## Democrats fail to win N. C. legislative majorities

NC Democrats felt that Election 2020 Tuesday was their best chance to take back the General Assembly from the Republicans, who have had it since 2011.
They were wrong.
Republicans in both the N. C. Senate and State House staunchly held their majorities, and with it, the right, once again, to redraw the voting districts that will govern
the next ten years, thus maintaining the GOP dominance in how congressional and legislative voting lines are drawn.
This means that Democrats will remain the minority party in the N. C. General Assembly until 2030. The prospect will determine how much Black Democratic repThey needed a gain of six House and five Senate seats to have attained majorities, but they failed to do so. "Voters returning a strong Republican majority to the North Carolina House of Representatives tonight reflects the powerful momentum behind policies that promote economic prosperity, educational achievement, and saee Tim Moore in a statement.

Fortunately, for Democrats, Gov. Roy Cooper was reelected for a second term Tuesday, defeating Lt. Gov. Dan Forest handily, and, even though Republicans maintained control of the legislature, they did not do so with vetoproof majorities.
The GOP will have 28 Republicans to 22 Democrats in House next January. Cooper's official pen can still veto any legislation with which he's not pleased.
However, the Democratic governor will also have the same difficulty he's had in recent times convincing Republicans to expand Medicare coverage for low income citizens.

Yet, President Donald Trump, claiming he won tre election and alleging fraud with no evidence, has
announced he will ask the U. S. Supreme Court to stop all vote counts. Trump made his announcement around 2:15 am Wednesday following a statement by Vice President Joe Biden. "We were getting ready to
win this election. Frankly we did win this election," Trump said from the White House. "This is a major fraud on our nation...We will be going to the U. S. Supreme Court. We want all voting to stop."
Biden had earlier stated in Wilmington, Delaware, "I'm here to tell you tonight,
we believe we're on track to we believe we're on track to
winning this election...We kinning because of the unprecedented mail-in vote and the early vote that it was going to take a while. We're going to have to be
patient until the hard work patient until the hard work
of tallying votes is finished and it ain't over until every vote is counted."
At Trice Edney Newswire deadline, Biden led the race with 224 to Trump's 213 electoral votes with literally millions more votes to count in five states Arizona,
Pennsylvania, $\quad$ Georgia, Pennsylvania, Michigan
and Wisconsin. It takes 270 Electoral College votes to win the presidency. The threat of election theft by Trump is - in part the reason that a group of Black faith leaders and
