





SENIOR CITIZENS EXEMPTION (RP-467) AND PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES AND LIMITED INCOMES (RP-459-c)

Pursuant to an executive order signed by Governor Andrew M. Cuomo on December 18, 2020, the requirement for filing an annual renewal form for the 2021 assessment roll year has been waived and permits the assessor to grant these exemptions to all property owners that received the senior citizens and persons with disabilities & limited incomes exemptions on the 2020 assessment roll. However, renewal applications will still be required when the assessor has reason to believe that a significant change in ownership has occurred since the 2020 assessment roll. 





Winter Safety for Children

Winter is here and that means there will be freezing temperatures, snowstorms, icy roads, and slippery sidewalks. The winter weather comes with a variety of health and safety hazards. Protect your children during the winter months. Follow the tips below to keep your children safe from injury or illness:

- 1. Layer up! Bitter cold and snow can cause frostbite. Dress your child in several layers, and make sure their head, neck and hands are covered. Dress babies and young children in one more layer than an adult would wear.
- 2. Play it safe. Even when roads are closed to traffic, it's not safe to play or sled in the street. Visibility may be limited due to snow banks and ice on the roads.
- 3. Check in on warmth. Before kids head outside, tell them to come inside if they get wet or if they're cold. Then keep watching them and checking in. They may want to continue playing outside even if they are wet or cold.
- 4. Use sunscreen. Children and adults can still get sunburned in the winter. Sun can reflect off the snow, so apply sunscreen to exposed areas.
- 5. Use caution around fires. Wood-burning stoves, fireplaces and outdoor fire-pits are cozy but can present danger especially to small children. Use caution and put up protective gates when possible. If you've lost power or heat and are alternative heating methods like kerosene or electric heaters, be sure smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are working.
- 6. Get trained and equipped. Children should wear helmets when snowboarding, skiing, sledding or playing ice hockey. And to avoid injuries, teach children how to do the activity safely.
- 7. Prevent nosebleeds. If your child suffers from minor winter nosebleeds, use a cold-air humidifier in their room. Saline nose drops may keep their nose moist.
- 8. Keep them hydrated. In drier winter air kids lose more water through their breath. Offer plenty of water, and try giving them warm drinks and soup for extra appeal.
- 9. Watch for danger signs. Signs of frostbite are pale, grey or blistered skin on the fingers, ears, nose, and toes. If you think your child has frostbite bring the child indoors and put the affected area in warm (not hot) water. Signs of hypothermia are shivering, slurred speech, and unusual clumsiness. If you think your child has hypothermia call 9-1-1 immediately. Sources: Save the Children, American Academy of Pediatrics, University of Michigan.

But, one might say, if the hope the apostle preached, and the hope of the twelve tribes, were the same hope, why was he persecuted by the Jews? The answer is, because Paul and the rest of the apostles, testified that Jesus whom they had crucified was the king whom God had anointed to be the judge of Israel in his kingdom, of which they were the natural born citizens. They had been constituted a kingdom of priests, and a holy nation by the covenant of Sinai; and had on that occasion accepted Yahweh as their king. They were therefore the kingdom of God. In after ages, they had demanded a king who might go in and out before them. He gave them David; and promised to raise up from among his descendants, sleeping in the tomb, a king, who should be immortal, and reign over them forever, according to the provisions of a new constitution. Now, the apostles testified that God had raised up Jesus from among the dead for this very purpose; and had sent them to the Jews first, to inform them that if they desired to reign as princes over Israel and the nations with his king, it was not enough for them to be natural born descendants of Abraham; but that they must acknowledge Jesus as King of Israel, and walk in the steps of Abraham's faith. They testified furthermore, that, if they would not acknowledge him as their king, seeing that the kingdom and empire of God would require kings and priests to administer its affairs, they would turn to the gentiles, and invite them to accept the honor, and glory of the kingdom, upon terms of perfect equality with Israel; for so the Lord had commanded them to do. This mortified the Jews exceedingly. They despised Jesus because of his poverty, and ignominious death. A suffering and crucified king was a reproach to the nation in their esteem; and to be put on a level with Gentiles, whom they regarded as "dogs," filled them with indignation and madness against the preachers of such pestilent heresies. But it was the apostolic mission to withstand their fury with "the testimony of God;" and to establish their preaching by what is written in the law of Moses and the prophets, and by what they had seen and heard, and which was attested by the power of God exhibited in the miracles they performed.


