




Leaf pick-up in the Village will continue through November 24th. After this date our DPW will be preparing equipment for the upcoming Winter months.



### **State Imposes New COVID-19 Restrictions**

With the number of positive COVID-19 cases climbing in New York State, Governor Andrew Cuomo is imposing new statewide restrictions effective Friday, November 13, 2020 at 10PM. According to the Governor's website, the restrictions are as follows:

- Indoor and outdoor gatherings at private residences are limited to 10 people or fewer.
- Bars, restaurants and gyms or fitness centers, as well as any State Liquor Authority-licensed establishment, will be required
  to close in-person service from 10PM to 5AM daily.
- Restaurants will still be allowed to provide curbside, food-only pick-up or delivery after 10PM but will not be permitted to serve alcohol to go.
  - Empire State Development provides these additional details from New York State:
- Social clubs Elks, American Legions, Ancient Order of Hibernians, Knights of Columbus, Sons of Italy, etc. are included in the restrictions.
- Restaurants without liquor licenses They are also included in the restrictions but are allowed to continue delivery and to-go service after 10PM.
- Casinos the entire casino floor operation must close at 10PM (not just the bars, restaurants, and drink service).
- Movie theaters that have SLA licenses If a movie theater has an SLA license, all movies in the theater have to be over and closed by 10PM.
- Last call must take place before 10PM.
- 24 hour establishments such as diners may reopen at 5AM.

Radon is a cancer-causing radioactive gas that you cannot see, smell, or taste. It can be present in your home without you knowing and has been identified by the Surgeon General as the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States. The EPA reports that radon is responsible for approximately 20,000 deaths annually.

Radon is produced naturally by the decay of radioactive material in soil, rock and in groundwater. It moves upward in the soil and can enter your home through cracks and other holes in your home's foundation or with groundwater from a well. Houses located (i) on highly permeable, gravel concentrated soils or (ii) on or around limestone rock formations may be at higher risk for elevated indoor radon levels.


The only way to determine if radon is a concern in your home is to test for it using a radon detection kit. The Livingston County Department of Health reminds residents that these kits are available free of charge to Livingston County residents who are homeowners. ### **November is National Hospice Month**

Mount Morris, NY, November 2020 — Hospice is a team-oriented approach to providing specialized care for people facing a life-limiting illness or injury. It includes expert medical care, pain management and emotional support for patients and their families. But more simply, hospice care supports living one's life to the fullest with dignity regardless of how much time remains. Seven in 10 Americans said they would prefer to die at home according to a Time/CNN Poll. Statistics show that 25 percent actually do according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. In a recent national survey, the overwhelming majority of respondents agreed that expertise in keeping a terminally-ill patient as comfortable and as pain-free as possible is the single most important service to consider when caring for a loved one and the end-of-life experience. This is the essence of hospice care. One of the great myths of hospice, for many who have not experienced it, is that hospice patients are merely lying in a bed, barely conscious. This is not the case. When a patient is admitted at an appropriate time, hospice care can improve his or her quality of life. Research shows that health care providers feel responsible to discuss hospice with their patients when the time is right, as it provides a kind of care that they are unable to give. Nearly three-fourths of family caregivers agree that hospice care is a better choice for a terminally ill patient. Of this group, 69 percent believe that involvement in hospice makes a better impact on the patient's family as well. Another hospice myth is that families lose control over what happens to their loved ones. The facts are that a family is generally able to choose their preferred hospice provider for a loved one, and can be trained to serve as a primary caregiver, with a specialist to provide support when needed. It is the unique nature of hospice that allows for the feeling of family and comfort to become embedded and vital in the patient's care. This concept of more family interaction explains the overall goal of hospice - creating more moments of life before a life is over. Hospice enables moments and memories that would otherwise not occur. It is the quality of these final moments, after all, that can define a "good death."

It's never too soon to explore your end-of-life options. Livingston County Hospice is a program of the Livingston County Department of Health, which provides home visiting using CDC precautions regarding COVID-19.
