



Background facts: Seniors make up 13% of the population but take 33% of all prescriptions. Those admitted to nursing homes take on

average 15 medications. It's estimated that by 2040 seniors will comprise 25% of the population and take 50% of prescriptions!

Why so many drugs?

1) Physicians are trained to cure problems and help patients. Pharmaceutical efforts have made thousands of drugs available

2) Drugs have cured or relieved many previously incurable conditions, helping people with chronic conditions to live longer and better. Therefore, everyone concludes (falsely) 'more must

3) TV advertising directed at patients promotes a "pill for every ill", encouraging people to ask for a specific prescription. [only the USA and New Zealand allow such advertising]

4) Medical training produces mostly specialists, who focus on their own area, following guidelines that promote a specific treatment for each disease, resulting in multiple therapies when you have several diseases; rarely does anyone ask what might be best for the 'whole' patient.

5) Physicians rarely discontinue drugs prescribed by another—resulting in an accumulation of pills.

6) Doctors worry they'll be sued if they haven't done 'everything' to keep a patient happy and alive. That means following Clinical Practice Guidelines [CPG] on how to treat a particular disease and which drugs to use. (However, if they've discussed the patient's goals and documented that the recommended CPG's are inappropriate for that patient, their risk is minimized or eliminated).

Dear Dave,





should rush into the upgrade just yet. If you are running Windows 7, my advice is to hold on to what ya gots until all the bugs are worked out. If you run Windows 8/8.1 and hate it as much as I do, by all means upgrade as soon as possible. Windows 10 is fast, a little more secure (supposedly) and gets rid of some annoyances inherent with Windows 8. Generally speaking, it will also make your old computer run much faster.

Microsoft released a huge batch of updates to Windows 10 this past November. The updates includes additional

features and improvements and will automatically download and installed when it becomes available.

Still Engaged in Suppression

To the Editor:

On December 17th the U.S. Senate unanimously passed a resolution "condemning the government of Iran's state-sponsored persecution of its Baha'i minority and its continued violation of the International Covenants on Human Rights." Senate Resolution 148 gained strong bipartisan backing, with a total of 39 Senators in support. This included the original sponsor and 38 cosponsors, comprising 18 Republicans and 21 Democrats.

This Resolution directly calls on the government of Iran to release the seven leaders of Iran's Baha'i community, who have been imprisoned since 2008; the Baha'i teachers and administrators who have been imprisoned for providing education to Baha'i youth; and all other prisoners held on account of their religion in Iran.

Baha'is continue to face other serious forms of systematic persecution, as well. They are barred from government employment, their homes are raided and their property seized, their marriages are not recognized, and their cemeteries are desecrated. In recent months, the government has targeted Baha'i-owned businesses, sealing dozens of shops for their observance of Baha'i holy days, and the government-controlled media has dramatically increased its efforts to incite hatred against the Baha'is using anti-Baha'i propaganda.

It is very important to remember that the government of Iran is engaged in this suppression of a peaceful minority religion in their country as our government moves to normalize relation with them.

My friend was pulled over after having a couple of beers. The police officer gave him a sobriety test and he blew a .05 and they charged him with DUI. I didn't think that was the legal limit. What should he do?

- Kayla, Tuscumbia, AL

The Alabama Supreme Court ruled that it is not illegal for a person of legal age to enjoy a glass of wine with dinner.

The Alabama State Legislature has passed laws governing the rules of the road including laws relating to driving under the influence. Basically there are two separate ways to be guilty of driving under the influence. The first is a statutory amount of alcohol that as a matter of law is deemed to be driving under the influence. If a person's test on an approved breathalyzer is .08% or more it doesn't matter how well they drive or how sober they appear. They

are guilty of DUI by statute. The second way to be guilty of driving under the influence is the inability to safely operate a motor vehicle. The law presumes that someone is not unable to operate a car safely at .04% or less. The law gives the officer discretion between .04% and .079%. At .08% and above the issue has been decided by the Legislature.

A police officer would have to have probable cause to make the traffic stop and would have to be certified to use the breathalyzer and that breathalyzer would have to be certified for the results to be admissible. Of course, officers use field sobriety tests and observe the results. The law also provides that you may be found guilty of DUI due to alcohol or another substance that impairs your ability to operate an automobile safely.

In this case, the officer would have to testify and prove (although his testimony may well be proof) that your friend was impaired to the extent they could not safely operate a car before he or she could be found guilty by a judge or jury. Typically, the first hearing is in a municipal or district court without a jury and if an appeal is promptly filed within the time allowed by law an appeal may be taken to a court with a jury.

You have the right to refuse to participate in or take any test, however, under the implied consent rules contained in your driving privileges your license will be suspended for ninety days if you refuse. As always my advice is to be polite to the police officer no matter how unreasonable he may seem to you at the time. Remember that you are on film while outside the police car and being recorded while inside the car so asking for a "break" isn't going to sound good later.

Buckle up and drive safely.




Stop Obama's devastating anti-ener anti-energy







SERIOUS PLAY

Toys are essential to keeping your cat active and happy

'nside every cat is a lion. Or a tiger. Or a lynx. Or, really, all of these great hunters. And in your cat's mind, he's a wild predator, too.

In fact, all cats are. They love to lurk and prowl and chase and pounce. An indoor cat doesn't have the opportunity to go after real prey (unless you have mice in your home), but he still has strong hunting instincts. This genetic coding doesn't disappear just because he lives a royal lifestyle in your home and has his meals delivered on the feline equivalent of a silver platter.

When a cat's need to hunt isn't fulfilled with live action, he turns to the next best thing: feet moving beneath the covers, hands dangling at an owner's side, arms, legs, you name it. Instead of letting a kitten believe your body parts are fair game, provide him with toys that will satisfy his urge to hunt as well as save your skin.

It's all too easy to accidentally encourage kittens to bite or scratch in play, but this type of aggressive behavior can turn into a big, painful problem as the kitten gets bigger. Never "arm wrestle" with a young cat, and keep some distance between you through play with toys that don't involve direct contact with the kitten. When kitten teeth or claws touch human skin, screech loudly and immediately walk away. Kittens learn fast that playing rough ends the game, especially when there are other things to play with.

Cats like toys they can stalk, chase, pounce on and bite. Turn your home into an indoor hunting ground with perches for watching the outdoor world go by (such as a window-box bird feeder), scratching posts for paw marking and nail maintenance, cat trees for climbing, resting and observing, and an ever-changing assortment of toys, toys, toys.

Puzzle toys are particularly good for giving your cat an outlet for his hunting instincts and ensuring that he keeps his sleek, sinewy physique. Wands with feathers or other dangly bits and wind-up

or battery-operated toys that move on their own excite a cat's chase instinct. Balls inside a track let him paw for "prey," just as if he were exploring a mouse hole. The fast, erratic motion of laser pointers and flashlights increase a cat's ability to think and move quickly. (Direct the beam up and down the stairs to give him a real workout.) And don't forget the classic catnip-filled mice for rolling and rabbit-kicking under the influence.

To keep your cat interested in his toys, change them out every few days. If he sees the same ones over and over again, he'll get bored and look for something new to play with. Cats being who they are, it will probably be something expensive or fragile that you don't want him to treat as a toy.

Those laser pointers, flashlights and wand toys have especially high value to cats because

they are just so darn much fun. Bring them out less often than other toys, and limit the amount of time your cat is allowed to play with them. For some cats these toys are addictive, and they will stand in front of the closet where the laser or wand is stored and yowl plaintively until they are brought out. Remember, if you give in even once, you have just taught your cat exactly how to manipulate you. To help soften your cat's disappointment when these favorite toys go up, reward him with a treat afterward or give him another favorite toy, like a catnip mouse.

The word "toy" just doesn't seem to cover how important these items are to our pets, especially an indoor cat. Indulge your pet with the gift of play, and you'll both be happier for it.

Antifreeze gets a safety makeover

 The manufacturers of antifreeze and engine coolant have agreed to add a bittering agent to their products, making them far less likely to poison pets and wildlife. In its original state, these products taste sweet, making them attractive to animals. The active ingredient, ethylene glycol, is highly toxic in small amounts and quickly absorbed, making veterinary response difficult and death common for animals that ingest the product. A number of states have mandated that bittering agents be added before products can be sold, but the voluntary agreement, brokered by the Humane Society Legislative Fund, expands the sale of the new formulation to all 50 states

· Like humans, dogs have two kinds of sleep. The deeper kind is characterized by rapid eye movements, so it's known as REM sleep. We know humans dream during REM sleep. We also know that the whining, heavy breathing, twitching and leg movements we've all seen in our dogs occur during canine REM sleep. So it's not a far fetch to believe dogs are dreaming, too. the eastern seaboard from New Jersey down to Florida. Over the last 30 years this extensive shortleaf pine ecosystem has lost over 50% of its former acreage with most of the significant decline taking place east of

the Mississippi River.
The Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) allows eligible landowners to apply to receive funding to plant shortleaf pine on their land.

"North Alabama landowners can help the ecosystem rebound by supporting the shortleaf pine on their land," said NRCS State Conservationist Ben Malone. "Our hope is that this first round of the Shortleaf Pine Initiative in Alabama will lead to more support for the effort.

Applications from producers are accepted all year, but only those submitted by January 15 are considered for this year's funding. NRCS field offices are listed under U.S. Department of Agriculture or on-line at http://offices. sc.egov.usda.gov.

The Lions were coming off back-to-back National Championships in 1993 and 1994 and were setting their sights on becoming the only team in NCAA scholarship football to win three consecutive national championships.

Wallace is a member of the Division II Football Hall of Fame, Alabama Sports Hall of Fame and UNA Athletic Hall of Fame.


