





BUSINESS AND LEADERSHIP

Alison Stanfield began her work with Florence-Lauderdale Tourism 20 years ago as an administrative assistant and worked her way up to assistant director. Along the way our tourism and visitor's bureau won awards, increased visibility in the world, and drew people to the area overnight. Tourism has a huge economic impact for our area - and that didn't just happen by itself. Stanfield was a large and unheralded part.

SERVICE AND SPIRITUALITY:

One very cold night when Beth Howard was walking her dog, she began thinking about the people in our area who don't have a warm place to lay their heads. She and **Krista Manchester** met at an organizational meeting and joined forces to do something about it. The result was Room in the Inn, a multi-denominational effort among area churches to feed homeless and food-insecure individuals and families, and to provide safe, warm overnight accommodations during the winter months. At least seventeen different congregations have come together on behalf of those who have the least among us.

SCIENCE AND MEDICINE:

Dr. Ajit Naidu is a local cardiologist who was raised and educated in Chicago. He is the son of a prominent neurosurgeon. pediatric Naidu has brought innovative techniques for the treatment and control of heart disease and vascular problems to the Shoals.

Dr. Naidu was the first in the area to perform radial artery cardiac catheterizations and coronary interventions, laser varicose vein ablation, advanced techniques peripheral vascular intervention.

Naidu's brother, Joseph, died of an undiscovered cardiac problem. Ajit and Divya were determined to turn tragedy for their family into help for others.

Divya has been instrumental in creating the Joseph Naidu Foundation to provide free screenings of all types to residents of the Shoals area. The hope is that the discovery of undiagnosed problems can lead to early treatment. Divya is also very involved in the Shoals Community Clinic, a medical facility located in a subsidized housing neighborhood which provides free medical and dental care for those who otherwise couldn't afford it.

EDUCATION: Darlene Montgomery

Freemon was a creative instructor writing Florence High School. She was selected from a group of distinguished nominees primarily because practices what she teaches. In her own words, "I was the child of functionally illiterate parents who never traveled more than 250 miles from home. They loved me but did not expect me to finish high school. I credit the teachers in my life for using both "carrots and sticks" to push me to succeed. I also credit the teachers for giving me the vision to travel to the 26 countries I have visited. I especially credit the teachers for helping me to become a person who is capable of enjoying moments of perfect contentment and heartrending joy, first through literature and now in reality."

ARTS AND CULTURE:

The winner of the Arts and Culture category and the Renaissance Person of the Year is a man who needs no introduction, Edsel Holden.



This is #3 in the Polypharmacy series about why be concerned with seniors taking so many pills: What is Beers List of Potentially **Inappropriate Medications**

What is Beers List and why is it important? Beers List, or Beers Criteria (named after geriatrician Dr. Beers), describes drugs seniors should avoid because the potential for harm outweighs any potential benefit.

The drugs listed are associated with poorer outcomes: increased hospitalizations and death rates; more risk of falling, fractures, confusion, and depression; and increased need for assistance in ADL's [Activities of Daily Living - dressing, toileting, walking, eating, bathing]. Medicare and the States use the List to monitor quality of care in nursing homes: patients on any one of these must have documentation justifying why.

What drugs are included?

The List includes 53 medications or drug classes, divided into three categories:

- 1) drugs to avoid in all older adults;
- 2) those to avoid if you have certain diseases that the drugs can make worse; and
- 3) drugs which may be used but only with great caution. The List only suggests drugs that are "potentially inappropriate" because there may be situations where (a) one is needed and no other drug has worked, or (b) someone's taken it for years and has had minimal or tolerable sideeffects. The decision to take the drug is one shared between patient and doctor.

The List is important: knowing possible side-effects can help avoid high-risk drugs; and if there is a bothersome symptom, it can guide which drugs to stop first—rather than add another prescription to treat the side-effect. If your health depends on the drug, your physician may be able to prescribe an alternative with fewer side-effects.



I love the move to get out of debt, and the fact that you and your wife are determined never to go back there. If you truly feel that you're being called by God to be a pastor or some other form of ministerial work — and you're both in agreement on how to make it happen — I think that's great, too. Just remember your promise to stay away from debt in making it happen.

But I did hear one problem you need to fix. You should stop having so much income tax withheld from your paychecks. That \$4,500 you mentioned is the result of one or both of you overpaying your taxes. For the future, make sure to adjust your withholdings \$375 month. It's always better to have the cash you earn in your pocket rather than parking it with the IRS interest-free every year.

AVOID THE GIMMICKS

Dear Dave, What kinds of insurance should I avoid? Rhonda

Dear Rhonda, in the

insurance world, should buy only term life insurance. Avoid any kind of insurance that has a savings program built into it — things like whole life, universal life and variable life. Another thing to avoid is return of premium. This is where an insurance company charges you extra, but gives all your premium money back if you don't use the policy. It sounds good, but if you'd just invest the extra you pay for that stuff, you'd get all your premiums back, and more, whether you used the insurance or not!

I also don't recommend gimmick insurances, like double indemnity accidental for death. Think about it. You're not double-dead if you die by accident; you're just dead. Your family needs the same amount of money whether you die by accident or heart attack. If you have a family, I suggest 10 to 12 times your annual income in a good, level term policy. Also, stay away from cancer insurance policies. regular health Your insurance policy should include cancer coverage. If it doesn't, you've got a crummy policy and you need to get a better one right away.

So, for the coverage you do need, we're looking at level term life insurance, good health insurance, long-term disability and homeowners and/or renters insurance. Throw in auto coverage and, once you hit age 60, long-term care insurance and you're pretty much set!





LONGER, BETTER LIVES?

Scientists seek answers to the canine aging process and lifespan

ow long do dogs live? I think we can all agree that it's not nearly long Lenough. Canine lifespans vary from as short as 6 to 8 years for certain giant breeds to an astounding 20-plus years for some tiny dogs. Owners of small and medium-size dogs can generally expect their companions to live

Diet, good care and genetics all play a role in the length of a dog's life, but two researchers at the University of Washington in Seattle are hoping to learn more about now dogs age, as well as whether the aging process can be delayed and the lifespan lengthened. The Dog Aging Project (DAP), headed by Daniel Promislow, Ph.D., and Matt Kaeberlein, Ph.D., plans to track 10,000 dogs in homes around the United States to get a sense of how genetic and environmental factors affect aging in dogs.

As dogs — and humans and other animals age, organs and tissues break down, increasing the risk of age-related diseases such as cancer, cardiovascular disease, kidney disease, Alzheimer's disease and more. Age is a greater risk factor for these diseases than diet, weight and exercise.

"The big picture behind what we're trying to do is to understand the aging process so we can delay the onset and progression of all these diseases," Dr. Kaeberlein says. "It's sort of a fundamental shift from the traditional medical approach, which is to wait until dogs - or people — are sick, and then try to treat

The dogs in this observational study will include many different breeds in different environments: short-lived dogs, long-lived dogs, dogs in wealthy households and dogs in more modest households. The researchers will look at not just how long the dogs live, but also at how environmental factors affect them as they age.

Included in the DAP will be a smaller study, with up to 36 pet dogs in the Seattle area. It will look at whether a drug called Rapamycin — used to prevent organ transplant slow aging, extend canine lifespans and improve quality of life. The drug has been shown to increase lifespan in many different organisms, Dr. Kaeberlein

says, as well as improve cognitive, cardiac and immune function in animals such as mice.

"There's been accumulating evidence over the past several years that not only do they live longer, but that the aging process itself is slowed down," he says.

Of the 46 dogs whose owners have expressed interest in enrolling them in the Rapamycin study, only 26 dogs so far have met the criteria to be included: at least 6 years old, weighing at least 40 pounds and with no pre-existing conditions. Among them are golden retrievers, a greyhound, Labrador retrievers, German shepherds and mixed breeds.

In both studies, dogs are good subjects because their shorter lifespan allows scientists to see results in a decade or less.

"If we had a large enough sample size, we



could know in three years — certainly in five years — the extent to which Rapamycin improved healthy aging in dogs," Dr. Promislow says. "And for a longitudinal study of age, where we want to follow dogs throughout life and understand the genetic or environmental factors that affect aging and disease in dogs, you can do that in a decade. That's not possible in that timeframe

The eventual results could have implications for humans, but the dog-loving scientists say their research is about more than that.

'We're both determined to find ways to improve the quality of life for dogs," Dr. Kaeberlein says. "This is not just about finding something that will help people. It might be good for dogs and their owners."

Coat color may affect cats' temperament

• Does your calico have cattitude? Science says: Yes. According to a study conducted by researchers at the University of California, Davis, calico and tortoiseshell cats are more likely to be assertive in their interactions with humans. In other words, they don't hesitate to hiss, chase, bite, swat or scratch to get their point across to owners and veterinarians. The information, acquired by surveying more than 1,200 cat owners and published in the Journal of Applied Animal Welfare Science, confirmed that cats who come in those patterns can have spirited temperaments. Some call them "difficult"; we like to think of them as, uh, forceful communicators. Want a more laid-back cat? Choose one with a solid-colored coat.

• Endangered rhinos have some new best friends: anti-poaching dogs. One of them is Larry, a 2-year-old Belgian Malinois employed in Swaziland, a country in southern Africa where rhinos are at high risk from poaching gangs. Larry and other dogs, including bloodhounds and foxhounds, track and apprehend poachers and scent out rhino horns and ammunition smuggled through airports. Anti-poaching dogs and their handlers also work to protect rhinos in South Africa's Kruger National Park and Kenya's Ol Pejeta Conservatory. Elephants and gorillas benefit, too, from the approximately 100 dogs who help to protect African wildlife.

• When Annabelle slipped down an icy embankment in Orange, Massachusetts, and became trapped in some brush, her pal Jacques did the sensible thing: He called the police. Officers had been trying to catch the west Highland white terriers, who had escaped after their owner was taken to the hospital, but they couldn't get close to them until Jacques ran up to an officer and barked, then led him to Annabelle. Officers were able to use a ladder to rescue her, and brought them in until they could be reunited with their owner. Thank goodness for "Lassie" reruns.



business website. This is not to lambaste Facebook. In fact, the Courier Journal offers a series of digital marketing opportunities including a

comprehensive Facebook advertising package.
Some FB users will say, "I already have a business page and Lundate it often." page and I update it often."

That is good, but it is not advertising. Most people are not paying for their advertising on Facebook. Organic posts only reach 3-5% of your intended audience. That is a huge difference compared with the 20% that were reached with your post even a few years ago. FB is a business; they make money on paid posts, not free ones. So your post to 1,000 followers will reach anywhere from 30-50 people. You can walk out the door of your business, scream your sale prices into a megaphone and reach as many people. Neither is much of a marketing plan.

It is not a bad idea to have a Facebook page AND business website. However, understand that they do differ greatly. You can control every

aspect of a good website. Unless you start with a simple template, there are no restrictions on colors, graphics, what von appearance, formatting, what you promote, how you promote, what link pages you have, what you can sell, and how much space your website occupies. You can record every visit to your site for YOUR future marketing use and know how visitors came upon it. You also don't have to divulge any personal information.

You control very little on your Facebook page and FB uses all your friends and their tendencies to its

advantage, NOT yours.

And for those of us who are Facebook users... What about those people who post and then immediately like their own post?

CPAP Forum...

Attacking Sleep Apnea: It's All About the Mask

CONCORD, NH – A large number of individuals with sleep issues from six states kicked participated in the January edition of 'CPAP Chat' – the world's only free monthly virtual support group for people with sleep apnea. Participants were from as far as New Hampshire down to Florida and out to Nevada.

and out to Nevada.

'CPAP Chat' is a unique town hall style conference call where people with sleep apnea (or anyone with an interest in the topic) share tips on how to get a better night's sleep and learn about the latest sleep technologies and equipment

and equipment.

"The biggest challenge for many patients is to find a mask that provides the perfect fit and seal without irritating the skin," said Amy Michaud, a territory manager for ResMed (www. resmed.com), a maker of devices for sleep-disordered breathing. "Unfortunately, there is no one size that fits all."

January participants discussed ways to combat mouth dryness – often a result of using a CPAP mask, learned of fellow patients' success with Biotene gel or Xylimelt and reviewed new humidifiers with a water reservoir that can last through the night.

Eric Cohen, an engineer who has invented and developed CPAP masks, knows the importance of how the mask is positioned on the face. "Tightening the straps too much can actually decrease the sealing performance," Cohen said. "If you compress the cushion too much, you change its shape and ability to expand against your face which is what creates the seal. This can also lead to red marks, sores, and even bruising and broken skin."

Ill-fitting masks, loud mask leaks, or a whistling or flatulent sound are not normal and should be addressed.

The Centers for Disease Control calls sleep apnea a national epidemic. Over 20 million Americans suffer from it, but most have yet to be diagnosed. Often chronic fatigue can lead to depression, high blood pressure, diabetes, heart disease, and even death.

The Department of Transportation estimates drowsy driving is responsible for 1,550 fatalities and 40,000 injuries annually.
