The Livingston County Department of Health (LCDOH) would like to remind residents that it offers COVID-19 Diagnostic Testing on a limited basis. LCDOH works in conjunction with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) Wadsworth Center to provide this testing.

The LCDOH community-based testing site is located at 2 Murray Hill Drive in Mount Morris. Please call 585-243-7270 Monday-Friday, 8:00AM-4:00PM to determine if you qualify for testing and to set up an appointment. No walk-ins are allowed.

Jennifer Rodriguez, Livingston County's Public Health Director, stated, "Our community-based testing site makes COVID-19 diagnostic testing more accessible to our residents. Increasing access to testing is essential to quickly identifying contacts and mitigating the spread of COVID-19."

"We thank the New York State Department of Health and the team at Wadsworth for partnering with us on this much needed, vital service," said Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle.



Dear "Speak Out,"

In a democracy it's important that we all pay attention, educate ourselves and get involved. This can encompass letters to papers, Facebook sharing, discussions with our neighbors, lobbying our representatives, campaigning for or to be elected representatives, joining civic organizations and protesting in the street.

Right now I feel compelled to respond to the misinformation and misunderstandings in Mr. Powell's last "speak out". It contained a litany of ideas that we have been inundated with since the 1980s. Over the past 20 years I have read innumerable books, articles, etc. trying to understand the value of these ideas and I have come to the conclusion that they are unsupported by facts or common morality. The revisionism that's problematic is Mr. Powell's own, not the educators who wish to deal with the facts - all the facts, the good and the bad. The facts of American history prove that the opinions Mr. Powell expresses are based on lies that he, me, and you have been told for 40 years by Wall Street, giant multi-nationals, the media and politicians in both parties.

I also know from my studies that the founding fathers as a group did not intend the constitution to be looked at the same way so many evangelicals view the christian Bible- as unalterable, unerring truth directly from God that must be obeyed without question. 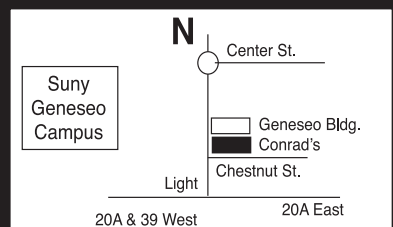

CONTINUED--- It should also be noted that there were a great number of types of people living in the America when the Constitution was written that the founding fathers gave very little consideration to when they wrote it (not because the founders were evil but because they were rich men of the late 18th century and so didn't think too much about these things). The needs, concerns and experiences of women, blacks and Native Americans were not included at all in the writing of the Constitution. So I agree with the founders that the Constitution has always been a living document to be changed, altered and (yes) interpreted by successive generations according to their needs and according to the continued changes in human society.

The federal debt and deficit are a misunderstood issue too complex to get into here; but what I can say is we can pay for our social programs by taxing the mega-rich or by running deficits. Since I'm in agreement with Jesus' morals, I prefer to keep social programs and tax the mega-rich. I'm not talking about taxing the guy or gal in town who made a million or two running a successful business. I'm talking about the mega-rich who inherited, or made, billions of dollars. I'm talking about the Wall Street banks and the giant multi-national corporations. Strong progressive taxation works. The good old days that most conservatives want to go back to were partially brought to us by a marginal top tax rate of 90% and a corporate tax rate of 50%.

Barring raising taxes on the mega-rich, I'm okay with running deficits as needed. Our current President has said "deficits don't matter". This is for two reasons. One, as our current President also said, "the United States government never has to default because you print the money." So the government can kick that can down the road as far as it wants. The debt has only ever been paid off once (in 1840) in the entire 244 year history of our nation. Two, the U.S. dollar is the reserve currency for the world. This means that if the dollar goes down, the rest of the world does. No one is going to let that happen.

As far as "boondoggles" I know from experience that they do happen, but that doesn't mean we should get rid of government social programs. It means we should police them better. Here are just a few examples of some programs that have worked over the history of our country in spite of those who tried to use them as "boondoggles": social security, medicaid and medicare, unemployment insurance, fire departments, the FDIC, roads/highways, public parks, education and the armed forces (this last one is debatable since the "boondoggles" may out-way the benefits).

I agree with Mr. Powell that our leaders are not following the will of the people. However, it seems that, based on poll after poll, most of the American people don't agree with Mr. Powell's limited view of government. The majority of people in the U.S. appear to want universal healthcare, clean air & water, higher taxes on the mega-rich (& lower taxes for themselves), and a living wage.

The reason our representatives, in both parties, are not following the will of the majority is simple and obvious- they are following the will of Wall Street banks and multi-national corporations (especially the fossil fuel industry, the pharmaceutical industry and the armaments industry).

I know that immigrants made this country great. Whether they were the unwilling African slaves or the Italian, German, Irish etc. of the 19th century. Whether they were the Mexican, South American, Asian and Indian of the 20th and 21st century. I know they come from all creeds and religions. I know many of the original European immigrants of the 17th and 18th century came to find religious freedom. So I don't want, and neither did the founders, a country that prefers one religion over another. People can worship how they want in their homes, churches, synagogues, mosques etc. but the government should not be a place to promote any one religion.

In my opinion the last thing we need to do to make America great is to keep following the same path, based on the same fallacies, we've been sliding down for 40 years.

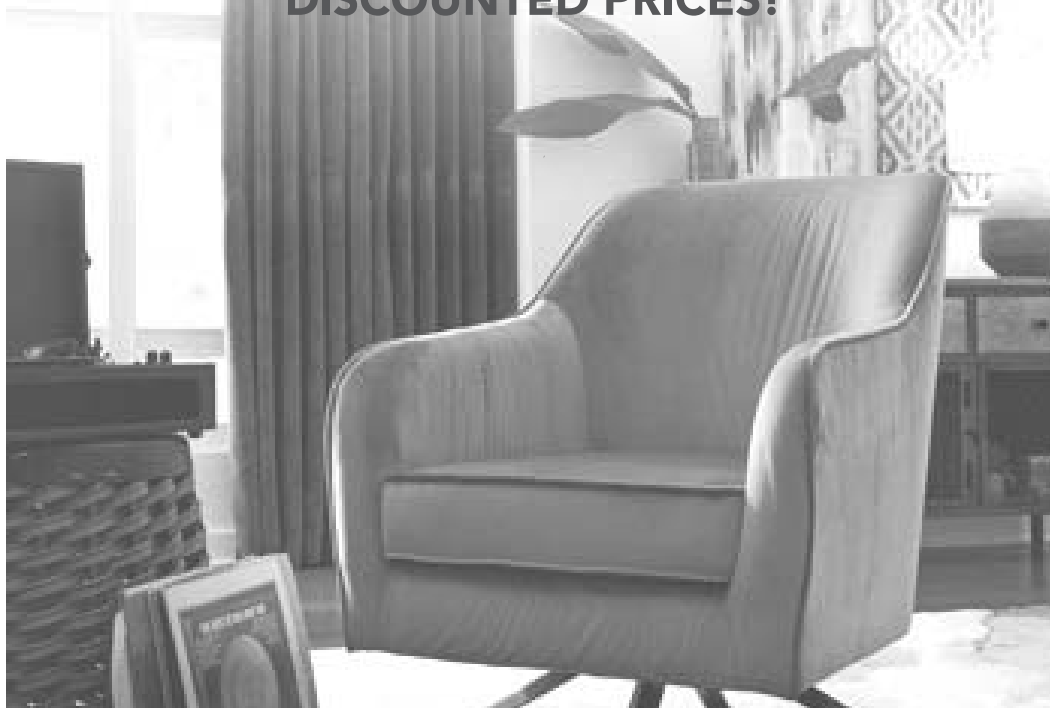

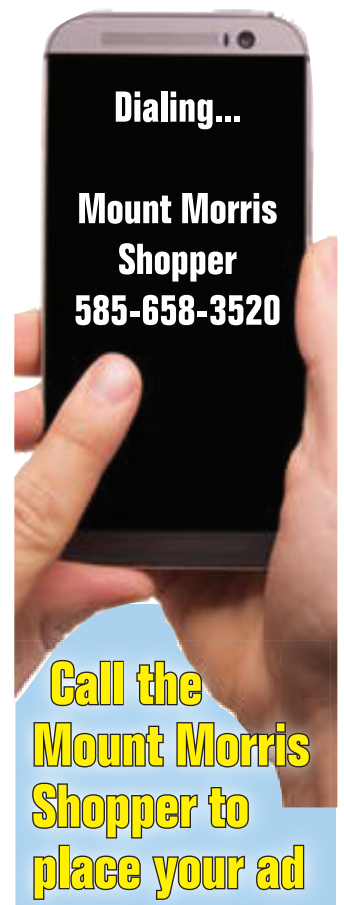

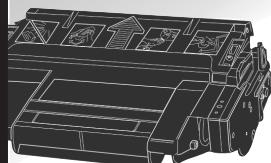

October is Health Literacy Month

Health Literacy Month is a time to bring attention to the importance of making (i) health information easy to understand and (ii) the health care system easier to navigate. According to the National Action Plan to Improve Health Literacy – prepared by the United States Department of Health and Human Services – limited health literacy is a serious issue facing patients. It states, “Nearly 9 out of 10 U.S. adults have difficulty using the everyday health information that is routinely available in our healthcare facilities, retail outlets, media, and communities.” Low health literacy is often linked to misunderstanding prescription medication instructions, a greater likelihood of taking medications incorrectly, as well as poor comprehension of nutrition labels and preventative care information.

As a patient, clear communication is the foundation to be able to understand and act on health information. Ask Me 3, an educational program developed by health literacy experts at the Partnership for Clear Health Communication, promotes three simple, but essential, questions for every healthcare interaction:

- **What is my main problem?**
- **What do I need to do?**
- **Why is it important for me to do this?**


