





- * For a little extra visibility in the basement, try applying glow-in-the-dark or reflective tape on the edges of the stairs.







Buddy is our delightful, incorrigible Umbrella cockatoo who has ruled the front lobby for over 13 years. When April has to leave the office to take care of other shelter business throughout the shelter, Buddy screams for her. He wants his beloved friend to be in his sight.

Years ago when April was going to be gone for a week for the first time since we got Buddy, I had no idea how he would survive the week (or how we would survive his yelling). I took a picture of April, printed it on a sheet of paper and taped it to his cage. The entire time she was gone, he sat

Do your loved ones know that you love them? Be a Buddy and never hesitate to tell them.

We really did not think that the window frame needed to be destroyed in the couple of minutes someone put his cage to close to the window and then left the office. 'Modern Gothic' Daybed

George Hunzinger (1835-1898) was born in Germany and trained as a cabinetmaker. In 1855, he emigrated to the United States and started making his own style of furniture, chairs and tables made of wood or wire inspired by pipes, machinery and his 21 patented designs and methods. He invented or improved extension, swivel top and nesting tables; reclining and folding chairs; platform rockers; convertible beds; and a woven seat made of fabric-covered wire. A woven wire bed was sold recently by Neal Auction Company. It had an adjustable back and curved arms, but most importantly, it still had the original fabric-wrapped metal wire webbing Hunzinger patent-

ed in 1879. It sold for \$3,125. This new material cut the cost of making a chair, and he sold his novel chairs for the low price of \$30. Collectors have no trouble recognizing his work because most of it is stamped with his name and the patent date. He made copies of his furniture in a variety of wood finishes and upholstery materials that were bought by a diverse range of customers. And he had sales offices, agents and catalogs in many countries. Hunzinger furniture was very different from the period designs, and the Neal catalog called the daybed a "Modern Gothic" piece.

• I'd like some information and value for a toy washing machine I played with about 1932. It's labeled "Busy Betty Washing Machine, No. 354" and says, "Patent Applied for, the Hoge Manufacturing Co. Inc., New York, N.Y., USA." It's metal with white enamel paint, glass tub and removable wringer. It's 10 1/2 inches high and is in perfect condition.

A. Hampden Hoge started the Hoge Manufacturing Company in 1909. At first, it made office supplies. It started making toys in 1931. Toy washing machines, sweepers, sewing machines, cars, trains and other toys were made. The No. 354 model Busy Betty Washing Machine was listed in the company's 1936 catalog, which said the machine "actually

washes" and "grownups can use it to wash handkerchiefs and other small items." A slightly different model was made later. Production ended in 1939, and the company was sold to the Mattatuck Manufacturing Co. The value of your toy washing machine is about \$360, more if in mint condition.

Utilities bill payment scam

Danville Utilities is again warning its customers about a payment scam involving a threat to disconnect service within 30 minutes if payment of their utility bill is not made immediately.

The scammers are using a local phone number that is spoofed as Danville Utilities. The caller falsely claims to be with the Utilities Department and threatens to disconnect service if the customer does not make immediate payment. The customer is asked to provide a debit card or credit card number in order to make payment.

A warning about a similar scam was issued in early September.

Danville Utilities does not make phone calls to customers about disconnects. Any notice of disconnection is done by mail.

Businesses often are targets of utility bill payment scams, but households appear to be the target of this scam.

Utility bill payment scams are not new. Guard against fraud. Never provide a Social Security number, credit card number or banking information to anyone requesting it unless you initiated the contact and know the identity of the person with whom you are speaking.

If you receive a call from someone you do not know and who is urging you to make a payment to Danville Utilities, capture the phone number and then hang up and contact the Division of Customer Accounts at 434-799-5125 or visit the Charles H. Harris Financial Service Center, which is located at 311 Memorial Drive.

HOLLYWOOD — Gloria Steinem, who spearheaded the women's liberation movement of the late 1960s and 1970s, is finally getting her due. Originally intended for theaters, "The Glorias" began streaming Sept. 30 via Amazon Prime. Gloria as a child is played by Lulu Wilson, then Alicia Vikander, Oscar winner for "The Danish Girl," takes over, followed by "Just Alice" Oscar-winner Julianne Moore as an older Gloria. Two-time Oscar nominee Bette Midler plays Bella Abzug, and "Ordinary People" Oscar-winner Timothy Hutton portrays Gloria's father.

Julianne Moore is currently pre-paring to play the mother of Evan Hansen in the film version of the Tony Award-winning best musical "Dear Evan Hansen," which made Tony winner Ben Platt a star. Platt completed two seasons of Netflix's "The Politician," which is not likely to have a third season; however, he'll recreate his success as Evan Hansen. Six-time Oscar nominee Amy Adams will sing in the film. Adams is due in two Netflix features, first in "Women in the Window," with Oscar-winners Julianne Moore and Gary Oldman, along with Anthony Mackie and Jennifer Jason **Leigh**. It's available for streaming Oct. 4. Adams and **Glenn Close** will star in Oscar-winning director Ron Howard's film, "Hillbilly Elegy," which will be available in November. Between them, Adams and Close have 13 Oscar nominations, but have never won.

Congratulations to choreographer Mandy Moore, who recently won a third Emmy for choreography for "Zoey's Extraordinary Playlist." Not to be confused with actress/singer Mandy Moore in "This Is Us," dance guru Moore choreographed "So You Think You Can Dance" (2010-2017), "La La Land" (2016), "Second Act" (2018) with **Jennifer Lopez**, and the upcoming "Star Girl" and "Valley Girl" films. The award was presented to Moore at events between Sept. 14-17.

when he started making the comingof-age movie "Boyhood," with Ethan Hawke, Patricia Arquette and Ellar Coltrane. With a \$4 million budget, it took 12 years to complete, with Linklater turning 53 when it was done. "Boyhood" won a Golden Globe for best picture, drama, best director and best supporting actress for Patricia Arquette, and netted six Oscar nominations, though only Arquette won for supporting actress. It made \$57 million at the box office.

Now Linklater, at 59, is beginning another project, the musical comedy "Merrily We Roll Along," based on a musical comedy by Stephen Sondheim, George Furth, George S. Irving and Moss Hart. Joining Ben Platt, 26, are Beanie Feldman, 27, of "Lady Bird" (2017) and "Booksmart" (2019), and Blake Jenner, 28, who was Ryder Lynn on "Glee." Both were with Platt in his Netflix concert film, "Ben Platt Live From Radio City Music Hall." His new film will shoot over 20 years, which means Linklater will be 79 and his stars will be 46, 47 and 48, respectively. At that pace maybe it should be called "Merrily We Crawl Along!'

Cinnamon Apple Pie Bread



Forget the pie crust and get all the flavors of fall in a quick and easy bread with brown sugar and cinnamon topping that's as sweet as apple pie.

1/3 cup light brown sugar (not packed)

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

2/3 cup white sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup salted butter, softened (or use unsalted and add ¼ tsp salt)

2 eggs

1½ teaspoons vanilla extract

1½ cups all-purpose flour

1¾ teaspoons baking powder

½ cup milk

1 apple, peeled and chopped (I used Granny Smith)

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a 9 x 5-inch loaf pan.

Mix brown sugar and cinnamon together in a mixing bowl and set aside.

Beat white sugar and butter together in a bowl using an electric mixer until smooth and creamy. Beat in eggs, 1 at a time, until incorporated; add va-

nilla extract and stir until incorporated.

Combine flour and baking powder together in another bowl; stir into creamed butter mixture.

Mix milk into batter until smooth.

Pour half the batter into the prepared loaf pan. Next add half the apples and half the brown sugar cinnamon mixture. Lightly pat/push apple mixture into

Pour the remaining batter over apple layer; top with remaining apples and add more brown sugar/cinnamon mixture.

Lightly pat/push apples into batter; swirl brown sugar mixture through apples using a finger or spoon (I cleaned my hands and used my finger because it was

Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted in the center of the loaf comes out clean, 30 to 40 minutes. Mine took about 35.

Tip: If you notice it getting too brown on the top, cover it loosely with tin foil and continue baking until the inside is done. Enjoy!



The Value of Using Irrevocable Trusts in Medicaid Planning (Part 2 of 2)

Last month, we started talking about the value of using irrevocable trusts in Medicaid planning instead of just gifting assets outright. In this month's article, we will continue to talk about some additional benefits of utilizing irrevocable trusts. Ability to Make Trust Assets Non-countable for Beneficiaries' Medicaid or SSI It is a sad fact that an outright gift or bequest from a donor, such as a parent, to a disabled donee can result in the donee becoming ineligible for means-based governmental benefits that he or she was eligible for before the gift or bequest, or soon would have become eligible for. In such situations, unless irrevocable trust planning is then done to establish a "self-settled special needs trust," the gifted or bequeathed assets typically get consumed for the donee's care and once they are gone, the donee goes onto the governmental benefits from which the gift or bequest disqualified him or her until consumed. One way of looking at this outcome is that the indirect recipient of the gift or bequest was the governmental benefit program from which the gift disqualified the disabled person for a period of time. This is generally considered poor planning.

Better planning is for the gift or bequest to be made in an irrevocable special needs trust for benefit of the disabled beneficiary, so that the gift or bequest will be managed to enhance the living conditions of the disabled beneficiary by paying for things that the governmental benefits do not pay for. If a disabled person becomes entitled to an outright gift or bequest, or an outright gift or bequest recipient later becomes disabled, depending on the age of the disabled person, it may be possible to establish a "self-settled special needs trust" for the disabled beneficiary. Such trusts (funded with assets of the disabled person) must contain a provision stating that upon the death of the disabled beneficiary any remaining trust assets must pay back the state up to the full amount of Medicaid benefits received by the beneficiary, and only after the state is reimbursed may any excess pass to other beneficiaries such as other relatives. The payback provision requirement is Congress's "quid pro quo" – the balancing deal that makes it fair for the disabled person's otherwise disqualifying assets to be set aside in a Medicaid- and Supplemental Security Income-non-countable trust that is nonetheless able to be consumed by the trustee for benefit of the disabled person to supplement but not replace the governmental benefits.

Ability to Specify Terms and Incentives for Beneficiaries' Use of Trust Assets

Many parents or grandparents desire to infuse their planning for their children or grandchildren with positive aspirations. Such goals may be as simple as that the gifts or bequests may only be used for the recipients' education, to finance a career change or buy a home. Or the goals may be more serious, for example, establishing that the intended recipient will only become eligible to receive the gift or bequest if he or she participates in a drug or alcohol rehabilitation program or gives up some other behavior that the donor wants to create an incentive for the donee to abandon. Such planning goals of a client almost always indicate an irrevocable trust with beneficiary incentive provisions as the vehicle to implement the plan. This is completely compatible with Medicaid asset protection planning for seniors at the same time.

Ability to Decide Which Beneficiaries Will Inherit Upon Settlor's Death

The retained Limited Power of Appointment referred to above (sometimes called a Special Power of Appointment) preserves for the settlor the power to decide who within a designated class of recipients will receive the benefits of the trust, how much they will receive, and in what way they will receive it. The class of potential recipients can be as broad as everyone in the world except the settlor and his or her creditors, and the settlor's estate and its creditors. Most often, however, the class of potential appointees consists of the settlor's descendants, certain other relatives or in-laws, and/or certain charities. Such a Limited Power of Appointment (LPOA) can determine whether the trust is a grantor or non-grantor trust, as well, so the specific language of the LPOA must be crafted carefully with regard to the grantor trust rules of the Tax Code. As an aside, a power of appointment is sometimes referred to jokingly as a "power of disappointment" because it truly retains for the settlor or other power holder the power to disinherit someone who acts badly.

Ability to Determine Successor Beneficiaries

A major concern in Medicaid asset protection planning and estate planning in general is who will be the successor beneficiaries of anything a client leaves to someone. If the gift or bequest passes outright, the recipient has control through lifetime consumption of assets and income or through his or her estate plan, to determine who will receive anything that the initial recipient doesn't use up. Of course, the recipient's creditors or predators also may gain control over the assets and income gifted outright to the initial recipient. If the client would prefer to designate that only blood descendants, or descendants and their spouses, and/or certain charities will receive what is not consumed by the initial recipient, an irrevocable trust is a key instrument to create such a plan. This is true almost regardless of the initial size of the gift or bequest – if a modest amount of funds are left in trust, there may nevertheless be a remainder to pass to a successor beneficiary or even another successor beneficiary. This sounds like a "dynasty trust" and it actually is, even though it is of modest size. The point is that by use of an irrevocable trust, the client has the option to decide who the possible recipients will be, and even to grant limited powers of appointment to the named recipients in order to give them some control as well.

Analysis of Need to File a Federal Gift Tax Return for Year of Funding

A goal of many planners in design of irrevocable trusts is to make the initial trust-funding gift(s) "incomplete" for tax purposes. The purpose is generally to prevent the settlor from having to file a federal gift tax return for the year(s) of the funding transaction(s), assuming that the taxpayer makes no other "taxable gifts" in any such year.

There is a split of authority with the Internal Revenue Service concerning when transfers to an irrevocable trust are considered "complete," thus requiring the filing of an income tax return. Normally there will not be any gift tax due (the current laws allow an individual to give away \$5 million in assets during their lifetime without paying any tax on the gift) but it is important to follow the rules that do require filing a gift tax return, even if no tax is due. Every situation is different and it is always highly recommended to consult with a tax professional on any questions in this case to be safe!

In conclusion, the above discussions demonstrate that use of irrevocable trusts in Medicaid planning, as in other fields of estate planning, provides many opportunities to create great benefits beyond simply transferring assets. Some or most of these benefits may be achieved through the use of an irrevocable trust. If care is taken to include the correct and desired provisions, an irrevocable trust can greatly enhance the value of the clients' Medicaid planning beyond what can be accomplished through simple outright gifting.

Helping Seniors Recognize Fake News and Propaganda

Dear Savvy Senior,

Are there any resources that you know of that can help seniors detect fake news? My 75-year-old mother shares a lot of misinformation with her family and friends that she sees on Facebook. I've talked to her about it, but for some reason she has a difficult time deciphering real news from fake news and propaganda.

Frustrated Daughter

Dear Frustrated,

Unfortunately, the digital misinformation problem your mom is experiencing is not uncommon. According to researchers from Princeton and New York University, people aged 65 and older are up to seven times more likely to share fake news and dubious links on social media than their younger counterparts.

Why?

There are several theories. The first is that many seniors started using social media sites like Facebook only within the past five or six years and may lack the digital literacy skills to identify false or misleading content.

Some other possible theories are that most seniors experience some cognitive decline as they age, making them more likely to fall for hoaxes. Many older Americans also suffer from chronic loneliness which can cause them to share misinformation as an attempt to make connections with other people. And studies have shown that older people are generally more trusting than younger generations, which can make them more gullible.

All this is particularly concerning now as we sit in the midst of a global health pandemic and a 2020 election season, both of which are ripe with misinformation, rumors and conspiracy theories. And seniors are prime targets of this false/misleading information because they are much more likely to vote than their younger cohorts and are much more vulnerable to getting sick and dying if they contract COVID-19.

Where to Get Help

To help your mom detect and combat online misinformation there are several great resources she can turn to that offer free courses and tips.

One is MediaWise for Seniors, a project of the Poynter Institute, which offers two free online courses to help seniors detect and combat online misinformation – see Poynter.org/mediawise-for-seniors.

The first four-week course has already filled up, but your mom can still enroll in a self-directed course called "Hands-On Lessons to Separate Fact and Fiction Online." It is hosted by Christiane Amanpour and Joan Lunden, and is scheduled to begin Sept. 24, but she can take the course anytime.

In addition, Poynter has worked with AARP to produce Fact Tracker interactive videos and a webinar on spotting and filtering misinformation at AARP.org/facttracker.

Some other free course options you should look into include Senior Planet, which is offering a one-hour online course on "How to Spot Fake News" at SeniorPlanet.org.

The News Literacy Project that provides the Checkology virtual classroom, which was initially created for middle and high school students, is now offering an independent learners option that is ideal for older adults – see Get.Checkology. org. Their lessons will help your mom detect the difference between news, opinion and propaganda.

And Coursera, a free world-wide online learning platform, which offers an indepth six-week course called "Making Sense of the News: News Literacy Lessons for Digital Citizens," which she can access at Coursera.org/learn/news-literacy.

There are also many good websites, like PolitiFact.com, Snopes.com and FactCheck.org that will let your mom fact check a story to help her identify fact versus fiction. These sites have most likely already fact-checked the latest viral claim to pop up in her news feed.

Now More Than Ever, Get Your Flu Shot

A sincere wish just came true: This year's highdose senior version of the flu shot will contain all four vaccines. In past years, the senior shot (for those over age 65) contained only three of the vaccines, two A and one B. Most years I would write a snarly note to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and ask about the reason for the false economy. Of course I never got a reply, but now ... finally, we seniors will have a flu shot with all four vac-

And what a shot it will be. The four vaccines are names we haven't heard in a while, if ever: A/ Guangdong-Maonan (H1N1), A/Hong Kong (H3N2), B/Washington and B/Phuket. To help us kick start our immune system, the senior version will contain four times the amount that younger folks get. The standard trivalent (threeway) will have two A and one B, while the standard quadrivalent (four-way) has all four. If your doctor says you should have a flu shot, don't delay. When I called my pharmacy (where I get my flu shots each year), the first appointment was many days out, and they had been swamped with requests for the shot. Yes, they will be resupplied when they run out, but no, they didn't know how quickly that would be. By getting a flu shot, should you get sick later this season, it will be a good bet that it's not the regular flu, which will save much time in getting a diagnosis.

To find flu shots, call your doctor, local pharmacies, grocery stores or go to vaccinefinder.org. If you have a Medicare or insurance card, you won't have to pay anything.




