



Dear "Speak Out,"

It seemed most appropriate to tell the story of the birth of Jesus Christ at this sacred and holy time of the year, The birth of Jesus Christ was foretold many times in the Old Testament of God's Word. Here is one prophesy from Isaiah 9:2,6-7 "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this."

The following is the story of the birth of Jesus Christ from Luke 2:1-21 "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.)

And everyone went to their own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise the child, he was named Jesus, the name the angel had given him before he was conceived."

I am amazed at the large holiday balloon figures of Frosty the Snow Man, Santa Claus and other traditional characters of the holidays. I have nothing against these characters and displays, but I am deeply disturbed to see almost no Nativity scenes. Stores promote Christmas as "Happy Holidays" with no mention of the "Reason for the Season – Jesus Christ". I wish all of you a very Merry Christmas and pray that you will reflect on the birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, as the true meaning for Christmas.





Elpis Israel

But we have a still plainer avowal, if possible, of the identity of this national hope with the hope for which the apostle suffered so much. The Lord Jesus had appeared to him after his arraignment before Ananias, and said to him, "Be of good cheer, Paul; for as thou hast testified of me in Jerusalem, so must thou bear witness also at Rome." When he arrived at this city, he called the chief of the Jews together, and told them that he had nothing to accuse his nation of; but had sent for them to inform them how matters really stood. He then told them how it was they found him in the custody of a Roman soldier, with fetters upon his person: "On account of the Hope of ISRAEL," said he, "am I bound with this chain" (Acts 28:20). This is conclusive. *The hope of the promise made to the fathers*, was, and, indeed, is to this day, *the Hope of Israel*; and for preaching this hope, and inviting the gentiles to a participation in it without other circumcision than that of the heart, he was denounced as a pestilent fellow, and unfit to live (24:5-6; 22:21-23)

But what was the hope of Israel about? The answer to this question is easy. Having made the chief of the Jews at Rome acquainted with the cause of his appeal to Caesar, they remarked to him, that they should like to hear of him what he thought upon the question of the national hope, as so strenuously contended for by the sect of the Nazarenes. As it was not, however, convenient then, they appointed a future day when they would meet him, and hear what he had to say upon the subject. Accordingly, at the time appointed they came together at Paul's lodging, and he proceeded to lay before them his thoughts upon the subject of Israel's hope. But I cannot do better than to state what he did in the words of Luke; who says that "he expounded and testified to them *the kingdom of God*, persuading them concerning Jesus, *both out of the law of Moses and out of the prophets*, from morning till evening." (Acts 28:23)

Now who can be so dim of vision as not to perceive, that the subject-matter of the hope of Israel is the kingdom of God? And observe, that in giving his thoughts of the national hope, the apostle's persuasions turned upon things concerning Jesus. The kingdom of God and Jesus were the subjects of Paul's testimony, when he preached "the hope of Israel," or "the hope of the promise made of God unto fathers." Having begun his testimony with the chiefs of the Jews, some of whom recieved it, he continued to publish it for two years in his own hired house to all that visited him, "preaching *the kingdom of God*, and teaching those things which concern the Lord Jesus Christ, with all confidence" (Acts 28:30-31). In this way he bore witness for Jesus in Rome, as he had done before in Jerusalem.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

The Town of Mount Morris Public Water Supply Has Levels of Haloacetic Acids (HAA) Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation. We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Sample results taken on November 10, 2020 show that our system exceeded the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for Haloacetic Acids (HAAs). The standard for HAA's is 60 micrograms per liter. The average level of HAA's over the last year was 68.75 micrograms per liter. It is important to note that the sampling location for HAAs represents the location where the highest levels are thought to occur, and may not be representative of the entire system.

What are haloacetic acids (HAAs)?

HAAs are formed in drinking water during treatment by chlorine (the most commonly used disinfectant in New York State), which reacts with certain acids that are in naturally-occurring organic material (e.g., decomposing vegetation such as tree leaves, algae or other aquatic plants) in surface water sources such as rivers and lakes. The amount of HAAs in drinking water can change from day to day, depending on the temperature, the amount of organic material in the water, the amount of chlorine added, and a variety of other factors. Drinking water is disinfected by public water suppliers to kill bacteria and viruses that could cause serious illnesses. For this reason, disinfection of drinking water by chlorination is beneficial to public health.

Some studies suggest that people who drank chlorinated drinking water containing disinfection by-products (possibly including HAAs) for long periods of time (e.g., 20 to 30 years) have an increased risk for certain health effects. These include an increased risk for cancer. However, how long and how frequently people actually drank the water as well as how much HAAs the water contained is not known for certain. Therefore, the evidence from these studies is not strong enough to conclude that the observed increased risk for cancer is due to HAAs, other disinfection by-products, or some other factor. Studies of laboratory animals show that the individual HAAs, dichloroacetic acid and trichloroacetic acid, can cause cancer following exposure to high levels over their lifetimes. Dichloroacetic acid and trichloroacetic acid are also known to cause other effects in laboratory animals after high levels of exposure, primarily on the liver, kidney, and nervous system and on their ability to bear healthy offspring. The effects reported in studies of laboratory animals occur at exposures much higher than exposures that could result through normal use of the water. The risks for adverse health effects from HAAs in drinking water are small compared to the risk for illness from drinking inadequately disinfected water.

What does this mean for you?

At present, the water is suitable to drink, cook with, and bath in. Some people may wish to take additional practical measures to reduce their exposure. We do not consider these measures necessary to avoid health effects, but they are provided as options. These include using bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes, or using water pitchers containing an activated carbon filter or a tap-mounted activated carbon filter. These filters are readily available in many grocery and home improvement stores. Ventilating bathroom areas (e.g., using exhaust fans or opening windows) when showering or bathing can also help reduce exposures from chemicals released into the air.

What happened? What is being done?

The Town of Mount Morris is working diligently with the Village of Mt. Morris to improve the quality of water delivered to consumers, including a flushing program to help maintain fresh water in the system. NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF 94-c TRANSFER APPLICATION

Morris Ridge Solar Energy Center, LLC ("Applicant") will be transferring its Application to construct the Morris Ridge Solar Project, a major solar electric generating facility, from Article 10 of the New York Public Service Law to the Office of Renewable Energy Siting (the Office) pursuant to Section 94-c of the New York State Executive Law ("94-c Process"). This notice announces that on or about December 18, 2020, the Applicant will file a Transfer Application pursuant to 19 NYCRR 900-3.2 seeking a Permit from the Office authorizing the construction and operation of the Facility. Upon the filing of the Transfer Application, the Transfer Application shall be complete in accordance with Section 94-c on the basis that the Application was deemed complete under Article 10.

The new 94-c Process replaces the Article 10 process for the permitting and siting of renewable energy facilities with a generating capacity of 25 megawatts or more. Section 94-c will be implemented by the newly established Office of Renewable Energy Siting and establishes a review process with uniform standards and conditions for all projects.

The Facility is a proposed solar-powered electric generation project consisting of up to 177 megawatts (MW) of solar electrical generation and up to 83 MW of energy storage generation (total generation will be limited to 177 MW) to be located in the Town of Mount Morris, County of Livingston, New York. The Facility will include approximately 600,000 photovoltaic (PV) solar panels and their rack/support systems; direct current (DC) and communications cables connecting the panels to multiple decentralized inverters located adjacent to the PV solar panels; the inverters, with their support platforms, control electronics, and step-up transformers; buried alternating current (AC) medium voltage collector circuits; fencing and gates around each array of panels; access roads; temporary laydown/construction support areas; a medium voltage-to-transmission voltage collection substation, with associated equipment and fenced areas; a point of interconnection (POI) switchyard with associated equipment and fenced area (to be owned by New York State Electric and Gas Corporation [NYSEG]); and a potential 83 MW energy storage facility.

The Facility is a zero-emission solar energy facility that will assist the State in meeting the goals of the Climate Leadership and Protection Act and State Energy Plan, which includes obtaining 70% of energy generation from renewable sources by 2030 and significantly reducing greenhouse gas emissions. Other positive impacts of the Facility include diversification of energy supplies, new employment opportunities (both temporary construction employment and full-time jobs), and increased revenues to the Town of Mount Morris, Livingston County, Mount Morris Central School District and Keshequa Central School District, payments to the local hospitality industry, and purchase of local supplies and goods. In addition, the Applicant has attempted to minimize impacts to land associated with the Facility by limiting the disturbance to forested lands and wetlands to the maximum extent practicable. The Applicant submitted an Application that includes extensive studies evaluating the potential impacts associated with the Facility and identified methods which have been agreed to be implemented to avoid, minimize and mitigate potential impacts.

This notice is being provided in accordance with 19 NYCRR 900-1.6(c) and will be published at least three days prior to the filing of the Transfer Application. In addition, a copy of the Transfer Application will be served on the Chief Executive Officer of each municipality in which any portion of the Facility is located, as well as those persons and agencies enumerated in 19 NYCRR 900-1.6(a).

Upon filing the Transfer Application, the Applicant will provide funding to be disbursed by the Office to local agencies and potential community intervenors to help pay expenses, including attorneys and consultants, associated with participating in the 94-c process. Within thirty (30) days of the date of the filing of the Transfer Application any local agency or potential community intervenor seeking funding from the local agency account must submit a request for initial funding to the Office of Renewable Energy Siting at 99 Washington Avenue, Albany, New York 12231, Attention: Request for Local Agency Account Funding.


