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

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

# HOLLYWOOD

HOLLYWOOD — There's no denying that one of the greatest films of all time is 1972's "The Godfather," which received 10 Oscar nominations and won Oscars for: best picture; best actor, Marlon Brando; and best adapted screenplay, Mario Puzo (who wrote the original book) and Francis Ford Coppola (who also directed the film). It grossed \$287 million. Three years later "The Godfather II" won four Oscars for: best picture; supporting actor, Robert DeNiro; again for best adapted screenplay for Puzo and Coppola; and best director, Francis Ford Coppola. It grossed \$80 million. But when 1990's "Godfather III" was released, the bloom must have been off the blossom, winning no Oscars but still besting "Godfather II" grosses with \$137 million.

Director **Barry Levinson**, who directed "Diner" (1978), "The Natural" (1982), "Good Morning Vietnam" (1987), "Bugsy" (1991) and "Rain Man" (1991), for which he won a best director Oscar, is directing "Francis and the Godfather." Oscar Isaac ("Star Wars" Poe Dameron), will play Francis Ford Coppola and Jake Gyllenhaal has been cast as Robert Evans, the former actor who was the head of Paramount Pictures, the studio that made "The Godfather" films.

Levinson will soon be announcing actors to play Marlon Brando, James Caan, Robert Duvall and Diane Keaton, among others. When Marlon Brando won his Oscar, he sent American Indian Sacheen Littlefeather to accept his award and deliver a message about the plight of the American Indian. Brando went on to make epic films such as "Last Tango in Paris" (1972), "Missouri Breaks" (1976), "Superman" (1978) and "Apocalypse Now" (1979) (directed by Francis Ford Coppola) and his last film, "Superman Returns" (2006). Levinson redeveloped this screenplay, which was based on a Black List script, but that's another story among the many to be told about the making of "The Godfather."

When asked what he thought of Barry Levinson making this film, Coppola said, "Any movie Barry Levinson makes about anything will be interesting and worthwhile!'

Ricky Martin, who hasn't made a film since 2018's "The Assassination of Gianni Versace," in which he played Antonio D' Amico (Versace's lover), is shooting Netflix's Nov. 13 release of "Jingle Jangle: A Christmas Journey," a live-action musical film with Keegan-Michael Key, Phylicia Rashad and Forest Whitaker, who plays a toymaker Jeronicus Jangle, whose prize creation is stolen. It will feature original songs by "The Voice" judge and EGOT member (Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony Award winner) John Legend, Philip Lawrence and Davy Nathan, and includes "This Day," performed by Usher and Kiana Lede.



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## Reimagined Danville Science Center Announces Reopening Date Staff Eager to Reveal New Spaces and Help Curious-Minded Guests Across Dan River Region Discover Their World

DANVILLE, Va., November 2, 2020 – It's been more than two years since the Danville Science Center announced it was embarking on a major refreshment of its core exhibits. Dan River Region residents have been eagerly waiting for the 25-year-old organization to turn dozens of innovative ideas and community stories into reality. Now their patience will be rewarded when the Science Center reopens to the public on Saturday, Nov. 14, with two new major exhibition galleries and a creativity lab to encourage guests to discover their world in unexpected ways.

"So much has changed this year, but what hasn't changed is the importance of science in our lives," said Science Center Executive Director Adam Goebel. "The timing of our reopening couldn't be more perfect. The Danville Science Center has been transformed into a world-class, dynamic resource that will help our community make connections to the science all around them."

"Water" is the showcase space, and the largest gallery at approximately 5,000 square feet. The gallery has an immersive quality unlike anything that has ever been displayed in the region. Packed with interactive stations – such as a rain maze for guests to walk through and a wall made up of 2,400 water bottles to help guests visualize water usage in our everyday lives – it will help guests understand water differently, such as its chemical makeup, the power this resource can generate and the ecology of bodies of water like the Dan River.

Through kinesthetic (physical interaction) learning, "Go!" highlights the intersection between the physics of machines and the biology of the human body. Stations in the space engage guests in challenges: they can race animals or other family members on a sprint track, shoot free throws at a basketball hoop with arc-sensing technology, experience a human-powered hamster wheel and much more.

From construction paper to digital design programs, daily challenges in the J.T.-Minnie Maude Charitable Trust Creativity Lab will offer guests hands-on access to craft and design tools. The makerspace is an entry point into STEM learning and workforce development, not through formulas and equations, but by affording guests the opportunity to hone problem solving skills and utilize critical thinking abilities to determine solutions.

"I am thrilled for both the Danville Science Center and the City of Danville that we have met this milestone," said Delegate Danny Marshall, one of the representatives who sponsored budget amendments to obtain state funding for the project. "The investment in the Danville Science Center is an investment in STEM literacy for our community, which is critical to helping our next generation prepare for the 20th century workforce."

In addition to the three new experiences opening this month, preschool-age children can continue to enjoy "Crescent Crossing," the 1,800-square-foot train-themed exhibit that opened in May 2019. The first in the phased approach to the reimagining of the Science Center, "Crescent Crossing" introduces families to important fundamentals such as creativity, problem solving and cause and effect, and encourages children ages five and under to learn through play.

"With the completion of all the new permanent experiences, the Science Center is poised to have a lasting impact on the education, economic and community health of the Dan River Region," said Senator Bill Stanley. "I am proud to have supported such a powerful regional cultural project that can enrich the Danville community and inspire Virginia's future STEM leaders."

The reopening marks the culmination of phase two of the master plan adopted in 2017. An extensive community engagement process revealed the need for enhanced experiences as permanent galleries at the site had not been updated since its opening at the Danville Passenger Rail Station in 1995. To accomplish this, the Science Center embarked on a \$9 million interior refurbishment. The \$5.25 million awarded from the state combined with \$3 million from Danville Regional Foundation, \$500,000 from the J.T.-Minnie Maude Charitable Trust, \$250,000 from the Hughes Memorial Foundation and \$75,000 from the Kiwanis Club of Danville allowed the Science Center to complete the work, which finished on schedule.

As part of this project, the Science Center underwent a rebranding process. Guests will notice new design elements, such as colors and fonts, as well as a new logo, the Discoverymark, when returning to the building and soon thereafter on the Science Center's website

In addition to the new experiences, guests can visit the Dome to see a giant-screen feature or planetarium show while on site. Also, previously scheduled to close over the summer, the traveling exhibition "Sportsology" has been extended and is currently on display through December 1. The interactive, bilingual exhibit explores the science behind sports through a series of hands-on challenges that allow guests to test their athletic abilities while learning how their body works. Just after "Sportsology" closes, the "Young Architects" traveling exhibition will open on December 12.

"The Danville Science Center's transformation is impressive, and I look forward to the fun and innovative atmosphere the new spaces will create," said Senator Frank Ruff. "Cultural organizations can have a transformative impact on young visitors, and the Science Center will inspire and empower countless creative and ambitious young people in our community."

The renovation closure overlapped with the Science Center being closed to help limit the spread of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19). While staff are excited to welcome community members back into the building and eager to discuss all things STEM, the Science Center has made several adjustments to help ensure a safe environment

The Science Center has developed a reopening plan that is guided by recommendations from public health officials and from the best practices of museums throughout the country that includes enhanced cleaning procedures, adjusted HVAC systems and new operating policies for guests. Social distancing will be enforced, hand sanitizer is readily available and all visitors ages 5 and up are required to wear masks. Guests are encouraged to review the full reopening procedures on the Science Center's website at http://dsc.smv.org/protocols.html before their visit.

The Science Center's new operating hours are Wednesday through Saturday from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sunday from 11:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Science Center admission is \$9 with \$1 discounts for guests ages 4-12 and 60+. A combo ticket for admission plus a ticket to see a Dome show is \$11 with \$1 discounts for guests ages 4-12 and 60+. "STEM literacy is a fundamental competency in today's world," Goebel added. "We're giving people another tool in their toolbox to help understand and navigate today's challenges. We appreciate the support from our community, and look forward to seeing many familiar faces in the new exhibits in the coming weeks and months. I am confident that the Science Center will make the residents of the Dan River Region proud."

# Fuel Assistance Application Period Underway

Deadline to apply is November 13

Richmond, VA (November 2, 2020) – The Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) is currently accepting applications for fuel assistance online and at all local departments of social services through Friday, November 13. Applications may also be submitted by telephone by contacting the Enterprise Customer Service Center, Monday through Friday, from 7:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. at (855) 635-4370.

Fuel assistance provides state support to assist low-income households in meeting their home energy needs such as electricity, natural and liquid propane gas, oil, kerosene, coal and wood. Assistance may also be available to support delivery and installation charges as well as connection or reconnection fees. The program is funded by the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program federal block grant.

To qualify for fuel assistance, the maximum gross monthly income for a one-person household must not exceed \$1,383. For a household of four, the maximum gross monthly income is \$2,839.

"Fuel assistance provides critical support to vulnerable citizens who need and deserve a safe and warm environment during the cold, winter months," said VDSS Commissioner S. Duke Storen. "Our agency remains committed to providing opportunities for households to receive assistance to meet their energy needs, which are likely increasing due to the extended time families are now spending at home working, social distancing or virtually learning."

Virginians who do not qualify for fuel assistance may be eligible to receive energy assistance support through the COVID-19 Energy Assistance Program, a new program established to help households affected by COVID-19 in meeting their home energy needs. 

He is survived by his son, Richard Callahan (Diane) of Danville; also, a number of stepchildren, aunts, uncles and cousins.



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
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### The Value of Certified Elder Law Attorneys

The following guidelines will also help to make certain that your Medicaid and elder law needs are addressed thoroughly and effectively:

**Every case is unique.** Believe me, there is no cookie-cutter approach that will effectively address your Medicaid needs. Each individual facing issues related to elder law brings to the table a unique set of circumstances. In searching for an elder law professional, avoid those that do not treat each client as a fresh, unique case.

You may not have to be in a nursing home to receive Medicaid benefits. Did you know there is a benefit for in-home care? Medicaid benefits may be available to cover the costs of receiving in-home care. In Virginia, for example, the state Medicaid program not only provides benefits for qualifying individuals in nursing homes, but also for qualifying individuals who wish to remain in their homes. A qualified elder law attorney will have the knowledge to walk you through all of your long term care options, including programs that may enable you to remain in your home for as long as possible.

Asset protection should be an integral part of your elder law planning. Depending on the circumstances, there are a variety of estate planning techniques that may serve to preserve a portion of your assets without necessarily disqualifying you from Medicaid. More importantly, giving away your assets may trigger a penalty period under the Medicaid statutes that could prevent access to needed benefits for an extended period of time. An experienced elder law attorney will be able to help you implement the gifting and planning techniques that best fit your particular situation. While estate planning attorneys may be great at planning estate, they may

not have the unique expertise to plan ahead for Medicaid, if needed.

Force those advising you to prove they are qualified. Do not assume that anyone is qualified to give Medicaid advice without first asking them about their experience and certifications. Social workers, financial advisors and attorneys are not necessarily well versed in Medicaid law simply on account of their titles. Ask professionals seeking to advise you to explain their training. Attorneys, for example, must receive special training and certification prior to labeling themselves as an elder law specialist. The National Elder Law Foundation is the only national organization certifying elder law attorneys, or CELAs. CELAs must complete an examination and demonstrate that their law practice is actually focused on elder law. Once certified, a CELA must continue to practice primarily in the elder law field and complete advanced continuing education programs.

Consider hiring a law firm with a full service elder law team. A growing number of law firms in Virginia realize the importance of elder law and have assembled teams capable of addressing all of your elder law needs. Look for a firm that has attorneys trained and preferably certified in the practice of elder law. Then ask about all of the people who will be working on your case. Does the firm have a elder care coordinator? Will there be someone to help you with placement of your loved one? Will the firm handle the application process? Pinpointing a full service firm allows you to choose the level of services that is best for your situation. Even if you plan on ultimately completing the paperwork and application yourself, hiring a firm with the capabilities of shepherding the entire process become invaluable if complications or unforeseen obstacles arise.

The legal world is fraught with pitfalls and complexities that can have lasting consequences. What's more, the planning process for the care of an elderly family member can be an emotionally and physically draining experience. I hope that the guidelines presented in this article will help those in need of long term care planning find an experienced elder law team who will present appropriate planning options for your situation so that you can feel secure and confident in planning for long term care for you or your loved ones. 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## How Seniors can Save Money on Prescription Eyeglasses

Dear Savvy Senior,

What tips can you recommend for finding affordable prescription eyeglasses? I used to have vision insurance through my work but lost it when I turned 65 and signed up for Medicare.

Need Spectacles

Dear Need,

Unfortunately, in 2020 it's still true that original Medicare does not cover vision services, which includes routine eye exams and prescription eyeglasses — unless you've just had cataract surgery. While there's no one solution to this common need, here are a few tips that can help you save.

Medicare Advantage

While original Medicare doesn't cover vision services, there are Medicare Advantage plans that do. Medicare Advantage plans, which are sold through private insurance companies, cover all the same medical and hospital services that original Medicare does, but many of them also provide vision as well as dental, hearing and prescription drugs too.

To locate Advantage plans in your area that provide vision coverage, go to Medicare.gov/plan-compare or call 800-633-4227. But before enrolling in a plan, check the benefit details to ensure the plan's vision coverage includes routine eye exams, eyeglass frames and lenses.

If you are currently enrolled in original Medicare you can switch to a Medicare Advantage plan each year during the open enrollment period, which is between Oct. 15 and Dec. 7. Or, if you already have an Advantage plan that doesn't provide adequate vision coverage, you can swap to another plan between Jan. 1 and March 31.

If, however, you don't want to change your Medicare plan, you can still get coverage by purchasing a vision insurance policy – see eHealthInsurance.com. Vision policies typically start at around \$11 to \$13 per month for an individual, but before signing up make sure your savings potential is worth the cost of the monthly premiums and required copays.

## Discount Stores

Purchasing eyeglasses from discount retailers is another way to save. Costco Optical is

one of the best discount stores for good eyewear and low prices. Eyeglasses cost an average of around \$184, but to shop there you have to pay a \$60 annual membership fee. Some other good retail options for low prices include Sam's Club Optical and Walmart Vision Centers.

You also need to find out if you are eligible for any discounts. Some retailers provide discounts to membership groups like AARP and AAA. AARP members, for example, can get 30 percent off a pair of glasses (frames and lenses) at LensCrafters and Glasses.com, and you save an additional \$10 on a complete pair at Target Optical. AARP also offers \$55 comprehensive eye exams (dilation included) at participating eye doctors. See AARPVisionDiscounts. com for more information.

#### **Buy Online**

Buying eyeglasses online can also offer huge savings. Stores like ZenniOptical.com, and EyeBuyDirect.com sell prescription eyeglasses for as little as \$6 and \$7. These sites let you upload a photo of your face, so you can see what you'd look like in different frames.

Or, for a snappier choice of frames see WarbyParker.com, which offers single-vision glasses starting at \$95. They even offer a free program where you can request up to five pairs to try on at home for five days

To purchase glasses online, you'll need a valid prescription from an eye doctor (typically no more than a year old), plus your pupillary distance number, which is the distance, measured in millimeters, between the centers of your pupils in each eye.

#### Low-Income Assistance

If your income is low, depending on where you live, there may be some local clinics that provide free or discounted eye exams and eyeglasses. Put in a call to your local Lions Club to see what's available in your area. See Directory.LionsClubs.org for contact information.

You may also be able to get free eyeglasses through New Eyes (New-Eyes.org, 973-376-4903), a nonprofit organization that provides free eyeglasses through a voucher program to people in financial need.

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#### **Cinnamon Apple Pie Bread**



Forget the pie crust and get all the flavors of fall in a quick and easy bread with brown sugar and cinnamon topping that's as sweet as apple pie.

#### Ingredients

1/3 cup light brown sugar (not packed)

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

2/3 cup white sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup salted butter, softened (or use unsalted and add ¼ tsp salt)

2 eggs

1½ teaspoons vanilla extract

1½ cups all-purpose flour

1¾ teaspoons baking powder

½ cup milk

1 apple, peeled and chopped (I used Granny Smith)

#### Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a 9 x 5-inch loaf pan.

Mix brown sugar and cinnamon together in a mixing bowl and set aside.

Beat white sugar and butter together in a bowl using an electric mixer until smooth and creamy.

Beat in eggs, 1 at a time, until incorporated; add vanilla extract and stir until incorporated.

Combine flour and baking powder together in another bowl; stir into creamed butter mixture.

Mix milk into batter until smooth.

Pour half the batter into the prepared loaf pan. Next add half the apples and half the brown sugar cinnamon mixture. Lightly pat/push apple mixture into batter.

Pour the remaining batter over apple layer; top with remaining apples and add more brown sugar/cinnamon mixture.

Lightly pat/push apples into batter; swirl brown sugar mixture through apples using a finger or spoon (I cleaned my hands and used my finger because it was easier).

Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted in the center of the loaf comes out clean, 30 to 40
