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
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

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

## PECAN PUMPKIN CRUNCH

**Ingredients** 

 4 tablespoons (1/2 stick) unsalted butter, at room temperature, plus more for baking dish

• One 15-ounce can pumpkin puree (not pie mix)

1 cup heavy cream

4 large eggs

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup packed light brown sugar, divided

1 tablespoon bourbon, optional

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon, divided

1/8 teaspoon table salt

1 1/2 cups roughly chopped pecans

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

# **Bourbon Whipped Cream**

1 cup heavy cream

1 tablespoon confectioners' sugar

1 tablespoon bourbon

Add the heavy cream to a medium bowl. Beat the cream with a hand-held mixer until thick and frothy. Add the sugar and bourbon and beat until medium peaks form.

### **Directions**

Heat the oven to 350 degrees F and arrange a rack in the middle. Coat an 8 by 8-inch baking dish with butter and set aside.

Combine the pumpkin, cream, eggs, sugar, 1/4 cup brown sugar, bourbon, if using, ginger, nutmeg, 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/8 teaspoon salt in a large bowl. Whisk until evenly combined and pour into the prepared baking dish.

Cut the butter into small pieces and add to a medium bowl. Stir in the pecans, flour, and the remaining 1/4 cup brown sugar, 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, and 1/8 teaspoon salt and mix until it holds together somewhat but still crumbles. Scatter the topping over the pumpkin mixture and bake until the edges are puffed and the filling is set in the center, about 45 minutes to 1 hour. Remove to a rack to cool to room temperature. Serve with the Bourbon Whipped Cream

# GINGER SNAP PUMPKIN PIE WITH GINGER CREAM

### **Crumb Crust:**

 5 tablespoons butter, melted, plus more for greasing

2 tablespoons sugar

1/4 teaspoon fine salt

16 gingersnap cookies

1 sleeve graham crackers (about 9 sheets)



### Filling:

2 cups pumpkin puree (about 1 1/2 cans)

1/4 cup dark brown sugar

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

2 large eggs

1 banana, mashed 1 egg white One 5-ounce can evaporated milk

## **Ginger Whipped Cream:**

3/4 cup heavy cream

3 tablespoons sugar

3 tablespoons candied ginger, minced

### **Directions**

For the crumb crust:

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease the sides of a 9-inch spring-form pan with butter. Wrap the bottom of the pan in foil to prevent leaking. Combine the sugar, salt, 8 of the gingersnap cookies and the graham crackers in a food processor and pulse until crumbly. Drizzle in the butter and continue pulsing until the mixture is the consistency of wet sand. Pour the mixture into the pan and push into the base and halfway up the sides using a glass with straight edges.

2. Bake the crust for about 10 minutes, and then

let cool completely while you make the filling.

For the filling: Stir together the pumpkin, dark

brown sugar, cinnamon, eggs, banana, egg white and milk in a large bowl. Pour the filling into the baked crumb crust and bake for about 50 minutes. Let cool completely while you make the ginger whipped cream.

For the ginger whipped cream: Whip the cream with the sugar until soft peaks form using a

hand mixer. Fold in the ginger.

Run a thin knife around the edge of the pie to release it from the pan. Load the whipped cream into a piping bag with a large star tip. Pipe rosettes around the perimeter of the pie and decorate with the 8 remaining gingersnap cookies. Cook's Note: Make sure you use a piping bag with a

large star tip so the ginger bits in the whipped cream don't clog the tip.

## **MEYER LEMON-CRANBERRY BUNDT CAKE Ingredients**

 3 1/4 sticks unsalted butter, cubed and at room temperature, plus more for the pan

3 cups cake flour, sifted, plus more for the pan

 1 12 ounce bag fresh or frozen cranberries, thawed if frozen

 2 1/2 cups granulated sugar

6 tablespoons whole milk


4 large eggs, plus 2 egg

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 tablespoons finely grated Meyer lemon zest

1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder





1/2 teaspoon salt

## For the Syrup and Glaze:

- 1/4 cup granulated sugar 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons Meyer lemon juice
- 1 1/2 cups confectioners' sugar

### **Directions**

1. Butter and flour a 10-cup fluted Bundt pan.

2. Heat the cranberries in a pot until they start to release their juices. Add 3/4 cup granulated sugar, and cook over medium heat until until juicy and the mixture reduces to 1 1/4 cups, about 15 minutes. Let cool completely.

3. Position a rack in the middle of the oven and

preheat to 350 degrees F.

4. Whisk the milk, whole eggs and yolks, and vanilla in a medium bowl; set aside.

Whisk the 3 cups flour, the remaining 1 3/4 cups sugar, the lemon zest, baking powder and salt in a large bowl. Add the 3 1/4 sticks butter and beat with a mixer on low speed until moistened. Add half of the milk mixture, increase the speed to medium and beat 1 minute. Add the remaining milk mixture in two batches, beating between each addition. Scrape down the sides of the bowl and beat again, about 30 seconds.

6. Transfer 2/3 of the batter to the pan. Spoon the cranberry mixture in a ring around the middle of the batter (do not let it touch the pan). Top with the remaining batter and smooth evenly. Bake until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake

comes out clean, 55 to 60 minutes.

until smooth. Spoon over the cake.

Meanwhile, make the syrup: Dissolve the 1/4 cup granulated sugar in 1/2 cup lemon juice in a saucepan over low heat. Remove the cake from the oven, poke the surface all over with a skewer and pour the syrup on top. Let cool in the pan for 10 minutes. Carefully invert the cake onto a parchment-lined rack to cool completely. Wrap tightly in plastic wrap and let sit overnight. 8. When ready to serve, whisk the confectioners' sugar and the remaining 2 tablespoons lemon juice

APPLE SPICE CAKE WITH CREAM

CHEESE ICING

### **Ingredients**

• 1/2 stick butter, plus extra for loaf pan

 3 Granny Smith apples, peeled and cored, cut into 1/2-inch dice and tossed with a little lemon juice

• 1/2 lemon, juiced

• 1 cup apple cider

- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour, plus extra for loaf pan
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 3 or 4 grates fresh nutmeg (about 1/2 teaspoon)
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 3/4 cup sugar
- Pinch kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup toasted and chopped walnuts
- 1/2 cup golden raisins

### Cream Cheese Icing:

- One 8-ounce package cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1 stick butter, at room temperature
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 Teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 lemon, juiced

### **Directions**

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F.

- Melt the butter in a large saute pan over medium heat. Toss in the apples and stir to coat them with the butter. Add the lemon juice and the apple cider. Cook until the apples have softened and the cider has reduced by half. Transfer the mixture to a food processor and pulse into a coarse paste. Reserve.
- In a large mixing bowl combine the flour, cinnamon, baking soda, nutmeg, both of the sugars and a pinch of salt. Make a well in the dry ingredients and add the pureed apples, the egg and vanilla. Stir to combine. Toss in the walnuts and raisins.
- 4. Butter and flour a loaf pan. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and put it in the preheated oven. Bake until a toothpick, inserted in the center comes out clean, about 40 to 45
- 5. Remove the pan from the oven and let cool for 10 minutes. Remove the cake from the pan and cool completely.
- 6. Cut the cake in half equatorially and spread half of the icing on the bottom layer. Replace the top half and ice the top of the cake, leave the sides bare. Slice and serve.
- Cream Cheese Icing:
- 8. Beat together all of the ingredients in a stand mixer or with a hand mixer until light and fluffy.

However, unfortunately human wisdom is often our default mode of operation, but we need to learn to consult God before we engage in major undertakings or decisions.



# Claybank Master Gardeners

Greetings Gardeners!

Since Hurricane Sally, the rain has ceased for October, but hopefully things will revive with some hand watering. Weed and rogue grass growth has given this gardener plenty to keep up with. While the heat and drought caused some die-back of the smaller shrubs and younger plants, we took the opportunity to clear out the overgrowth and clean up the landscape. The soft, moistened soil was then ready for weeding and cleaning up the garden areas, to prepare for planting the fall veggies and spring bulbs. We happily welcome cooler FALL! (insert graphic)

Soil preparation for your fall veggies and plants will be greatly enhanced by MULCH, a FREE goldmine of beneficial nutrients from layers of pine needles, decaying tree leaves and grass clippings that prevent weed growth and provide moisture. Allow your gathered mulch to decompose in a dampened pile for a couple weeks or more before adding them around your plants and shrubs. Busy little bugs will munch away at the decaying mulch and add aeration and nutrients, turning the mulch into more beneficial soil. Earthworms will also show up, a good sign of healthy soil! (Composted kitchen scraps can also be added.)

The Alabama Extension's free SOW app (without ads!) tells us we can now plant broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, collards, kale. lettuce, mustard, onions, radishes, spinach, strawberries and turnips. If you click on broccoli, for example, it recommends different methods (seeds or transplants) depending on whether you are in zone 8a or 8b. Some of us in the Wiregrass area are in 8a, some in 8b.

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

Dear Dave, What exactly is a zero-based budget? Dean

Dear Dean,

Simply put, a zero-based budget is income minus outgo equals zero. If you earn \$4,000 a month, and you're doing a zero-based budget, every item you spend, save, give and invest should add up to \$4,000. It's a method of knowing where every single one of your dollars is going. Most people don't live on a budget. They just cash checks, write checks, then they look up and wonder where all their money went. Not having a plan, especially for your money, is a bad plan.

List all your income from all sources for the month. Next, list every single expense you have each month. Rent, food, cable, phones, and anything else you pay for gets added to the list. Your expenses vary from one month to the next, which is why you make a new

spending plan each month.

Now, here's where it gets real. Subtract your income from your expenses. Ideally, this number will be zero. It might take some practice, so don't be discouraged if everything doesn't balance out perfectly the first few times. All that means is you need to find a way to bring one of the numbers up, the other one down-or both. But whatever you do, don't spend a dime that's not accounted for.
