As with any collision, you must carefully document hit and run

accidents for your insurance company and the police. However, that can be a little tricky since one driver has taken off!

Here are some dos and

don'ts for handling the



situation. **DON'T** follow the fleeing driver. Leaving the scene of the accident could put you in a compromising position: You'll miss getting eyewitness accounts - and police could question


who's really at fault.

DO call 911 if you are in your car or someone is injured.

DON'T wait to call the police or your insurance company to file a police report or an accident claim. The official accident report will help police look for the missing driver and will be useful when you file

your accident claim.


DO get as much information about the driver, car and accident as possible, including:



- The other vehicle's make, model and color
- Description of damage to the other vehicle
- Which direction the other vehicle was headed
- Photos of the damage to your vehicle
- Location, date, time and cause of the accident

DO ask witnesses if they can supply additional information about the accident. If they give you or the police a statement, be sure to get their names and contact information. Witness information can

be especially helpful if the hit and run occurred when you were not with your vehicle.





"We were grateful to have collected that amount, especially given the fact that the United Way was without an executive director or campaign manager for part of that time," said Jennifer McNulty, who took the reins as executive director in December 2019.

With COVID-19 hitting hard beginning last March, the campaign's focus diversified somewhat. The

United Way's attention turned in large part toward helping area non-profits navigate the financial hardships of shutdowns across the region it serves.

A COVID fund was established and raised \$80,000 during the remainder of the year for struggling non-profits. The 2020-21 United Way

The 2020-21 United Way campaign kicked off last September again with a goal of \$1 million to fund the 19 partner agencies and the 22 programs which fall under their auspices.

under their auspices. This year's campaign for the most part is being handled virtually. That approach already looks promising.

promising. So far, the campaign has raised \$270,000.

And while corporate giving isn't at the level she'd prefer, there is light on the horizon.

"We're not doing as well as we were four years ago at this time, but we're further ahead of where we were last year at this time," she said.

The campaign will go until June.

Aside from corporate giving, there have been

special fundraisers along the way, including an online music showcase set for next month.

There have been other generous donations as well, including an anonymous donor matching new leadership donations dollar for dollar. That same donor is

matching any increases in repeat donations. For example, if someone's donation

someone's donation increases from \$1,000 to \$1,500, the donor will match \$500.

So far, \$20,000 in new and increased leadership donations is eligible for the match.

McNulty said there's still uncertainty surrounding workplace campaigns, but United Way employees and volunteers are willing to meet in person or virtually with employers.

"We have ambassadors calling on companies and we're doing it all safely, adhering to pandemic safety protocol," she said. "We're really pushing for leadership giving."

Capital Chaos Too Much Too Late

nce all the media drama settles down, the emotions that boiled over for a few hundred protesters in Washington D.C. last week will be but a small blip on the radar of history. As legislators met at the capital to

debate merits and validity of the Nov. 3 elections, a few hundred of the 300-500,000 protesters fed up with inaction on both perceived and real voting irregularities broke through barricades, scaled walls, broke windows, and breached doors forcing elected officials inside to scurry through emergency exits. I was in an automobile accident and my medical bills were more than the other persons insurance. What do I do?

Ashley, Town Creek, AL

We see this situation fairly often.

First, do you have health insurance, Medicaid or Medicare? Be certain that they pay first as they will receive a substantial discount in the amount of the bills.

Second, do you have medical payment coverage on your car?

Third, do you have uninsured motorist coverage? If you

do, uninsured/underinsured motorist (UM/ UIM) coverage provides an additional source of compensation for an injured person when the person who caused the accident either has no insurance, or the limits of his or her insurance won't pay your bills.

There are numerous issues that arise when dealing with a UM/UIM claim that must be addressed on a case-by-case basis. Often there is more than one policy which can add additional coverage through "stacking" more than one policy. Once you know the available policy limits of the person who caused the accident, as well as how much insurance you have available, then you are ready to settle with the person who caused the accident and/or their insurance company. A special release called a "Pro Tanto Release" must be given or this coverage is waived.

Uninsured/underinsured motorist can be tricky. Often insurance carriers just allow you to make the mistake of accepting money from the at-fault driver and losing your claim for more money. If you have a question, give me or Joel a call.

Medicare Minute "Qualifying for Medicare"

When I began working with Medicare health plans a few years ago it became obvious to me that people aging into Medicare were joining a health insurance program that they really didn't understand. Although the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) do all they can to educate Americans about the benefits of Medicare it still isn't enough for them to fully understand what they have as far as medical coverage through the federal government. Over the next the next few weeks we're going to discuss the basics of and what is covered under Medicare. But first let's look at how Medicare started.

On July 30, 1965, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed into law the bill, Title XVIII of the Social Security Act, which led to the establishment of Medicare. The original bill included Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medical Insurance). Today we know these 2 parts as "Original Medicare". In the beginning Medicare was created to provide health insurance to people 65 years of age and older, regardless of income or medical history.

Over the past five decades changes have been made as to who qualifies for Medicare. In addition to people over the age of 65, Medicare now covers people under the age of 65 who are permanently disabled and have been receiving Social Security Disability Insurance for 24 months. Also anyone at any age can receive Medicare if they have End Stage Renal Disease or ALS.

Although Medicare provides medical coverage for those who qualify it is not 100% coverage!! We often hear "once I go on Medicare my medical insurance worries are over." Medicare has deductibles and coinsurance that the Medicare beneficiary is responsible for unless the beneficiary has additional coverage to supplement Medicare.

aligned procedural process that was taking place when all of this transpired.

As was the case with numerous other riotous situations recently, it appears that law enforcement again was largely unprepared and let the situation get out of hand.

Although it was on a day that would get good media coverage, it was far too late to mount any meaningful peaceful protest, beyond something symbolic.

Like much of what transpired November 3-4, this and the US riots over the past several months mirror events that often take place in corrupt, under-developed countries. Over 50 people arrested have been thus far for last week's insurrection, so the lawlessness there is at least being addressed.

Unfortunately, a young woman died from a gunshot wound to her neck, and an officer died later from injuries. Both incidents are under investigation. Still sadder is that so many on social media, most hiding behind a screen name, said the petite, unarmed 14-year Air Force veteran 'got what she deserved.' We'll have to remember

that blanket dismissal. We can use it the next time some drug-induced male two times her size and intent on killing injuring one or or more members of law

enforcement is himself killed in a skirmish, or some other group riots sets buildings on fire.

The main differences are that last week's riot at the capital involved fewer people in daylight hours on a bigger stage in front of more eyes than those lasting for months which have largely been ignored by the major networks and condoned by local officials and law enforcement.

In addition, far less damage was done here than in other recent similar situations. Not to say that insured media equipment and a few hundred thousand dollars worth of damage to public property at the capital is insignificant, but it will





Remember Rural Areas

Editor:

President-elect Joe Biden ran on a platform that promised to "Build Back Better" while also pledging to take the steps needed to address the harsh realities of a changing climate. For rural Americans, the level of investment required to secure the goals promised by the president-elect and his new team is long overdue.

For too long, presidential administrations have given lip service to rural folks while failing to put forth the resources and policies required to facilitate economic and societal prosperity in rural communities.

As the new administration looks to inauguration day, we ask them to recognize reality. Prioritizing rural America is non-negotiable if they are to successfully enact their domestic climate agenda.

In the final months of 2020, the incoming president announced his self-titled "Climate Team" and other nominations including his selections for the Energy, Agriculture, Interior, and Transportation departments, and the Environmental Protection Agency.

When we look back in four years, rural America will be a litmus test of success for the government's renewed emphasis on climate change. 
