

Okoboji Music 28-Day Challenge for New Uniforms Okoboji Fine Arts is coordinating a 28-Day Challenge in February to raise funds for new band and choir uniforms at Okoboji High School.

Both band and choir wear the same concert attire. The current chiffon dresses and full tuxedos are over 10 years old. The chiffon dresses have been hemmed too many times and many



of the tuxedos pieces are stained.

Fundraising began in late November and almost \$2000 has already been raised! The OFA aims to raise \$10,500 in 3 phases. PHASE 1 (\$4,800): Replace the dresses with new ones that are

machine washable with no chiffon for easier hemming. A formal, full length dress (including tailoring) will be approximately \$75.

PHASE 2 (\$2,600): Replace the dress shirts which are priced at \$14 and the tuxedo dress pants which are \$28. We are able to keep the current bowties. This uniform with alterations will cost approximately \$55.

We will delay PHASE 3 (\$3,100) for a year or two while we apply for grants. Phase 3 involves the purchase of new tuxedo jackets. Each jacket is approximately \$70 with tailoring.

PRIZES: Each individual/business that donates will be eligible for one of four \$25 gift certificates to Perkins Restaurant. OFA will draw for a prize on February 7, 14, 21, and 28. OFA will announce the results of the 28-Day Challenge at the 7-12 Vocal Concert on March 1st.

Leading up to the weekend I reviewed the full schedule of events, and added those I wanted to watch to my "Winter Games" calendar. I organized my schedule in 30 minute increments based on where the events were taking place, so my travel was most efficient. I then shared the calendar with everyone I felt needed to know where I would be at any given time throughout the weekend. This was not a shock to any of my friends. #### Equine Lunch and Learn Webinar Series

New monthly webinar is designed to educate horse enthusiasts

Horse owners and enthusiasts will have an opportunity to learn more about management of equines during a monthly webinar on equine management decisions.

Beginning February 11, Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will provide a monthly series of short virtual meetings over four months. The webinar topics include nutrition, the importance of soil for pasture and hay, weed control and environmental management. Opportunities for interaction with the presenters will be available.

"The program is designed to provide attendees with an interactive and informative opportunity to further develop their knowledge of equine related topics, including management and care," said Peggy Auwerda, associate professor in animal science and extension equine specialist at Iowa State University. Session topics

- February 11. "Bringing Your Horse Out of Winter and into the Show Arena," with Randel Raub, director of research and nutrition with Kent Nutrition Group.
- March 11. "Importance of Soil Fertility for Forages," with Antonio Mallarino, professor in agronomy and extension specialist at Iowa State University.
- April 8. "Tips to Manage Weeds in Horse Pastures," with Meaghan Anderson, field agronomist with ISU Extension and Outreach.
- May 13. "Environmental Management of Horse Facilities," with Kapil Arora, field agricultural engineer with ISU Extension and Outreach.

All sessions will be held from noon to 1:00pm and the webinars are free.

### Farm Bill Meetings Offered

Producers and landowners can hear about options ahead of the March 15 deadline

Iowa producers have until March 15, 2021 to make their annual election for Price Loss Coverage or Agriculture Risk Coverage (at the individual or county levels) under the 2018 Farm Bill.

This annual decision impacts the 2021 crop year, consistent with the 2018 Farm Bill. Similar annual decisions, for the 2022 and 2023 crops, will coincide with the final two years of the bill.

In order to help Iowans understand their options for 2021, Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will hold in-person meetings throughout Northwest Iowa in February through early-March, as well as offer virtual webinars for those who cannot attend in person.

"The key decision is between Price Loss Coverage and Agriculture Risk Coverage (county or individual)," said Gary Wright, farm management specialist with ISU Extension and Outreach. "A farmer's choices will depend on the type of operation, where located, and their price outlook.'

Wright explained that PLC payments are triggered when the marketing year average price falls below the reference prices of \$3.70 per bushel for corn and \$8.40 per bushel for soybeans. Whereas, ARC-CO payments are triggered when actual county revenue for the crop is less than the guarantee. Wright says current USDA projections for 2021 are close to \$4 per bushel for corn and \$10.55 per bushel for soybeans.

Ag producers and landowners are encouraged to be proactive and attend an in-person or virtual session if they have questions about their options. In order to properly mitigate COVID-19 risks, pre-registration is required, and a fee may be assessed. Sessions will be one-hour in length, with additional time for questions at the end.

## **Increasing Pig Survivability**

is actively involved in a research, education and extension effort to improve pig survivability. It is unfortunate that mortality is part of swine production, but the good news is that progress in this area can be very rewarding. The project is multi-state and funded by the National Pork Board and the Foundation for Food and Agriculture Research (FFAR) with the goal



being to reduce mortality and maximize pig survivability The interdisciplinary team working on this project is from Iowa State University, Kansas State University and Purdue University. More information is available through Extension or by visiting the website *piglivability.org*.

A previous project studied sow prolapse on farm and identified several areas to be studied. One hundred four farms with 400,000 sows were studied, multiple factors contributing to prolapse were identified, and commonly held presumed causes were shown to have minimal influence. More studies are currently underway to learn more specifics regarding the problem and to help producers manage.

Now, along with sow mortality, new work is studying pre-weaning and post-weaning survivability. In addition to research, the grant focuses on education, including a survey to understand barriers to implementing new strategies. Specialists are also working on the economics across swine production setting benchmarks and model business discussions to improve survivability strategies. One example of output from the grant includes educational podcasts. Go to piglivability.org to listen to educational information regarding reducing wean-to-finish mortality; weaning age impact; sow body condition score; biosecurity; starting nursery pigs; colostrum intake and more.

Locally, we have been working with swine producers in various ways. We are collecting some sow condition score data on select farms to see if there are farm differences that impact the results of sow condition scoring. Additionally, work continues in biosecurity training. We are finding that most operations have been taught what to do, but the execution of implementing biosecurity technologies vary substantially from farm to farm. Hands-on biosecurity workshops have been beneficial to many operations.


