POLICIES

- 1. We recommend that all cable and satellite networks carry the Rural Free Delivery programming as part of their basic package.
- 2. We recommend that the PMMB start retail assessment of non Class 1 dairy products.
- 3. We recommend that horse and buggy operators are required to hold a permit or license to operate on public roads.
- 4. We recommend that custom operators are required to obtain a license or permit to operate a motorized vehicle on public roadways.
- 5. We recommend that PFA lobby FSA to put ARC/PLC on form 578.
- 6. We recommend PFB to lobby state legislators (more aggressively) for the elimination of the school property tax.
- 7. We recommend that undersized eggs be allowed to be provided to food banks within seventy two hours instead of having to be discarded.
- 8. We recommend the state require a 300 feet setback property line for intensive animal feeding operations instead of the 100 feet that is currently required.
- 9. We recommend that PFB provide its own property, auto and health insurance to its members.

How do I register?

Registration is open now! Attendees, except for voting delegates, are asked to register online by filling out and submitting the form available at www.pfb.com/register.

Your registration may take up to a few days to process so be sure to register as early as possible.

If you are serving as a voting delegate, do not register through the online registration form. You will receive special registration instructions after you are selected by your county Farm Bureau.

You will need an email address to register and access the meeting. If you do not have an email account, you can sign up for a free email account through services such as Gmail (visit mail.google.com), AOL (visit login.aol.com) or Outlook (visit outlook.live.com/owa).
