# Livingston County Reports Uptick in Positive COVID-19 Cases and Alerts Residents of Potential Exposure 

Mount Morris, NY, July 9, 2020 - The Livingston County Department of Health is reporting six new positive cases of COVID-19 in Livingston County as of this morning, which brings the total number of positive cases to one hundred and forty (140). Of these 140 cases, 121 have recovered and 11 are active.

According to Jennifer Rodriguez, Livingston County Public Health Director, the new positive cases and any associated household members are now in the LCDOH quarantine process.
"As we are seeing an uptick in positive COVID-19 cases, our message remains unchanged," stated Rodriguez. "To slow the spread of this virus, all residents must remain vigilant - practice social distancing and limit gatherings, wear face coverings in public spaces, and continue proper handwashing. This 'new normal' must be maintained even as we begin to reopen our economy and public life."

County Administrator Ian M. Coyle stated, "Please be smart and do your part. You are not only protecting yourself, but the immunocompromised, the elderly including those in places like nursing homes, and your fellow staff and residents of all ages who are more susceptible to the impacts of COVID-19."

## Dear "Speakout,"

We continue our study of our wonderful "Declaration of Independence" with the hope of learning more of our history, becoming more patriotic Americans and protecting our liberties.

Last week we saw that King George III would dissolve any assemblies which he saw as against his tyrannical rule. The king would appoint other officials to represent himself in his interests. These officials could not be removed from their offices by the people of the colonies. They were forced to rely on Great Britain to protect the colonies from invasion and internal turmoil: "He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected; whereby the legislative powers, incapable of annihilation, have returned to the people at large for their exercise; the state remaining in the meantime exposed to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within."

The king would prevent immigrants from becoming naturalized citizens and refused to pass laws to encourage any immigration. He passed laws which limited how new lands would be gained.
"He has endeavored to prevent the population of these states; for that purpose obstructing the laws for naturalization of foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage their migration hither, and raising the conditions of new appropriations of lands. The colonists were left without recourse in times in which they needed judicial powers to adjudicate their legal matters: "He has obstructed the administration of justice, by refusing his assent to laws for establishing judiciary powers."

He would appoint judges of his choice to do his bidding and decided just how long they would remain in office: "He has made judges dependent on his will alone, for the tenure of their offices, and the amount and payment of their salaries."

The king would appoint numerous officials whose primary purpose were to harass the colonists and to remove their property: "He has erected a multitude of new offices, and sent hither swarms of officers to harass our people, and eat out their substance."

Unlike the liberties which we enjoy today where the military are subject to civil authority, the military were placed in the communities to control the colonists and maintain tyranny: "He has kept among us, in times of peace, standing armies without the consent of our legislature. He has affected to render the military independent of and superior to civil power." The colonists were not represented by elected officials but they were subject to a king from another continent for their rights: "He has combined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our constitution, and unacknowledged by our laws; giving his assent to their acts of pretended legislation."

Large numbers of military were stationed in the communities of the colonists. The military were immune from any acts of murder and mayhem which they committed against the colonists and were tried in mock trials which approved such acts: "For quartering large bodies of armed troops among us: For protecting them, by mock trial, from punishment for any murders which they should commit on the inhabitants of these states:..."

Great Britain would not allow the colonists to trade with other countries but were dependent on the import of English goods: "For cutting off our trade with all parts of the world: For imposing taxes on us without our consent:..."

## Livingston County Joins National Push for Flexible Fiscal Aid to State and Local Governments

Livingston County, as a member of the National Association of Counties (NACo), has joined a nationwide coalition of over 170 businesses and organizations appealing to the United States Senate to immediately provide support to state and local governments due to financial damage caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

On June 29, 2020, the coalition sent a letter to Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell and Minority Leader Chuck Schumer stating that the pandemic has affected major revenue sources and threatens services and jobs in areas such as education, public safety, healthcare and transportation. According to the letter, nearly 15 million Americans are employed by state and local governments. Over 1.6 million state and local government jobs have been lost since March 2020.

Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle stated, "Our local governments in Livingston County and across the nation have to begin their fiscal years on time and with a balanced budget. An infusion of direct, flexible funds from the federal government will help offset unprecedented budget shortfalls and sales tax implications as we continue to respond to the COVID-19 crisis." Coyle continued, "We are urging the federal government to act immediately on a relief package so that we can begin to get our local economy back on track and continue to provide vital programs and services to our residents."

It is anticipated that the Senate will address the next coronavirus relief package when its members return from their two-week Fourth of July recess.
