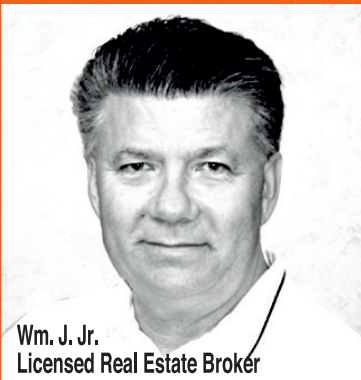

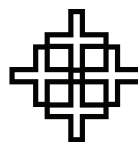

Each year, thousands of older Americans fall at home. Many of these falls result in serious injuries and some become disabled. Falls are often due to hazards that are easy to overlook but can be simply fixed. To help prevent falls, it is important to follow these tips:

Remove things you can trip over. Remove small throw rugs or tape them down to keep from slipping. Have grab bars next to your toilet and in the tub or shower. Use non-slip mats in the bathtub and on shower floors. Improve lighting in your home to see better. Have handrails and extra lighting put in stair cases. Wear shoes both inside and outside of the house. Avoid going barefoot or wearing slippers, unless they have a skid-proof sole. 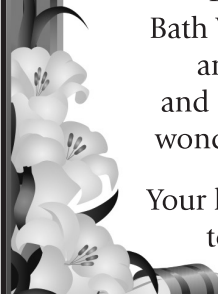

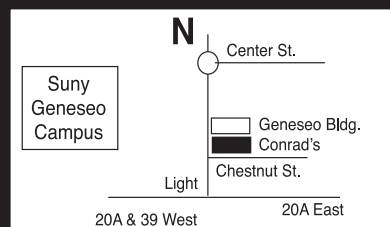

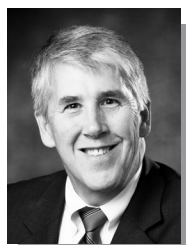

What is it?!

A Mindset: Before “all lives” can matter, we *have* to acknowledge the historical legacies of white supremacy, large and small, and the ways people of color have been harmed in our society. From enslavement to lynching to poll-taxes and literacy tests, from Jim Crow laws and red-lining to anti-Black massacres, from segregated schools to police brutality, legacies of trauma and generational wealth gaps...people of color have never been included in sentiments such as “All are created equal.” *“All Lives” cannot matter until Black Lives Matter.*

Reflect: What feelings and reactions do you have? What other questions come up?

Are They Anti-White? No. Black Lives Matter is supported by people of every race and ethnicity. Advocating equitable treatment for Black and Indigenous People of Color (BIPOC) is not anti-white. It is natural to feel skeptical of change; when you are used to privilege, equality can feel like oppression. Repeat: Being anti-white *supremacy* is not being anti-white.

White Supremacy? The Civil War is over! It can be difficult to learn at first, but unfortunately, ending slavery did not end racism. To learn more about this history, search the Internet for: Black Codes, Reconstruction, Jim Crow, Tulsa OK massacre, slave patrols, red-lining, Emmett Till, Rosewood FL, poll taxes, literacy tests, and lynching (warning: content may be graphic)

White Privilege?!?! White Privilege is the set of advantages and “benefits of the doubt” white people have that people of color don’t. It does NOT mean white people don’t struggle, or that white people have “had it easy,” just that they have not had the additional burden of racism.

But What Are They Actually Doing?

Encouraging voter registration and voting has removed anti-Black politicians and worked to pass critical legislation. Direct non-violent action in the streets has demanded the attention of mainstream audiences, and that exposure has shifted the narrative on the racial inequities in America—and highlighted existing groups like Color of Change, the Equal Justice Initiative, and Showing up for Racial Justice. Culture is shifting before our eyes, due in part to Black Lives Matter.

What Men Need to Know About Prostate Cancer

Prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in men.

September is National Prostate Cancer Awareness Month across the nation. The American Cancer Society reports that approximately 1 in every 6 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer during his lifetime. Prostate cancer can occur at any age but is most commonly diagnosed among men over the age of 65.

Early detection is key. All men are encouraged to consult with their physicians about prostate cancer since it is often treatable if detected early. The prostate is a walnut-sized reproductive gland that is located below the bladder and in front of the rectum. Its function is to produce seminal fluid that nourishes and transports sperm.

Recognize warning signs. If a man has a strong family history of prostate cancer, consumes a diet that is high in fat and low in fruits and vegetables, or show symptoms – including frequent urination, trouble stopping or starting urine flow, blood in the urine, or constant pain in the lower back, pelvis or upper thighs – the Livingston County Department of Health recommends talking to his doctor.

Reduce the risk. By choosing healthier food, exercising regularly, avoiding tobacco products and getting screen regularly, men may reduce their risk of prostate cancer. Eating a diet high in fruits and vegetables but low in saturated fats is associated with a reduced risk of prostate cancer.

Men diagnosed with prostate cancer by a doctor who is a Cancer Services Program provider may be eligible to enroll in the New York State Medicaid Cancer Treatment Program.
