## **SPEAK OUT**

#### Dear "Speak Out,"

Congress should have legislated the latest stimulus package as a "stand alone" bill and not added a lot of boondoggles into it. The bill comprised over 5000 pages and almost no one in the Congress had an opportunity to read it before voting on it.

If all 330 million Americans (men – women – children) were sent a check for \$2000, the total cost would be 660 billion dollars. If you subtract 660 billion dollars from the 900 billion dollar bill, there would be 240 billion dollars remaining to be spent.

Here are just a few of the boondoggles in this bill: 85.5 million dollars was earmarked for Cambodia, 134 million for Burma, 1.3 billion for Egypt to buy military weapons (probably from Russia), 25 million for democracy gender programs in Pakistan, 505 million for several Central American countries, 40 million for the Kennedy Center (which is closed), one million for the Smithsonian (which is also closed), 154 million for the National Gallery of the Arts (which is also closed), 7 million for reef fish management, 25 million to combat Asian carp, 2.5 million to count Amberjack in the Gulf of Mexico, 3 million for poultry production technology, 2 million for construction projects for the FBI and also monies to promote breeding fish in federal fish hatcheries.

Illegal aliens would receive up to 1800 dollars each in their stimulus checks compared to 600 dollars for American citizens. It is no wonder that the president did not want to sign a bill with so many boondoggles!

We need to understand that we cannot spend our way out of this economic problem! Unfortunately, being elected to office was more important before the election than the well-being of the American public whom these politicians represent. Those unfortunate Americans who are unemployed should have been the top priority when preparing this bill! For the first time since the Great Depression the number of Americans who are unemployed and hungry is at a critical level. Politicians have become very indifferent as they enjoy their lucrative jobs and vacations in lush resorts while many Americans are being evicted from their homes and go hungry. This is a disgrace that these politicians are "fiddling while America burns".



#### 1 in 15 Homes in the U.S. Have High Radon Levels Help Protect Your Community this January

Mount Morris, NY, January 2021 -

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has designated January as National Radon Action Month. This January, the Livingston County Department of Health is raising awareness about the risks of radon in our community — and teaching others how to test their homes.

According to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, an estimated 1 in 15 homes in the U.S. have high radon levels — and high radon levels can be a risk anywhere. Living in a home with high radon levels can be dangerous for your health. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer and it is estimated to cause over 20,000 deaths each year in the U.S. Because of the ways that radon and tobacco smoke damage the lungs, high radon levels are especially dangerous for people who smoke. Their risk of lung cancer is 10 times higher than non-smokers.

Radon, a radioactive gas, builds up in homes over time and can't be seen, tasted, or smelled — so it's easy for radon problems to go unnoticed. The only way to know if you have a radon problem is to test your home. The Surgeon General recommends that all homes get tested for radon. Home radon tests are simple and inexpensive — and can help save lives.

Homeowners can test their homes with a simple kit — and if their home has high radon levels, they can fix it. Radon reduction repairs can be done with the help of a licensed radon mitigation contractor.

## Day One of COVID-19 Vaccination Rollout at LCCNR and LCDOH a Success!!

January 7, 2021 — Yesterday marked the first day of COVID-19 vaccinations being administered at both the Livingston County Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation (LCCNR) and Livingston County Department of Health (LCDOH) vaccination clinics.

The first of three vaccination clinics at LCCNR was open to both residents and staff. "The vast majority – over 90% - of our resident population elected to receive the COVID-19 vaccine," stated Stephen Woodruff, LCCNR's Director of Long-Term Care. Future clinics for LCCNR residents and staff will be held on January 27, 2020 and February 17, 2020.

Woodruff continued, "While vaccination is, of course, noncompulsory, we nevertheless have worked with our partner, Health Direct, to assure the availability of vaccine for 100% of both staff and resident populations."

At this time, LCDOH is only vaccinating those prioritized in Phase 1A of the New York State Vaccination Program, including:

• All outpatient/ambulatory front-line, high-risk health care workers of any age who provide direct in-person patient care, or other staff in a position in which they have direct contact with patients (i.e., intake staff)

• All front-line, high-risk public health workers who have direct contact with patients, including those conducting COVID-19 tests, those handling COVID-19 lab specimens and COVID-19 vaccinations;

• Home care workers and aides, hospice workers, personal care aides, and consumer-directed personal care workers; and

Staff and residents of nursing homes, skilled nursing facilities, and adult care facilities.

LCDOH's COVID-19 vaccination clinics are held Mondays – Fridays, 11AM–2PM at 1 Murray Hill Drive in Mount Morris. To schedule an appointment for Phase 1A, visit the Livingston County COVID-19 Vaccine Information webpage. **YOU MUST HAVE AN APPOINTMENT. NO WALK-INS.** 

"The initial rollout at our clinic yesterday went very smoothly, and appointment slots for future clinics are filling up quickly" said Jennifer Rodriguez, Livingston County's Public Health Director. "As we advance through the phased rollout, we strongly encourage Livingston County residents to get vaccinated for COVID-19 as they become eligible. In addition to wearing masks, washing hands, and maintaining distance, getting vaccinated will help our community stay healthy and safe."

### **Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention**

Every year, hundreds of people die and thousands are injured from unsuspected exposure to an odorless, colorless gas—carbon monoxide (CO). Studies by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicate that, while people recognize CO gas is poisonous, they perceive CO as less dangerous than other household hazards. CO poisoning is most prevalent when furnaces are turned back on to fight cold winter temperatures, but also commonly occur after summer and winter storms and accompanying power outages, when people tend to rely on portable generators for electricity.

Here are some simple steps to protect yourselves and your family:

- ✓ Install battery-operated CO detectors near every sleeping area in your home.
- ✔ Check CO detectors regularly to be sure they are functioning properly.
- ✓ Have gas or oil furnaces inspected by a qualified professional every year.
- ✓ Never use a generator inside the home or garage, even if doors and windows are open.
- Only use generators and power washers outside, more than 20 feet away from the home, doors, and windows.
- ✓ Never use a charcoal grill inside the home.
