
March and Spring have arrived! In Texas, that means breezes ruffling the colors of the Lone Star State and sunshine enhancing the red and brilliant blue of our flag. Let us never take our freedoms for granted, and let us never forget the b avery and determination that is our Texas heritage.

By February 1836, Jim Bowie had arrived in Texas and written to Governor Henry Smith relating his belief that the Alamo location could serve as a stronghold from which to repel Mexican forces marching toward Sabine. In the letter, Bowie reinforced the idea of 'victory or death' at the



Alamo saying "we would rather die in these ditches than give it up to the enemy". He asked for men, money, rifles and cannon powder. His original orders were to remove the artillery (or cannon) from the fort to keep it out of the hands of the advancing Mexican army. However, the heavy guns could not be moved without draft animals, and so the Texans had no choice but to dig in and defend where they were. According to historians, here's a list of the artillery the Texans had at their disposal. (classified by the size of the projectile each could fire) One large cannon (the famous 18-pounder brought by schooner to Velasco), one iron 16-pound, one iron 12-pound, one 9-pound "pedero" which fired stone balls, two iron 8-pound, six 6-pound, three iron 4-pound, a brass or bronze 4-pound, two 3-pound, plus two small brass guns and one small iron gun, making a total of 21 cannons inside the Alamo. The Mexican army also owned cannon, and during the first week of the siege, up to 200 cannonballs per day fell into the Alamo plaza. The Texans put these to good use and later, they would use whatever they could as ammunition, including door hinges, nails and chopped-up horseshoes and chain.

During 12 previous days of siege, the Mexicans had kept up such a din of bombardment at all hours that sleep for the small army of Texans had been scarce. When the firing ceased at 10pm on the night of March 5, the exhausted men inside the walls fell into their first uninterrupted rest despite the fact that the night was bitterly cold and firewood had run out. The silent approach of four columns of Mexican forces went undetected. At 5:30am on the morning of March 6. Santa Ann's forces were at the walls when their bugles sounded, awakening the Texans. Cannonfire and gunfire gradually gave way to the sounds of hand-to-hand combat with sword, knife and rifle butt and in less than an hour, all the Texans were dead. The Thirteen Days of Glory ended in brave defeat. (from archives of Texas A and M University;

While in Scotland, by the way, we took pictures of the Elephant House Cafe, where JK Rowling supposedly wrote some of the Harry Potter books. In the hall, the actual long dinner table used in the movie was set with silverware, food, plates and serving dishes.

Perhaps the main reason we were there was so our twelve year-old grandson Caleb could see it. He is a big Harry Potter fan and has read all the books and seen all the movies. He came home with some great memories and a wand purchased at the gift shop.

There are so many things to see in every nook and corner of each gigantic room. Everything is authentic including manikins dressed and made up to look like real characters from the movie. In one area there was a new coat. Next to it was another identical coat that had been made to show wear. The latter had rips and dirt spots. Racks held hundreds of costumes. There were cauldrons of all sizes, a goblet of fire that rose out of a golden cabinet, stairways to nowhere, flying brooms, silver knives that had hand worked filigree, and an apothecary laboratory.

One room had the Hogwarts Express locomotive. At the end of the tour was a room full of snow-covered buildings used in the filming. Just spectacular. Dozens of portraits hung on the walls. Crewmembers donned costumes and posed for many of these. The place is a tribute to creativity and ingenuity.

The entire visit was a tour of fantasyland. The care that went into every phase of the productions was evident in every prop and set piece. The visit showed how the people who worked on the movies became like a family. They were together ten years.

Lt. Colonel in the Texas Army - fought and died at the Alamo

William Barret "Buck" Travis (August 1, 1809 - March 6, 1836) was a 19th-century American lawyer and soldier. At the age of 26, he was a lieutenant colonel in the Texas Army. He died at the Battle of the Alamo during the Texas Revolution.

Travis's grandfather, Berwick Travis, came to the British Colonies of North America at the age of 12, where he was placed in indentured servitude for more than a decade. A descendant of the Travers of Tulketh Castle in Preston, England, Berwick had a life that hardly resembled his ancestor's glory and wealth. After working his period of servitude, he traveled south to the colony of South Carolina, where he received a grant of over 100 acres of land in what is now present day Saluda County, South Carolina. A year later he married Anne Smallwood, and they lived out their lives there. They had seven children (four daughters and three sons), including Mark Travis and the Baptist missionary Alexander Travis.

Mark Travis married Jemima Stallworth on June 1, 1808, and she gave birth to William Barret Travis on August 1, 1809. Records differ as to whether his date of birth was the first or ninth of August, but his voungest brother James C. Travis, who was in possession of the Travis family Bible at the time of his statement, indicated that William was born on the first. Mark and Jemima had nine other children over the next

Travis was commissioned as a lieutenant colonel of the Legion of Cavalry and became the chief recruiting officer for a new regular Texan army. Governor Henry Smith ordered Travis to raise a company of professional soldiers to reinforce the Texans who were then under the command of James C. Neill at the Alamo Mission in San Antonio. Travis considered disobeying his orders, writing to Smith: "I am willing, nay anxious, to go to the defense of Bexar, but sir, I am unwilling to risk my reputation ... by going off into the enemy's country with such little means, so few men, and with them so badly equipped." James Bowie arrived at the Alamo with 30 men on January 19, 1836. On February 3, Travis arrived in San Antonio with eighteen regulars as reinforcements. A compromise was reached between Bowie and Travis for command of the Alamo, with Bowie in command of the volunteers and Travis in command of the regulars. When Bowie's health began to fail the compromise became irrelevant, and Travis became the official commander of the Alamo garrison. On March 6, 1836, following a thirteen-day siege, Santa Anna ordered the assault on the Alamo during the predawn hours. Travis died fighting to the end, and his remains were burned along with all the other Alamo defenders.

On February 24, 1836, during Santa Anna's siege of the Alamo, Travis wrote a letter addressed "To the People of Texas and All Americans in the World"


Fellow citizens and compatriots;

I am besieged, by a thousand or more of the Mexicans under Santa Anna. I have sustained a continual Bombardment and cannonade for 24 hours and have not lost a man. The enemy has demanded a surrender at discretion, otherwise, the garrison are to be put to the sword, if the fort is taken. I have answered the demand with a cannon shot, and our flag still waves proudly from the walls. I shall never surrender or retreat. Then, I call on you in the name of Liberty, of patriotism and everything dear to the American character, to come to our aid, with all dispatch. The enemy is receiving reinforcements daily and will no doubt increase to three or four thousand in four or five days. If this call is neglected, I am determined to sustain myself as long as possible and die like a soldier who never forgets what is due to his own honor and that of his country. VICTORY or DEATH. William Barret Travis


P.S. The Lord is on our side. When the enemy appeared in sight we had not three bushels of corn. We have since found in deserted houses 80 or 90 bushels and got into the walls 20 or 30 head of Beeves.

He gave this letter to courier Albert Martin to deliver. The envelope that contained the letter was labeled "VICTORY or DEATH". The letter, while unable to bring aid to the garrison at the Alamo, did much to motivate the Texian army and helped to rally support in America for the cause of Texan independence. It also cemented Travis's status as a hero of the Texas Revolution.


