

Two Named to ASUN Team

ATLANTA – The University of North Alabama men's basketball team placed two players on the ASUN Preseason All-Conference Team. Juniors Jamari Blackmon and Emanuel Littles were each selected for the honor while the UNA men were picked to finish sixth in both the ASUN coaches and media polls.

Blackmon started all 30 games as a sophomore for UNA last season. He was second on the team in scoring at 12.4 points per game and led the team in three-point shooting at 37.2%. Blackmon closed the season with consecutive 22-point performances against FGCU and Stetson.

Littles saw action in 27 games last year and 23 starts. The 6-7 forward from Lanett led the ASUN in rebounding as a sophomore with 10.3 boards per game, a total that was 18th in the nation at the Division I level.

North Alabama received 40 points in the preseason coaches poll and 146 points in the media poll.

Liberty, Stetson and North Florida rounded out the top four. Each team received at least one first-place nod in each poll. FGCU was fifth, leading UNA by five points in the coaches poll and 10 points in the media poll


UNA Record Enrollment

FLORENCE— Enrollment at the University of North Alabama for the Fall 2020 broke previous records on campus, with nearly 8,400 students enrolled, with the largest growth coming in online graduate programs. This indicates an approximate 4% increase in enrollment from Fall 2019.

In addition to the overall enrollment growth, online graduate enrollment alone grew by 35% from 2019-2020. Additionally, approximately 77% of the freshmen who entered UNA in the Fall of 2019 opted to return to campus this fall. This indicates a record retention rate and places UNA well ahead of our peer group in the persistence of first-time, full-time students.

"Our record retention rate is a testament to the hard work and commitment of our dedicated faculty members and professional advisors," said UNA President, Dr. Ken Kitts.

The retention rate of 77% is a 2% increase from 2019. This increase is relatively rare, particularly amid a global pandemic.





to yellow, we must first understand where the leaf began.



"Photosynthesis, the food-making process in the plant, takes place in the green chlorophyllcontaining leaves," Kelley said. "As day length begins to shorten, so does the amount of sun available to the leaves. Therefore, the living plant cells in leaves do not receive enough light to create food and begin to change color.'

ile temperatures daylight hours While and continue to decline, the chlorophyll begins to

break down, allowing yellow the color to show through. This yellow color

has actually been in the leaf all along. It has just been covered by the chlorophyll. Eventually, they will die and fall to

the ground.
"The initial plant that tells me fall is here is the terribly invasive popcorn tree," said Kelley. "You will start to notice them along fence rows and out in pastures along the

roadsides." Even though the yellow color change can seem like a magical overnight phenomenon, it is simply a chemical process causing the breakdown of chlorophyll.

Orange, Red, and **Purple Leaves**

If yellow leaves are caused from chlorophyll breaking down, then how do leaves form the striking red, orange or even purple shades? Surprisingly, these radiant colors started as yellow leaves as well, but they transition to other shades because of temperature

changes. Kelley said warm ˈsunnv with davs night cool

temperatures, especially below 45 degrees, will give leaves these extravagant shades.

These day and night temperatures tend to raise the level of red coloration," said Kelley.

The cool night temperatures trap the sugars produced during the warm sunny

day inside the leaves, producing the array of fall colors. Certain tree species will only show certain colored leaves.

"Sugar maples take

on a fiery orange color, hickories will only show yellow colors, while oaks are primarily reddish brown to a brown shade," she added.

More Information

No fall leaf colors are the same. They can vary tree to tree based on factors like physical location or even genetics. Colors can even vary on the same tree. For instance, leaves that are directly exposed to the afternoon sun may turn a bright red, while leaves on the shady side of the tree may only turn vellow.

With every year comes a different array of these striking fall colors. One thing remains constant; it is a phenomenon that brings about a special joy for folks of every age to cherish.





As the years slip away for my generation, the bitter memories of the Vietnam Era continue to linger. Even advancing age and the passage of time cannot erase the void of friends who didn't make it back or fellow airmen who died or were destined to years in a POW camp.

My way of addressing my expériences is to continue my research and to share lost or misplaced tidbits of pertinent information relative to those on the Wall in hopes that a revelation may bring closure and hope to a love one:

Beallsville, Ohio, pop.475, paid the heaviest price by losing 6 of its young

Now one can easily see that they have taken over many of America's institutions, including a major political party and most of the news media.

> men in Vietnam. West Virginia paid the greatest price for a state with 711 deaths (or 39.9/100K population). Thomas Edison High School of Philadelphia experienced the greatest number for a high school with 54 killed. There are 40 sets of brothers on the Wall who were both killed in action. January 28, 1968 recorded the single day highest number of causalities with 245 dead; this was during the Tet Offensive. I recall vividly since I was there!

> There are 16 chaplains listed on the wall including two Medal of Honor recipients: Navy Lt. Vincent R. Capodanno for heroism under fire attending a Marine Rifle Company and Army Major Charles J. Litety, a

Conscientious Objector who heroically braved enemy fire to personally carry 20 wounded solders to safety.

Then there are the Marines of Morenci, This group was

inseparable growing up, playing sports and exploring the Arizona deserts. It just was meant to be that they enlisted in the Marine Corp as a group under the Buddy Plan-all 9 of them! They made their way to Vietnam, but only three came home!

Perhaps the most satisfying thing you could do this Veterans Day is to find a Vet, preferably a Vietnam Vet. Treat him to lunch or simply shake his hand and let him know you appreciate his service.





Medicare Minute

"Medicare Advantage Plans Part 3"

A Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) is a type of Medicare health plan offered by a private insurance company that contracts with Medicare to provide you with all your Part A and Part B benefits. There are six things to consider when choosing a MA plan. We discussed three of those things last week; the premium, copays and coinsurance of the plan. This week we will talk about deductibles, provider networks and drug formularies.

A deductible is the amount you are required to pay for your health care services before your health insurance begins to pay. Most MA plans do not have a deductible on services as long as you receive the services from an in network provider. If you receive the services from an out of network provider you may have to meet a deductible before the plan pays or you may not have coverage at all depending on the type of plan you have.

The provider network of the plan is a list of doctors or health care facilities that have agreed to accept the plan. If you are considering a MA plan for the first time you will want to verify with your agent that any doctor or facility you may want to visit is in your plan's network. If you are already in a MA plan you will want to verify with your doctor that they will accept the plan in 2021.

A MA plan's drug formulary is a list of drugs that are covered by the plan. This will include the tiers and copays of the drugs and any deductible you may have to meet on the prescriptions you are taking. Don't overlook the formulary of the plan because MA plans do not cover every prescription drug that is manufactured.

moniker, "Computer Skeptic," was inspired by my deep appreciation for the power of being skeptical of incredulous claims and scam artists. Being a skeptic does not mean one is immune to falling for scams and fictions, it just means that I make a conscious effort to raise my eyebrow when I come across some extraordinary claim. My point is that it's important to realize we aren't perfect and to be a bit humble with our viewpoints (yeah I'm looking at you, mirror). We're gonna need to focus on the truth and ignore crazy aunt Linda.



The at fault driver's insurance company says that because my Blue Cross Blue Shield paid most of the bills they will not pay me without paying Blue Cross and there will not be any money left to pay me. I really hurt for a while and missed a week of work which I needed. I believe I am due some money. How much should they have to pay me and what does Blue Cross Blue Shield have to do with it?

Robert, Tuscumbia, AL

You should be reimbursed for the pay you missed and you should be compensated for the pain you suffered. I guarantee you that if it were the insurance

adjuster who had missed his pay check and had been injured, he would insist on the same.

We go to such great lengths to enjoy our lives and be comfortable and safe that an injury caused by someone else's inattention while driving is unacceptable. Alabama law provides for compensation for wrong doing. Alabama law says that you are entitled to be reimbursed for your loss wages and that people sitting on a jury, just like you, get to decide how much money it is worth to be injured through no fault of your own.

Blue Cross Blue Shield is entitled to be paid back for money they spent for your medical bills. They have to share in the cost of the recovery meaning that they have to pay their fair share of the attorney's fees and costs for recovering that money. Occasionally this is extremely important in cases where the medical bills exceed the amount of available insurance coverage. In those cases we can negotiate with Blue Cross Blue Shield to lower the amount they claim so that everybody gets some monetary compensation. If Blue Cross paid \$30,000 in medical bills and all the available coverage totaled \$30,000, Blue Cross would have to take under \$20,000 and would likely accept \$10,000.

One of the most unfair laws ever passed in this State is the law that says that if someone like you injured through no fault of their own has insurance to pay their bills the jury is told of the injured party's insurance. The jury can never be told that the defendant has insurance and as I have stated many times before insurance defense attorneys go to great lengths to hide the fact that the defendant has a lawyer paid for by the insurance company and an insurance company to pay the jury verdict. So the person who did wrong hides the fact that they have insurance and the person who was injured through no fault of their own gets less money because they had the foresight to have insurance.



How Seniors can Save Money on Prescription Eyeglasses

Dear Savvy Senior,

What tips can you recommend for finding affordable prescription eyeglasses? I used to have vision insurance through my work but lost it when I turned 65 and signed up for Medicare.

Need Spectacles

Dear Need,

Unfortunately, in 2020 it's still true that original Medicare does not cover vision services, which includes routine eye exams and prescription eyeglasses - unless you've just had cataract surgery. While there's no one solution to this common need, here are a few tips that can help you save.

Medicare Advantage

While original Medicare doesn't cover vision services, there are Medicare Advantage plans that do. Medicare Advantage plans, which are sold through private insurance companies, cover all the same medical and hospital services that original Medicare does, but many of them also provide vision as well as dental, hearing and prescription drugs too.

To locate Advantage plans in your area that provide vision coverage, go to *Medicare.gov/plan-compare* or call 800-633-4227. But before enrolling in a plan, check the benefit details to ensure the plan's vision coverage includes routine eye exams, eyeglass frames and lenses.

If you are currently enrolled in original Medicare you can switch to a Medicare Advantage plan each year during the open enrollment period, which is between Oct. 15 and Dec. 7. Or, if you already have an Advantage plan that doesn't provide adequate vision coverage, you can swap to another plan between Jan. 1 and March 31.

If, however, you don't want to change your Medicare plan, you can still get coverage by purchasing a vision insurance policy – see *eHealthInsurance.com*. Vision policies typically start at around \$11 to \$13 per month for an individual, but before signing up make sure your savings potential is worth the cost of the monthly premiums and required copays.

Discount Stores

Purchasing eyeglasses from discount retailers is another way to save. Costco Optical is one of the best discount stores for good eyewear and low prices. Eyeglasses cost an average of around \$184, but to shop there you have to pay a \$60 annual membership fee. Some other good retail options for low prices include Sam's Club Optical and Walmart Vision Centers.

You also need to find out if you are eligible for any discounts. Some retailers provide discounts to membership groups like AARP and AAA. AARP members, for example, can get 30 percent off a pair of glasses (frames and lenses) at LensCrafters and Glasses.com, and you save an additional \$10 on a complete pair at Target Optical. AARP also offers \$55 comprehensive eye exams (dilation included) at participating eye doctors. See AARPVisionDiscounts.com for more information.

Buy Online

Buying eyeglasses online can also offer huge savings. Stores like ZenniOptical.com, and EyeBuyDirect.com sell prescription eyeglasses for as little as \$6 and \$7. These sites let you upload a photo of your face, so you can see what you'd look like in different frames.

Or, for a snappier choice of frames see WarbyParker.com, which offers single-vision glasses starting at \$95. They even offer a free program where you can request up to five pairs to try on at home for five days.

To purchase glasses online, you'll need a valid prescription from an eye doctor (typically no more than a year old), plus your pupillary distance number, which is the distance, measured in millimeters, between the centers of your pupils in each eye.

Low-Income Assistance
