On behalf of the City of Hartselle, we are glad you are here. Whether this be a visit, you are looking to make a move to our city, contemplating opening a business here, coming back home to retire or seek employment, or you have lived here your entire life, you cannot find a better place to be than the "City of Southern Hospitality." More than just words it is a lifestyle, one that many who have been here for years can attest to.

Founded in 1870 by George Hartsell, needing a stop-off point for the North and South Railroad, Hartselle is home to several generations of families, as well as new comers who have just recently moved to our city. While Hartselle has grown and changed much over the past 150 years, one thing that remains is the small town community life appreciated and enjoyed by many who live here. From an agricultural based farming community, with a small area of downtown, Hartselle is now home to approximately 14,500 citizens. However, Hartselle's citizens have the highest median income in all of Morgan County.

Many were born here and have stayed for their entire life, others have moved for employment or family reasons, while others have chosen the slower pace of life to retire in. At the top of the list for reasons to choose Hartselle is our award winning school system. Hartselle City Schools is the jewel in the crown of Hartselle. The school system graduates 225 -250 students each May, and within the best of their ability these students are college and or career ready. New emphasis has been placed on vocational training and workforce development of late and Hartselle is stepping up to the plate to make sure our students can fill the needed roles. Hartselle City Schools consistently ranks in the top 10 -15 schools in the state in academics, the arts and athletics.

Another reason folks choose to stay, or move here, includes the feeling of safety in our city, for their family and themselves. Hartselle has been named the 4th safest city in the state and with a very low crime rate. In fact, many of the crimes committed are basically property crimes and not crimes against persons. The school system is also ranked as one of the safest in the state as well.

Hartselle offers recreation facilities not seen in many cities our size. An Olympic size pool at the Aquatic Center, along with a splash pad, are used frequently in the summer months. Well maintained athletic fields for baseball, football, soccer and softball, for ages youth to adult are also a sought after commodity for those who call our city home.

Well-staffed and trained police and fire departments, with long time personnel add to the attraction of calling Hartselle home. Public works services that include curbside trash, rubbish, yard waste and recycle pick-up in city provided bins, are appreciated by those who live here.

Hartselle is also known for our churches. Home to most denominations and several non-denominational churches, each one seeks to share the gospel as well as support the community.

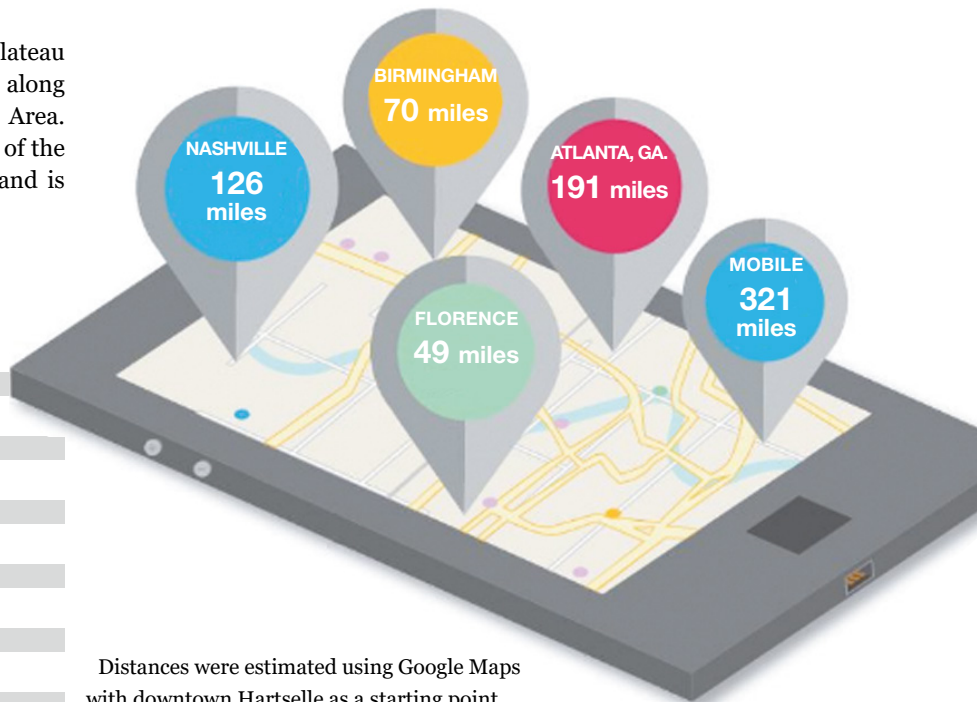

WEATHER

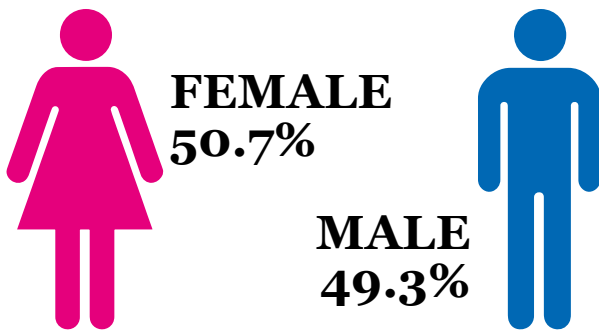


Hartselle experiences primarily mild and pleasant weather all year.

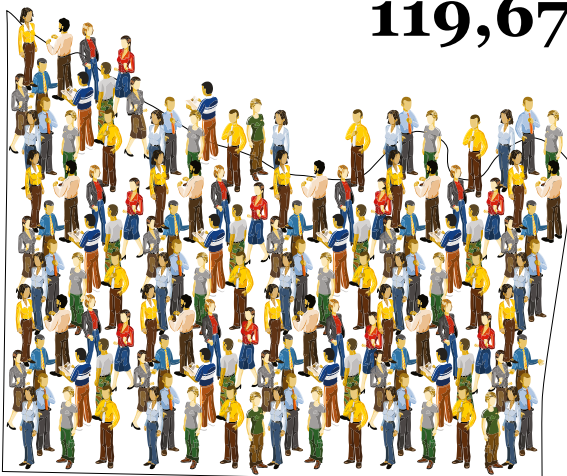
Four months, December through March, account for about 43 percent of the normal annual precipitation. Severely cold weather seldom occurs.

The average date for the last occurrence of freezing temperatures in the spring is late March, and the average date for the first freeze is late October.

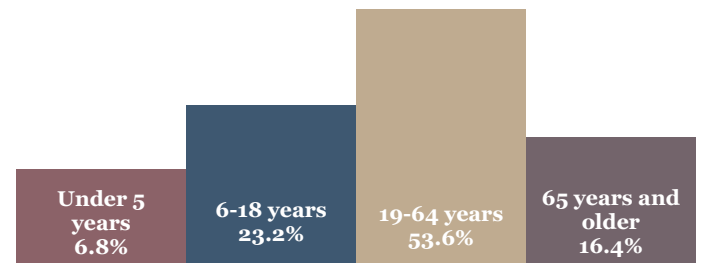

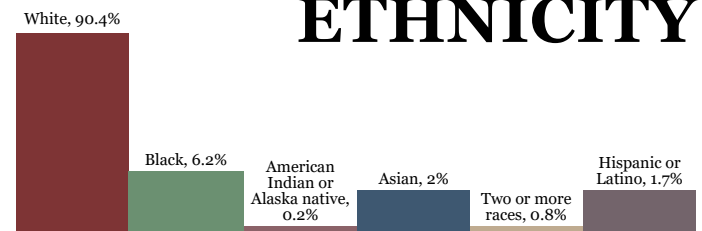

NEW & EXPANDING INDUSTRIES IN MORGAN COUNTY

During fiscal year 2018-2019, Morgan County companies announced 18 expansions/equipment upgrades, some which remain confidential, for a total of \$377,256,510 in capital investment and 141 new jobs. Additionally, there was one company that announced it will locate in Morgan County with an investment of **\$4,210,000** and **24 new jobs**.

Morgan County is a consistent leader in Alabama in existing industry expansions and is currently home to approximately 145 industries, including 14 Fortune 500 companies and 7 Global 500 companies.

Hartselle Utilities serves the City of Hartselle with water, electricity, natural gas and sanitary sewer system. To get connected with Hartselle Utilities service, a rental lease or a house purchase agreement must be presented to transfer utilities to the new customer.

The deposit cost is determined by credit rating and ranges from \$25 to \$435. If the prospective customer can provide a letter from another utility company stating he or she was in good standing for at least one year, the deposit fee could be waived, and only a connection fee would be required.

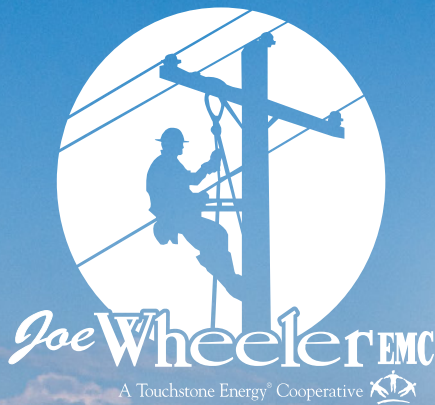

The Hartselle Police Department is under the leadership of Chief Justin Barley. Barley has been with the department since January 1999 and began his law enforcement career in 1997.

Barley is a 2001 graduate from Athens State University, where he earned a Bachelor of Science in public safety administration. He also earned a master's degree in justice and public safety from Auburn University in Montgomery. He is a 2008 graduate from the FBI National

Academy Session 235 and is also a Certified Police Chief through the University Partnership for Alabama Continuing Education.

The department is made up of 29 officers, with one part-time officer for code enforcement and four part-time School Protection Officers. SPECIAL NEEDS ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND

In 2006 the civic clubs of Hartselle – Civitan, Kiwanis, Lions and Rotary – in an unprecedented move united to plan and develop a playground for children with physical disabilities in Morgan County. The playground, named The John Mark Stallings Special Needs Accessible Playground of Morgan County, is designed to accommodate the now-estimated 2,500 children with special needs and other children in the county.

The overall objective of the project was to develop the premier special-needs playground in Alabama. Parallel goals were to provide recreational facilities and interaction opportunities for children with special needs in Morgan County and the surrounding region; and to stimulate other communities across

the nation to similarly recognize and accommodate such needs.

Soon after the clubs united, the City of Hartselle, Hartselle Area Chamber of Commerce, Morgan County Volunteer Firemen Association, United Way of Morgan County, Volunteer Center of Morgan County and Walmart of Hartselle joined in support. The four civic clubs and these entities are recognized as SNAP Founding Partners.

Compelling support emerged for this compassionate, needed and worthy project. The list of endorsements includes:

- proclamations from the Morgan County Commission, cities of Decatur and Hartselle and towns of Eva, Falkville, Priceville, Somerville and Trinity

- letters from State Sen. Arthur Orr, State Rep. Ronald Grantland, the Autism Society of Alabama and Children's Hospital of Alabama.

The entire complex is accessible and usable and is in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Of paramount importance is encouraging interaction of children with all abilities.

The site in Hartselle, near the Sparkman Civic Center, is centrally located in the county, offers balanced access from throughout the county and offers good access from Interstate 65. The specific location satisfies prime considerations of safety and well-being, ambient environment conducive to a feeling of inclusion, continual oversight by a trained staff, restrooms, drinking water and ample and convenient parking.

SNAP is designed to be a destination attraction and features comprehensive play equipment that satisfies ADA requirements. Comfort and aesthetics are significantly enhanced by shades, seating

for adults and abundant landscaping.

The complex has been constructed in increments to permit use as funding became available: 2008 – Swing Area
2010 – Splash Pad
2011 – Pavilion
2013 – Main Entrance and Playground A
2016 – Playground B and overall complex enhancements

The SNAP Splash Pad was recognized in 2011 by Aquatics International as the Best of Aquatics Spraypark in the nation, typifying the character of the entire complex.

The 10-year project has been administered in total by non-paid volunteers, with construction being made possible by donations, grants and in-kind services. The complex represents an investment of approximately \$1M, including cash donations, grants and in-kind services.

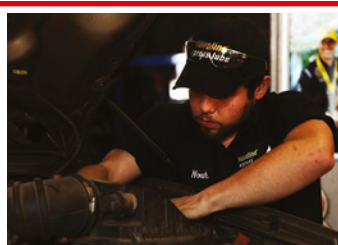

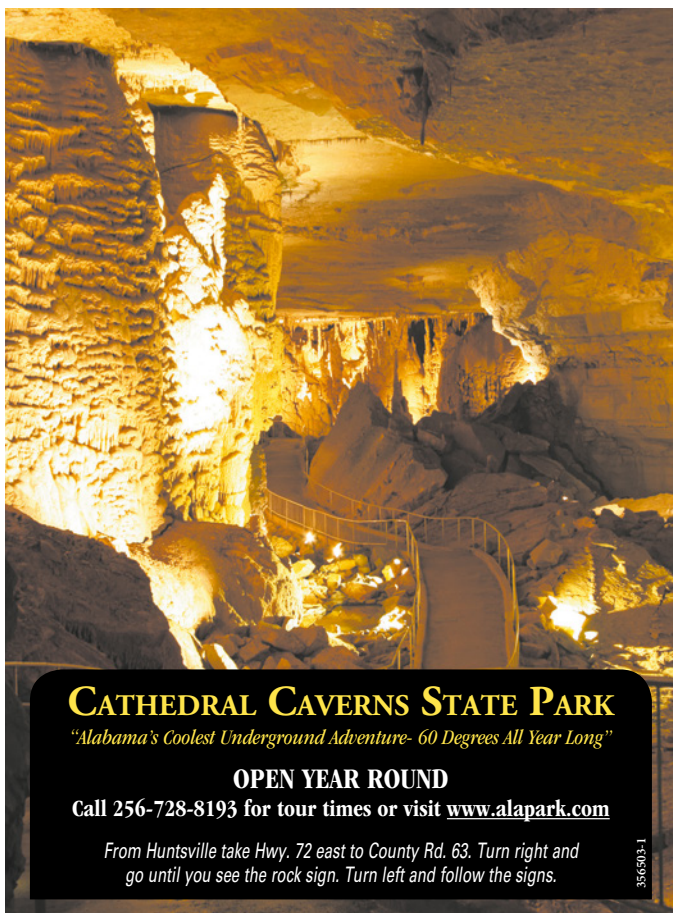

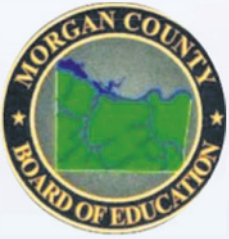
