

For food lovers, farmers markets all over Texas are diverse and interesting places. There you might find exotic varieties of your favorite veggies and fruits that you can see up-close and maybe even sample before buying. I appreciate the imaginative growers who are also vendors at farmers markets. For example, here are two varieties of beans...Anasazi and Asparagus... which I had never seen before, and I found them both at Winnsboro Farmers Market stands during October!

These small kidney-shaped purple and white beans have a long, even ancient history, having been a part of the human diet for thousands of years. In the same family as pinto, the colorful Anasazi are used in Latin and Southwest cultural menus. They are also marketed as New Mexico Cave Beans and Jacob's Cattle Beans. Thousands of years ago, the Anasazi (Pueblo) Indians of the SW grew beans as one of their main sources of food. They were cliff dwellers and occasionally, their preserved beans are still found in cliffdweller ruins. Once shelled, the brilliant color of the beans is amazing!



Anasazi Beans

Asparagus beans, also known as the long podded cowpea, Chinese long bean or snake bean, can grow a foot or even longer. The green pods, filled with white beans formed in a row, are actually best when picked at an immature stage, and cooked like green beans. Those who cultivate them say they're entertaining to grow, love hot, humid conditions and are delicious! Some growers actually prefer them over green beans, because there's more bean and less work! You will

probably have to order this variety from a seed supplier.

What about the plants that bear these beans? Yardlong bean plants are usually growing up to 10 to 12 feet tall, so they need support, like a pole or lattice to help keep the vines upright. The Asparagus Bean can be eaten raw, cooked like a vegetable, or by drying its seeds and using them for next year's garden. You can develop this variety in your terrace garden, container, or patio very easily. The characteristic of this plant is that it grows fast and produces fast fruits. Pods grow fast too, several inches per day, and that means a daily harvest! Don't plan to go on vacation with these in the garden unless you have someone to pick them in your absence!





Asparagus or Yard-Long Beans



#### Here's some planting tips:

A 3-gallon container can grow 2 plants.

Use a clay pot or a plastic tub at least 8-12 inches deep

Soil type does not matter as asparagus beans are not very picky about the soil that they are planted in.

Sow seeds 3 inches apart and cover with 2 inches of fine soil.

Firm them lightly and water gently.

Seedlings emerge in 10-14 days depending on soil and weather conditions. Keep sowing bean seeds every 2 weeks for a constant supply of beans. It is recommended that you soak the beans for 24 hours before planting. And remember, neither the foliage nor the seed of this Asian pole bean plant resembles green beans!.



### Tips to prevent spread of COVID-19

COVID-19 is thought to spread mainly from person to person: between people who are in close contact, within 6 feet, of one another; and via respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs or sneezes. The droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs.

People are thought to be most contagious when they are most symptomatic (the sickest). Some spread might be possible before people show symptoms; there have been reports of this with this new coronavirus, but this is not thought to be the main way the virus spreads.

Thus, the CDC and DSHS offer these tips to help prevent the spread of COVID -19:

Wash hands often for 20 seconds and encourage others to do the same.

If no soap and water are available, use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue, then throw the tissue away. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands. Disinfect surfaces, buttons, handles, knobs, and other places touched often.

Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Department of State Health Services also recommends that you start practicing social distancing. Social distancing involves staying away from other people to avoid catching or spreading illness. It is a fancy term for avoiding crowds and minimizing physical contact. This could mean avoiding concerts or weddings, skipping the handshake, and/or staying at least 6 feet away from others.

### **CHILI SEASON IS UPON US**

**Tumbleweed Smith** 



I met H. Allen Smith at his home in Alpine in 1969. He was a big deal celebrity: Hollywood screen writer, nationally syndicated newspaper columnist, an author of magazine articles in Esquire and similar magazines and a frequent guest on television talk shows. His books stayed on the bestseller list a hundred days at a time. He was profiled by Edward R. Murrow. H. Allen was a humorist. He coined the phrase "To Hell in a Handbasket." Once when he looked up a word in a dictionary he discovered the example of how the word was used happened to be something he had written. He moved to Alpine from Mt. Kisco, New York in 1967. I went to interview

him about chili.

H. Allen is responsible for our Texas Chili Culture that began after he wrote a magazine article stating he made the best chili in the world. The Austin chili maker Wick Fowler challenged H. Allen's claim and they staged the world's first chili cook-off in Terlingua in the fall of 1967. It ended in a tie.

H. Allen judged various cook-offs all over the country where cooks prepared items like sausage, tamales, menudo and barbeque. "Some of it not fit to serve to a starving jackal," he said. He turned down the chance to sample Goat Gut Tacos in Laredo. He commented on the Texans' love of beef. "Some Texans hate to even say the word pig." He has judged such chili entries as Mouth of Hell Chili, Cedar Rat Chili, Crawfish Chili, Jackrabbit Chili, Coyote Short Ribs Chili, Cabrito Chili, Armadillo Chili, Javelina Knuckles Chili, Buffalo Hump Chili, Roadrunner Chili, Raccoon Chili and Gator Tail Chili. Some cooks spice up the chili with mescal or other drinks made from desert plants. "It'll grow hair on an anvil. A man could get more flavor from a set of stewed piano keys. Some chili cooks know less about a good bowl of chili than a pregnant sow knows about Neiman Marcus. Sometimes when I even get a whiff of some types of chili, I make a noise like when you pour hot butter into a panther's ear."

H. Allen and I became close friends. I interviewed him many times after we had enjoyed a bowl of red at his table. The first time I met him I was working at a radio station. The second time we visited I had just been fired. He was most encouraging and told me, "Now you can do something."

We corresponded over the years and I treasure his letters. When he died in 1976 his widow Nelle told me I could have anything in his office. I took 2 photographs and the typewriter he had used to produce 43 novels. The photographs are on the wall of my studio and I donated the typewriter to Sul Ross State University in Alpine, which has the H. Allen Smith achieves.
