

To our friends and family in this community and beyond, we do not know where to even begin. As many of you know, our lives have been turned upside down this year. It has been a surreal time. Thankfully, our family is safe, which is absolutely the most important part of this whole experience. Besides the four of us, our oldest daughter Felicia and our four granddaughters were here from Alabama. As I looked out the window, as I do every morning, we were blessed that a piece of burning roof line fell in front of my face. We continue to attempt to keep all the "What if's" out of our minds.

We must begin with a special heartfelt thanks to all the first responders who came to our home early in the morning on June 20th. To the firefighters and police of Albion and surrounding towns, we cannot thank you enough for your heroic efforts to keep our family safe and for trying to limit the damage to our home. Unfortunately, everything inside is a total loss.

With regards to our community in general, we do not even know where to begin. From the neighbor across our street (whom we still do not know her name) who called 911, to all of you that attended our benefit; How can we express that amount of gratitude in words? Never in a million years did we think we would be on the receiving end of such generosity. It has been very humbling.

While devastated at the experience of a house fire will be etched as one of our childrens' biggest childhood memories, we are consoled by the fact that these incredible acts of kindness will likely be a much more vivid memory. It has been important for them to see all the goodness in the world in the middle of such a frightening time of uncertainty.

The compassion and generosity that has been shown to us started while the fire was still burning and continues each day. It has all been so very overwhelming. Friends brought us toothbrushes and clothing that day when we had not even processed the fact that we did not have ours anymore. People came with food, money, and support. They fed us, opened their homes, bought diapers for the babies, and sent messages to our social media. Most of all they simply sat with us, as our emotions ran rampant, and held our hands, while we watched our home go up in flames.

We certainly have a long road ahead, but it is so comforting knowing that we are not alone. We are eternally grateful for everything the community has done for us. It may be a while before we get a chance to acknowledge friends, family and first responders individually, but know that we have seen every text, listened to every voicemail, saw every social media post and read every card that has been sent. After much thought, we made the painful decision to sell our property and move in with my father. We loved our home and neighborhood and will miss it terribly as we start a new chapter in our lives.

What makes a house a home is the people inside and what makes a loving community is the spirit of all of you that have helped us through these challenging months. We will never forget the incredible support you have given us. From the bottom of our hearts, we thank you.

Let's go on an adventure together....to Kentucky!

I had several adventures in mind as I thought about this edition of "Travel Thoughts By Kim" and had pretty much decided on one in particular. But, a new friend suggested I check out a travel blog he enjoys —"Tennessee Crossroads"— and while I was skimming through it, it kept reminding me of my trip to Kentucky last year. Yeah, I know, it should have reminded me of Tennessee, right? Well, I've been to Tennessee a few times, but it has been many years ago, now, so memories are a bit faded. I want to do a visit to Tennessee, again — in fact, I had considered a trip to the Memphis area this spring (I still have "cry on Elvis" grave" on my bucket list) and I had a trip to Nashville booked for this November. But, unfortunately, this year resulted in a lot of cancelled plans. So, Tennessee will have to wait. No, reading through that travel blog really got me reminiscing about my time in Kentucky, so that's what I want to share with you this time.

In 2019, I was able to spend time in the last three states that finished off my "visit all 50 states" bucket list item. Kentucky was my # 48.....Colorado and New Mexico wrapped up the list in September and October. I went to Kentucky the last week in August. I thought it was going to be a "check the box" trip — didn't think there'd be much to do or see there. But, I was so wrong! It was a 5 day trip — two travel days and three full days to explore. In that time, I put 460 miles on my rental car and traveled another ~150 on a bus tour and still wished I had more time to do more! I absolutely loved Kentucky and everything I did while I was there. Let me try to condense all the wonderful things I crammed into three days into one short story for you all.

I decided to fly into Louisville as my base for the trip. I stayed at the Radisson, Louisville North in Clarksville, Indiana which is just across the Ohio River from Louisville. So, I drove across a huge bridge between Kentucky and Indiana over the Ohio River at least twice every day. Across the parking lot from the hotel was a dinner theater — Derby Dinner Playhouse. I checked out their web site and found their current production was "Million Dollar Quartet" — the story of the night of Dec 3, 1956 when Sam Phillips got Elvis Presley, Carl Perkins, Johnny Cash, and Jerry Lee Lewis together for the first and only time for a jam session and made Rock and Roll History at Sun Records. I was exhausted after a long day in airports, but couldn't resist — I went and saw a totally awesome live performance that blew me away!

Day one started with a stop at Cave Hill Cemetery right in the heart of downtown Louisville. It was really odd to find this huge and absolutely stunning park-like cemetery in the middle of a busy city. I love old cemeteries — especially ones with so much history, character, and beauty. Cave Hill didn't disappoint. Established in the mid-1800s, it has rolling hills, lakes, streams, abundance of nature, and lots and lots of stunning statues and memorials — some of the most unique and elaborate I've ever seen. It is also home of Louisville's National Cemetery for veterans. I planned to just do a quick drive through and find the two most famous residents — Colonel Sanders and Muhammad Ali — and move on to the next stop on my Day One Agenda, but it was all so gorgeous and there were so many photos I felt compelled to take, that I ended up spending over two hours there. I could have easily spent another couple hours if I didn't have admission tickets to the Ark Encounter to get to. If you're ever in or near Louisville, do yourself a favor and spend some time in Cave Hill Cemetery — you won't regret it. After my wonderful morning at Cave Hill Cemetery, I drove about an hour and a half to Williamstown, KY to visit the Ark Encounter. The Ark Encounter sits on 200 acres and is a 510 foot long, 85 foot wide, and 51 foot high replica of Noah's Ark with life-like exhibits of how life on the biblical ark would have been like. What an awesome experience. It was absolutely fascinating to go through and includes a small zoo with many of the animals that would have been on Noah's Ark. And, you can even ride an actual camel while you are there! Definitely a must see — but, don't cut your time short — it's an easy 4 or more hour visit. I didn't include the nearby Creation Museum — maybe on another trip.

Day two was devoted to an eight hour Bourbon Tour. It was an expensive tour — they pride themselves on small focused groups with detailed, informative tours and it was so worth the price. The tour I was on was in a large SUV with me and three young guys from Australia and the guide. We had so much fun — the guys treated me like their long-lost aunt — and I learned a lot about Kentucky and bourbon. I'm not a bourbon/whiskey drinker, but thought the distilleries would be interesting and how can you go to Kentucky without doing something along the Bourbon Trail? It was a wonderful tour and I actually got a new appreciation for bourbon. We traveled about 150 miles in eight hours and visited five distilleries (two

unscheduled additions our guide made to make our tour a bit nicer) — Maker's Mark, Willett, Heaven Hill, Barton, and Jim Beam — and the day also included a nice lunch at a beautiful Country Club. I learned that "all bourbon is whiskey, but all whiskey is not bourbon"— there is a very strict list of requirements by law to be able to put the word "bourbon" on a whiskey label and that 95% of the world's bourbon is made in a triangle area in Kentucky that I toured that day. The distilleries were stunning and so interesting— I'm really glad I spent the day with my three new young friends from Australia tasting bourbon. I did a lot of driving and saw a ton of stuff on Day Three. I started out just down the street from my hotel in Clarksville, Indiana. I saw signs for Falls of the Ohio and, since I love waterfalls, I had to check it out. I discovered it wasn't a waterfall, after all. It was a series of rapids caused by lime stone tables along that section of the Ohio River resulting in the

world's largest exposed fossil bed and it was awesome! The photos I took nowhere near do it justice....so beautiful! From there, I went to Churchill Downs where I took the walking tour and learned all about the history of the famous horse track — very interesting. I capped my time at the Downs with a stop in the bar for a Mint Julep — I was told it was against the law to go to Churchill Downs without having one, so.....hahaha! It cost me \$12 for the experience — I had a couple sips and left the rest. It was actually pretty good, but oh-so very strong and I had a long drive and day ahead of me, so thought it was best to just say I tried one and move on.

After Churchill Downs, I started out on a little over an hour and a half drive to Lexington with plans to go to the Kentucky
Horse Park and whatever else grabbed my attention along the way. The first side trip that caught my eye was Frankfort — the
capital of Kentucky. Frankfort is a lovely little town with an amazing capital building and the home of the original Bourbon
Ball candy Leguldoft resist a stop at the Rehecca Buth Candy Museum to get some of her historic Bourbon Balls and others

It seems that Ruth Booe is the Mother of the Bourbon Ball and started a candy business with her friend, Rebecca, in 1919 and kept it going until 1964, when her son took over the business. Back on the road, I saw signs for Historic Georgetown and knew I had to check it out. It was a quaint little town with lots of charm and shops. I finally made it to Lexington and the Kentucky Horse Park, where I took a horse and buggy tour led by two gorgeous Clydesdale horses. Definitely worth the long drive. On the way back to Louisville, I found a highly recommended hole in the wall BBQ restaurant out in the middle of nowhere — Red State BBQ — and had the best beef brisket dinner I've ever had! For sure this place can be the poster child for don't judge a book by the cover and one you really should put on your to do' list if in the Lexington area! Also, venturing out beyond Louisville gave me the joys of seeing the absolute beauty of the great state of Kentucky — rolling hills and miles of horse farms, board fences, and the deepest blue grass I've ever seen in my life.

### Holley, F-H-M will form combined **Murray Joint Fire District**

HULBERTON — The fire commissioners the Fancher-Hulberton-Murray Holley joint fire districts voted on Sept. 16 to form a new Murray Joint Fire District that combines F-H-M and Holley. The new joint district will take effect on Jan. 1. The commissioners from the two districts need to work together before then for a budget for the new district and also to pick the fire chief and a deputy chief for the Murray Joint Fire District.

F-H-M and Holley will continue to have separate volunteer fire companies that comprise the personnel. Those fire companies will pick a station chief and the line officers at Holley and F-H-M. The joint district will have elected commissioners

who will pick the district fire chief and district deputy chief, and the commissioners will also set the budget and oversee spending and the equipment for the district. Fire commissioners moved to consolidate the district citing manpower concerns and

potential budget efficiencies. The two fire companies already work together on many fire calls and emergency responses in Murray. F-H-M covers about a third of Murray, the western end, while Holley's district covers the rest of Murray including the Village of Holley.

The consolidated district will have one tax rate for the entire town. In 2020, property owners in the Holley Joint Fire District pay \$1.80 per \$1,000 of assessed property while F-H-M pays a \$1.39-rate. The consolidated district will result in a lower rate for Holley, while F-H-M's goes up.

The average Holley property owner will see the fire protection tax go up \$10 to \$20 in F-H-M, while Holley's drops \$10 to \$20, said David Garwood, an attorney with Pinsky Law Group in Syracuse. His firm advised the two districts in the consolidation. "The net effect for the average taxpayer is fairly small," Garwood said. "It's not a huge change."

Holley's rate is higher mainly due to the debt service on a new ladder truck. That truck will become property of the new joint fire district, meaning F-H-M will have ownership in that truck, Garwood said. Eventually, F-H-M will have some of its equipment and fire trucks get too old. F-H-M may not have to replace some of them because Holley will already have it, offering F-H-M savings in the future, said Ed Morgan, a F-H-M commissioner.

The agreement was unanimously approved by the fire commissioners at the meeting on Wednesday. Mark Porter of Holley made a motion to approve the agreement, which was seconded by Frank Balys of Holley. They voted in favor of the consolidation, along with Doug Heath and David Knapp of Holley, and the F-H-M commissioners of Bob Miller, Bill Bower and Ed Morgan. Al Buell of F-H-M and Chris Glogowski of Holley weren't at the meeting. F-H-M also has one vacancy among the commissioners.

Each year, there is a fire commissioner up for election in Holley and F-H-M. In the next three years, only one will be elected annually. That will reduce the group from 10 to seven members. Holley's assets total \$3,241,059, about twice the value of F-H-M's at \$1,541,391. Holley's liabilities are at \$685,000 for the bond to pay off the new ladder truck. F-H-M's only liabilities are a \$20,000 lease for the fire hall which is paid annually. to the F-H-M Volunteer Fire Company.

David Knapp, one of the fire commissioners form Holley, said the fire trucks and apparatus will be labelled Murray Joint Fire District. That might not happen right away on all the trucks, but the district would like to begin labelling some of the trucks for the new joint fire district in 2021.

The community probably won't notice the change to the Murray Joint Fire District because the two fire companies already function as a team on many mutual aid calls. "It will be a seamless transition," Garwood said. "You work together anyway right now."

## TO ALL CONCERNED RESIDENTS OF BARRE:

In response to the application filed by Apex, the Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment sent them a letter identifying seventeen problems they had to fix before the application could move forward to formal consideration.

How can it be the case that a huge company like Apex, who employs many lawyers, submits an application so badly written that the Electric Generation Siting board finds seventeen deficiencies in it that have to be fixed before the application can even be considered? Don't all these lawyers between them have the competency to fill out an application? The experience Apex boasts of having in this area would suggest they shouldn't be making these mistakes.

We would like to explain and discuss the many problems with their application here for you to understand.

**Problem 1)** As part of the application Apex was supposed to submit a map that showed all properties that would contain a major component of electrical generating equipment or related equipment, and any other properties within 2,000 feet of those properties, properly labeled with the tax parcel number and owner of each property. However, the Maple St. and Oak Orchard Road parcel numbers are missing. Either it was left out deliberately, or they did shoddy research.

<u>Problem 2</u>) The application is supposed to include a map of the existing zoning districts and proposed zoning districts within the affected area of the project, including what is and isn't permitted in each zone. However, the map they submitted completely left out the <u>Town of Barre</u> in spite of the fact that we are the host of these proposed turbines. The application goes on to claim that Wind energy generation is allowed in any of the town's zoning districts as long as they have the correct permits, but they only identify the requirements for one of the three districts they mention

<u>Problem 3)</u> The application has different widths listed for the access roads in the site plan drawings and the decommissioning plans creating an unresolved inconsistency. This is par for the course with Apex, whose proposals are typically not well defined or easy to understand.

<u>Problem 4)</u> The setbacks for turbines from occupied structures are inconsistent with the height of the turbines. This being one of the primary concerns of the residents of Barre, this should be very well laid out in the plans. Also, the setbacks should be from the *property lines*, and not from the edge of the occupied structures. The law states that nobody can build anything within the potential fall zone of the turbine which is twice its height or more. If someone else's turbine is on the edge of their land up against the edge of *your* land, then you will lose the right to build anything in the area where the windmill may fall. Once Apex has an agreement in place, they will request right of way permits, which will give them the right to use your land even if you do not have a turbine lease on your property.

<u>Problem 5)</u> The drawings in the application do not include the necessary local setbacks related to the proposed collection substation, Point of Interconnection switchyard, and Operations & Maintenance building. Was this omission deliberate to keep the people from realizing how close to their homes the high voltage equipment would be placed?

<u>Problem 6</u>) The citing board states that architectural drawings for the collector substation are missing the necessary elevation views throughout the application. Also, the application doesn't have architectural drawings for the POI (Point of interconnection) switchyard. Was this another deliberate omission?

<u>Problem 7)</u> The design drawings for underground and overhead power collection circuits contain <u>NONE</u> of the necessary details regarding Right of Way, limits of disturbance, anticipated depth and level of cover, clearing with limits for construction and operation of the facility and elevations for overhead facilities and transmission lines, structure layouts, span lengths and separation requirements. Right of way are usually requested after the signing of the agreement with the host community, therefore the town will grant right of way in order to keep the project going, which will leave residents who do not have a lease with Apex having no say over who can or cannot come on their property for the purposes of the project.

**Problem 8**) The citing board states that the application requires that the owners of record for all parcels included within the facility site and for all adjacent properties <u>must</u> be provided, but this was not done. Why were the names of the lease holders and the owners of adjacent properties left off? This is quite the omission and the idea that it is an accident is laughable.

<u>Problem 9</u>) The application requires that Apex must include the results of a literature review on any public health and safety concerns associated with potential 'blade throw' and tower collapse. The relevant exhibit (#15) in the application does not report on manufacturer recommendations or local requirements for this issue. How could one omit the manufacturer recommendations?

**Problem 10)** The application requires that Apex must include sound power level information from the manufacturers of the turbines, however this information was <u>not</u> included with the application. One of the primary concerns surrounding wind turbine projects is infra-sound, therefore this is an alarming omission.

**Problem 11)** The application requires that Apex must include the full Archeological Phase 1B report, which they failed to do. They only included a summary. Was this omitted because of the possibility of Indian grave sites?

<u>Problem 12</u>) The application requires that Apex must identify and evaluate reasonable mitigation measures regarding the impact of blasting and the use of alternative technologies or structures, and a plan for compensating people for damages that may occur from blasting. No alternate technologies were described and no plan for compensating individuals for blasting damage was described. The blasting locations were also not concisely described. A plan for compensating people for damages incurred by blasting is essential before any work can be allowed to begin.

<u>Problem 13)</u> The application requires a map, based on publicly available information, that shows all areas of the study that impact groundwater. However, the map supplied by Apex does not show groundwater flow direction as required. Their map is also required to be parcel-based for the purposes of showing the locations of public and private water supply wells, which it does not do. Without a properly conducted water flow study this could result in wells running dry or crops not getting enough water or the loss of wetlands

<u>Problem 14</u>) The application requires that Apex identify the nearest downstream drinking-water supply intake to the facility site, or specifically state that they take the position that no surface water intakes would be adversely impact, which they did not do. We need a statement from Apex as to where they think the nearest drinking water supply intake is so that we as citizens can verify what they are telling us.

<u>Problem 15</u>) The application requires Apex to propose various ways of reducing the visual impact of construction on the area, including a simulation that illustrates how the mitigation will be prepared for the observation points where it is proposed to go in. Apex proposes to reduce the visual contrast with some form of perimeter plantings, but no simulation was provided for this planting so the board could not be clear on what they are proposing to do. We will need to see how Apex intends to reduce the visual impact of their construction before we can make an informed decision about their project and any potential damage to the native environment.

<u>Problem 16)</u> The application requires Apex to provide a summary of their consultations with relevant emergency service providers (first responders and helicopter rescue etc...), which they did not do. Why was a summary omitted? It is extremely important to establish that Apex is prepared to deal with emergency situations as they may arise. The turbines cannot simply be allowed to burn if a fire takes place because this could easily wipe out an entire field and endanger the surrounding residents.

<u>Problem 17</u>) The application requires Apex to list all of the requests they anticipate making to the Board for the purposes of their project. Apex states that they anticipate requesting the Siting Board to authorize NYSDOT to issue "over-sized vehicle permits, highway work permits, and other ministerial permits associated with road work in State highways or rights-of-ways." However, this statement in the application does not clearly state what exactly Apex intends to ask for, which it <u>must</u> do. We will need specific details about where, when and what type of vehicles are to be used before this request can be evaluated as to whether or not it is in the interest of the town to grant it. We need to know what hours these oversized vehicles will be operating, how much greenhouse gas we can expect them to dump into our air, and the total number of vehicle miles traveled on *our* roads. Apex's failure to disclose this crucial information shows blatant disregard for the host community and their indifference to committing a huge environmental injustice.

We are extremely concerned that a *supposedly* expert Wind Turbine firm like Apex could have so many problems and inconsistencies in their Article 10 application. Aren't they supposed to have done this before? Several of the problems involve a failure to include the owners of land parcels, property setbacks, and even a failure to include our town in their map of affected zoning districts! They didn't include technical information from the turbine manufacturers about windmill collapse or blade throw and they left out the technical information on sound power levels. They didn't include a plan to compensate people for damage to their property from blasting and they didn't bother to specify their Right of Way requirements or conversations with emergency services. Apex is simply *not* prepared. With all these inconsistencies can the residents of Barre really trust Apex to honor their agreements?

Just for the information of the Residents of the Town of Barre, the town supervisor and town attorney made some changes to the Town of Barre wind laws and took them to the Orleans County legislature board for presentation. However, they were not given permission by the board of the Town of Barre to do this. The information was not even given to the Barre town board members until an hour before the Barre town board meeting on Wednesday, August 12<sup>th</sup> 2020. They did not have time to read these changes or discuss them but the town supervisor pressured them to pass them anyway. It was refreshing to see that the board rejected this pressure and requested a workshop meeting to discuss the changes before voting on them. It would be good if the town Board of Barre registered an official reaction to two recent independent surveys, one conducted by Mr. McKenna and the other conducted by Citizens for a Better Barre. Both surveys overwhelmingly reported that the residents of the Town of Barre do not want the windmills to be constructed. A petition presented by Ms. Swan showing between 200 and 250 residents supporting the windmills consisted mostly of leaseholders and their family members. We ask the board to represent the majority of residents within the Town of Barre and not just the vested interests of a relative few.

### **SIGNS OF A STROKE**

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking a few simple questions:

Ask the person to SMILE.

Ask the person to TALK AND SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE. i.e. It is sunny out today.

Ask the person to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

Ask the person to **STICK OUT HIS TONGUE**. If the tongue goes to one side or the other, that is a sign of a stroke.

#### **OTHER STROKE WARNING SIGNS** • Sudden **numbness or weakness** of the face, arm or leg, especially

- on one side of the body
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden, severe headache with no known cause

## Signs of a HEART






