"The scholarship would not be possible without the generosity of the Danville Area Humane Society and Paulette Dean," Roach said. "Their support through a 100 percent match of our family's annual contribution reinforces what I have always known about DAHS: They are caring and loving to both people and animals. We were blessed to be able to tell my grandmother about the scholarship while she was alive and could understand, and she was so honored and so happy that she, as an immigrant from Germany who didn't speak fluent English when she moved to the United States, would be known for making education more accessible for the community that she loved so dearly. Knowing that the scholarship brought such joy and comfort to her in her final days means more to me and my family than words could ever accurately convey. We thank the Danville Area Humane Society for making this possible and for all that they do to make the lives of animals in our community better, safer, and happier."

The second scholarship, which will be awarded to a student living in the City of Danville, was also created last year in memory of Barbara S. Smith. The Barbara S. Smith Scholarship for Animal Welfare Studies fund was established by the daughter of Smith, Hilary Wyatt.

Smith was born in Roanoke. Virginia, and raised in Portsmouth, Virginia. She moved to Danville to study at Danville Technical Institute. After graduating from



there, she went to work at Corning Glass Works, Inc., where she worked until her retirement after 41 years. Smith was a member of the Danville Charter Chapter of American Business Women's Association. During her time with the ABWA, she strongly supported their scholarship funds for women pursuing a higher education.

Smith's daughter, Hilary Wyatt, was employed by the Danville Area Humane Society as the shelter manager and currently serves as on the board of directors. Wyatt said, "The thought of my mother's love for education and young people continuing with this scholarship fund warms my heart. The mission of the Danville Area Humane Society has always been dear to my family. The time I spent as a kennel attendant, assistance manager, and shelter manager will always be one of the favorite times of my life. The work of an open-admission shelter is often misunderstood and criticized; however, I know from personal experience that it is compassionate, needed service to the animals."

Paulette Dean, executive director, said "The Danville Area Humane Society is thrilled with our two scholarship funds. The Barbara S. Smith Scholarship for Animal Welfare Studies will award \$500 to a Danville resident every year and the Margot Richter Mayhew Scholarship for Professional Studies will award \$500 to a Pittsylvania County resident every year. Local Outreach Workers Help Newly Unemployed Virginians Apply for Free Health Insurance During COVID-19 Health Emergency

Danville, VA - During these uncertain times, health is on nearly everyone's mind. The Commonwealth of Virginia is taking action to fight COVID-19 and to improve access to the healthcare you and your family need. Virginia's Medicaid/FAMIS programs cover comprehensive health and mental health services, including testing and treatment for COVID-19.

Local Outreach Workers, Francina Jones and Linda Williams, at Danville-Pittsylvania Community Services, provide free, no touch 1:1 assistance to anyone who wants to learn about, apply for, or renew Medicaid/FAMIS coverage.

Between March 14 and May 16, 2020, the first 2 months of the COVID-19 pandemic, 8,363 new unemployment claims were filed in Danville and Pittsylvania County. More than half (57%) of these area residents who lost their jobs are now eligible for Virginia Medicaid. It is projected that by January 2021, 71% of Virginians uninsured due to COVID-19 loss of health coverage will be Medicaid-eligible.

Even those who have been denied in the past may now qualify.

Current monthly income and family size are the only criteria used to evaluate financial eligibility for this comprehensive insurance coverage, available to Virginians under age 65. For example, the following individuals would be eligible for

- Single adult Virginians with a monthly income up to \$1,469 (annual income up to \$17,609).
- Adults in a household of three with a monthly income of \$2,499 (annual income up to \$29,974).
- Children in families earning up to \$2,680 for a family of three (annual income up to \$38,776).

Home, land, and retirement savings do not count as income when determining your Medicaid/FAMIS eligibility. COVID-19 stimulus checks (Economic Impact Payments from the IRS), and the \$600 in additional federal unemployment also do not count as income and will not affect your eligibility.

Medicaid/FAMIS coverage starts on the first day of the month in which you apply, so do not delay in applying for the coverage you have earned.

Ms. Jones and Ms. Williams are committed to working safely during this health emergency and provide all application assistance following social distancing guidlines. And, they make sure the Medicaid/FAMIS application process goes as smoothly as possible, every step of the way.

A Walk Alone

It is Tuesday night and my boy has not come home. He is always here on his day off from work, but where did he go? The next day I repeatedly called and texted him but never received an answer. I called family to help me locate him, yet, to no avail. So I go to the police. They locate his car on the cul-de-sac where his deceased mother's abandoned house was located. The detective did not want me to be alone because he thought Charlie might be found nearby the old house.

The next few hours were far worse than a nightmare. With my emotions all over the place, I figured, if the police called me, everything would be okay, but if a car came into the driveway then dreaded news awaited. Every time a car sped past my house, I labored to breathe, while walking the floors repeating the words, "Charlie is okay. He has to be okay."

The police stopped the search for Charlie that night because of the hard rain and continued first thing the next morning. I could not stay at home, so I went to the site where he was believed to be. What I heard next was, "We have found your boy. He has what it appears to be a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head." I looked at my sister, Teresa, and said, "This is really a dream, right? It is time to wake up. This is not happening". However, I was awake and that which I had feared had come upon me. As I typed these gut-wrenching words, a cold sweat suddenly struck and I walked away.

People say, "I do not know how you feel. I can only imagine." I have not ever felt this alone, this empty, this abandoned, not ever. I feel sick all the time. Just sick. I hate going home, hate seeing his room, his car, the dog he loved. And I hate looking at any picture of my precious boy. Food tastes like saw dust, yet I force myself eat to keep from getting sick. A part of me just wants to run as fast as I can, but I have nowhere to go.

I walked up to his casket at the cemetery thinking how very much I craved for things to be different. Charlie, what did you do? Baby boy, you are in that box and I want to pull you out and tell you everything is going to be alright, and I know this too is much bigger than me and there is no fixing it. He is gone forever in this life and I will never see him again until Heaven.

Some days I'm sort of numb. On other days I pick up the grief and deal with it. I process what I can one day at a time, one moment at a time. Grief is no stranger to some. Yet, as soldiers of the cross, we do not grieve as those who have no hope. Even in the center of my aching, I feel the prayers of others pouring over me like warm honey in this cold, cold season of the heart. Even in this knowing, a chaos exists that tosses me about like the wind. I'm never knowing from which direction it blows. How can one feel so lost, yet know I am so blessed. I do not ask for another blessing, I have had too much bestowed on me. God is a good and loving, wonderful Father. I know Charlie is in His hands and he no longer hurts any more.

In my pain, I'm asking you to celebrate Charlie by reaching out to other hurting kids. Show them what we all know to be life. There is always hope. God is closer than a brother and a great help in time of need. We are all loved with an everlasting love. This thing called life is eternal. It is not over. Our hope is in our heavenly Father.

Charlie, til we meet again. I will never, ever forget you. Thank you for allowing me to father you. I am sorry that I could not make the pains of your heart go away. Your wounds were too deep. Until later, I leave you in God's





11/2 cups grated zucchini - lightly packed -do not drain liquid

1 cup granulated sugar

1/4 cup packed light brown sugar

1/2 cup unsweetened applesauce

1/3 cup vegetable oil -or your preferred cooking oil 2 large eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

11/2 cups all purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Spray a 9x5 inch loaf pan with cooking spray.

In a large bowl, add the grated zucchini, sugar, brown sugar, applesauce, oil, eggs, and vanilla. Whisk until well combined.

Add the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon. Stir just until no dry flour remains, trying not to over mix. Pour the batter into the loaf pan. Bake for 50 to 54

minutes. A toothpick inserted into the center of the bread should come out with moist crumbs on it. Cool in the pan for 10 minutes. Remove from the pan


and transfer to a wire cooling rack to cool completely

Homeless Veterans and the Coronavirus

A recent Department of Veterans Affairs press release describes a new initiative asking the public to "provide emergency relief and facilitate remote access to health care for Veterans who are homeless or at risk of homelessness during the COVID-19 pandemic."

Specifically the VA is asking for non-perishables, cellphones and cash for security deposits.

Back in February, VA Secretary Robert Wilkie turned down money when asked if the VA needed more to deal with the coronavirus problem. Yes, you read that right. He turned down money. Granted, in February maybe it wasn't clear to Wilkie just how bad it was going to get, but he assured those at the budget meeting that they were good to go because they train for emergencies. A month later the VA had to get \$60 million in emergency help, followed by nearly \$20 billion a week later. That money was spread out over a long wish list, including IT, construction, mobile treatment ... and yes, homeless veterans.


On a given day, there are an estimated 100,000 homeless veterans on the street.

For those who are ready to whip out a credit card to help, go online to the eDonate site at www. volunteer.va.gov/apps/VolunteerNow. Find your state and the facility you'd like to support. Be sure to include a note that says you want the money to go to support homeless veterans.

And yes, I did donate a hefty amount to the eDonate site. After all, it's for our homeless brothers and sisters. But I still want to know why Wilkie turned down that money. On the day he said that, there already were 80,000 cases of coronavirus around the world and in six U.S. states. Everyone knew what was coming.
