

A soaring family tradition

AJ Waage joins ranks of family pilots spanning three generations

Graduating Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah senior Anders "AJ" Waage reached a couple of major milestones this summer.

Not only did he graduate with his classmates, he also took a giant step toward earning his pilot's license.

Like his father, grandfather, and sister before him, Waage hopes to join the ranks of family pilots this summer, after checking off his mandatory solo 150-mile cross country flight.

For Waage, that marks the final step in the process of earning his license. He recently made his first solo flight, as a stepping stone to the final objective.

"I hope to finish everything by July, and then focus on my studies coming up this fall at the University of North Dakota," he said. At UND, Waage will enroll in a four-year commercial aviation program.

Family tradition

The Waage family flying tradition dates back a couple of generations to AJ's grandfather, who first ignited the passion for flying as a hobbyist.

Growing up under that influence, AJ's father, Matt, became the family's first professional pilot. Matt serves as a professional corporate pilot, a career that grew out of his 21 years flying refueling tankers with the Air National Guard out of Milwaukee.

"Flying has always been a family thing for me. It was a huge piece of my childhood and my growing up. I want to continue with that," AJ said.

AJ's older sister Megan has her pilot's license, and his younger sister Anna, just finished with eighth grade, is already training to get her license.

They all will have learned in the same plane that Matt's grandfather bought many years ago.

Keeping it in the family

Matt Waage recalls how he learned to fly in his father's plane, back around the same time he would have been interested in buying a car.

His father told him it would be a lot cheaper to buy a plane and learn, then sell it once lessons were completed. Renting time in a plane can be expensive, and this helped to keep the costs in check.

Keeping the plane in the family was a no-brainer decision, and eventually led to the family using it to fly to northern Wisconsin and back.

With all three kids either holding or on their way to earning their flying licenses, the plane still offers great value for the Waage family. In fact, Matt indicates that he hopes to convince his wife to go through the process of getting her license as well. "She already knows to handle the plane and she wants to at least get to the point of doing a solo flight," he said.

That would give the Waage family the unique distinction of having everyone in the family qualified to fly.

Credit to instructor

As AJ looks back on his learning time, he credits instructor Eldon Isely for helping him through his training. "Eldon was very involved in helping me," AJ said.

As part of the pilot training, AJ had to initially complete ground school, pass a



written test, than complete a minimum of 40 hours in the air between solo and assisted flights.

Isely was his guide through the whole process. He runs a flying club at the Sheboygan County Airport and trains many pilots at that location.

Preserving and protecting resources

Protecting land and water resources for future generations is the heart of the mission of the Glacial Lakes Conservancy.

As a private, non-profit conservation organization, the Conservancy grew out of what was originally formed as the Sheboygan Area Land Conservancy in 1996. The volunteer organization was renamed in 2005 after a 10-year focus on preserving and protecting natural areas and farmland in the Sheboygan County.

“The conservancy was formed by volunteers—local residents who saw that development was increasing, and sought to protect the natural resources of the area,” Executive Director Rose Phillips said.

As the coverage area expanded northward to Kewaunee County, the organization merged with the Rural Land Legacy Committee of Kewaunee County, a group with similar aims. It was in that year that the Glacial Lakes Conservancy took on its new name and identity. This year, they are one of the newest members of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce.

The conservation group serves a five county area, including Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Kewaunee, Calumet and Fond du Lac Counties.

As one of about 50 land trusts in Wisconsin, Glacial Lakes Conservancy holds a 501c(3) charitable status. This means that donations of cash, conservation easements, IRA’s, land, stocks and mutual funds are all tax-deductible.

Glacial Lakes Conservancy is able to accomplish its goals through the generosity of its members, donors and volunteers.

Land holdings

As a land trust, Glacial Lakes Conservancy is able to raise funds for the purchase of land, or accept gifts of land.

These acquisitions enable GLC to make the properties accessible to the public.

Glacial Lakes Conservancy actually owns four properties, which are managed as preserves. They include the Grasshopper Hill Preserve in the Elkhart Lake area, along with the William F. Christel Woods and Wetlands Preserve, the Charles and Winnifred Spring West Twin River Preserve and the Willow Creek preserve.

“Grasshopper Hill still holds a lot of memories for the residents of Elkhart Lake who have grown up in that area. As a preserve it provides a safe sanctuary for the public to reminisce and create new memories,” Phillips said.

Private landowner conservation

The aims of GLC can also be achieved through partnering with private landowners.

Conservation easements are a key tool which leaves ownership of the land in the hands of the private property owner, yet safeguarding the property by limiting development and protecting conservation values.

Such conservation projects must meet the criteria and goals set by Glacial Lakes Conservancy to qualify.

Once they are established, GLC commits to the monitoring and enforcement

of the easement's objectives.

In some cases, like the Point Creek Management Area in Manitowoc County, Glacial Lakes Conservancy offers collaborative management on a privately owned property with a conservation easement.

While such easements can take on different looks from one property to the next, one thing is common for every easement granted. There can be no development or fragmentation of the land.

The conservation easements transfer when ownership of the land is transferred, and the restrictions on development remain with the property indefinitely.

GLC also helps the preservation and conservation effort through advocacy and by partnering with regional conservation groups and projects.

Glacial Lakes Conservancy currently

stewards about 1,700 acres of land across the five-county region.

The organization has two staff members, including Executive Director Rose Phillips and Land Project Coordinator Abbey Vizelka

GLC is governed by a Board of Directors, including Cindy Northrup, acting president; Jeanett Wierzbach, treasurer; Ryan Zinkel, secretary; John Durbow, Christine Krieg, Andrew Morris, Hilary Hawley, Mary Kohl, Scott Larson, Michael Slattery, Peter Pittner, Steve Victor and Greg Zahn.





First Street Studio offers design, promotion ideas

First Street Studio aims to help its business clients gain visibility and grow through promotional product offerings.

A new member of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce, First Street Studio was founded by owner Jamie Dahmer in 2006 and is located in Kiel.

The primary focus of First Street Studio is screen printing, embroidery and promotional product sales. "Anything you have ever seen a logo on, we can produce for our customers," Dahmer said. The list of items is endless, including apparel, bags, drinkware, office items, tradeshow promotional items, writing utensils and more.

But, the services of First Street Studio go beyond simply filling orders for promotional items. The business has the ability to create "online stores" for its customers. These sites offer customer logo products for employees and others. First Street Studio has also set up "spirit sales" stores for schools. Stores can also be created to help organizations with fundraisers.

"We have invested in that venture to combine our traditional skills with technology," Dahmer said. "Any way we can help our customers to succeed in their goals."

The technology also has helped replace traditional paper order forms for product sales with easily accessible online orders.

Graphic design skills





1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable

condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 pm-10 am each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the 2nd Sunday of June and ending the 3rd Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

6. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 M.P.H. on the water.

Leash Law

Village Ordinance - 8.32 Animal Feces

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, lake street walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property!!






