

They had just announced plans to remodel and expand next door into a new bar space when a construction fire happened.

The fire happened way back in the "old world" of October 2019. The business: restaurant and bar -- was opened again on Monday, September 14. It was nicely remodeled and the staff breezed around with smiles when this writer visited on Sept. 17. They said they were excited to be busy.

Manager Stephanie Hart said she was very pleased with the steady stream of customers since reopening.

Out the window, to the south of the workout room, are many plots for community gardens.


Julie from Deerwood was there one recent evening, pulling up the last of her bounty. With the mild weather, many things were still growing.

Crosby man killed near Trommald

A 57-year-old Crosby man was killed Sunday, Sept. 27, after the 1998 GMC Sierra truck he was driving struck a tree south of Trommald, Crow Wing County Sheriff Scott Goddard reported.


Crow Wing County Sheriff deputies were dispatched at 11:01 a.m. to a one-vehicle

crash at the intersection of Iverson Road and South Black Bear Road south of the city of Trommald.

On arrival, deputies located one deceased male, identified as Stacy Elmer Walls, in the driver seat. There were no other occupants. The crash appears to have been unwitnessed and the reporting party only happened upon the scene. A preliminary investigation showed the vehicle was traveling northbound on Iverson Road, crossed South Black Bear Road and crashed into a tree on the northeast corner of the intersection. The Sheriff's Office was assisted at the scene by the Crosby Police Department, Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Minnesota State Patrol, Ironton Fire Department and Cuyuna Regional Medical Center ambulance.

I mentioned to her that the law and city policy requires preapproval on items over \$2,500 and did she know that to which she responded yes.

It is my opinion that Ms. Peeples actions have tarnished the integrity of the entire city council and I ask that she resign immediately.

He was born on May 25, 1933 to Levi and Tillie Anderson of Ironton. He was a


graduate of Crosby Ironton High School. He obtained a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from the University of Minnesota.


