

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

I really enjoy seeing the mural at the southwest corner of Main and Chapel Streets in the Village of Mount Morris that reads "one nation indivisible". This is part of the original Pledge of Allegiance written by Francis Julius Bellamy of Mount Morris.

As an extremely patriotic American that is what I want most. During deliberations in the Second Continental Congress in the summer of 1787, the representatives from each state struggled to arrive at the content and the wording of our wonderful United States Constitution. Each state representative proposed wording which would best benefit the citizens of their individual states. After many days it was apparent that they were at an impasse. The wise elder statesman, Benjamin Franklin, addressed the convention on Thursday, June 28, 1787, with a suggestion: "I have lived, Sir, a long time and the longer I live, the more convincing proofs I see of this truth -- that God governs in the affairs of men... We shall be divided by our little partial local interests; our projects will be confounded, and we ourselves shall become a reproach and a bye word down to future age... I therefore beg leave to move -- that henceforth prayers imploring the assistance of Heaven, and its blessings on our deliberations, be held in this Assembly every morning before we proceed to business." This is just an excerpt of this significant speech.

The convention was adjourned to provide a time for the members to reflect and pray to God. When the members returned, the President of the Convention, George Washington, commented that the change in the members was nothing short of a miracle. As prayer was offered to God each day before any deliberations were undertaken, the members began to agree.

We owe their prayers to God for our wonderful constitution. Because some issues, such as slavery, were not addressed, it was eventually necessary to fight our terrible and bloody Civil War. Before the Civil War began, Abraham Lincoln, stated in his speech on Wednesday, June 16, 1858, "A house divided against itself, cannot stand." He recognized that a country in which severe divisions exist at its core cannot continue indefinitely.

You are probably asking what does this have to do with us now. As I have watched the impasse between the White House, the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate on the passing of legislation so important to our country, I was reminded of Benjamin Franklin's call to prayer back then. I write letters very frequently to our local, county, state and federal elected officials expressing concerns which I have.

I have written letters recently to the President, Vice-President, both our United States Senators, our United States Congressman, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the White House Chief of Staff, the Secretary of the Treasury and both the Chaplain of the United States Senate and the Chaplain of the House of Representatives expressing my concerns about these divisions. I would encourage each and every citizen of the United States of America to become involved in the direction in which our wonderful country is headed while we still have a free republic.





On Tuesday, September 15th, residents of the Town and Village of Mount Morris will vote to decide whether to create the Mount Morris Fire District. This new Fire District would be responsible for handling all fire protection services in the Town and Village.

Currently, the Mount Morris Fire Department is responsible for fire protection services. The Village Government operates the Fire Department (funded by Village taxpayers) and then contracts with Town Government (funded by Town taxpayers) to pay for the service between both municipalities. The cost split between the Town and Village varies significantly from year to year. That means that Town and Village taxpayers aren't paying the same amount for the same service, which just isn't fair.

The current year-to-year fluctuations can create the need for the Town and Village to make significant changes to your property tax rate. It just doesn't make sense to continue in this haphazard way when it comes to something as essential as protecting our communities' families.

If we VOTE YES to create the new Fire District, there will be more stability and the tax rate will be fair for all Town and Village taxpayers. The Town and Village will be able to reduce taxes because they won't have to contract for fire protection services anymore, and the new Fire District will be able to implement smart and fiscally responsible long-range planning for capital items (like fire trucks and other needed equipment).

If we **VOTE YES**, we will vote to directly elect volunteer (unpaid) Fire Commissioners to manage the Fire District. If they do a good job, we re-elect them. Heroism - Bravery - Professionalism



At the Board of Supervisors meeting on August 26, 2020, the Livingston County Sheriff's Office was recognized for its heroism, bravery and professionalism during a perilous incident in late May 2020.

On May 27th, a tractor trailer driver was stopped for speeding in the Village of LeRoy, Genesee County. During the stop, the driver refused to follow directions from law enforcement and pulled away, sparking a multi-county police chase. In the course of the incident, the driver, later found to be an "anti-police extremist", fired at least twenty-four rounds at law enforcement and rammed at least four police cars. Four police cars were struck with gunfire, including a Livingston County Sheriff's car that was hit with nine bullets.

Nearly an hour and fifteen minutes after the traffic stop, deputies declared the driver in custody. It is a true miracle – given the chaotic and dangerous circumstances of the pursuit – that there were no injuries to officers or civilians with the exception of the driver. Based upon items recovered during the investigation that followed the chase, including improvised explosive devices and assault rifles, it is clear that this individual was planning a larger, more threatening attack and the intervention of law enforcement undoubtedly saved human life.

During the course of this incident, despite being the target of senseless acts of violence, members of law enforcement, including those from the Livingston County Sheriff's Office, bravely continued to meet the call of duty in order to ensure the safety and security of the general public.



David L. LeFeber, Chairman of the Livingston County Board of Supervisors, stated, "Today, let us recognize each and every member of the Livingston County Sheriff's Office for their courage, bravery and resolve in the face of extreme danger." LeFeber continued, "We commend our law enforcement officers for their dedication to public service and commitment to protecting our community."
