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


# A Funeral for A Leg

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# CRAB SALAD

## **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 pound imitation crab meat flaked
- 1/2 cup celery finely chopped
- 3 tablespoons red onion finely chopped
- 1/2 teaspoon Old Bay seasoning
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1 1/2 tablespoons fresh dill chopped, plus more for garnish

# **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Add all of the ingredients to a large bowl. Stir gently to combine. Serve immediately, or cover and chill for up to 2

# CRAB PASTA SALAD

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 lb medium pasta shells
- 1 pound package imitation crab meat cut bite size
- 1 can medium black olives sliced 1 medium red bell pepper diced
- 3 or 4 green onions sliced thin about two inches into the green
- 3 stalks of celery diced

# **DRESSIN**G

- 1 1/2 cups plain non fat yogurt (NOT GREEK YOGURT)
- 1/4 cup fat free mayonnaise
- 1/2 TBSP Spike (found in the spice aisle)
- 1 tsp celery salt
- 1 TBSP yellow mustard
- 1/2 TBSP soy sauce
- 1/4 cup Italian vinaigrette salad dressing

# INSTRUCTIONS

- Cook pasta according to package instructions. Drain and rinse with cold water.
- 2. In a very large bowl, mix the pasta, crab, olives,
- red peppers, green onions, and celery.
  3. In a small bowl, whisk together the yogurt, mayo, Spike, celery salt, yellow mustard, soy sauce, and salad dressing.
- 4. Pour the dressing over the pasta and veggies and stir to combine. Refrigerate at least two hours before servina.

# SUMMER CRAB SALAD

# **INGREDIENTS Dressing**

- 1 Tb whole-grain mustard
- 1 small garlic clove, peeled, minced & mashed



# Crab Salad

- 1/2 tsp. lemon zest
- 1 lemon, juiced 1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- 1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper 1/4 tsp. granulated sugar
- 3 Tb. extra-virgin olive oil

### Salad

- 1 lb. lump crab meat, picked through for shells
- 1/4 cup red bell pepper, small dice
- 1/4 cup English cucumber, small dice
- 1/4 cup fresh corn kernels or yellow bell pepper, small dice
- 1-2 Tb. red onion, minced
- 1 Tb. fresh basil, minced 1 Tb. fresh parsley, minced
- 1 Tb. fresh mint, minced
- 1 small jalapeno, seeded and minced (optional)

# **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Combine dressing ingredients in a small bowl and whisk until combined. Set aside.
   Into a large mixing bowl, add crab, bell pepper, cucumber, corn, onion, herbs and jalapeno (if using). Add dressing, stir gently to combine, and refrigerate until ready to serve.
- 3. Serve with crusty bread or crostini, with mixed greens as a salad, in a sandwich, or all by itself.

# CRAB AND ORZO **SALAD**

# **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 ½ cups uncooked orzo pasta
- 1 pound cooked crab meat
- 4 Roma tomatoes
- 1 carrot, peeled and diced
- 1 medium red bell pepper, diced
- 1 medium green bell pepper, diced
- 3 medium green onions, chopped
- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 3 tablespoons chili sauce
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon pepper
- 3 drops hot pepper sauce

# **DIRECTIONS**

Bring a large saucepan of lightly salted water to a boil. Add orzo, and cook 11 minutes, or until al dente. Drain, and place in the refrigerator about 1 hour, until chilled.

Step 2

In a large bowl, toss together orzo, crab meat, tomatoes, carrot, red bell pepper, green bell pepper, and green onions. Step 3

In a small bowl, blend mayonnaise, chili sauce, lemon juice, salt, pepper, and hot pepper sauce. Pour over the orzo mixture, and toss to coat.

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# **MEL'S CRAB SALAD**

### **INGREDIENTS**

1 pound imitation crab meat, flaked

½ cup finely chopped celery, or more to taste

- ½ cup reduced-fat ranch dressing
- ⅓ cup mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon white sugar
- 1 teaspoon minced fresh parsley

# **DIRECTIONS**

Gently mix flaked imitation crab, celery, ranch dressing, mayonnaise, sugar, and parsley in a salad bowl

until thoroughly combined. Refrigerate overnight, stirring occasionally. Stir again just before serving.



# CRAB PASTA SALAD (2)

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 ½ (8 ounce) packages tricolor pasta or bów tie pasta
- 3 stalks celery diced 1 pound imitation crab meat
- 1 cup frozen green peas
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 ½ tablespoons white sugar
- 2 tablespoons white vinegar
- 3 tablespoons milk
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon ground black pepper

### **DIRECTIONS**

1. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add pasta and cook for 8 to 10 minutes or until al dente; rinse under cold water until cool and drain. 2. While pasta is cooking, chop celery and crab

meat. Run hot water over peas to defrost.

3. In a large bowl, whisk together the mayonnaise, sugar, vinegar, milk, salt and pepper. Add the pasta, celery and crab meat and stir until evenly coated. Adjust the salt, sugar or mayonnaise to suit your taste. Chill several hours before serving.

# CRAB SALAD (2)

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 2 pounds crab meat
- 2 ½ cups chopped celery
- 8 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 2 teaspoons celery seed
- 1 pinch paprika
- 2½ tablespoons white sugar
- ½ tablespoon ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon Old Bay

Seasoning

• 2 teaspoons dried parsley **DIRECTIONS** 

1. In a large bowl, combine the crab meat, celery, mayonnaise, celery seed, paprika, sugar, pepper, seafood seasoning and parsley. Mix well and refrigerate until chilled.





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

A few weeks ago, my wife and I were out of town and our associate pastor preached the Sunday message. Andrew opened up the message by citing an old Anglican prayer he heard

Alistair Begg recite. I would like to share that prayer with you. The prayer was this, "Father, what we know not, teach us. What we have not, give us. What we are

Pray and praise God until you see results


Encourage others even when you need encouragement yourself

# Claybank Master Gardeners

# Greetings Gardeners!

Our last two columns covered the basics of composting, a way to combine clean (not diseased) yard debris and kitchen scraps to develop your own nutritional soil to add to your potting soil or gardens. If you have composting questions, the folks at the County Extension offices are available in all 67 Alabama counties to answer any questions about gardening, farming, or 4-H programs providing *research-based information* and materials from cooperative efforts of Alabama A&M and Auburn Universities. They are here to serve you.

Four of the Wiregrass area extension offices you can call are in Dale County (334) 774-2329, Coffee County (334) 894-5596, Houston County (334) 794-4108, and Pike County (334) 566-0985. There is also a web **site** to access information at <u>www.aces.edu</u> .

As a clueless gardener from south Florida, I knew nothing about how or what to grow in south Alabama. But thanks to the efforts of a local Master Gardener group, I took the Master Gardener course through the Extension Office in Dale County. I was happily connected with a group of people who like me had lots of questions, plus others who had experiences to share. It was beyond my expectations, and after 8 years *I am still learning* through all the resources so abundantly provided by the instructors, county agents and online.

The Master Gardener course is under way again in Dale County on Wednesday mornings, as of August 26 through November 18th. This fall the course will be both online and in-person. The next one may be offered in the spring in either Houston or Coffee Counties so keep looking in this column or call your county agent. Scholarships are available to anyone in the Harvest4Health program.

Now that September is underway, here are some of the fall crops you can still plant or begin to sow: carrots, cucumbers, eggplants, lima beans, peppers, snap beans, summer squash, white potatoes, and winter squash. If you buy transplants available at the local garden supply stores, be sure to look carefully for plants with moist soil, plus healthy leaves & root systems.

# Herbs for cooking or medicinal teas

are so easy to grow in pots outside the

kitchen door, and most will continue through the winter. Be sure to read the labels for the best place to grow your plants, in sun or shade or partial shade. Herbs provide

flavor and health benefits to home cooked meals. Some of our favorites are

parsley, mint, sage, rosemary, thyme, tarragon, oregano, basil (grows best in summer), and cilantro (grows best in winter months).

The politician had worked up to his finale, and the crowd was getting more and more excited. "I promise better education opportunities for Native Americans!"



"Sure," the Chief said, "but be careful not to step in the hoya..."



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
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
