Deadline approaches for special youth deer hunting

The state of Minnesota has scheduled 17 special youth deer hunts with limited numbers of permits available for the fall of 2020. Applicants must be at least age 12 and under age 16 at the time of the hunt. Deadline for applications is Friday, Aug. 14. Apply at any of the license vendors around the state or website for only\$1 or at http://licenses.dnr.state. mn.us/ and click on Purchase. Please be aware that hunts may be canceled or changed due to COVID-19 concerns. Prior to participating in the fall 2020 hunting season, hunters should refer to the DNR's COVID-19 response web page at www.mndnr. gov/covid-19 for the latest information.

The licensing agent will ask for the following information when applying: State Driver's License, State ID, Firearms Safety Certificate number,

or MDNR number. A Social Security Number will be needed, if you are applying for the lottery or purchasing a license for the first time. along with a date of birth. Agent asks for License Type and Area - 631 for firearms and the hunt area. The cost is \$1. You will receive a receipt of your application information. Keep your receipt as proof of application and check receipt to ensure information was entered correctly. Corrections can only be made at the time of application.

Group applications and party hunting are not allowed; participants must shoot their owndeer. A lottery will be held if applications exceed the number of permits. Applicant may only apply for one youth firearms hunt. Cost is \$1. Participating in a special youth hunt does not preclude one from hunting the regularseason.

Unsuccessful applicants receive preference for future youth hunt drawings of the same type. An adult parent/ guardian mentor, who may not hunt, must accompany youth participants while hunting at all times and will abide by all hunting rules. All youth participants and an adult parent/guardian mentor must attend a mandatory prehunt orientation session.

Blaze orange or pink (recently approved by legislation) is required during youth firearms hunts.

Tree stands and pop-up blind in special state parks hunts only: Are permitted up to seven days prior to the hunt, placed during normal park hours and must have owner/hunter clearly identified on them with their MND-NR license number.(Thisisto facilitate hunt preparation by youth who are normally in school Monday through



Opinion — Safely educating our children during a pandemic

By GOVERNORTIM WALZ As a classroom teacher for more than 20 years, I know firsthand how resilient, strong, and flexible our students and educators are. There's nobody better suited for a challenge. But COVID-19 has posed unprecedented questions about the balance of public health and education that simply have no easy answers.

We know Minnesotans have conflicting feelings about the upcoming school year. Some families are afraid for the safety of our students and the families they go home to. Others are eager to get children back into the classroom, where our kids learn best. Many more feel a mixture of both and we all worry for the health of our teachers and school staff. As a former teacher for more than 20 years and the parent of a child in public school, I am committed to providing the

best education to our students the best with the public health while keeping them and their educators safe.

I followed three principles as I worked with the Departments of Education and Health on a plan for the 2020-21 school year. First, our top priority was the safety, health, and well-being of students, staff, and families. Second, we continue to make data-driven decisions, leaning on science and research to make the best decisions for our state. And finally, we would respect the importance of local school districts, their expertise of their unique communities, and their commitment to making the best decisions for their students.

That is why we are taking a localized, data-driven approach to the 2020-21 school year that will put student and staff safety first. By bringing together the local education leaders who know their students, staff, and communities

experts who know the virus the best, this plan will help determine a learning model that makes the most sense for each community.

School districts and charter schools will begin in one of three models: in-person, distance learning, or a hybrid model. Experts at the Departments of Health and Education will partner with local school districts and charter schools to help determine which learning model they should use to start the school year. While there are many factors to consider, the decision-making process will center on local data indicating the prevalence of COVID-19 in the surrounding county.

Throughout the school year, we will need to be flexible and adapt with the fluid nature of this pandemic. The Departments of Education and Health will work with school districts and


local health professionals to consistently track the virus to determine if and when a school may need to adjust their learning plan. School districts and charter schools will be required to ensure all families have the option to choose distance learning for their student. Teachers and staff will be given similar flexibility to the extent possible. As we switch between models, the plan prioritizes keeping younger children in the classroom because transmission is less likely for younger children and in-person learning is particularly critical at their developmental

With an investment of more than \$430 million, we will support our schools, educators, students, and families through this uncertain time. We will provide face coverings for every student, educator, and staff member. We will deploy a comprehensive testing plan for educators and staff. We will help cover costs for cleaning supplies and technology needs, and we will create strategies for child care throughout the state.

School districts and public health officials have a lot of important work to do, but the ultimate success of this process isn't just up to them. It's also in the hands of each and every Minnesotan. Our schools reflect their surrounding communities. For this to work, we need Minnesotans to come together to slow the

spread of COVID-19. We need everyone to do their part to help get our kids and our teachers back in the classroom safely.

Think to stop the fear

Two types of people are wearing masks today: the wise who know they are at risk for COVID-19 because of poor health or co-morbidities, and the "others" who are still afraid this virus will kill them if they get it.

The science against wearing masks wins. Like the lockdowns, wearing masks will do more harm than good. But there is no end to the stupid things the "others" will do so they can feel safe.

It doesn't matter if Bev won't wear a mask because she believes it might reduce her blood oxygenation levels or weaken her immune system, makes her feel like she can't breathe, or she just doesn't want to—selfish Nancy wants everyone to wear a mask so

On July 27, there were 51,803 confirmed cases and 1,576 deaths for a "MN Black Death" fatality rate of three percent. According to the MN Department of Health, in the 2018-19 influenza season, there were 2,522 hospitalizations and 126 deaths, for a fatality rate of five percent. In the 2017-18 season, the numbers were 6,288 and 435 and seven percent.

Looking ahead, I am not afraid of the virus, but I am afraid there is no end to the stupid things the "others" will do so they can feel safe.
