Preheat grill to medium-high heat. Tear four 12x24" sheets of aluminum foil. Divide brats, bell pepper, red onion, potatoes and sweet corn evenly among the sheets of foil. Drizzle each with 1/2 tablespoon olive oil and 1 tablespoon broth. In a small bowl, combine

seasoned salt, paprika, ground mustard and Italian seasoning. Sprinkle 42 teaspoon of seasoning mix on each packet. Toss well to coat everything. Bring the two short ends of the foil up to the middle and

fold over twice to seal. Fold the remaining ends over twice to seal packet. Repeat with remaining packets. Place packets on the hot grill and grill for 20-25 minutes, flipping packets halfway through cook time. Open carefully and serve.





Okoboji Women's Club Celebrates 70 Years of Service

en's Club took place. It was presided over by the president, Esther LaFontaine. The club would go on to serve the Lakes Region with countless community service projects. Originally the club was part of the National Federated Women's Clubs but withdrew in the 1980s. The members wanted to raise funds and provide volunteer hours to strictly area projects.

Two of the major projects were the Gardner Log Cabin and the Lakes Art Center.

The local club was able to purchase and restore the only dwelling left standing after the Spirit Lake Massacre of 1857. Through tireless efforts, their project, the Gardner Log Cabin, took its rightful place in the National Registry of Historic Places in 1973. The historic site, located in Arnolds Park is now maintained by the State of Iowa and draws thousands of visitors each year.

Between 1966-68 the club purchased an old garage on a hill along Highway 71 in the town of Okoboji. The women converted the garage into a studio/shop and hired an art instructor to provide classes for the community. Major benefactors Bud and Bev Pearson embraced their goals and the new Pearson Lakes Art Center was opened in 1991. It continues to provide art education, gallery and live music events for the entire Lakes Region and its millions of visitors each year.

There are currently 28 active members and four honorary members. Due to the current COVID pandemic, the women have not been able to gather on a regular basis. They hope to resume work on projects for the area as soon as it will be safe to do so. 




FWIW: The guys in the band experienced 38 degree temperatures early Thursday morning when they began setting up their equipment, and deserve a special "atta boy."

"I was also interested in RD's struggles to find a grandparent song. I have attached a video of Clive Dunn, an English actor who played old person roles early in his career. He was only 51 years old when the song, 'Grandad,' went to #1 in the UK charts in 1971. *Enjoy it.*" We did — and you can too, by Googling: *Clive Dunn, Grandad*

Probably unrelated, but somewhat apropos, is last week's comment on the reader board at The Light of The Lakes Friends Church in Arnolds Park: "You'd be a Monkey's Uncle if Charles Darwin was right!" Amen...

Research director RD has taken on a blonde persona most of her life — even though she wasn't even born in 1951, when *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes* closed on Broadway on this day (September 15th), after 740 performances. RD is still reaching for all the glitter in life — like diamonds -- that by the song, are a girl's best friend. Carol Channing sang that song in the show, with Leo Robin's music and Jule Styne's lyrics. Besides her most famous rendition, modern versions that sparkled in the 21st Century include those by Nebraskan Tierney Sutton, the British Puppini Sisters, and Aussie Nikki Parrott on her 2015 CD, The Look of Love...

If he hadn't passed away in 2017, Wednesday would have been jazz lyricist and singer Jon Hendricks' 99th birthday. Hendricks was born in Newark, Ohio, and was one of the originators of "vocalese," after forming a trio with Dave Lambert and Annie Ross. The trio recorded nine highly acclaimed albums before Hendricks wrote all the lyrics for The Manhattan Transfer's 1985 Vocalese LP – which included the first recorded vocal version of the theme used on KUOO, KWOA and KRAQ radio over a 30 year period. Until 1985, the only recording of the tune was a head arrangement performed by The Count Basie Orchestra in a Paris nightclub, in 1946...

Thursday is Apple Dumpling Day, for which RD has selected two songs, Shoo Fly Pie and Apple Pan Dowdy, a popular song about Pennsylvania Dutch cooking, written by Guy Wood and Sammy Gallop, in 1945. It has been recorded by many artists, including Dinah Shore, June Christy, and Ella Fitzgerald. In 1967, the Allentown, Pennsylvania, group Jay and the Techniques released its own song about baking: Apples, Peaches, Pumpkin Pie, on the Smash label, and saw it reach number six on the Billboard Hot 100 list, and with sales of over a million copies....

It was September 20, 1968, that Hawaii Five-O premiered on the CBS television network. Jack Lord starred as Steve McGarrett, the police detective famous for uttering the phrase "Book 'em Danno," which was heard at the end of most episodes. The Emmy Award-winning theme song was written by Morton Stevens, and released in 1970 by The Ventures, as the title track of their 1969 album for Liberty Records. The single reached number four on the pop charts. And the album was certified gold by the Recording Industry Association of America, in 1971...



To The Editor:

Who Gets Counted in the 2020 Census?

There is an informative website about the Census at: https:// www.datacenterresearch.org/2020-census-resources/2020-census-frequently-asked-questions/

Below is just a brief sample of advice for college students and second-home owners during the pandemic which was occurring Census Day April 1, 2020.

Who Should I Count In My Census Response? You should count anyone who is living and sleeping in your home most of the time as of April 1, 2020. This includes both family members and roommates, foster children, and friends. This also includes people in the hospital or even in jail temporarily who normally live with you.

Are Children Included In The Census? Yes! It is important to count any children living in your home most of the time. This includes children who split their time between divorced parents, newborn babies, and other children who live with you like grandchildren, the children of friends, or nieces and nephews.

If I Have Kids Away At College, Should I Count Them? No. Basically, a student's "home" is where they live while attending college. If they're not living at their parents' home most of the time, the right place for them to be counted is in the town where they attend school. Students in college towns use local resources, including roads, and public transportation. That's why they must be counted in those college towns. College students living in on-campus housing are counted through their university as part of the Census Bureau's Group Quarters operation, which counts all students living in university-owned housing. You should not be included in your parents' or relatives' 2020 Census count just because of the temporary closing of your college or university! If you live in off-campus housing usually, that is the address you use.

What If I Own A Vacation Home And Receive A Census Letter There, Too? The Census Bureau's mandate is to count all residents where they live most of the time. Even if you happen to have been at your second home on April 1, 2020, due to the pandemic, the Census Bureau's aim is to count you only once, and in your primary residence. You should not count yourself as living at a "second home" or vacation home on a census survey. By reporting to the Census Bureau that an address is a second or vacation home, the Census Bureau can avoid sending an enumerator to that home to verify that it is vacant.

To indicate to the Census Bureau that an address is a second or vacation home, go to: www.2020census.gov or call 844-330-2020.

For the question "Including yourself, how many people were living or staying at __ on April 1, 2020?" your response should be "0" even if you happened to be in this home on April, 1, 2020. The Census wants to count you only once and at your

After two more prompts to confirm that zero people live at this address, the website will then ask "What is the primary reason why no one was living or staying at ___

Projects

Construction has begun on the addition of four pickleball courts and additional parking at Sawmill Park. Diamond Concrete was awarded the \$179,245 bid back in January, 2020; however, construction was delayed due to the COVID-19 health crisis and uncertainty of the financial impact that may result. The courts should be open for public use in the Spring of 2021

A watermain project beginning on Elm Drive north of the Abbie Gardner Cabin and extending approximately 482 feet down Prairie Lane is nearly complete. Final cost on this project is \$68,593. This project was done in anticipation of the mill and overlay of Prairie Lane that has been pushed back to the Fall of 2021. ABC Services out of Estherville, IA was the contractor on the Elm Drive/Prairie Lane watermain project.

Rentals

Please be aware that the minimum rental period differs depending upon what Zoning district property is located in. Rentals by the week, weekend, or night are allowed in the (R-3) Cottage Residential, (C-1) Downtown Commercial, (C-2) General Commercial – Mixed Use, (C-3) Highway Commercial, and (C-4) Resort Commercial districts. Regardless of location, all owners must provide enough off-street parking for their tenants. A 180-square foot parking space is required for every three (3) persons of occupancy, or one (1) space for each bedroom. Failure to comply with the City Ordinance can result in a Municipal Infraction charge and fine for each day that the violation occurs. Please check

with City Hall before listing your property for rent.

Utility Billing

Utility bills can be paid online using a credit card at www.arnoldsparkcity. com (there is a small fee for this service), by mail, or automatically deducted from a checking or savings account. Please contact City Hall for more information on automatic withdrawal.

ATV, ORV, & Snowmobile Ordinance
All persons operating must have a valid motor vehicle license and provide proof of current registration and financial responsibility as required by the Iowa

Code Chapter 321I. ATVs, ORVs, and snowmobiles are allowed to operate in the City from sunrise to midnight except for emergency situations or for loading or unloading from a transport trailer. ATV's may be operated during prohibited hours for snow removal purposes.

All ATVs, ORVs, and snowmobiles must be equipped with brakes, lights, muffling devices, and other equipment required by the State of Iowa law.

ATVs, ORVs, and snowmobiles will be allowed to cross Highway 71 at Broadway Street and 202nd Street, but will not be allowed to operate on Highway 71. ATVs, ORVs, and snowmobiles will be allowed on all other City streets.

ATVs, ORVs, and snowmobiles will not be allowed to operate in any City Park, playground, or upon any other City property without permission of

the City. No ATVs, ORVs, or snowmobiles shall operate on City streets at a speed greater than thirty-five (35) miles per hour even if the posted limit is greater than thirty-five (35) miles per hour. As always, drive sober or get pulled over. Please contact City Hall for a complete

While on your property, all animals must be in a secure location away from electric, gas, and water meters. This will assure your meters are

read properly. Winter is just around the corner. Please have an emergency travel kit in each vehicle, drive carefully and listen to weather forecasts. If you must travel during inclement weather, please allow extra time to get to your destination. All vehicles must be off City streets following a snowfall of 2 inches or more for snow removal. If they are not removed, they will be ticketed and/or towed.

Any resident of Arnolds Park that is leaving for an extended amount of time this winter may come to the Arnolds Park Police Department and fill out a House Watch form. This will allow the police department to contact you or an emergency contact should there be an incident that involves your residence.

picked up it must be placed in City bags (available at City Hall and Arnolds Park Casey's), tied shut, and placed at the curbside by 7 am on collection days. Bags will not be picked up if there is garbage or other items in the bag.

If you choose to burn your yard waste, please be courteous to neighbors and use good judgment based on weather conditions. All fires must be attended by a person 18 years of age or older at all times. Any yard waste you burn on your property, must originate on your

The burning of garbage, rubber, or anything of a toxic matter is strictly prohibited. Yard waste cannot be burned on City property.

Snow Removal

Town and Country Disposal will not empty commercial dumpsters if there is snow in front of or blocking the dumpster. Businesses are responsible for snow removal and ensuring the path is clear for the garbage trucks. All vehicles must be off City streets following a snowfall of 2 inches or more for snow removal, if vehicles are not removed, they may be ticketed and/or towed.

Winter Utility Shut Down

Every winter there are homes that have water lines freeze and break. In addition to water issues, we have seen sewer back-ups over the past several years. If a homeowner is leaving for a period of time, the home should be winterized. If for some reason there is a power outage, or the heat should go off, a flooded lower level might be avoided. In addition, it would be wise to have someone check the house periodically.

Garbage and Recycling

Beginning Labor Day residential garbage will be picked up only on Mondays. Commercial trash will be picked up Monday and Friday weekly. Recycling will continue to be picked up on the second and fourth Fridays each month. Please call City Hall with any questions regarding garbage or recycling.

This was before the age of smartphones, so they were both wondering what was going on and couldn't believe the news we reported to them.

While I'll never forget that morning and the feelings of fear for my friends and then feelings of horror for those who lost their lives and their loved ones, what I remember just as clearly is how our great country came together as Americans and helped each other heal. We didn't care if you were white, black, Hispanic, Native American, Asian, a Democrat, a Republican, rich or poor, we just all cared for and showed empathy for each other. I remember so many houses proudly flying the American flag and the sense of pride we had in our country as sports returned later that week with amazing ceremonies honoring our fallen heroes. I so dearly miss that America and so know that we can have it back, but it starts with each and every one of us being more tolerant and more caring.
