

Class of 2020 gets a send off

Graduation delayed by pandemic concerns

On Sunday, July 26th, the Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School held its 102nd Commencement Exercises. The delay, of course, was due to concerns with the COVID-19 pandemic. To have one's senior year end abruptly in March was certainly not foreseen and then to have a "virtual" Commencement seemed to be a poor ending to an otherwise excellent scholastic education experience. Through conversations with students, parents, administration, Board of Education members and faculty it was generally agreed that it was necessary to hold an "in person" ceremony to celebrate the achievements of the Class

A plan was constructed that would respect the traditions of high school graduations and simultaneously follow the guidelines of the CDC for limiting exposure to the Novel Coronavirus:

- 1) The ceremony will be closed to the public; attendance by invitation only.
- 2) Each graduate will be allowed only 4 tickets for family members.
- 3) Graduates and attendees will be socially distanced and all are encouraged to wear face masks.
- 4) Pre-ceremony gatherings will be discouraged. Class of 2020 will assemble in the Mauk Auditorium and will be socially distanced. A group photo will be taken at that time and it will done quickly to minimize close contact.
- 5) Faculty will be seated at the rear of the Class of 2020 and will be socially distanced.
- 6) Dignitaries on the podium will be minimized.
- 7) Handing out of diplomas will be done by one individual and handshakes, etc. will be eliminated.
- 8) After completion of the ceremony, graduates will leave the site accompanied by their family members and will exit the building as a group and depart. Social gatherings, photos, etc. will be done off campus.



Wisconsin partners produce new Road America wines





All in the family for 65 years

Wiese family instrumental in growing Quit Qui Oc Golf Course

For three generations, one of Elkhart Lake's most prized recreational resources has grown under the stewardship of the same family.

This year, the Wiese family celebrates 65 years in the business of providing fun, recreation and a great social outlet at Quit Qui Oc Golf Course.

Over those years, their focus has remained the same—they try to make the club feel like a home for others.

"It's a great place we all have to enjoy here in Elkhart Lake. We still want Quit Qui Oc to be a place where anyone feels comfortable, like it's their second home," owner Rachel Wiese Montaba said.

"It doesn't matter what you do or where you are from. People who come here to play golf or enjoy our other amenities are all considered friends."

Rachel, the granddaughter of Carl and Edna Wiese, and her husband Todd, are the current owners and golf professionals at Quit Qui Oc Golf Club. They know how to share hospitality to their extended family and friends at Quit Qui Oc, because they have experienced it firsthand.

Rachel grew up at Quit Qui Oc, playing golf and working during the ownership tenure of her parents, Tom and Lynn Wiese, as did her brother, Adam and sister Anna.

She went off to school to become a teacher, but like her father before her, she gravitated back to Quit Qui Oc in 1996. The former University of Wisconsin standout golfer enrolled in the LPGA membership apprenticeship program, and today holds a full Class A teaching membership as an LPGA professional.

Fell in love with course, people

Todd came up through ranks a bit differently, getting hired as the assistant pro by Tom Wiese in 1991. The Ozaukee native had intentions, but soon found Elkhart Lake and Quit Qui Oc captivating.

"I fell in love with Quit Qui Oc, the people and the customers in the area. I really never wanted to leave after that," Montaba said.

As head pro Tom Wiese was moving into the presidency of the Wisconsin PGA, Todd took over the daily operations.

"When I got here, I worked a lot with Rachel and her brother. We partnered well in the daily operations and spent a lot of time together," he said.

For Rachel and Todd, the special friendship turned into a dating relationship and eventually a marriage in 1998.

"We have been best friends all the way through this. We have a lot in common and common goals," Todd said. And neither has to tell the other about their day at the end of the work day. They have already lived it together.

Common family thread

For Todd and Rachel, the common thread in the Wiese family history at Quit Qui Oc dwells on that feeling of making the golf course and the restaurant a fun place to be and a place people always want to come back to.

It dates back to when her grandparents took on the reins of the golf course back in 1955—when it was still just a nine hole

Starting as the grounds keeper, Tom Wiese moved into a position of managing the course after his father passed away in 1977.

Tom went on to take the PGA instructional program, earning his PGA membership as he ran the inside operation of

A long-time Wisconsin PGA Board member, he served as the organization's president in 1995-96.

Prior to his retirement in 2010, Tom Wiese was recognized on three separate occasions with the Horton Smith award for golf education.

Tom's wife, Lynn, held the position of

office manager for many of the years he managed the course.

"Tom and Lynn are both still actively involved in consulting and special projects at Quit Qui Oc," Todd said. "They are still wonderful advisors for us."

Emphasis on juniors

Rachel recalls that her grandfather made it a point to emphasize junior golf, something her family continues to hold in the forefront.

"Grandpa was big on junior golf, and he made it affordable for young golfers to come out and play," she said.

"We have tried to continue that."

Today, Quit Qui Oc offers three unique programs for junior golfers, including junior lessons, a prep league, and a PGA junior league.

"We have a number of players who have grown up here, played here and done well in competitive golf. Many have gone on to play at State," Rachel said.

Todd and Rachel continue to carry Tom's emphasis on teaching forward into today's business.

Both are trained professional instructors, and both offer lessons, along with a variety of class opportunities.

Accessibility to golf is also a critical focus for the Quit Qui Oc owners.

"We have really tried to be welcoming to everyone," Rachel said. Quit Qui Oc has made a point to expand its programming and league opportunities for women golfers."

Playability of course

Due to its timeless design, Quit Qui Oc continues to get high marks for its playability.

"We have been rated highly as a 'beginner friendly' golf course," Todd said. "Any of the improvements we have done over the years have only been done to maintain and improve the integrity of the golf course—helping to keep it playable for all levels of golfers."

"That's unique in today's golf world. A

lot of courses are being built too long and too hard," he said. "Our layout hasn't been compromised by time. You still have to hit good shots to score, but it remains fun for the average player."

Through the years, Quit Qui Oc has made some significant changes.

The back nine has seen many of those changes, with the old #10 par three being replaced with #14. In 2000, the 16th hole was converted from a par 3 to a par 4, and hole 17 was revamped for safety and redesign purposes.

A third nine, known as the Glacial Nine, was opened in 2001, including a new practice range and teaching facility.

Business modeling

In a large sense, the traditions established by Carl and Edna Wiese, carried on through Tom and Lynn, have been the traditions that Todd and Rachel adhere to.

"We love coming to work," Rachel said.

"We have the good fortune of being in the business of helping other people enjoy their lives. To us, like our family before us, it's all about building a community of people that are welcoming to all walks of life—and having a good time with whatever they choose to do at Quit Qui Oc."

Rachel and Todd have ingrained that same philosophy in a trusted staff that also shares their style of hospitality. "It's something we do as a group," she said. "It's important for us to learn people's names and make them feel welcome here."

Beyond golf activities, patrons at Quit Qui Oc can enjoy dining at the restaurant, playing cards, Mahjong or other activities.


"We try to tie all that together to make this a community of fun and leisure time activities. Golf just happens to be one of those activities," Rachel said.

Todd added that many of the events at Quit Qui Oc are built around having a good time or socialization afterwards. Again, that is a continuance of traditions that began with previous members of the Wiese family.

Wolf Motorsports grows over decade

Wolf Motorsports is celebrating its 10 year anniversary this year.

But, the celebration of the spirit that founded business runs much deeper for owner Bart Wolf.

His love of racing and cars celebrates a 40 year anniversary this season, dating back to when he was just seven years old.

Wolf started his connections with racing back then, and he has turned that love into a lifelong passion and the emergence of his successful business ventures.

"They say if you love what you do, you never have to work another day in your life. I am fortunate to be involved in something that our whole team is passionate about and loves doing," Wolf said.

Both his career and his connections to Elkhart Lake are lifelong. Wolf's grandfather, Harold, ran an excavating business in the area. His father, Mike, has served on the village board. Together the family operated a Chrysler-Jeep dealership in the area. Bart's connections with the automotive business run that deeply. So do his connections with Road America.

The Wolf Motorsports Team has carved out of winning reputation, supporting cars and drivers not only at Road America but at nationwide racing venues.

"We have been fortunate to compete at some of the really great tracks around the country, including Daytona and Sebring," he said.

Wolf Motorsports is involved in a wide range of racing circuits, including vintage races, IMSA and Sports Car Club of America

Two years ago, Wolf competed in the Mazda Prototype Challenge and battled for the championship, holding the lead in the race with just 17 minutes to go.

An unfortunate bump out bounced them to second, but the result was an impressive statement about the team. "We are fortunate to have such a great group of employees who form our team and were able to challenge for a championship," Wolf said.

Services offered to drivers

The successful approach of the Wolf Motorsports team resonates with other drivers who contract their services at the track. Wolf Motorsports provides drivers with track support and testing services.

During July's WeatherTech International Challenge with Brian Redman, the Wolf Motorsports tent was responsible for running 11 cars.

"When these drivers are able to break away for racing, they just want to focus on driving. We allow them to arrive with their helmet, and we provide everything else."

Parallels for community

In the same way that Wolf Motorsports takes care of high end race drivers and their cars at the track, they also offer great services to every day car owners and drivers in the community.

The Wolf Car Care Division is housed at Wolf Motorsports Villas on Highway 67 near the south entrance to Elkhart Lake.

There, the same team of mechanics that competes for high level racing championships brings its passion for performance to maintaining every day vehicles.

"At Wolf Car Care, we do work on minivans, sedans and all sorts of every day cars," Wolf said.







"Our goal is to provide excellence in cost effective service and repairs for the people of this area," he said. "It's a natural marriage for our staff, given their passion for all things mechanical and their great attention to detail. Our team is the guys that are working on cars on the front lines. They understand what it takes to keep vehicles performing properly."

Wolf Car Care also provides work on custom and performance cars. "We also have a couple of team members who are particularly sharp with carburetors, which no one seems to work on any more," he said.

Wolf Power Sports

A relatively new division of the Wolf team's efforts is known as Wolf Power Sports.

"We saw that there was a definite void in the market for doing repairs on power equipment," Wolf said.

Wolf Power Sports can handle repairs and tweaking on just about any form of power equipment, ranging from motorcycles, to ATV's, jet skis, golf cart and snowmobiles.

As a Parts Unlimited vendor, Wolf Motorsports has access to a wide range of after market parts for all the power sports industry stuff.

Positive growth with village

One of the most visible projects for Bart Wolf and Wolf Motorsports has been the successful venture into the Motorsport Villas of Elkhart Lake complex, completed in 2018.

For Bart Wolf, the vision to undertake such a project started when he saw local resorts beginning to sell out their garage space.

The idea took off like wildfire.

He had faith in the concept from seeing how it worked in larger communities, then used that vision to sell the idea to the village board.

Within four and a half months, he had already sold 35 of the 36 units.

"The village was great to work with," he said, as the Elkhart Lake Village Board found ways to support infrastructure development through tax incremental financing.

"From the start, I knew we had to build this project with great care and esthetics. At that time the new firehouse was at the south entrance of the town and we had to do an equally attractive building for the community," he said.

The union between the developer and the village paid off, as Motorsports Villas of Elkhart Lake added about \$12 million to the tax roll.

But Wolf is equally proud of one other connection to the village—the people connection.

"All of our employees are local," he said. Three of the five have graduated from Elkhart Lake Glenbeulah High School. "So have a few of our weekend warriors," he said, speaking of those who work other jobs but join the team for race weekends.

"It's really neat to have a group of people mostly born and raised in Elkhart Lake that can compete on an international level and do extremely well," he said. "It shows you don't have to be from Indy or Europe to find your way to the top of the game."

Honors system

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School has abandoned the traditional Valedictorian/Salutatorian designations for graduating seniors in favor of the Laude

Typically, the Laude System recognizes three levels of honor graduation: Cum Laude (with praise), Magna Cum Laude (with great honor) and Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor).

The laude score is based on a formula in which students are rewarded for taking classes with higher rigor. The program is based on a two tier system: tier 1 worth 1 point per semester awarded to transcripted and AP courses, and tier 2 worth .5 points per semester awarded to continued from page 1

Cum Laude - 7 to 10.5 points; Magna Cum Laude - 11 to 14.5; and Summa Cum Laude - Greater than 15 points. A minimum GPA of 3.25/4.00 is needed in order for a student to be recognized in the laude system.



Ground breaking held

Work begins on Kohler Marsh Education Center project

It was a beautiful summer afternoon at the Broughton Sheboygan County Marsh Park on July 29 and the Friends of the Sheboygan Marsh were happy to host many of the major donors, dignitaries and supporters who came to participate in the groundbreaking ceremony for the long-awaited multi-purpose, environmental educational facility.

Trees have already been harvested and the site cleared in preparation for construction to commence. Joseph Schmitt Construction is the general contractor overseeing the project, which includes generous donations of numerous subcontractors providing labor and materials to supplement funds raised to complete construction. Sheboygan County which will benefit long-term from the new asset in the park is providing work and funds for the infrastructure, as well as the restroom/shower facility which will service the campgrounds and be contained in one wing of the building. Meeting facilities will be available for use by local community groups. YMCA Camp Y-Koda's environmental educational classes have outgrown the semi-trailer, and the building will be used as their classroom to meet the needs of approximately 1,500 students annually involved in their educational classes, as well as students who visit on field trips from countless schools in Sheboygan and adjacent counties.

The program included recognition and a few words from many who were heavily involved in developing the concepts for the structure and then the fundraising to make it happen, prior to the ceremony involving many of them putting the first shovels in the dirt.

Lil Pipping, President of the Friends of the Marsh is credited with spearheading the first project wherein the observation tower on the north end of the marsh was built in 2006 with funds raised from donors by the Friends of the Marsh, a nonprofit organization whose primary goal is to promote the marsh and knowledge thereof. Shortly after the dedication of the tower, the Friends began brainstorming about what else they could do to further enhance the Sheboygan Marsh. The trailer Sargento Foods had so generously donated decades earlier no longer met the needs of its users, and a conceptual plan was created of a structure for multipurpose use to replace it.

Lil Pipping told the story very well. "In 2011 we got an anonymous donation for \$25,000 to start planning the project. In December of 2013 Sheboygan County Board gave the go-ahead, and in March of 2014 we retained Joseph Schmitt Construction who had built the observation tower. Early in 2015 Kohler Company Stewardship division approached us to work with us on this project and the rest is history. As with the Tower, we've appreciated donations from as little as a few dollars upwards to multiple digits. People have fond memories of the marsh from their younger years and we so appreciate and welcome them to be a part of this project. There is ongoing opportunity for a few step plaques on the tower and generous donors large and small will be acknowledged in the new educational building as well that will be enjoyed for generations to come."

Naming rights are being assigned to the major donors for various components of the building, based on donation size and



their preference. The Kohler Company has chosen "Kohler Center for Marsh Education" as the name for the structure.

Laura Kohler, senior vice president at Kohler Company shared a few words with attendees. "We are proud to support The Friends of the Sheboygan Marsh in their efforts to promote the environment and conservation through education, handson activities and advocacy." She went on to commend the Friends in not only their hard work and several years of fundraising, but for incorporating principles of conservation and sustainability into the building's design and construction. "That alone will teach very important lessons to

our next generation" she remarked.

Infrastructure work is underway and construction of the building will soon commence. It is anticipated dedication of the Kohler Center for Marsh Education will take place in June of 2021. If you haven't visited the Sheboygan Marsh Park recently, we welcome you to come out, climb the tower, and watch the building's creation at the other end of the park. A big thank you to all who have already donated to this project, and we welcome ongoing donations to sustain educational programs for the future. ELIA works with county

Recently the Sheboygan County Office of Planning and Conservation took the next step in the effort to remediate the discharge of phosphorous nutrients into Elkhart Lake from the southwestern watershed area surrounding the lake. Sheboygan County and ELIA set up a phosphorous (P) filter on County A in the fall of 2017 to help reduce phosphorous and nutrient runoff.

Reducing the flow of sediments and nutrients into the lake is critical to gaining control over the increasing issue of weed growth and aquatic invasive speciescaused habitat destruction In the ensuing months following installation of the filter bed, the water sample testing did not produce consistent results and questions arose about the efficacy of the material selected for use as the filter media. With the help of CBC Engineers out of Oconomowoc, a review of the filter design was done, and it was determined that the material used as media had become "cemented." The media was too small in diameter and was becoming impacted by the accumulation of sediment that was part of the water being processed through the filter system.

The media was becoming a solidified mass and needed to be replaced.

Eric Fehlhaber, project leader from the county, Todd Weik from CBC Engineers, and their teams worked though the replacement options and selected blast furnace, specially treated slag which was 34" in average size, and considerably larger than the fine material initially selected.

The present P filter is set on relatively level ground, so the points of water entering the filter and then exiting are quite close topographically. Ideally, there would be more pitch to the installation so we would have gravity helping move water through, but this was the only site that was offered for the installation. We appreciate John Jens for his interest in helping provide a solution for phosphorous remediation by offering the land allocation for the sitting of the P filter.

Water sampling will be done periodically over the coming months from the updated filter system. If the hoped-for results materialize, we look forward to adding to the system a flow meter so we can assess the actual volumes involved in what the filter is processing as well as determining the percent amount of phosphorous reduction that is taking place.

The area in which this filter is located is a critical part of the Elkhart Lake watershed. Along with the older septic systems along the southern lakeshore, this area needs to be studied further to see what additional remediation efforts can be made.





Victory Park making progress

Village Operations - Please Keep Elkhart Woodview/Kettleview Lake Safe - COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

Work is nearly completion on all the utilities for the Victory Park Development. Work will begin shortly on building the base of the roads. We are also expecting construction on homes to begin within the next month. Take a look at the aerial progress from the beginning until the end of July. Court Road Issues

Our original plan was to complete a regrind and overlay of both Kettleview and Woodview Courts. We ran into some unexpected issues and are not only able to complete Woodview Court this year. I understand the frustration they has caused for residents of this area. We would have loved to have both roads fixed this year. The issue on Woodview was when we ground the old pavement off on Woodview Court "soft spots" were found. This means that in some areas we cannot just repave the road we need to fix these issues. The County provided an estimate of an additional \$20,000 to fix these issues on Woodview Court. We would expect the same issues on Kettleview Court, which would mean this road project would be greatly over budget. As we do not have this extra money in the budget, we had to cut Kettleview Court for the year. We are working on budgets for 2021 and it will be put in the budget with extra money now that we know this is a problem.

Absentee Voting for November

We are encouraging everyone to absentee vote for the November election. If you have been hearing the news stories about the delays related to the US Postal Service, we have noticed that the time to mail an absentee ballot has increased in the last few months. Please allow at least a week for the ballot to go each way. You can request a ballot very easily on https:// myvote.wi.gov/en-us/.

If you do not have access to the internet or cannot get the website to work, please call the Village offices (920-876-2122) and request an absentee request form. You will need to provide that form and a copy of your photo ID to our office. We anticipate the ballots going out in mid- to late September. The Wisconsin Elections Commission will also be sending out a form to request an absentee ballot in the first week in September. You can always fill this form out and send it back.

We have to mail an absentee ballot, but if you want to ensure we receive your ballot on time you can always drop it off at the Village offices.

In-person absentee voting for the November 3 election will begin 2 weeks before the election.

Someone is available from 7 am until 2 am EST, 7 days a week.

Census workers will be coming doorto-door to your residence if you have not yet responded. Census takers will wear masks and follow local public health guidelines when they visit your home. If someone visits your home this vear to collect information for the 2020 Census, check to make sure they have a valid ID badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date. Census workers may also carry Census Bureau bags and other equipment with the Census Bureau logo. Census takers may also deliver a paper questionnaire




