How to donate blood

A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are reguired at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger

also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Important COVID-19 information for donors The Red Cross

is testing blood,

platelet and plasma donations for COVID-19 antibodies. The test may indicate if the donor's immune system has produced antibodies to this coronavirus, regardless of whether they developed symptoms. Red Cross antibody tests will be helpful to identify individuals who have COVID-19 antibodies and may qualify to be convalescent plasma donors. Convalescent plasma is a type of blood donation collected from COVID-19 survivors that have antibodies that may help patients who are actively fighting the virus. Donors can expect to receive the results of their antibody test within 7 to 10 days through the Red Cross Blood Donor App or the donor portal at RedCross-Blood.org.

The Red Cross is not testing donors to diagnose illness, referred to as a diagnostic test.

Each Red Cross blood drive and donation center follows the highest standards of safety and infection control including temperature checks, social distancing and face coverings for donors and staff have been implemented to help protect the health of all those in attendance. Donors are asked to schedule an appointment prior to arriving at the drive and are required to wear a face covering or mask.

Hill City four-way stop to be installed | Funds come up short for Aitkin park Crash rate at intersection exceeds averages



Tiny's Lunch was once a Hill City landmark. With today's traffic, stopsigns are needed are Hwy. 169 entering Hill City from the south.

MnDOT will install a fourway stop at the intersection of Hwy. 169 and 200 in HIII City.

Christian Lewian, assistant traffic engineer for District 1, hosted an online meeting on August 19 to discuss the project.

"This intersection is seeing 1.31 crashes per million entering vehicles; which is much higher than state average," reported Lewian. "The city has voiced concerns to MnDOT about the high rate of crashes

at the intersection. We plan to install the all-way stop this fall and MnDOT will continue to monitor the intersection for operations and safety."

The best alternative would be a \$3.9 million roundabout at that location but it is not in the budget, the engineer said. The \$30,000 all-way stop is safer than a two-way stop as it is there now. Traffic on Hwy. 169 goes through, with warnings, while traffic on both sides of Hwy. 169, on Hwy. 200, stops.

A question was asked from the audience about installing a traffic light. Lewian explained that traffic lights cause more crashes. "Traffic signals do quite the opposite. Lights increase both injury and fatal crashes. A traffic signal is not something we want to put in if we are concerned with safety."

"Our number one reason is safety. This intersection sees much higher crash rate than the rest of the state."

Stop ahead markings, stop lines and reflective stopsigns will draw attention to the new signs on Hwy. 169. Extra attention-getters will be in place for a year.

This new solution, of two added stopsigns, should reduce the crash rate by 60-70 percent. No turn lanes will be added.

Due to COVID-19, the Make Your Mark Support Your Park project in Aitkin is coming in overdue and over budget.

City Administrator Rose Beverly reported that a special meeting was held on August 19 where an approximate \$350,000 bid for the hockey rink/pickle ball court was accepted from Rice Lake Construction.

Although the bid was accepted, Beverly said in an interview about the meeting: "We'll be working with Rice Lake Construction to get the bid into an acceptable range that we can afford."

Due to delays from COVID 19, busyness of contractors and increased costs of materials, construction of a new warming house is on hold. Beverly said they will check into if a grant for the warming house can be extended or must be returned.

Although \$468,000 was raised for the park project, about \$146,000 is already spent on materials, engineering and architecture fees, said Beverly.

She hopes the hockey rink can get finished this fall so it can be used this winter. Then, they have another year or so to raise more funds for the warming house. "If we built everything now, about \$200,000 to \$250,000 would be a shortfall funded by the city's taxpayers and that is not fiscally responsible. We are hoping to raise more funds and build everything without taxpayers' money."

She said a temporary shed or other structure could be used for a warming house this coming winter.

Aitkin's proposed **City Park upgrades**

Phase 1: New hockey rink and warming house that is handicap-accessible. Hockey teams/ice skaters/ broomball players can use it during the winter and pickle ball players in the summer. There will be a new parking lot and a party room in the warming house that can be rented.

Phase 2: New and improved handicapped-accessible walking trails.

Phase 3: Revamped playground that is handicapped-accessible.

Phase 4: Improved trails and picnic areas throughout Tibbetts Trails and Park. This is vacant land now -- a former farm across the river from the current park.

About 197 people answered a 2018 survey from the City of Aitkin. Of those, about half visited the City Park 10 or more times a year.

The right thing in the City of Crosby

A couple years back, a friend who was damaged by the City of Crosby's assessment policies, asked if I would write about what happened and why after refunds were approved and the money was available, the City of Crosby did not do the right thing and failed in delivering the refunds.

Being in the early stages of fighting rampant police administration corruption, the information was not looked into and did not get off the ground. The information has been looked at and the Mayor who was thought to have dropped the ball, did not. The city of Crosby's special assessments did not meet requirements and they were found to be an unconstitutional taking. Some residents lost their property, others simply deeded their property to the city, or the bank ended up getting their property. The Mayor who started the process Rick Ferrari, left office, a council seat became open also, the city had a new Mayor and one new council person. This left three council members who went through the entire process and unanimously voted for two years to continue the process and refund the money.

The internal force to stop the process appears to be spearheaded by the city clerk's position who convinced the new Mayor with use of external sources, to create doubt and fear that the city could not

afford the refund when they actually could. The city was scared into thinking a refund would hurt their credit/bond rating which is suspect. Only one of the informed council members stood firm for the people, the rest caved to the fear doubt and voted to rescind the motions, the refunds failed.

Crosby leaders failed in doing the right thing for its residents with the refunds, failed in of doing the right thing by holding the perpetrators who violated data privacy laws accountable could financially hurt the residents.

With four "leaders" abandoning the city in the last two years, it is with hope the council left standing has the morals and the backbone to do the right thing for the residents



Alma was born September 29, 1942 in Brainerd to Leland "Pat" Arthur and Marie Helen (Kellerhuis) Laidlaw. She graduated from Aitkin High School in 1960, a member of the National Honor Society, the school band, and choir. She attended Macalester College in Saint Paul before returning home to marry Donald Roden in 1961. Together they helped her parents operate the Aitkin Surplus Store. Her parents owned the store for 17 years and they for 21 years beginning in 1966. They also operated Royal Clothing for 2 ½ years before liquidating in 1998. Her husband passed away in 1989. Alma married Noel Bailey in 1993. Noel taught and coached at Aitkin High School until his retirement in 1998. They loved traveling with their motor home for 5 years. They were able to visit 49 of the 50 states

until they found their favorite winter get-away on St. Simons Island, Georgia, where they spent numerous winters. Alma worked various jobs in the Aitkin area: Woodland Container, Aitkin Community Hospital, MLEC, ISD #1, and Grand Casino-Mille Lacs. She spent her time volunteering for Rides for Health, Meals on Wheels, Riverwood Health Care Auxiliary for 27 years and a volunteer scheduler for 12 years. She was an avid reader of books and newspaper, and in the past was reconnected with lost families as she read the different obituaries. She loved listening to the birds, especially the loons. She would sit on her porch and watch the birds nesting and feeding their little ones. She was almost always willing to try anything and was very adventurous.
