Saturday's winner (for girls 17 to 22) gets a scholarship and works with the chamber of commerce, making appearances throughout the year as Miss Fort Stockton. 200 volunteers, including generations of some families, work with Water Carnival practically the entire year preparing for it. The same people have worked lights for 40 years. It's Fort Stockton's biggest event.

"That's what you do when you live in Fort Stockton all your life. When I was growing up I lived near the pool and would hear the music from the show. Our summers are spent on Water Carnival. We don't have a summer vacation. That's our family time together. It's a time of school and family reunions.'

The Water Carnival has been a part of Fort Stockton since 1936 when the Lions Club wanted to do something at the big swimming hole that was created by natural springs

"They would dance, have diving exhibitions and all kinds of stuff. Water Carnival lasted a whole week back then. Now it's Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights the 3rd weekend in July. So you come, you see beautiful girls at the first, and then you watch a great show of swimming and dancing. After that we name our pageant winners in different age categories.

The springs started slowing down in 1950 with the increase in agriculture. The pool was built in 1953 and stays full of water year round. There' a good reason for that.

"When it rained a lot, the pool would float out of the ground because the water underneath the springs would lift the pool up. So it's filled with water all the time to keep it weighted down."
