Results of local races here Crow Wing, Aitkin counties awash with red votes

The United States Presidential race between Donald Trump and Joe Biden was too close to call at Wednesday a.m. press time. However, voters in Aitkin and Crow Wing counties voted Republican up and down the ticket. Locals favored Trump and also Republicans for US Senate, US House, Minnesota Senate and Minnesota House. In local contested races

results were: Aitkin School District technology and transportation referendum was voted down: No, 51.29 percent and 2,963

votes. Yes, 48.71 percent and 2,814 votes

For Aitkin School Board, longtime incumbent John Chute will leave the board. The three elected were Dennis Hasskamp, 2,906; Dawn Houser, newcomer, 2,518 and Joe Ryan, 2499. Renee Kostick is nipping at Ryan's heels with 2,480. There were 80 write-ins.

Bob Nystrom, Kevin Boyles and Jana Shogren won for the Brainerd School Board, with Sue Kern, who has expressed some right-wing controversial views, was defeated. There were 225 write-ins.

In the Crosby-Ironton One's Paul Koering easi-School District, Joe Dwyer, Abby Goelz and Kim Coughlin were winners. There were 98 write ins.

City of Aitkin: Longtime resident and mayor Gary Tibbitts lost his bid for the first time to Megan Workman. Tibbitts lost with 468 votes to Workman's 561. Kathy Galliger was returned to the city council, joined by Jason Henke. There was no opposition for the city council seats.

In the city of Crosby, despite his controversial past, Jim Hunter rose to the top of the crowded mayoral field with 385 votes. Other totals: Rick Ferrari, 321; Sierra Mc-Lean 183 and Joanna Lattery, 172. Shawn Jarvela and Paul Heglund were elected to the council.

In McGregor, a three-way mayoral race saw Dake Olson rise to the top with 63 votes. Challengers Bruce Miller had 46 and Jerry Farley, 29. Terry Hensel was elected to the council with 66 and Angela Owen and Shelly Brantner were tied at 65 for second place.

In Crow Wing County commissioner races, District ly won a challenge from write-in candidate Arlene Jones, 5,184 to 807 write-ins (write-in candidates are not specified).

Paul Houge held his Cuyuna Range seat with 3,234. Challenger Michael Starry got 2,701 and there were 550 write-ins. Tom Nixon had campaigned as a write-in candidate

In Aitkin County, Jer-

ry DeMenge ran a write-in campaign for District 4, the greater McGregor area. Brian Napstad, a past board member, had 723 votes while incumbent Bill Pratt was close with 713. There may be a recount. Write-ins were 364.

In Aitkin County District 2, Incumbent Laurie Westerlund returns with 1,484 with Challenger Gene Miller getting 766.

DNR wildlife division manager says deer activity seems to be increasing

Russ Reisz, manager for the DNR wildlife division in these parts, had this to say about the 2020 Firearms Deer Season:

"Deer activity seems to be increasing, " Reisz observed "Scrapes are opening up and deer seem to be moving around in the woods. Although we still see a fair amount of night-time activity, lately deer seem to be most active during the day."

Prediction on harvest goals for 2020? "Deer densities are variable across Aitkin County. There were likely some localized negative impacts to

deer numbers and reproduction this spring from the long lasting snow pack of winter 2019-2020."

Three great tips from the

When asked what three things hunters should know this season, Reisz pointed out;

The CWD disease zone is still in place in DPA 604. Sampling is not required but it is important for hunters to take their deer heads to the self-service sampling stations and get them tested. Information can be found at:

North-central Minnesota CWD management zone (DPA 604)

Apply the "Golden Rule" to your deer hunt. Treat fellow hunters, private property and natural resources with respect and in a manner that you would like to be treated.

Minnesota's firearms deer season begins half an hour before sunrise on Saturday, Nov. 7, and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources expects nearly half a million hunters to participate. To assist with your coverage of the deer season, here are

materials about deer hunting because deer populations in Minnesota.

Firearms deer season is one of several seasons for deer hunters. Archery deer season opened Sept. 19 and lasts through Thursday, Dec. 31. Muzzleloader deer season is from Saturday, Nov. 28, through Sunday, Dec. 13.

Hunters are advised to make a deer hunting plan this year — not only to buy their licenses, but also to figure out where to hunt, whether they will be providing a sample for chronic wasting disease testing, and how they will process their deer.

Hunters who are traveling should do the following to help minimize the spread of COVID-19:

Travel as directly to your destination as possible, and minimize stops along the way. Attempt to bring all needed

If you do need to stop for gas or supplies, wear a cloth face covering.

supplies with you.

Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer after touching common surfaces (gas pumps, door handles, shared bathrooms, etc.).

Do not travel if sick.

The DNR's outdoor recreation guidelines are available on the COVID-19 webpage.

Harvest opportunities

This season, hunters in general will have more opportunities to harvest deer

have increased in much of the state. Opportunities in southeastern Minnesota have also been increased as part of the DNR's response to chronic wasting disease.

Hunters in north-central, northwestern and south-metro areas of Minnesota should double-check deer permit area boundaries. Some boundaries have changed due to public input during the deer population goal-setting process or in response to chronic wasting disease spread.

Safety the first priority

Hunters should follow the three tenets of safe firearms handling: Treat every firearm as if it is loaded by keeping your finger off the trigger; always control the muzzle of the firearm; and be sure of the target and what is beyond it. Tree stand accidents are the leading cause of injury to hunters, so it's always important to wear a safety harness and follow other safety guidelines when using a stand.

CWD management con-

The DNR continues its aggressive management of CWD by reducing deer densities, implementing feeding and attractant bans to reduce contact between deer, and restricting carcass movement.

The DNR created additional surveillance areas because CWD was detected in both wild and captive deer in new areas last year. As part of the DNR's COVID-19 response, CWD testing will be voluntary for all disease zones and surveillance areas. Hunters who harvest a deer in a disease zone are strongly encouraged to submit a sample. More details are available on the

CWD webpage. The DNR is, as in previous years, enforcing carcass movement restrictions in disease management and control zones to limit the spread of

On July 1, deer feeding and attractant bans expanded to include the south metro area. Due to the spread of CWD and the DNR's CWD management strategy, the antler point restrictions in southeastern Minnesota are not in place this year and cross-tagging, also known as party hunting, will be allowed in southeastern Minnesota for antlered bucks.




