





SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out",

Monday, December 7th marks the 79th Anniversary of the bombing or Pearl Harbor and our entry into World War II.

As I mentioned in a previous article, a senior from a high school south of Rochester asked me what the big deal was about Pearl Harbor. When I asked him what he meant, he told me that his history teacher told his class that Pearl Harbor and the Holocaust never happened.

I hope in this article to completely dispel that myth and to honor all those who died that infamous day. A Navy veteran, whom I knew from Mount Morris, who is now deceased, was at Pearl Harbor on December 7th and saw first-hand what happened. He even sent details back home which were published in the "Picket-Line Post" newspaper. So I am sure that he would not fabricate his stories as they were very graphic.

After World War I, America became very isolationist and did not wish to become involved in the war in Europe. There have been time periods since then that we have fluctuated between isolationism and being involved in all the world's problems! I believe that we should maintain a strong military to deter aggression from abroad.

All too often during times of isolationism, we allow our military to become weak. Article I Section 8 of the United States Constitution empowers Congress to maintain a military.

Therefore no president should be allowed to increase or decrease the strength of our armed forces without the consent of the Congress. Our military was in terrible condition at the beginning of our involvement in World War II which should not have happened.

Now back to the events of Sunday morning, December 7, 1941. The Japanese referred to the upcoming attack as Operation Z. The purpose of the attack was to destroy the United States Pacific Fleet and thereby prevent us from becoming involved in their planned attack against several Southeast Asian countries. The Imperial Japanese Naval Air Service launched their surprise attack against the United States Naval Base at Pearl Harbor on the Island of Honolulu in the Territory of Hawaii at 7:48 A. M. The Japanese referred to the attack as the Hawaii Operation and Operation A1.

The attack was comprised by 353 Japanese Imperial aircraft which included fighters, level and dive bombers and torpedo bombers in two waves launched from six aircraft carriers. Eight United States battleships were attacked and four were sunk. All but the U. S. S. Arizona were later raised and returned to action. Three cruisers, three destroyers, an anti-aircraft training ship and one mine layer were also damaged or sunk. 188 United States aircraft were destroyed, 2403 Americans were killed and 1178 others were wounded.

The power station, drydock, shipyard, maintenance, fuel and torpedo storage facilities, submarine piers and the head-quarters intelligence building were not attacked. Japanese losses were light with only 29 aircraft and five midget-submarines destroyed and 64 Japanese servicemen killed. Japan declared war on the United States later that day and our Congress and President Roosevelt declared war on Japan the next day on Monday, December 8, 1941.

On December 11th, Germany and Italy declared war on the United States. Peace negotiations were ongoing between Japan and the United States at the time of the attack.

President Roosevelt referred to the attack as "a day which will live in infamy". I know there are very few veterans alive who were there, but I would encourage anyone to share their memories of that day. Lord willing, I will send the remainder of my Pearl Harbor articles next week.





Toy Safety for Tots

Mount Morris, NY, December 2020 – As the holidays are quickly approaching, it is important to remember to buy toys that are safe, free of lead, and securely put together for your children's safety. Please take time to teach children how to use their toys to prevent potential injuries. Knowing what to buy for your children is the best way to keep your children safe. The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) is offering these tips to help parents make safe consumer choices for their children:

- Make sure the toy is specified for the age of your child. Government regulations on toy diameter and length will prevent your baby or toddler from choking. Never leave a baby unattended with toys and games containing small parts.
- Toys that plug into an electrical outlet are not recommended for children under 10. Prevent burns and electrical shocks by buying battery-operated toys for younger kids. Make sure that the battery is in a secured compartment that cannot be accessed by the child.
- Buttons, batteries, and magnets pose a serious health risk when swallowed, causing stomach and intestinal problems and possible death. Call your pediatrician or other health care provider immediately if your child swallows one of these items.
- Store toys in a designated location, such as on a shelf or in a toy chest, and keep older kids' toys away from young children.
- · Read instructions carefully on a toy before allowing your child to play with it.
- Don't leave children unattended with balloons. Uninflated or broken balloons are a choking hazard for children under 8.
- Watch out for pull toys with strings more than 12 inches in length. They could be a strangulation hazard for babies.






