If you fall behind prior to HEAP opening, contact the company and try to make some arrangement for payment.

- Non-heating electric shut offs cannot be paid with Regular HEAP Benefits.
- Interviews can be done over the phone as long as a HEAP application has been filed either through myBenefits.ny.gov or in paper form with the agency.
- Do not wait until you are out of fuel to apply for HEAP. Let us know when you are **low on fuel** (less than a quarter tank). Non-utility fuel companies may charge a delivery fee if they deliver “off route” because you are out of fuel. This charge is deducted from your HEAP grant, so you will receive less fuel from your HEAP grant.
- If you have a shut off notice on your natural gas or electric, contact us **prior to being shut off**. If service is shut off, the company does not have to accept the HEAP grant to turn it back on.

Protect Your Children from the Hazards of Lead

National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week is October 25-31

If you have children, you should know that lead poisoning is the number one preventable environmental health threat in the United States. Although it is true that children living in older homes are at greatest risk, lead can also be found in your children's toys, which makes lead poisoning a danger to every family. Lead poisoning from paint chips is the most talked about threat, but lead can also get in the body by breathing or swallowing dust or soil and can sometimes be found in drinking water.

The only way to know if your child has lead poisoning is to get a blood lead test. In New York State, all children must be tested for lead exposure at or around age one and again at age two.

The Livingston County Department of Health reminds parents that most children with lead poisoning do not look or feel sick. Children with both low and high levels of lead in their bodies can suffer from brain and nervous system damage, behavioral and learning problems, slowed growth, hearing loss and headaches. The first step in preventing lead poisoning is to keep your home in good repair. Consider the following:

- If you live in a house or apartment built before 1978, it's important to properly repair any peeling paint properly. When paint flakes are disturbed, the home can become filled with lead-containing dust.
- Call the local health department before you do any remodeling to find out how to paint and repair safely.
- Frequently wash children's hands, toys, and pacifiers as an effective way to keep lead from accumulating.
- Clean floors often with a damp mop, and use damp cloths to clean windowsills.

**Livingston County Asks Residents to Follow Executive Orders
as Rising Number of COVID-19 Positives
Necessitates Enhanced Enforcement**

Mount Morris, NY, October 22, 2020 - According to Livingston County Public Health Director, Jennifer Rodriguez, the number of COVID-19 positive cases has increased markedly in Livingston County over the last week. "Earlier this week, we recorded the highest number of active COVID-19 cases in Livingston County since the pandemic began in March," stated Rodriguez.

As we move toward the winter season, it is anticipated that the challenges with maintaining social distance will increase, especially if community members frequent restaurants and have indoor social gatherings. While Livingston County recognizes the economic impact the pandemic has caused - particularly on businesses - it is also of great importance to help ensure that businesses stay open while protecting public health.

To this effect, the Livingston County Department of Health will continue to exercise its authority to perform enforcement under Public Health Laws. Fines may be issued for non-compliance with current New York State Executive Orders related to the COVID-19 pandemic in amounts ranging from \$500 to \$10,000.

Complaints or concerns about non-compliance with COVID-19 guidelines and associated Executive Orders can be made through NYS PAUSE and will get directed to the appropriate party, including the Livingston County Sheriff's Office and Department of Health.

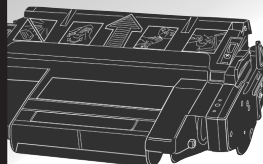

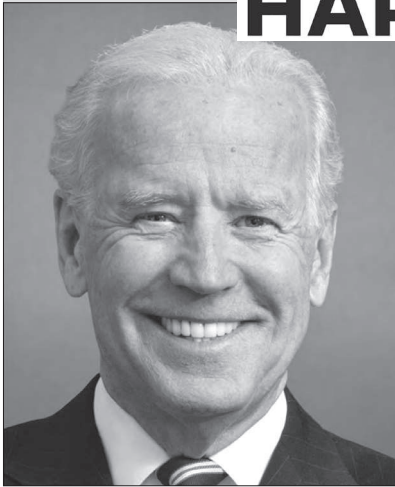
Is Your Home Safe from Radon?

According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Livingston County is one of many counties in New York State considered to have a high potential for high radon levels. Radon is a cancer-causing radioactive gas that you cannot see, smell, or taste. It can be present in your home without you knowing and has been identified by the Surgeon General as the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States. The EPA reports that radon is responsible for approximately 20,000 deaths annually.

Radon is produced naturally by the decay of radioactive material in soil, rock and in groundwater. It moves upward in the soil and can enter your home through cracks and other holes in your home's foundation or with groundwater from a well. Houses located (i) on highly permeable, gravel concentrated soils or (ii) on or around limestone rock formations may be at higher risk for elevated indoor radon levels.

The only way to determine if radon is a concern in your home is to test for it using a radon detection kit. The Livingston County Department of Health reminds residents that these kits are available free of charge to Livingston County residents who are homeowners. 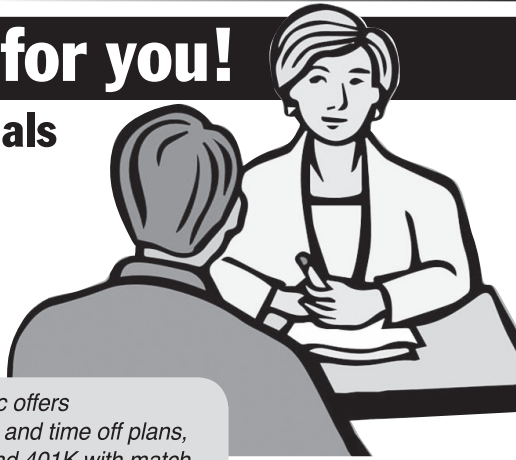
