local organizations in each market, including Committee on Church Cooperation in Decatur, Sidney's Safe! Foundation, the Departments of Human Resources in Franklin, Lawrence, and Limestone Counties, and Free 2 Teach in Madison.

The COVID-19 crisis presented some unique obstacles to engaging with the community. The solution for this year's School Share drive was to offer contactless means of donations. Hodge Jeff of Birmingham is the most recent player to reach 1,000 career points at UNA. The shooting guard finished his four-year career with 1,042 points, averaging 12.3 points per game as a senior in the 2017-18 campaign.

Dimario Jackson finished his two-year career in 2017 after leading the Lions in scoring with 466 points as a senior, including a 16.1 per-game average. The guard from Addis, LA., totaled 843

career points. **'DD' Smith**, is from Camden, MS and lettered two years from 2017-19, with his senior season representing UNA's first at the Division I level. He averaged double figures in both campaigns, finishing with 787 career points and a 13.3 points per-game average.

Nathan Spehr lettered four seasons for the Lions. The shooting guard from Adelaide, Australia is No. 8 on UNA's all-time scoring list with 1,243 career points. He added 203 career three-point baskets and 220 rebounds. He holds the program free throw percentage record after hitting 272of-300 attempts for a 90.7 percentage. He helped lead UNĂ to the 2014 ĠSC

championship. Kendall Stafford played two seasons at UNA at the Division II and Division I levels. He started all 27 games for the Lions as a junior, leading the team in scoring (15.6 points) and rebounding (8.3 rebounds). The forward from Corinth, MS finished his career with 757 points and 439 rebounds.

In some cases, limited options were then sprung on parents, giving them a week to make binding decisions for the semester.

The schedules for parents,

students of all ages, teachers, administrators, grandparents, employers, and a lot of volunteers are having to adapt instantly. Everything is new, even for the professionals who have been at this for decades.

Changes in routines and normal activities are always stressful for children. Elementary children who have known normal school


attendees are encouraged to purchase in advance. Considered the largest outdoor rodeo east of the

How Medicare and Other Tools Can Help Older Smokers Kick the Habit

Dear Savvy Senior.

I understand that COVID-19 hits smokers a lot harder than nonsmokers but quitting at my age is very difficult. Does Medicare offer any coverage that helps beneficiaries quit smoking?

Must Quit

Dear Must. It's true. Smokers and vapers have a higher risk of severe COVID-19 infection as the coronavirus attacks the lungs. That's why quitting now is more important than ever before.

If you are a Medicare beneficiary, you'll be happy to know that Medicare Part B covers up to eight face-to-face counseling sessions a year to help you quit smoking. And, if you have a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan, certain smoking-cessation medications are covered too. Here are some other tips that can help you kick the habit. It's Never Too Late

According to the Center of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) 12.5 percent of Medicare beneficiaries smoke. Many older smokers, like yourself, indicate that they would like to quit, but because of the nicotine, which is extremely addictive, it's very difficult to do.

Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable illness, responsible for an estimated one-fifth of deaths in the United States each year.

But research shows that quitting, even after age 65, greatly reduces your risk of heart disease, stroke, cancer, osteoporosis and many other diseases including COVID-19. It also helps you breathe easier, smell and taste food better, not to mention saves you quite a bit of money. A \$6 pack-a-day smoker, for example, saves about \$180 after one month without cigarettes, and nearly \$2,200 after one year.

How to Quit

The first step you need to take is to set a "quit date," but give yourself a few weeks to get ready. During that time, you may want to start by reducing the number or the strength of cigarettes you smoke to begin weaning yourself.

Also check out over-the-counter nicotine replacement products - patches, gum and lozenges - to help curb your cravings (these are not covered by Medicare). And just prior to your quit day get rid of all cigarettes and ashtrays in your home, car, and place of work, and try to clean up and even spray air freshener. The smell of smoke can be a powerful trigger.

Get Help

Studies have shown that you have a much better chance of quitting if you have help. So, tell your friends, family, and coworkers of your plan to quit. Others knowing can be a helpful reminder and motivator.

Then get some counseling. Don't go it alone. Start by contacting your doctor about smoking cessation counseling covered by Medicare and find out about the prescription antismoking drugs that can help reduce your nicotine craving.

You can also get free one-on-one telephone counseling and referrals to local smoking cessation programs through your state quit line at 800-QUIT-NOW or call the National Cancer Institute free smoking quit line at 877-44U-QUIT.

It's also important to identify and write down the times and situations you're most likely to smoke and make a list of things you can do to replace it or distract yourself. Some helpful suggestions when the smoking urge arises are to call a friend or one of the free quit lines, keep your



mouth occupied with some sugar-free gum, sunflower seeds, carrots, fruit or hard candy, go for a walk, read a magazine, listen to music or take a hot bath.

The intense urge to smoke lasts about three to five minutes, so do what you can to wait it out. It's also wise to avoid drinking alcohol and steer clear of other smokers while you're trying to quit. Both can trigger powerful urges to smoke.

For more tips on how to quit, including managing your cravings, withdrawal symptoms and what to do if you relapse, visit 60plus. SmokeFree.gov. There are also a variety of helpful quit smoking apps you can download like SmokeFreeApp.com and QuitGenius.com.


Medicare Minute "Medicare Part B"

Before we begin talking about Medicare Part B I would like to clear up something that was in last week's article concerning Medicare Part A. As I stated in the article Part A has a deductible of \$1,408 per benefit period. I also stated that if you paid into Medicare for 40 quarters that Part A was free to you. I was referring to the fact that you would not have to pay a premium to Medicare for Part A, not that it would exclude you from paying the deductible.


Medicare Part B is the part of Medicare that is billed when you receive services as an outpatient by a Medicare approved provider, such as your primary care physician (PCP) or specialist. Although a visit to your doctor is the primary way that you will use Medicare Part B, it also covers many other services. We will discuss the other services in next week's article.

If you are turning 65 in 2020, Medicare Part B will have a premium of \$144.60/mo. Because there is a premium attached to Medicare Part B this coverage is optional. This means you are not required to enroll in Medicare Part B. There are two important things to remember about Part B being optional. First, if you opt out of Part B you will have no coverage under Medicare for your outpatient services. Second, if you decide at a later date to enroll in Part B there can be a late enrollment penalty applied that will last as long as you live and have Part B. There are exceptions to the late enrollment penalty that we will discuss in future articles.



Best Location for Overpass

Mr. Magazzu,

I attended the outdoor presentation of the railroad overpass presented by options Volkert Engineering Tuesday evening. As an architectural cad designer I had a hard time reading the plans up close since most of the existing area was blurred to the point it was difficult to see how the new construction would tie into the existing streets. After looking at the sections online the only thing that most of the public would be able to determine is how many lanes and how wide all the proposals were. The longitudinal sections will be almost impossible for most of the public to understand. I don't understand why Volkert didn't have a 3D drawings for all 5 proposals which would clearly show how these structures would look on the existing landscape.

I did a crude 3D drawing 15 years ago of a Cox Blvd. to Avalon Avenue and King Street overpass that is easy to understand. I named the overpass "Unity Overpass" since it tied Muscle Shoals, Sheffield and Tuscumbia together. I have had letters I have had letters published in the *Courier Journal* years ago with my ideas as well as sending them to Senator Larry Stutts. I also sent my idea and the drawing I made NACOLG which the Volkert spokesperson said they had access to see as well. I've done about all I can do to get this location out to anybody who would listen as the best location with the least impact during the construction phase and probably the cheapest alternative as well.

There is no lawyer that can, could or should answer a question about a contract without reading the contract. Almost always, if you want to

ask a lawyer a question about a contract, the lawyer needs to see the contract.


I'm sure there are exceptions for contracts that call for outcomes that are not recognized by law. Anybody with an imagination can come up with an idea for an illegal contract. That being said, the law of contracts can be complicated. The law of contracts is extensive to the point where there are legal encyclopedias for courts and lawyers who deal with contracts to reference. The fact is that contracts can be governed by statute, prior decisions of the courts of the state in which the contract was made or interpreted and there are those contracts where the court would have to make new law.

Certainly the law of contracts does contain exceptions for contracts that are entered into in good faith but that have unforeseen difficulties. There may be exceptions when one side is unjustly enriched beyond what the parties contemplated in the original contract.

For a lawyer to apply the law as it relates to contracts and to provide legal advice, they have to have the contract to read.

Whenever a person has a question about a contract, always bring the contract.

while wearing a Daphne cheerleading uniform. It wasn't taken in any official capacity of them in their representation of Daphne High School.


