Farms can be the source of all kinds of dangers, but one After working with pesticides and other toxic of the most serious threats that agricultural workers face substances, wash your hands thoroughly and place all comes from the threat of exposure to toxic chemicals.

Many farmers rely on chemicals like pesticides, herbicides, veterinary chemicals and fuels to raise their crops, tend their livestock and maintain their farms. When handling hazardous substances, however, farm workers need to be aware of the risks of chemical exposure and take steps to protect themselves and their loved ones. Overexposure to certain chemicals used in farming can result in health effects ranging from headaches and nausea to burns, poisoning, respiratory illness, cancer and birth defects.

Chemicals can be absorbed into the body through inhalation, ingestion or direct contact with the skin or eyes. If you work with agrichemicals, you should always follow the manufacturers' instructions about how to store, transport, use and dispose of them. In some cases, wearing protective gear — such as gloves, goggles, masks or hazmat suits — when handling chemicals may be advised.

You should also make sure to store chemicals in sealed containers that are clearly labeled and keep them out of the reach of children and pets.

If someone around you exhibits symptoms of chemical overexposure, you should contact emergency services and help them seek medical attention right away.

Each year, the National Education Center for recommended safety protocols when using certain equipment or methods.

> Tractor accidents are the most common cause of farmrelated deaths. Nearly half of all fatalities in the agriculture industry occur because of accidents involving vehicles, especially tractors. Farmers should make sure tractors have the latest safety features, such as rollover protective structures (ROPs), and operators should be well versed in the safety procedures recommended by the manufacturer.

> Silos pose serious dangers. Working in silos puts workers in danger of suffocation by grain. Moving grain can become like quicksand and bury a person in seconds. Proper training and protective equipment can help workers stay safe when working with grain in confined spaces.

agricultural workers are Heat illness can be deadly. In many parts of the country, agricultural workers are at risk of becoming fatally ill from working in hot and humid conditions. During periods of extreme heat, workers should remember to stay hydrated and take breaks to rest in the shade.

STAY ALERT

Safe completion of any task depends on knowledge, alertness and hazard awareness. It's natural for us to take pride in our ability to work long hours in pursuit of a goal. Nowhere is this more evident than in harvesting operations. However, fatigue, drowsiness and illness frequently contribute to



mishaps in the field. Recognize when you have "had enough", and turn the operation over to someone else.

Adverse weather definitely adds to harvesting pressure. Don't rely on stimulants to keep you going, or take depressants to calm your nerves. Drugs and alcohol work against the keen awareness that is vital to safety.

TAKE TIME FOR BREAKS

Periodic breaks relieve the monotony of machinery operation. If you are going to eat in the field, at least climb down from the machine and relax for 15 to 20 minutes.

Equipment operators should be dressed for comfort and safety. Protective footwear and close-fitting clothes are essentials when working in and around machinery. Appropriate safety gear should be worn where noise, dust, or toxic materials pose hazards.

Farm safety: protecting your eyes and ears

Working on farms exposes your eyes and ears to all kinds of dangers. That's why it's vital that farm workers take precautions and wear personal protective equipment (PPE) when necessary.

AVOIDING EYE INJURIES

Farm workers have a high risk of eye injury from flying particles when performing tasks like feed grinding, haying, welding and repairing equipment. There's also an acute risk of eye damage when handling pesticides and other toxic che-

micals.

Eye injuries can be prevented by wearing the proper PPE, such as safety glasses, safety goggles (which can fit over most prescription glasses) and welding helmets (which protect eyes from strong ultraviolet and infrared rays that can cause blindness).

PREVENTING HEARING LOSS Farm workers have one of the highest rates of hearing loss. The noise from agricultural equipment like tractors, chainsaws, power tools and choppers is loud enough to cause permanent hearing loss if you don't take steps to reduce the risk. You should wear hearing protection when performing a certain task if: • A sound hurts your ears

• You have to raise your voice when speaking to someone three feet away

• Everything sounds muffled after exposure

• Your ears ring after prolonged exposure

Limiting the length of exposure and wearing earplugs and earmuffs can go a long way toward reducing your risk of permanent hearing loss. Look for hearing protection equipment with a noise reduction rating (NRR) of 24 or higher.






