

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speakout,"

Happy "Independence Day" to everyone. I pray that everyone spent time this year to reflect on what this special holiday means and not to just view it as another day off from work for pleasure.

As we continue our study of the "Declaration of Independence", we come to the portion where our founding fathers decided it was time to separate from England and form our country.

It was decided that we had petitioned England long enough to solve our differences and that it was our duty to ourselves to throw off this tyrannical rule and to provide a government which would provide safeguards for our continued safety and security: "But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.

We stated that the people of the colonies had been patient long enough: "--Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government." King George III was the King of Great Britain at the time and was a tyrannical ruler who had ignored our petitions of grievances: "The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world."

King George III had refused to approve of many of the laws which the colonies enacted for their public good and happiness: "He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good." The king had forbidden his appointed colonial governors to pass laws until he decided to find time to attend to the matters and eventually neglected to find time to address these issues: "He has forbidden his Governors to pass Laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them."

The king ignored the needs of large portions of the colonies until the colonists would relinquish the right to be represented as a people and have their views and opinions considered: "He has refused to pass other Laws for the accommodation of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of Representation in the Legislature, a right inestimable to them and formidable to tyrants only."

The king would have his appointed officials hold meetings in locations which were too distant from the colonists and in places where the colonists would find it extremely uncomfortable. These methods were intended to discourage the colonists: "He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable, and distant from the depository of their public Records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with his measures."

When the colonists established governmental locations of assembly and the king decided they were against his authority, he would abolish these assemblies: "He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly, for opposing with manly firmness his invasions on the rights of the people."

Lord willing, we will study our the Declaration more next week.



Rabies Positive Bat in the Town of Conesus, Livingston County

According to Livingston County Public Health Director, Jennifer Rodriguez, the New York State Health Department laboratory has confirmed that a silver-haired bat in the Town of Conesus tested positive for rabies on June 30, 2020.

Rabies is a deadly virus that attacks the central nervous system in mammals. It is most often found in raccoons, skunks, and bats in Livingston County. All mammals, including unvaccinated dogs, cats, and farm animals are at risk for getting rabies. There is no way to tell if an animal is rabid just by looking at it. Wild or feral animals should always be avoided. Signs of rabies in wildlife can include:

- inability to walk
- appearance of "drunkenness"
- unwillingness to drink water or eat
- drooling
- aggressive behavior
- any significant change in temperament

All potential rabies exposures should be reported to the Livingston County Department of Health.

Below are important steps you can follow to prevent rabies.

- Stay away from unfamiliar animals, either wild or domestic, even if they appear friendly.
- Thoroughly wash any wound from an animal with soap and water and seek immediate medical attention.
- Avoid wild and feral animals, especially if the animal is showing any sign of rabies.
- Be a responsible pet owner by keeping your pet's vaccinations current. Getting your pet vaccinated can help stop the spread of rabies from wild animals to humans.

New York State Law requires that all dogs, cats and ferrets have current rabies vaccinations beginning at 4 months of age. An unvaccinated pet that comes into contact with a rabid animal must be kept in strict confinement for six months or be euthanized. Free rabies clinics are offered for dogs, cats, and ferrets every year in Livingston County. Clinic dates are available on the Environmental Health website listed below. Inspirations Trail Art on Display through July 31

2020 was going to be the inaugural year for the Livingston County Inspirations Trail, but like many other events this year, the trail had to be postponed. This 90-mile self-guided art tour through Livingston County's nine downtown districts planned to showcase more than 100 works of art, designed by local artists and incorporating inspirational words, in storefront windows.

"The idea behind displaying the art in downtown businesses was to help drive traffic to our Main Streets to support our small businesses," stated Louise Wadsworth, Livingston County's Downtown Coordinator and trail organizer. "Sending people into our communities while our businesses were shut down would have defeated the entire purpose."

Additionally, there was the issue of getting all the artwork during the pandemic. Wadsworth was working with the high school art teachers at seven local districts as well as SUNY Geneseo where students were going to be creating more than 30 works of art. When the schools closed, these pieces were all put on hold.

The inaugural Inspirations Trail has now been rescheduled for May of 2021, but in an attempt to garner interest and participation from additional

artists and businesses, a Sidewalk Showcase will be set up through July 31 allowing viewers to see samples of completed art work on display in storefront windows.

"This is sort of a scaled-back sneak preview," said Wadsworth. "I believe that displaying some of the completed artwork will generate more interest in the May 2021 trail. I want people to see that anyone can be an artist! I hope to recruit more people to create works for the May trail, and more businesses to sign up to display the art. With some of our businesses starting to reopen, this July event will encourage people to visit our Main Streets and will also spread some positive and encouraging messages of inspiration, which I think everyone could use right now."

This is the first time an art trail of this scope has been attempted in Livingston County and is part of a comprehensive initiative by Livingston County Economic Development to bring public art to the down towns. Eventually the trail will include permanent pieces such as murals and sculptures. The villages of Mount Morris

and Nunda have already completed murals that will be part of this inaugural trail and the villages of Avon and Livonia are in the planning stages for future

Pieces that are on display through July 31 will then be collected, stored, and displayed again next May, along with many more new pieces. Following the May 2021 Inspirations Trail, all works will be available for sale. REAL ID DEADLINE EXTENDED TO OCTOBER 2021: The Department of Homeland Security recently announced that President Donald Trump ordered the deadline for the REAL ID program to be extended by a year due to the COVID-19 crisis. The program requires U.S. travelers to obtain REAL ID-complaint driver's licenses in order to board domestic and international flights.

According to a statement from Chad Wolf, Acting Secretary of Homeland Security, "Due to circumstances resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic and the national emergency declaration, the Department of Homeland Security, as directed by President Donald J. Trump, is extending the REAL ID enforcement deadline beyond the current October 1, 2020 deadline. I have determined that states require a twelve-month delay and that the new deadline for REAL ID enforcement is October 1, 2021. DHS will publish a notice of the new deadline in the Federal Register in the coming days."


