



SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

I am very much a patriot and a historian who loves our country. This article is intended to provide positive comments regarding our country and comments as to where we have gone astray.

The United States of America was established on the Bible. However, we have strayed from what our founding fathers intended. We need to admit where we have strayed and return to the principles on which our country was established so long ago.

Back in the 1920s, we replaced the importance of morality with an economic view of history rather than what really happened. Our public school text books were revised to eliminate the truths about our past as to replace them with what we wanted instead.

The Supreme Court in the early 1950s began attacks on prayer in our public schools and paved the way for legislation on abortion.

About the same time we lost our first war - the Korean War. In 1962 the Supreme Court outlawed prayer in our public schools in the case of Engel v. Vitale. In 1963 the Supreme Court outlawed the Lord's Prayer and the reading of the Bible in public schools in the case Abington School District v. Schempp.

The answer is that the morning after 9/11, the Senate Majority Leader in the United States Congress gave an address to Congress and America and said "The bricks are fallen down, but we will build with hewn stones: the sycomores are cut down, but we will change them into cedars". On September 11, 2004, a United States Senator repeated the exact same words in an address to a Congressional caucus in Washington, D. C.

Even today, our leaders in Washington repeatedly say that we will come back stronger in our economy without saying that we will do this with the help of God. This is very, very dangerous.

We need to give all honor and credit to God for our country. One of the finest men that I know in our area commented in an e-mail this past week "One Nation Under God", which I believe.

Livingston County Warns of COVID-19 Scams

Livingston County would like to notify residents of several COVID-19-related fraud alerts recently issued by federal and state departments.

United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS): Scammers are offering fake CO-VID-19 tests to Medicare recipients in exchange for their personal information. They then use this personal information as part of a broader identity theft scam to drain the bank accounts of their victims.

PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Beneficiaries should be cautious of unsolicited requests for their Medicare or Medicaid numbers.
- Be suspicious of any unexpected calls or visitors offering COVID-19 tests or supplies. If your personal information is compromised, it may be used in other fraud schemes.
- Ignore offers or advertisements for COVID-19 testing or treatments on social media sites.
- A physician or other trusted healthcare provider should assess your condition and approve any requests for COVID-19 testing.

New York State Office of Aging: Scammers are offering grants for home repairs. Older adults are receiving postcards addressed to "resident" offering to help secure grants for home repairs.

PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Do not answer your telephone if you do not recognize the caller or number.
- Never share personal information over the telephone,like your Medicare number, Social Security number or banking information.
- Never pay a fee to a company that says it will help you get a grant.
- Block or unfriend anyone who offers unsolicited grant information on social media. Even if you are "friends" with that person – they may have been hacked.
- Only use local contractors with validated references to do work in your home.

Livingston County Continues Advocacy for Equitable Federal Aid to Local Governments Impacted by the COVID-19 Global Pandemic

Livingston County officials are continuing to advocate for federal appropriations to local governments to blunt the negative budgetary impacts caused by the COVID-19 global pandemic. County officials, led by Board of Supervisors Chairman and Avon Town Supervisor David L. LeFeber, have contacted the County's U.S. Senate and Congressional Delegation explaining the necessity of equitable federal funding.

A previous round of aid to local governments distributed by the federal government under the CARES Act's State Stabilization Fund was inequitable, according to County officials. This aid was directly appropriated only to local governments with a population of 500,000 or greater.

Livingston County and a majority of other counties and municipalities across the nation and New York State did not meet the onerous population requirement set by the Act. Instead, they were eligible to receive indirect, much smaller appropriations of aid distributed through the states.

"During this time of budgetary strain caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, it is important that all local governments are eligible to receive fiscal aid from the federal government," said LeFeber. "I have been in regular contact with the offices of Senators Charles Schumer and Kirsten Gillibrand, along with that of Representative Tom Reed to highlight Livingston County's needs during this trying time. I will continue my advocacy efforts on behalf of the County for the quick adoption of a law to provide equitable federal aid to all local governments."

Two pieces of legislation have been introduced in the Congress to distribute federal aid to all counties regardless of population size. The HEROES Act, which has passed the U.S. House of Representatives, would distribute a portion of \$1 trillion to every county in the United States regardless of populations. The SMART Act, which has been introduced in both the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate, would distribute a portion of \$500 billion to all counties regardless of population size.
