

And the coffee, poured from a big blackened pot, had grounds in it, naturally. Or maybe I didn't give the grounds time to settle after the pot boiled! But best of all was the warm welcome and fascinating conversation. I was perfectly at home at this campfire and discovered we had a friend in common, Bill Grant. There can't be enough said about Bill, but first let me express that I was blessed to make some new 'old friends' in Dan Moody, "Cowboy" and Buck.

Bill Grant was from Grant, Texas near Hugo and grew up farming and cowboying and learning to play music. He was a musician and great entertainer, songwriter, guitar and mandolin player, storyteller, a lover of Indian lore and Western lifestyle, and a Christian. His music was his ministry. Springtime Bluegrass Festivals in Hugo and elsewhere were widely known and enjoyed for several decades and Bill earned a number of music-industry awards. When home, he was a regular in the band of the Cowboy Crossing Church and blessed all who came to worship until 2017 when his health began to go south. Bill passed away in 2019, and his widow Barbara Asbill Grant placed a unique headstone where he lies in Showman's Rest Cemetery in Hugo. The marker is truly a tribute to a well-lived life of service and a testimony to the humble man that he was. Everyone who ever met him loved Bill Grant. My new friend Buck wrote a poem for

Bill's funeral. One of the dozen well-rhymed verses states,

"I leave it to the museums and Halls of Fame to record and award this great man. The greatness I recognize comes from within, the stuff that makes a man worth his sand". Amen, Buck!





### A TOP TEN RUNNER

### **Tumbleweed Smith**



**Tumbleweed Smith** 

Running is like breathing to Dave Dial, who lives on the family ranch near the community of Grovetown, just outside of Crockett. In terms of lifetime running distance, Dave ranks number 9 and is moving up. He has run more than 203,000 miles. The top runner in lifetime miles is 85 years old and lives in California. He has run over 300,000

I had no idea there was even a running category for lifetime miles, nor did I know there was a ranking among the top 10. Only 10 people in the US have run more than

miles. Dave has been running since he was 5 and started keeping records at age 16 after getting acquainted with Running Magazine. He runs twice a day: 10 miles in the morning, 8 miles in the afternoon. He has not missed a day of running in 13 years and has the records to prove it. He keeps a notebook of his miles and puts down time, temperature, where he runs and how long it takes to run a mile.

"I usually run a mile in 7 or 8 minutes," says Dave. "In the morning that takes me about an hour and 15 minutes. The afternoon run takes just over an

Although Dave gave away all his trophies and ribbons there is one record he is proud of. In his earlier days, he entered the Boston Marathon.

"When I was 19 I set a record that still stands for the junior class. That's for runners 20 years old and under. I ran it in 2 hours, 24 minutes and 18 seconds. That's averaging 5 and a half minutes per mile for 26.2 miles."

Dave turned 60 this summer. He weighs 130 pounds and stands just under 6 feet. He has planned his running schedule based on previous years. When he was 38 in 1998 he reached his first 100,000 miles. Here it is 22 years later and he has added another 100,000 plus miles. At that rate he'll reach 300,000 miles at the age of 82, He says he doesn't feel his age.

Skechers Sport Shoes provides running footwear for Dave. Prior to reaching his 200,000-mile mark Skechers made him a special pair of shoes with the number 200,000 on them. He was wearing them when he reached that mile-

"I was really kind of depressed after that because that had been my goal for such a long time. So I thought I would reward myself. I bought myself some ice cream, something I hadn't tasted in 40 years."

Dave was a math major at Lamar University in Beaumont, then went into actuarial consulting and later coached track. He writes Haiku poetry because he likes the math required (5 syllables, 7 syllables, 5 syllables). He created this while running:

I seek shade-cloaked roads To fill them mile after mile With summer's footfalls.

# **Daughters of the American Revolution**

# Began Celebration of the Constitution, Adopted 1956

The United States Constitution stands as a testament to the tenacity of Americans throughout history to maintain their liberties, freedoms and inalienable rights. This celebration of the Constitution was started by the Daughters of the American Revolution. In 1955, DAR petitioned Congress to set aside September 17-23 annually to be dedicated for the observance of Constitution Week. The resolution was later adopted by the U.S. Congress and signed into public law on August 2, 1956, by President Dwight D. Eisenhower. The DAR has also erected a structure that is built in tribute to the Constitution of the United States. DAR Constitution Hall, which is a performing arts center, opened in 1929.

The aims of the Constitution Week celebration are to: Emphasize citizens' responsibilities for protecting and defending the Constitution. Inform people that the Constitution is the basis for America's great heritage and the foundation for our way of life. Encourage the study of the historical events which led to the framing of the Constitution in September 1787. Constitution Week is a great time to learn more about this important document and celebrate the freedoms it gave us. Get involved by encouraging young people to sign the Constitution Week Proclamation Pledge and ask your local community officials to issue a proclamation about Constitution Week.



# UNCLE SAM DAY

On September 13th, the United States recognizes Uncle Sam Day. The day commemorates the man behind the iconic image. The fascinating nickname for the United States government was born on September 13, 1766. Sam Wilson, a meatpacker from New York, supplied barrels of meat to soldiers during the war of 1812. To identify the meat for shipment, Wilson prominently stamped "U.S." on the barrels. It wasn't long before the soldiers dubbed the grub a delivery from Uncle Sam. As such nicknames tend to do, its popularity spread.

The first illustration of Uncle Sam is unlike the one we know today. Published by Harper's Weekly in 1861, the young government representative (a starred bandana on his head and wearing a striped vest) is depicted dividing up Virginia like a butcher. Through the years, the image of Uncle Sam would take many forms. Credit is given to German-born illustrator and cartoonist Thomas Nast for developing the long-legged Uncle Sam we know today. With the starred top hat and striped pants, the Uncle Sam debut in Harper's Weekly, also. He took on many issues with Nast as his illustrator. Some of the issues topics included Boss Tweed, Union recruitment, and Reconstruction. During the modern era, Uncle Sam obtained some color. The United States Army awarded Montgomery Flagg with the artwork for the familiar portrait used in the "I Want You For The U.S. Army" campaign during World War I. It first appeared on the cover of Leslie's Weekly, an illustrated literary and news magazine.

# **Star Spangled Banner Day**

September 14th

On September 14, 1814, Francis Scott Key pens a poem which is later set to music and in 1931 becomes America's national anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner." The poem, originally titled "The Defence of Fort M'Henry," was written after Key witnessed the Maryland fort being bombarded by the British during the War of 1812. Key was inspired by the sight of a lone U.S. flag still flying over Fort McHenry at daybreak, as reflected in the now-famous words of the "Star-Spangled Banner": "And the rocket's red glare, the bombs bursting in air, Gave proof through the night that our flag was still there."



Francis Scott Key was born on August 1, 1779, at Terra Rubra, his family's estate in Frederick County (now Carroll County), Maryland. He became a successful lawyer in Maryland and Washington, D.C., and was later appointed U.S. attorney for the District of Columbia.

On June 18, 1812, America declared war on Great Britain after a series of trade disagreements. In August 1814, British troops invaded Washington, D.C., and burned the White House, Capitol Building and Library of Congress. Their next target was Baltimore.
