# **ELG** District prepares for fall back to school effort

"What will school look like in the fall?" If I had a dollar for every time I was asked this question over the past months, our District's budget would be secure for years.

Not to make light of a very challenging time full of uncertainty, stress and anxiety, but the reality is right now there are more questions than definite answers. Things are changing—our plans will need to be fluid. It doesn't mean we're not planning; what it means is we have to make plans that will be able to adapt to the situation in which we find ourselves functioning.

One guarantee we can make, is that as a District, we will do whatever we believe to be in the best interest of our students by balancing safety precautions with meeting their educational, social and emotional needs.

We know getting our students back onsite is so important to many, and especially to our youngest learners who struggle with virtual learning more than our older students. But this does not mean this option will be the best fit for each student and/ or family.

That is why we are studying and planning for various learning options, reviewing and formulating possible plans, brainstorming various scenarios (room configurations, lunch/bussing procedures, entering/exiting buildings, etc.), purchasing/implementing many health and safety products, equipment and procedures, trying to think of all the questions that need answering, etc.

#### **Committee meets**

A "Return-to-School" committee has started to meet and will continue to do so weekly until a framework is established. This committee will serve as the "clearinghouse" of all the information/plans on which the administration, staff and other key stakeholders are meeting and planning, such as maintenance/cleaning; food service; child care; transportation; building level teams at the elementary, middle and high school level, etc. The end goal will be to take all the input from the subcommittees and use this to put together a draft framework that also takes into consideration guidelines from the CDC, DPI, State/County Health Departments, and local regulations, while weighing in the input given by staff and parents via surveys conducted.





While the Parent survey is still "open" for responses as I write this article, 70% of parents expressed they would send their students back to school in the fall, 29% were uncertain and 1% did not plan to do so. However, we know this can and will change for some families depending on the rate of the virus spread/transmission when school starts; the framework under which school opens, etc. Also, there may be a time when the choice is taken out of the District's hand if it is determined that on-site instruction cannot safely happen by the State, County or at a local level. We must also plan for that scenario.

#### Two models offered

But operating under the current situation/guidelines where returning to school on-site in the fall is an option, our initial draft plan is to offer two models of instruction to our students/families:

Option 1: On-site instruction 5 days a week (4 days for JK for most weeks) along with

Option 2: On-line/virtual learning. While specifics for how Option 2: Virtual Learning will be "conducted," parameters/ structures are being developed incorporating feedback from the spring experience supplied by parents and staff. This learning environment may look and function very differently at the varying learning levels – high school, middle school and elementary school. As the goal will be to conduct virtual learning during the regular school day schedule, older learners may be able to attend the same classes as their peers "simultaneously" via technology. However, this same expectation would not be reasonable and/or feasible for our younger learners. Also, the format may vary depending on the number of students at each grade level who choose the virtual option as staffing is an important consideration and factor.

As you can see, there are many, many factors to consider and various situations for which we need to plan.

#### **Addressing priorities**

Our process will focus on addressing the top three priorities parents expressed in the survey for the District this fall: 1) Encouraging student academic progress, 2) Planning for the safety of students and staff, and 3) Providing social connections/interactions with others for their children/students. The following are examples of steps already taken that begin to address many of the factors which parents and staff expressed would increase their comfort level (more to come):

Recommended hiring an additional

4th grade teacher to maintain small class sizes (up for approval at the July Board meeting).

With assistance from the ELG Education Foundation, purchased Chromebooks for students JK-grade 1 so each student in our District has access to a device if the need to go entirely virtual/online would again need to happen.

Ordered the following sanitizing/cleaning equipment – a sanitizing sprayer for each building for daily use; a "backpack" sanitizing sprayer model to be used on bleachers, playground equipment, etc.; wall sanitizers for each classroom, entryway, and hallways; plexi-glass partitions in office areas; established "quarantine" rooms in each buildings; sanitizing wipes readily available, etc.

Purchased thermometers for student screening upon entry into the building; staff will do daily self-monitoring for symptoms.

Purchased additional tables to spread the h.s. lunch area into the hallways.

This is just the start. To assist us in our planning, parents will be asked to complete a separate survey for each of the two buildings: elem./m.s. and h.s. that will give us specifics needed for planning – class lists, staffing, bussing, etc. This is critical information we will need to know. We realize this may change, but need parents to give us their best estimate for the choice of instructional format for their child/children this fall.

In addition to planning for return to school in the fall, parents expressed support for their child/children to return prior to the official start of school on August 19 and/or 20. This would give staff and students an opportunity to "reconnect" and bring closure to the 2019-20 school year. In addition, students will be introduced to the "new look" for 2020-21 and have the opportunity to share their thoughts, concerns, worries, fears with their teachers. We want to provide this opportunity for students to get their thoughts known, even if not all can be immediately addressed. The mental health of our students, and staff, and their ability to be resilient and adaptable will also be a primary focus as we return to school in the fall.

#### Patience, understanding vital

The patience and understanding of our parents, staff and entire community will be very important, and very much appreciated, as we work through this new landscape for education, and life in general. Communication is also paramount—on all our parts. People have to let us know

any additional concerns that may arise, and we will be sure to continue to provide updates on our planning process as we proceed. These will be posted on the District website—so please watch for these to begin by the end of July. As I've been saying often throughout this pandemic... please stay tuned. Due to our small school size, supportive community and willingness to work together as a "school family," I truly believe we can adjust to provide the services to meet our student, staff and parent needs...or at the least, we'll try our very best.

While we anticipated changes to address safety concerns regarding the pandemic, one change that was very unexpected was notice from Mr. Fischer that he would be resigning from his position as Elementary/ Middle School principal.

#### **Fischer leaving**

In the best interest of his health, his family, and his future, Mr. Fischer shared with me at the end of June that he will be resigning from the position of Elementary/ Middle Principal effective July 31, 2020. On behalf of the District, and personally, I want to recognize and thank Mr. Fischer for sharing his time, efforts, creativity, compassion, experience, sense-of-humor, and more with us. He truly became a key component of our community, and especially of our Resorter family. While sad to see Mr. Fischer leave, and disappointed that his tenure at ELG is over, I truly appreciate and respect his decision. Family and health are important, and should definitely come first. We wish Mr. Fischer only the best as he returns to his former position at Stockbridge. We offered to host a "farewell/thank you" event for Mr. Fischer (following guidelines, of course), but it was his choice not to do so. However, I think messages and emails would mean a lot to him and would be greatly appreciated. He will be missed!

Mr. Fischer's unexpected leaving created a "hole" in our administration team, so we have worked the past few weeks to best figure out a plan for moving forward. Many options were considered, and we are excited to announce our direction going forward. We believe it will serve us well-both for the short and long-term.

#### **Dr. Courneene joins staff**

On Monday, July 13, the same people who participated in the principal interview process last spring, reconvened and interviewed our principal candidate, Dr. Jeanne Courneene. This committee was comprised of staff and parents. That same evening, the School Board, along with

Mrs. Hammann and me, did follow-up interviews. At the end of the day/evening, it was unanimous to put forth for formal approval at the July 20 Board meeting a recommendation for Dr. Courneene's hire as she seemed to be just what we needed in a leader to get through the challenging times ahead -- experience, enthusiasm, energy, a love for teaching -- especially at the elementary & middle school levels, a strength in curriculum, a passion for developing all under her care -- students and staff, and extremely important at this time, a positive can-do attitude and a great sense-of-humor.

Dr. Courneene comes to ELGS with many years of experience as a middle school teacher, assistant principal, principal and district administrator. She was most recently at Cedar Grove-Belgium where she served in the roles of M.S. teacher, principal and district administrator from 1998 to 2019. Dr. Courneene took early retirement last year, in large part to care for her mother and moved her to WI to be nearer to her. Once her mom was settled, she was again ready to resume her passion -- being a principal and working with students and staff.

Upon "formal" Board approval at their meeting on Monday, July 20, Dr. Courneene will "officially" begin her principal role on August 1. However, do not be surprised if you see her in the building and in the community before then. She and Mr. Fischer will be working together so a smooth transition can occur, and Dr. Courneene is already involved in our "Return-to-School" planning meetings. We (and she) want her to be "up to speed" as we know this coming year will be like no other--so we want to be ready--for whatever the future may bring. As I keep saying...stay tuned...

As I said, Mr. Fischer will be ending his time as principal at ELGS on July 31, but you may see him around as he has offered to help out/be available as needed to help keep things flowing smoothly.

Feel free to reach out to me if you have any questions, or better yet, watch for Dr. Courneene in the buildings. She'd love to meet you and talk with you!

# Farm 1849 offers place for events

The love of her childhood experiences of being raised on a Central Illinois farm has prompted Kristen Pachis and her husband Trevor to pursue a dream of converting a farm into an event hosting venue.

After years of searching, the couple finally found their dream property, and they are advancing their plan to use it as a combination event and catering business.

Farm 1849 is the moniker chosen by the couple for their new event hosting and catering business. It's derived from the farm property's history. The farm dates back to 1849, a year after Wisconsin's statehood, when records show it was purchased from the United States government. Farm 1849 rests along County Highway T between County C and Highway 23 near Greenbush.

"We are in a great location, just eight minutes from Elkhart Lake, ten minutes from Plymouth, and close to the Ice Age Trail head," she said.

#### Positive end of the search

"We both have experience in the service industry—bartending, serving and others, and we always had an interest in buying a farm to use as an event space," Kristen said. She was recently involved in running her own small Chicago area boutique wedding planning firm, a business she founded.

"We had looked at so many farms over the course of years, that it actually became quite a hobby for us. Wouldn't you know it, the day we decided we were going to take a break from looking, we found this place. We looked at the barn, and we knew this was the one! We fell in love immediately. It sits up on a hill with gorgeous views in every direction, yet it feels very private."

#### **Phases of renovation**

Upgrading the barn and outdoor property to host events involves a two phase plan, the first phase of which began last summer, when a former pole barn was dismantled to create an outdoor gathering space.

A huge outdoor pergola was constructed enhance that space, with the contractor wrapping up the project in early July.

Large farm tables, lounge seating and a bar are enhanced by string lighting to create a festive backdrop. "It's a great fun space," Kristen said.

"Our outdoor space is almost complete, except for a fence. COVID set us back just a little bit in our plan," Kristen said.

Recently, the new owners broke ground on the bathrooms and catering area for their event hosting facilities.

"We hope to be able to host some small events in September and October. Right now we are just waiting to see what happens with the ability of people to gather," she added.

#### Working on the barn

Phase II of the Farm 1849 renovation involves the indoor gathering spaces. The owners hope to complete the indoor upgrades to the barn by the end of next summer.

They will be working on rebuilding the hayloft floor, along with remodeling both the loft and the milking parlor to help accommodate events.



#### Wide range of events

The plan for Farm 1849 is to serve as a hosting site for a wide range of events. Along with weddings, the facility is equipped to host local community-driven events, corporate events, family or class reunions, or just about any kind of gathering up to 299 people.

Farm 1849 contemplating hosting movie nights, allowing people to bring their own chairs and blankets to watch a movie on a Sunday night in the open air courtyard, with refreshments available for purchase.

They are also discussing partnerships with local business to create new and interesting events for the community.

"We met recently with Plymouth Springs Fish Company to talk about options for events like lobster boils and seafood-driven farm dinners," Kristen said.

"These would be ticketed events involving music, drinks and dinner."

#### **Bed and Breakfast**

Farm 1849 also serves as a lodging option through AirBNB, offering a single rental option with six bedrooms, eight beds and three-and-a-half baths.

With help from their two children, Stella 12 and Sebastian 17, the construction and planning and decorating have truly been a family affair for the Farm 1849 owners.


And, they are excited to unfold their rural Wisconsin gem with others.

Sheboygan County is currently in phase 2 of the re-opening guidelines. The Village parks, library, and offices are open. If you attend any meetings in the civic center a mask is required. If you need to have an absentee ballot, please call the Village offices and request an absentee request form. You will need to provide that form and a copy of your photo ID to our office, or go to https://myvote. wi.gov/en-us/ and request an absentee ballot. You can request ballots for the remainder of the year, if you so choose. If you request a ballot online, it will be mailed when it is available for each election.

Ballots have been mailed for the August 11, 2020 fall primary election. This election is the primary for many county, state, and federal elections. You can also see a sample ballot on https://myvote.wi.gov. You can stop in the office to vote beginning July 27th, or you can request a ballot be mailed to you. We are encouraging you to vote absentee, as we are trying to keep the election workers as safe as possible. The less people who vote in person, the safer the election will be for Elkhart Lake residents.

#### 2020 US Census Please Participate

Please respond to the US Census. The Village's current response rate is only 65.7%. They have contacted the Village, as are response rate is low. The Census will be looking to set up booths at farmer's market and other areas around the Village. We need you to participate. Please respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail and shape the Village's future

today. Paper questionnaires should have arrived in the mail around April 30th. You can participate online by going to www. my2020census.gov. If you do not have a computer, you can respond in English by phone by calling 944-330-2020. Someone is available from 7 am until 2 am EST, 7 days a week.

You should respond online or by phone "no" when asked if you or anyone else was living or staying that that address on April 1, 2020.




