

With Tyler Adams being named to the Second Team Academic All-State team in baseball by the Iowa Baseball Coaches Association, the 2020 Okoboji graduate became the only male athlete in the State of Iowa to be named Academic All-State in four sports during the 2019-20 seasons. Adams was selected Academic All-State by the Iowa Football Coaches Association this past fall. To be selected for this honor, a player must be a senior starter, have a GPA of 3.7 or higher, must be involved in other



extra-curricular activities and must be recommended by their head coach. Adams was then one of just 26 players selected to the Iowa Basketball Coaches Academic All-State team. This team carried the following averages: an ACT composite score of 27.6; a scoring average of 14.4; and a GPA of 3.8. Even though there was no spring sports season, every spring sport still named an Academic All-State team. Adams was one of just three Class 2A boys named to the Iowa Golf Coaches Association Academic All-State team. The Iowa Baseball Coaches Association Academic All-State team is chosen by a panel of coaches who selected the senior players who demonstrate outstanding academic, moral, and athletic

2020 ANNUAL REPORT

In a normal year the Dickinson County Taxpayers Association holds an Annual Membership Meeting the second Friday in June. Each year we have an interesting speaker to address issues of interest to Dickinson County taxpayers. We did not hold an Annual Meeting this year due to the difficulty of holding a large public meeting due to Covid-19. This year we are publishing an Annual Report. The report will summarize the various activities in which the Taxpayer Association has been involved this past year.

1. PROPERTY TAX



20 PERCENT BOOST TO OKOBOJI LAKESHORE LAND VALUE In March 2019 (an Iowa reassessment year) the Dickinson County Assessor mailed an assessment notice that increased the value of East and West Okoboji lakeshore land by an average of 20 percent. Impacted were 1,263 lakeshore properties on West Okoboji and 633 lakeshore properties on East Okoboji -

south of the Highway 9 Bridge.

COUNTY ASSESSOR LOGIC During April and May 2019 we asked the County Assessor many questions about how the 20 percent increase was determined. The answer from the Assessor for West Okoboji lakeshore land was that 39 properties were sold during 2018. A comparison for those 39 properties showed that they sold for an average of 20 percent above their assessed value. For East Okoboji it was 16 properties that sold for an average of 20 percent above their assessed value.

The conclusion drawn by the Assessor was that since 3 percent of the 1,263 West Okoboji properties and 3 percent of the 633 East Okoboji properties sold for 20 percent over their assessed value one can assume that the other 97 percent of the properties could have sold for 20 percent over their assessed value. The result was a 20 percent increase for all lakeshore land on West and East Okoboji – below the Highway 9 Bridge.

NOTE: The Taxpayer Association doesn't believe it is appropriate to raise the assessed value of 100 percent of lakeshore land property values by 20 percent based on only 3 percent of the properties being sold. As a result our Association requested a hearing before the Dickinson County Board of Review and pursued an appeal with the lowa Property Assessment Appeal Board.

COUNTY BOARD OF REVIEW HEARING On June 12, 2019 the Taxpayer Association was granted a hearing before the Dickinson County Board of Review. A copy of our presentation made that day is on our website under the heading of "Property Tax". The Board of Review took no action regarding our Association protest. Their stated reason was that the Taxpayer Association did not list a specific property. To the contrary, we cited all of the 1,896 lakeshore properties that received the 20 percent increase.

IOWA PAAB APPEAL On June 30, 2019 the Taxpayer Association filed an electronic appeal with the Iowa Property Assessment Appeal Board – an independent state agency. The grounds for our PAAB appeal were that fewer than three percent of the East and West Lake Okoboji properties sold in 2017 and 2018 were used to justify the 20 percent increase in Okoboji lakeshore land appraised value. PAAB rejected our appeal on the basis that our association was not an aggrieved taxpayer (we will fix that next time) and did not represent a sufficient number of the 1,986 taxpayers that received the 20 percent increase.

AUGUST 2020 TAX BILLS This month the County Treasurer will mail the 2020-2021 Property Tax Bills. The new tax bills will reflect the March 2019 revaluations. That would include the 20 percent increase on Okoboji lakeshore land. It will also include the cost of the \$25M bond issue to build the new Middle School in Milford for taxpayers in the Okoboji School District. Typically half of the annual property taxes will be paid in September 2020 and the second half in March of 2021.

2. IOWA LAKES COMMUNITY COLLEGE



DICKINSON COUNTY BENEFIT FROM A FIVE COUNTY CC DISTRICT Last year the Taxpayer Association became concerned about the financial benefit Dickinson County receives from a five county Community College District. An Association review of the financial cost to the Dickinson

County discovered some interesting information. Our County paid the most of any county, but, by our assessment, received the least amount of benefits. Dickinson County has little college infrastructure and fewer students compared to other counties supporting the college. On November 14, 2019 the Association Board of Directors met with officials of the Iowa Lakes Community College – including their President. A very stimulating discussion has held about the financial inequity problem and how to level the playing field. More meetings are planned.

3. OKOBOJI SCHOOL DISTRICT



SALE OF THE ARNOLDS PARK MIDDLE SCHOOL In April of 2018 the voters of the Okoboji School District approved a \$25M bond issue to build a new Middle School in Milford. The result would make the existing Arnolds Park Middle School an unneeded facility. The District voters were hopeful the sale on the Arnolds Park Middle School at a prime location in the lakes area would

help offset the \$25M cost of the new Middle School. In late 2019 and early 2020 the sale of the Milford Middle School was moving at a slow – unorganized pace. On January 20, 2020 the Taxpayer Association sent a letter to the Okoboji School Board asking the sale be better organized to better optimize the sales price. The Middle School sold in late February 2020 for \$1.1M to Neal Slater. Possession is to be provided September 1, 2020.

OKOBOJI SCHOOL DISTRICT STATE FUNDING INEQUITY The Okoboji Community School District has asked the Taxpayer Association to help them correct a school funding in equity that financially hurts the School District taxpayers. The problem is caused by the Okoboji School District having the highest real estate property tax valuations per student in the State of Iowa. For this reason the Okoboji school district does not receive the same level of financial support from the state as other school districts.

For the 2020-2021 school year, Okoboji school district taxpayers will pay an additional \$911,976 to supplement the lack of funding coming from the state simply due to high property tax valuations per student in the district. The Okoboji School District and the Taxpayers Association are working together to solve this inequity.

4. ASSOCIATION BUSINESS



ELECTION During the last year Mark Sullivan was elected the new Vice President and Jan Bowles was elected the new Treasurer.

New Study to Look at Iowa **Great Lakes Watershed** By Steve Weisman



There is little doubt that the bodies of water here in the Iowa Great Lakes have a huge impact on the entire area from recreation to economic impact to sources of drinking water. Without them, we would be, well, we would be just any other rural Midwest area. With them, the Iowa Great Lakes is the centerpiece, the hub.

For that reason, a lot of work has gone into improving water quality and protecting these bodies of water. That's why each lake has its own protective association, why we have the Dickinson County Water Alliance, the Water Quality Commission. One of the driving forces behind water quality decisions comes from the research done. The most recent comprehensive study was the Lake Diagnostic and Feasibility Study done in 2006. The assessment was used to build the current Iowa Great Lakes Management Plan which helped guide current efforts and led to many great clean water projects.

Over 1,300 acres of wetlands have been restored, permanent land protections have occurred to protect the lakes, restorations have taken place on Marble Lake, Center Lake and West Hottes, the Iowa Great Lakes Sanitary District has continued its improvements, agriculture and urban best management practices have occurred, partnerships have been forged between public and private entities. These are examples of positive clean water outcomes based on the last study.

However, that has been 14 years, and as Mike Hawkins, DNR fisheries biologist notes, it's kind of like people getting a regular check-up. "When we don't feel good or just need some health advice, we go to the doctor's office for tests, a diagnosis and a treatment plan. It's been 14 years since the Iowa Great Lakes has been in to see the doctor. It's time for a check-up."

The new study is entitled "A Vision Toward a More Resilient Iowa Great Lakes: Proposed Monitoring to Support Watershed Planning." Spearheading the 2020 study will be Keith Schilling, Ph.D., Iowa Geological Survey. Co-planners include Nathan Young, Ph.D., IIHR, University of Iowa; Corey Markfort, Ph.D., College of Engineering, University of Iowa; Chris Jones, Ph.D., IIHR, University of Iowa; Larry Weber, IIHR, University of Iowa.

The major endpoint will be to develop a watershed model to quantify and assess lake and watershed management decisions. In other words, the researchers will look at past successes, identified gaps and potential improvements. This comprehensive report will cover ground water monitoring, stream and lake gauging, surface water quality monitoring, in-lake hydrodynamics and water quality.

From this report, the goal is for the community and watershed partners to use all of this new analysis and modeling to update the Iowa Great Lakes Watershed Management Plan. An updated plan would aid conservation partners and the community in project prioritization and land use planning, guiding local decision making for years to come.

The hope is that funding will be secured this fall and work will begin this fall with two calendar years of monitoring (2021-2022). During this time, quarterly meetings and local presentations will be given to share updates.

Hawkins, reflects, "It's a good time for another diagnostic study to look at the history to see how we got here, the progress that has been made and the chance to look at updated problems."

Ribbon Cutting And Dedication Of The State Pier At Arnolds Park

to announce the completion of the State Pier at Arnolds Park and will celebrate this accomplishment with a ribbon cutting ceremony, as well as a formal dedication and renaming of this property in honor of the late Berkley Bedell, on September 5, at 11:30am.

The State Pier renovation project has created a dynamic plaza space where we see many tourists and locals already congregating to enjoy the area sights and sounds around this spot. This 5,500 square foot pedestrian plaza features a large fountain and reflecting pool below three stainless steel sail sculptures, precast concrete benches/amphitheater seating, landscape beds, and decorative donor paving surrounded by a custom LED hand rail. Dramatic lighting on the sails and fountain create a visible landmark that coordinates with the arches of the Promenade. The plaza itself is a compass, oriented North/South, with a North Arrow and a map of the Iowa Great Lakes as decorative elements in the paving.

Earlier this spring, the Imagine Board of Directors worked with the DNR and the HAPI Board of Directors to rename and dedicate this property as the Berkley Bedell State Pier. On August 13th, 2020, the DNR approved this request. Berkley passed away on December 7, 2019, at the age of 98. Berk was a hardworking, kind, and compassionate man and dedicated his life to actively make a difference. And making a difference is just exactly what he did.

In 1999, Arnolds Park was purchased by a real estate developer and was slated to be demolished and replaced with

multi-family housing. Berkley lead the effort to save the Park and served as Co-Chair of the Save the Park campaign. Through his efforts working with dedicated volunteers, elected officials and community members, \$7.25 Million was raised. This was enough to buy the land back, keep it a public space, and preserve

one of Iowa's most beloved attractions along the shores of Okoboji.

After attending the state university (ISU today), Berkley served in the Army Air Corps as a flight instructor. In 1945 Berk returned to Spirit Lake to start Berkley and Company, the focus of the business was cable wire leaders. The business he started in his parent's basement grew over the next four decades becoming a multi-million-dollar global fishing industry business that operates in every state in the U.S., and abroad in 19 countries, with 1,134 employees speaking 28 languages. Berkley made significant and long-lasting contributions to the fishing industry while creating hundreds of jobs in his hometown of Spirit Lake, Iowa.

Today, the company Berk started in 1945 is known as Pure Fishing and continues his work on conservation efforts through the Berkley Conservation Institute, which is part of Pure Fishing. Initiatives of the BCI include water quality, climate change, fisheries management, the future of fishing, recycling, and con-

servation implementation partnerships.

Later in life, Berkley had a desire to make the Iowa Great Lakes a better place and leave a legacy. This desire led to the creation of the Okoboji Foundation, a community foundation to support non-profits in the region. In 2000, Berkley garnered pledges from about 20 families and today, the Okoboji Foundation is stronger than ever and has granted \$4.1 million to projects that focus on lake quality, environment, outdoor experiences, recreation, and arts and culture. Throughout the years of building the foundation, Berkley was always present as a leader and mentor, continually challenging board members to do more and work together to accomplish their goals and build the endowment.

"We can think of no one more deserving of this honor than Berkley Bedell, who gave so much to not only our Iowa Great Lakes community, but, also to the people, one by one," said Michele Goodenow, Executive Director of Imagine Iowa Great Lakes.

Crazy Covid-College Football Week

I didn't write my View From The Bench last week because I knew the landscape of college football was rapidly changing with rumors of no college season at all swirling around on Monday. It looked like everything would be canceled, but then many college athletes, coaches and parents spoke up and appeared to gain some momentum to saving a season. When the dust settled on Tuesday night the B1G and Pac 12 had postponed their seasons to the spring while the ACC, the Big 12 and the SEC all pushed ahead with plans to play 10 game seasons starting in mid-September. As of Monday, Ohio State quarterback Justin Fields was trying to rally support to playing their season and had over 220,000 signatures on a petition; a group of football parents from Iowa, Ohio State and Penn State have also sent letters to B1G Commissioner Kevin Warren asking for a meeting to air their concerns about the decision making process to postpone the season.

While I certainly don't have the answers for whether there should be a football season or not, I do find it somewhat hypocritical of the conferences who are canceling due to "player safety" for several reasons. The first is that many of these institutions and conferences are welcoming back tens of thousands of students to their campus for on-campus classes and learning. If they don't feel that athletes are safe with the rigorous testing and tracking protocols in place within the athletic departments, how do they think it's safe to turn these athletes loose on campus? It appears that many of the athletic departments have done a great job with testing and keeping their players safe, as you have not heard of as many positive tests recently like you did when the athletes first came back to campus. These athletes were adhering to the policies for the hopes of being able to compete this fall, and now that those hopes are gone at the many colleges, will these athletes be disciplined enough to continue following these protocols when their seasons are not being played?

The second issue I have with these schools who canceled/ postponed their seasons citing player safety is that many of them are going to try and play a spring season. Football is by far and away the most physically demanding sport there is; how do these experts who are concerned about "player safety" expect a college athlete to play 6-10 games this spring and then turn around and play a regular season (let's hope) in the fall of 2021 with what will probably be only a month off? How can you say you are worried about your athletes' health and then expect them to play back to back seasons? I do also snicker at the player safety reason when discussing football and all the other safety issues that could be discussed with this very physical sport.

The one thing that we've learned during the COVID-19 pandemic is that we really don't know what the future holds. To be completely honest, the most honest answer you can give when asked about anything in the future right now is "I don't know". I do like the approach that the ACC, Big 12 and SEC are taking in planning to have a season while knowing that there will be issues along the way. I also like how the Big 12, along with the obvious conferring with scientists and doctors, also visited with two player representatives from each team to get their input. The latest protocol that I heard the Big 12 will put in place involves three straight days of testing leading up to every game; to me that sounds like a pretty safe way to get these players on the field in a safe environment, as well as being much safer than what those athletes who are on campus and not playing will be dealing with.

Suicide Prevention Program Remains Available Virtually

Iowa's rural communities and families are still coping with the uncertainty, stress and imposed isolation produced by the COVID-19 pandemic. Financial worries and unpredictable commodity prices also continue to contribute to anxiety in the agriculture industry.

In response to this ongoing impact, Iowa State University Extension and Outreach is offering weekly, online "Question. Persuade. Refer." (QPR) programs, said David Brown, behavioral health specialist with Iowa State University Extension

QPR is a suicide prevention program that teaches participants three steps to help save a life from suicide.

"Just as people trained in CPR and the Heimlich maneuver help save thousands of lives each year, people trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade and refer someone to help," Brown explained.

ISU Extension and Outreach is offering QPR every Tuesday from 12:00 to 1:00pm, July 21 through October 27. Each program will last for one hour.

Agribusiness professionals, agriculture lenders and bankers, veterinarians, vet techs, commodity group members, producers, social service professionals and other concerned individuals can register at no cost for any of these programs.





Research director RD tells us today is Bad Poetry Day and offers a glaring example from a genius: "Celery raw develops the jaw, but celery stewed is more quietly chewed." Good or bad, the lines belong to Ogden Nash, who was born on August 19,1902, and is known for his

light verse and short rhymes. The song that serves up the crispy veggie, *The Celery Stalks at Midnight*, was written by Carl Sigman, George Harris, and Will Bradley and released by Doris Day with Les Brown and His Orchestra, in 1941..

Today is also Serendipity Day. The term means "a pleasant surprise," for which RD suggests an *Orange Colored Sky*, as offered up by Nat 'King' Cole, in three versions. *OCSky* was written by Milton Delugg and Willie Stein. And the most famous of Nat's versions was recorded with *The Stan Kenton Orchestra* in August,1950, for Capitol Records. The lyrics say, "I was walking along, minding my business, when out of an orange-colored sky, flash, bam, alakazam, wonderful you came by...'

A 1960's American folk group, *The Serendipity Singers*, had a sound not unlike that of *The New Christy Minstrels*. Their debut single, *Don't Let the Rain Come Down*, was a Top Ten hit and garnered the group's only Grammy nomination. Another of the group's hits, Beans In My Ears, was written by Pete Seeger.

Saturday is Be An Angel Day, calling for the jazz standard Angel Eyes, composed in 1946 by Matt Dennis with lyrics by Earl Brent. Seven years later Dennis not only sang Angel Eyes in a motion picture, but accompanied himself on piano as well. Through the decades, other popular renditions were released by Ella Fitzgerald, who recorded it at least 4 times; The Dave Brubeck Quartet, which used the tune as the title track of their 1966

LP; and jazz vocalist Karrin Allyson, on her 2002 CD, In Blue...

Sidebar: Along with his writing partner, lyricist Tom Adair, Dennis was the composer of "Ballads, Blues and Big Bands, Too," which was recorded by Frank Sinatra, Jr. and Pat Longo's Super Big Band on the LP and CD, "Billy May For President." Nancy Wilson used the song as the title of a three CD compilation. And Longo's version was the theme for Class 105...

Actor, dancer, singer, and director Gene Kelly was born in Pittsburgh, on August 23,

1912. Kelly starred in the 1951 MGM musical An American in Paris, along with Leslie Caron. AAiP was nominated for eight academy awards, and won six, including Best Picture. George and Ira Gershwin penned all the music, which included some of their most well-known efforts, *Embraceable You*, *Nice Work If You Can Get It*, and the Kelly/ Caron duet, Love Is Here To Stay..







The Dickinson County Nature Center is excited to announce that Dee's Bee & Butterfly Festival is set for September.

"Although this year will not be the same as previous years, I am excited to keep the tradition of celebrating our pollinators alive through this modified event," said Bryanna Kuhlman, environmental education coordinator.

this year's event will be spread out over four days. Families are asked to sign up for a time slot when they would like to attend the event: 4-5 p.m., 5:15-6:15 p.m. or 6:30-7:30 p.m. Sept. 1-4. Simply go to Signup Genius, https://www. signupgenius.com/go/10C0D-4DACA922A1FFCE9-beeand

During Dee's Bee & Butterfly Festival, participants will be able to visit several stations — a self-guided storybook walk, a photo opportunity with Sweetie the Bee and the ever-popular monarch tagging area.

Tagged monarchs will be released on their migration to overwinter in Mexico, a part of the University of Kansas Monarch Watch program. Those who tag a monarch will receive a certificate with their monarch's gender and tag number, and they can check next spring to see if their monarch is collected by Monarch Watch citizen scientists.

"We are excited to continue to offer our monarch tagging program that families look forward to all year," said naturalist Ashley Hansen.

Participants will also receive an activity bag to take home filled with supplies for bee and butterfly crafts as well as a honey stick.

Dee's Bee & Butterfly Festival will be held outside the Dickinson County Nature Center in Kenue Park, and participants can enjoy the beautiful area while they go through the event stations, as only one group per station at a time is requested. Families may even bring food and drinks to enjoy in the park during their time slot.

"Enjoy your time outside learning about the importance of bees and butterflies," Kuhlman said.

To keep staff, volunteers and festival-goers safe, safety precautions will be implemented. Participants may wear masks if they choose, but all festival hosts will be wearing masks. There will also be hand sanitizer available at each station.

Wills and Jones Encourage Students to Apply for Legislative Page Program







Free Sports Injury Clinics, On-Site Game Coverage Included in Care Fall sports are an exciting time for the entire community, and local sports specialists want to ensure it's a safe one for the athletes themselves. Local medical professionals collectively comprising Sports Medicine Northwest are providing care for area athletes in various ways. Orthopedic surgeons from Northwest Iowa Bone, Joint & Sports Surgeons, a Certified Athletic Trainer, and Physical Therapists from Lakes Regional Healthcare (LRH) are offering a free Sports Injury Clinic and

The free Sports Injury Clinic will be held every Saturday at 9 am or by appointment August 29 through October 10. Located within Northwest Iowa Bone, Joint & Sports Surgeons' Spirit Lake office, the clinic is offered free of charge to area middle and high school athletes. To attend the clinic, enter Lakes Regional Healthcare through the east entrance. Appointments and physician referrals are not necessary to utilize the clinic. However, a parent or guardian must accompany athletes under age 18. Therapists will review the injury and orthopedic surgeons will be available to provide further evaluation and specify treatment if needed. A free screening x-ray is also provided if warranted. Any follow-up appointments, further radiology tests such as CT scans or MRIs, or supplies such as casts, braces, or splints are charged to health insurance. Where is everyone in this corona virus time? They are on the bike trails. You can keep yourself 6 feet away from other people. There are some new trails. One is along highway 86 on the west side of West Okoboji. There is a new one by our home at the Landings. It follows 155th Street along Cutty's, Tree Tops and two homes. It then turns north on Percival Drive. There are new trails further along the north side of West Okoboji and past Iowa Methodist Campground. They are new and now finished. They go from 151st Street to 155th Street on the Northeast side of West Okoboji.

I have been picking up litter along the .3 mile stretch. I am asking you to stop throwing litter on the trails or driving by and throwing litter. It has helped me to lose a few pounds for my TOPS Club, and I also like riding the trail on my 3-wheel tricycle. I see walkers, bike riders, dog walkers, runners, and even a woman carrying her baby, another woman pushing a stroller, a family wheeling a wheelchair, plus children on their skate boards and scooters; however, after getting 15 pails or bags of litter I want to be done. Do not leave cigarette butts on the trail, beer bottles, fire crackers, pop and water bottles, candy wrappers, and misc. items. We ask you to ride, wave, and smile. A stick on the trails can cause a bike accident. The 155th Street trails is tree lined. The Dickinson County Trails Association will be putting up a stop station on 155th Street with a bench saying In Honor of Stan Lemkuil -- Happy Trails to you. Stan rode the Sheriff Bike Patrol for 17 years. The trail is fast and fun and we hope to see you there, but I hope I am not picking up your litter.

There is a bike ride scheduled for September 26th that has not been called off yet. ...hope to see you on that ride.

Join The Creative Writing Laboratory


Whether you are a novice or experienced writer, or an elementary student, teen or adult, the public is invited to join the Creative Writing Laboratory, a collaboration between author Kartika Budhwar and Iowa Lakeside Laboratory.

The Creative Writing Lab kicks off this August with weekly writing prompts and short videos. It is free, online and can be accessed through Iowa Lakeside Laboratory's Facebook and Instagram pages and You Tube channel. In the future it will be available under Budhwar's website, currently under development.

"This is the perfect way to start if you have never written before. If you have published ten books this is a great way for you to continue writing" says Budhwar.

No registration is required. Participants just click on the links and get started. "All you need to do is commit at least seven minutes a day once or several times a week. In just seven minutes you will be surprised with what beautiful pieces you can write. Do it for yourself first!"

Writing prompts will be posted on Tuesday through Friday. "The prompts are a good way to get started and bring yourself to the page. People should have notebook, paper pen or pencil in hand."



During the prompts and videos, Budhwar will model her writing methods. When it is time to put the pen to the page, she says "I will be writing with you!" Teachers can also collaborate with the Creative Writing Laboratory. "I will be happy to

assist teachers with prompts and working with their students," says Budhwar. The writing prompts and videos will each be numbered, but do not need to be followed

in any order. Participants can join any day or time of the week, even after the Creative Writing Laboratory is well underway.

The Creative Writing Laboratory was inspired both by Budhwar's passion for writing and the times we are living in. "The Pandemic has forced so many of us to isolate from one another. It is so important now to reach inside and find deep connections between ourselves and others - writing helps us do that. As a working writer, I know so much of my self-care and way I cope with the world is through writing, and I really hope to share that with everyone.'

Budhwar is a recent graduate of Iowa State University's MFA program in Creative Writing and the Environment. In 2018 she was a Writer in Residence at Iowa Lakeside Laboratory, sponsored by the Friends of Lakeside Lab, Lakeside's valued partner and nonprofit community support organization. She holds an additional MFA degree in Creative Writing from North Carolina State University. She has received the Albert L. Walker Excellence in Literature Award (2020), the Graduate Research Excellence Award (2020), the Hogrefe Grant for Creative Writers (2018, 2019) and the Graduate Teaching Excellence Award (2018). She was awarded Second place in the Arts and Letters Fiction Prize (2019), the Blue Mesa Nonfiction Prize (2019), and the Indiana Review Fiction Prize (2018); her writing appears in the same journals. She was also a Finalist for the Frank McCourt Memoir Prize (2019). She is currently a Senior Editor for The South Asian Avant-Garde (SAAG) Anthology. You can reach her at kartikabudhwar@gmail.com.
