

Dear "Speakout,"

I want to congratulate all women on the 100th Anniversary of your right to vote. August 2020 is "Women's Suffrage Centennial" and "National Women's History" month.

The 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution was ratified on Wednesday, August 18, 1920, and prohibited the states and federal governments from prohibiting the right to vote to any citizen of the United States of America on the basis of sex.

I will attempt to include all the women who were prominent in Livingston County in alphabetical order.

Mary Jemison (1743-1833) She and her family were attacked by French soldiers and Shawnee Indians on April 5, 1758, in the Buchanan Valley near Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Her family was murdered and she was taken captive to Fort Duquesne, now Pittsburg. She was adopted by two Seneca women and later married a Delaware Indian named "Sheinga" and moved into the area which is today Letchworth State Park. She was given the Seneca name Deh-ge-wa-nus meaning TWO VOICES. She was later called the White Woman of the Genesee by white settlers.

Mary Kennedy (1825-1905) She was born at Squawkie Hill and her people were sent to the Buffalo Creek Reservation and a few years later to the Cattaraugus Reservation. She was the last of the full-blood Squawkilia Indian tribe.

Sara Jane McBride (1844-?) She grew up along the banks of Caledonia Creek which is now known as Spring Creek. Sarah's father made and sold lures for fly fisherman and Mary succeeded her father in the business when he died in 1875. She wrote "Beside the Singing Stream" and the "Etymology of Fly Fisherman".

Eleanor Shaw Smith Fraser (1868-1948) She lived with her sister at 22 Main Street in Geneseo in the first half of the 20th century. Both were involved in the highest levels of the state, national and international suffrage and temperance organizations. They were inspired by their aunt the Reverend Dr. Anna Howard Shaw who took her two nieces under her wing after their mother died.

Harriet Lee Saltonstall Gratwick (1907-1999) She moved to Linwood Gardens in 1934 which was her husband Bill Gratwick's family summer home. Both she and Bill were active in community theater and music productions through the Linwood Grange. Harriet attended the Eastman School of Music for conducting and later opened the Linwood Music

School in 1948. The summer programs operated on the Gratwick property until 1963. Harriet also helped establish the York Opera Company in 1948 an the Rochester Zen Center in 1966.

Mary Seymour Howell (1844-1913) She was born in Mount Morris and grew up at 2 State Street. She was educated at the Genesee Wesleyan Seminary and taught at the Mount Morris Academy as a young woman. She became well known in literary and social circles and for her involvement in woman suffrage. She continued to be at the forefront of the women's suffrage movement until her death in 1913 only four years before the passage of woman's suffrage in New York State in 1917.





Vaccines affect the entire community by breaking down herd immunity. Herd immunity, or community immunity, is when a large percentage of the population is vaccinated and protects the entire community - those who are vaccinated and those who cannot be vaccinated. When a family chooses not to vaccinate, they not only put their children at risk of vaccine preventable disease but they also put others at risk.

During NIAM, the Livingston County Department of Health encourages you talk to your doctor, nurse, or other healthcare professional to ensure your children are up-to-date on recommended vaccines.

Sun Safety for the Summer Months

Sunburns and tans are a result of too much exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation (rays) from the sun. Even when a sunburn or tan fades, the damage caused to skin cells does not, and the effects cannot be reversed. These effects include skin cancer and early aging of the skin (wrinkles, age spots, etc.).

Exposure to the sun's rays happens when you're doing everyday things like biking, gardening, and walking. People who have jobs that require them to work outside are more likely than anybody else to get skin cancer.

There are three skin cancers that are most common and include basal cell, squamous, and melanoma. About 90% of skin cancers are the result of too much exposure to ultraviolet (UV) rays. UV exposure adds up over time, increasing the risk of developing skin cancer, so sun protection should start at an early age. Here are a few ways to stay sun safe:

Wear long-sleeved shirts, pants, and a wide-brimmed hat to get the best protection. If you're wearing a baseball cap or short-sleeved shirt, make sure to put sunscreen on your ears, neck, and arms.

Stay in the shade as much as possible between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., which are peak times for sunlight.

• Use a broad-spectrum sunscreen of at least SPF 15 on any exposed skin. Apply the sunscreen to dry skin 15-30 minutes before going outdoors and re-apply it every two hours, as well as after swimming, sweating, or toweling off.

[©] Wear extra sun protective clothing around surfaces like snow, sand, water, and concrete that reflect the sun's rays and could increase your risk of sunburn.

If you work outdoors, ask about sun protection at your job, like wearing sun-protective clothing.

Follow these tips on cloudy days too! Clouds do not block most UV rays.

Avoid indoor tanning.
