





Dear "Speak Out,"

September 2nd marked the 75th Anniversary of the end of World War II. This would prove to be the biggest war in history.

Germany began with its invasion of Czechoslovakia on March 15th, 1939, and continued with its invasion of Poland on August 31st, 1939. France and Great Britain honored their treaty with Poland and entered the war against Germany on September 3, 1939. The United States of America assisted both France and Great Britain with supplies but remained out of the war until December 7th, 1941, when Japan attacked Pearl Harbor.

We declared war against Japan on December 8th, 1941, and both Germany and Italy declared war against the United States three days later on December 11th, 1941. World War II was fought in two theaters of conflict both in Europe and on the Pacific Ocean.

German U-boats sank eight unarmed vessels off the shore of New York City in Mid-January 1942. Bataan fell in April 1942. B-25 bombers crews led by Lt. Colonel James Doolittle bombed Japan on April 1st, 1942. Corregidor fell on May 6th, 1942. The Battle of the Coral Sea took place on May 7th and 8th, 1942. The Battle of Midway took place from June 4th through 7th, 1942. A Japanese submarine shelled Fort Stevens, Oregon, on June 22nd, 1942. Operation Torch took place in North Africa in November 1942. 35,000 American troops were confirmed to have died in 1942. The Battle for North Africa took place in February 1943, the Aleutian Islands in May 1943, Sicily in July 1943, the Battle of Tarawa in November 1943, Anzio in May 1944, D-Day on June 6, 1944, and Saipan in mid-June 1944. Germany retreated and Paris was freed in August 1944. The Battle of Peleliu took place in September 1944. General Mac Arthur retook the Philippines in October 1944. The Battle of the Bulge took place in December 1944 and the Battle of Iwo Jima in February 1945. Intense bombing of Japan took place in March 1945. The Battle of Okinawa took place in April 1945. Germany surrendered on May 9th, 1945 (VE-DAY).

An atomic bomb was dropped on Hiroshima on August 6th, 1945, and a second on Nagasaki on August 9th, 1945. Japan accepted unconditional terms of surrender on August 14th, 1945. The Japanese surrendered on board the U. S. S. Missouri on September 2nd, 1945, and the war ended (VJ-DAY). The War Department announced that 407,316 American troops were killed and 671,278 were wounded during World War II. While our troops were fighting the war on two fronts, Americans were sacrificing. First of all they sacrificed their husbands, fathers, sons and daughters. They also sacrificed by doing without the items such as sugar, tires, fresh fruits, new automobiles and many other items which we take for granted in today's society.

We refer to these Americans who lived through the 1930s & 1940s as "The Greatest Generation". How true that really is! I don't think there ever will be another like them!

A young high school senior south of Rochester asked me "What is the big deal with this Pearl Harbor and the Jewish Holocaust?" He told me that his high school history teacher taught him that these events never happened. This is historical revisionism!

I wonder if we Americans today would be as patriotic and sacrifice to the same extent as our forefathers did so long ago?

Ron Powell Nunda Dear "Speak Out,"

I'm writing as a resident and taxpayer regarding my informed opinion on the proposed Fire District. I believe the formation of a Mount Morris Fire District would be a benefit to our community.

I know some taxpayers may be concerned about the addition of a new taxing entity, but in reality, this could actually create a decrease in your local taxes.

The Town is currently experiencing rapid growth with 6 projects under development. If a Fire District is created, these projects will all be required to pay Fire District taxes on the assessed values of their properties, which is not the case with the Village and Town taxes that currently contribute to the fire budget. These projects will negotiate a Payment In Lieu Of Taxes (PILOT) with the County, Town and School District. Since most of these projects are outside the Village limits, they will not be paying a PILOT to the Village that currently owns and operates the Fire Department. In fact, with the creation of a Fire District, most tax exempt property in the Town and Village will be required to pay for fire protection which currently is not the case. This increased tax base has the potential to lower the overall tax burden on the remainder of the community.

As the local Town & County Tax Collector, I can tell you from experience that this Fire District can ease the tax burden for the average property owner in our community.

A Fire District with elected commissioners trained for the job, will work to provide improved equipment and protection which also has the potential to lower the cost of your homeowner's or other property insurance.





IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

The Town of Mt. Morris Public Water Supply Has Levels of Haloacetic Acids (HAA)
Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation. We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Sample results taken on August 4, 2020 show that our system exceeded the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for Haloacetic Acids (HAAs). The standard for HAA's is 60 micrograms per liter. The average level of HAA's over the last year was 63.25 micrograms per liter. It is important to note that the sampling location for HAAs represents the location where the highest levels are thought to occur, and may not be representative of the entire system.

What are haloacetic acids (HAAs)?

HAAs are formed in drinking water during treatment by chlorine (the most commonly used disinfectant in New York State), which reacts with certain acids that are in naturally-occurring organic material (e.g., decomposing vegetation such as tree leaves, algae or other aquatic plants) in surface water sources such as rivers and lakes. The amount of HAAs in drinking water can change from day to day, depending on the temperature, the amount of organic material in the water, the amount of chlorine added, and a variety of other factors. Drinking water is disinfected by public water suppliers to kill bacteria and viruses that could cause serious illnesses. For this reason, disinfection of drinking water by chlorination is beneficial to public health.

Some studies suggest that people who drank chlorinated drinking water containing disinfection by-products (possibly including HAAS) for long periods of time (e.g., 20 to 30 years) have an increased risk for certain health effects. These include an increased risk for cancer. However, how long and how frequently people actually drank the water as well as how much HAAs the water contained is not known for certain. Therefore, the evidence from these studies is not strong enough to conclude that the observed increased risk for cancer is due to HAAS, other disinfection by-products, or some other factor. Studies of laboratory animals show that the individual HAAS, dichloroacetic acid and trichloroacetic acid, can cause cancer following exposure to high levels over their lifetimes. Dichloroacetic acid and trichloroacetic acid are also known to cause other effects in laboratory animals after high levels of exposure, primarily on the liver, kidney, and nervous system and on their ability to bear healthy offspring. The effects reported in studies of laboratory animals occur at exposures much higher than exposures that could result through normal use of the water. The risks for adverse health effects from HAAs in drinking water are small compared to the risk for illness from drinking inadequately disinfected water.

What does this mean for you?

At present, the water is suitable to drink, cook with, and bath in. Some people may wish to take additional practical measures to reduce their exposure. We do not consider these measures necessary to avoid health effects, but they are provided as options. These include using bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes, or using water pitchers containing an activated carbon filter or a tap-mounted activated carbon filter. These filters are readily available in many grocery and home improvement stores. Ventilating bathroom areas (e.g., using exhaust fans or opening windows) when showering or bathing can also help reduce exposures from chemicals released into the air.

What happened? What is being done?

The Town of Mt. Morris is working diligently with the Village of Mt. Morris to improve the quality of water delivered to consumers, including a flushing program to help maintain fresh water in the system. 


