



Dear "Speak Out,"

This week's article is entitled "The Evils of Abortion".

I was graduated from high school in 1961. My generation is responsible for the horrible condition in which our country is presently in today.

My "baby-boomer generation" stood idly by as the United States Supreme Court outlawed prayer in public schools in 1962 and outlawed Bible reading in 1963.

Later we continued to sit idly by as the United States Supreme Court legalized abortion on Monday, January 22, 1973, in the infamous case Roe v Wade.

More than 63 million babies have been murdered in abortion mills since then. This amounts to an average of 1,340,000 babies being killed each year since 1973 which averages about 3600 abortions per day.

It has been estimated that our total population in America today would be over 500 million compared to the 330 million alive today if these 63 million babies had not been aborted. Many would be in their 30s and 40s today and would have had children and grandchildren of their own by now.

With all these additional Americans in our workforce, our Gross National Product (GNP) would be significantly higher than it is currently. There would be no need to borrow trillions of dollars to fund our lavish lifestyles. These Americans would be paying income taxes to help fund our state and federal budgets. They would be paying into the Social Security and Medicare Trust Funds and would have strengthened them. We would not be concerned about the liquidity of these funds and their continued ability to assist we baby boomers and our children in the future.

We have endangered the future of our economy by allowing these unborn children to be murdered. Something of even more importance than the effects on our economy is the spiritual significance which abortion has had on America. Ancient Israel offered thousands of their born children on the altars of BAAL while we have sacrificed millions of our unborn in our abortion mills. 



1 in 15 Homes in the U.S. Have High Radon Levels Help Protect Your Community this January

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has designated January as National Radon Action Month. This January, the Livingston County Department of Health is raising awareness about the risks of radon in our community — and teaching others how to test their homes.

According to U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, an estimated 1 in 15 homes in the U.S. have high radon levels — and high radon levels can be a risk anywhere. Living in a home with high radon levels can be dangerous for your health. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer and it is estimated to cause over 20,000 deaths each year in the U.S. Because of the ways that radon and tobacco smoke damage the lungs, high radon levels are especially dangerous for people who smoke. Their risk of lung cancer is 10 times higher than non-smokers.

Radon, a radioactive gas, builds up in homes over time and can't be seen, tasted, or smelled — so it's easy for radon problems to go unnoticed. The only way to know if you have a radon problem is to test your home. The Surgeon General recommends that all homes get tested for radon. Home radon tests are simple and inexpensive — and can help save lives.

Homeowners can test their homes with a simple kit — and if their home has high radon levels, they can fix it. Radon reduction repairs can be done with the help of a licensed radon mitigation contractor.
