
Hundreds Came for Her Birthday

Antibody Therapy at NAMC



FLORENCE - North Alabama Medical Center (NAMC) is offering bamlanivimab and casirivimab and imdevimab, a new monoclonal antibody therapy, for treatment of nonhospitalized patients with a mild or moderate case of COVID-19. The drug was developed by pharmaceutical company Eli Lilly and Regeneron Pharmaceuticals,

Inc., and it recently received emergency use authorization from the Food and Drug Administration. It is now being allocated by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) in partnership with the Alabama Department of Public Health and other state agencies.

Space Camp **Scholarships**

RUSSELLVILLE-Middleschool students who live in Alabama House District 18 are eligible to apply for scholarships to attend a special Space Camp program free of charge. This includes students who live in Lauderdale, Colbert, and Franklin counties.

"The importance of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) cannot be emphasized enough. I want to be sure that our students in rural Alabama have the same opportunity to attend Space Camp as other kids in the state" said District 18 Rep. Jamie

Students ages 12-14 may apply for Space Academy for Leading Students in Alabama (SALSA), a Space Camp program funded by the Alabama legislature. One male and one female student living in the district will receive a scholarship to attend SALSA, To be eligible for SALSA, students must apply before the February deadline. The two students chosen will be notified in March 2021. The camp will take place

in May. Each scholarship includes tuition, room and board for the Space Academy program. Travel to and from the U.S. Space & Rocket Center is not included.

Community **Action Grant**

MONTGOMERY— Grants totaling \$47.8 million have been awarded to help low-income households with utility costs during the cold winter and hot summer months.

"The coldest and hottest times of the year hit many low-income residents particularly hard," Gov. **Kay Ivey** said, "These grants will provide additional funding to assist in lowering the costs for many of them." stated Gov. Ivey. She awarded the grants to 19 community agencies that manage the program of emergency funding at the local level that will help low-income families heat and cool their homes this year.

The Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs is administering the grants from funds made available by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. These grants in addition to grant funds

of \$13 million in grants awarded through the CARES Act in late 2020.





day's mail was delivered.

Some first- and second-grade classes at Webster Elementary made her cards, adding another 63 to the tallv.

The total has risen daily since the word got out about a week before her birthday.

Iimmy Moomaw said his wife, who is dealing with Parkinson's disease and dementia, hasn't been able to be out and about the past 10 months because of COVID-19 concerns.

The couple's frequent travel was likewise thwarted last year.

Jimmy considered drive-by birthday parade, but feared it would be too cold for her to sit outside and enjoy it.

Jimmy initially wanted to keep all the cards until Barbara's birthday and surprise her, but it soon became apparent wasn't doable.

"The mailman started delivering them on Tuesday before her Saturday birthday and there were so many, I knew I had to let her have them as they came in or it would take forever I to get through them all," he

"I joked that the mailman was probably thinking with all those cards that I'd died and she was getting sympathy cards.'

Moomaw went to the mailbox and found 169 cards addressed to his wife.

"She is well-loved by a whole lot of people," he said.

The outpouring of love for Barbara came from all around including 11 states.

She received cards from her friends from Waterloo, where she attended high school; from co-workers from ECM from which she retired in 1995 as a secretary; and from countless people she'd taught during her 40 years as a Sunday school leader.

"I just can't tell you why there was such a response," Barbara said. "Jimmy never meets a stranger and has always gotten me involved with many different groups of people, so I guess that's how I've come to know so many people.

"It has always been that when you see one of us, you see us both," she said. "I couldn't believe all these cards, and I read every one of them, more than once, actually."



Masks Req'd on the Trace

WASHINGTON - To protect the health of those who live, work, and visit our national parks and facilities, and in support of the President's Executive Order on Protecting the Federal Workforce and Requiring Mask-Wearing, the National Park Service (NPS) last week implemented a mask requirement for employees, visitors,

partners, and contractors. The mandate includes the Natchez Trace Parkway through Mississippi, Alabama, and Tennessee.

Masks are now required in all NPS buildings, facilities, and on NPSmanaged lands when physical distancing cannot be maintained, including narrow or busy trails, overlooks and historic homes. Additional public health measures are in place across the service, from capacity limits to oneway trails, or temporary closures in response to local conditions

"Working with public health officials and following the latest science and guidance, we can make national parks safer for employees, visitors and partners," said NPS Deputy Director **Shawn Benge**. "We will continue to evaluate operations and make appropriate modifications to visitor services as needed."

Visitors should check park websites and social media channels for details before they visit. Park rangers are on duty to provide information, protect visitors and park resources, and uphold this requirement.

I believe I started writing letters about the railroad overpass around

2005 that were published in the Courier Journal and have submitted several more that were published over the years.

I did a drawing of my proposal and showed it to a couple of my back coworkers

in '05. I did the drawing after I videotaped that location a couple of times. I'm not an artist by any means, but it gets the point across. I'm sure there would have to have been some changes to the idea.

I remember pointing out in one of my letters that the center lane would be for emergency vehicles only and that

if one life was saved it would be worth it. I also pointed out that construction of an overpass at that location could be almost entirely built without interrupting traffic until it was tied into the existing streets. It also had another entrance into Sheffield that ran along the tracks which could probably be tied in with the new Inspiration Landing project.

I later proposed that a private firm build the overpass to ALDOT standards which would have been far cheaper than the current proposals. I suggested that it be a toll overpass with smart phone readers that could charge a person's account and after the private firm got a reasonable return on their investment it would be given to the state of Alabama. I told you about the drawing I made, but you said you couldn't publish it at that time.

The latest \$120,000 study on the best places for a railroad overpass in the Shoals area has "can you believe five" locations. My initially-proposed







How to Choose a **Medical Alert System**

I am interested in getting my mom, who lives alone, a medical alert system with a wearable pendant button that will let her call for help if she falls or has a medical emergency. What can you tell me to help me choose one?

Too Many Choices

Dear Too Many,

A good medical alert system is an effective and affordable tool that can help keep your mom safe and living in her own home longer. But with all the different products and features available today, choosing one can be challenging. Here are some tips that can help.

Three Key Questions

Medical alert systems, which have been around since the 1980s, provide a wearable help button - usually in the form of a neck pendant or wristband - that would put your mom in touch with a dispatcher who could summon emergency help or contact a friend or family member as needed.

To help you narrow down your options and choose a system $\,$ that best fits your mom's needs, here are three key questions you'll need to ask, along with some top-rated companies that offer these products.

1. Does your mom want a home-based or mobile system? Medical alert systems were originally designed to work inside the home with a landline telephone, which is still an option. But since fewer and fewer households have landlines these days, most companies today also offer home-based systems that work over a cellular network. With these systems, pressing the

wearable help button allows you to speak to a dispatcher through a base unit located in your home.

In addition, many companies offer mobile medical alert options, too. You can use these systems at home, but they'll also allow you to call for help while you're out and about.

Mobile alerts operate over cellular networks and incorporate GPS technology. They allow you to talk and listen to the operator directly through the pendant button, and because of the GPS, your location would be known in order for help to be sent.

If your mom doesn't leave the house very often, she may not need a mobile system, but if she is still active, she may want added protection outside the home.

2. Should her system be monitored or not?

The best medical alert systems are monitored, meaning that the help button connects you with a trained operator at a 24/7 dispatching center.

But you also have the option to choose a system that isn't monitored. With these, when you press the help button, the device automatically dials a friend or family member on your programmed emergency call list.

These products can often be set up to call multiple people and to contact emergency services if you don't get an answer from someone on your list.

3. Should you add a fall-detection feature?

Most medical alert companies today now offer the option of an automatic fall detection pendant for an additional fee of \$10 to \$15 per month. These pendants sense falls when they occur and automatically contact the dispatch center, just as they would if you had pressed the call button.

But be aware that this technology isn't full proof. In some cases, this feature may register something as a fall that isn't. The alarm might go off if you drop it or momentarily lose your balance but don't actually land on the ground.


Dear Kurt,

He has exhibited at museums across the country and was featured as an Artist in Residence on the streaming service Hulu in 2019.

Following a near drowning in 2015, Meko's work began to focus on "the African American experience of navigating public spaces while remaining buoyant within them." Meko's work explores how the "barrage of images" on social media of African Americans being threatened in public spaces "simulates an experience of drowning." His exhibition at TVMA is titled When It's Black Outside: *Notes from the Before Times.*

The exhibit has been made possible by grants from the Alabama State Council on the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts.

The museum's Education Gallery will feature an exhibition by Birmingham artist Lynthia Edwards. Her paintings and collages are "inspired by the ordinary existence of black girls raised in the south." Edwards' work expresses the "creations the subtractions of the control of the cont the "emotions, thoughts and ideas about the world (each girl) lives in" and aims to "ignite a dialogue amongst the viewers that glorify black girl magic.

Edwards received attention from the media and the art world when one of her portraits of Senator John Lewis was purchased by the civil rights pioneer himself. In 2020, she also designed voter registration posters for the DC Sparkle Squad project.

Alongside Meko and Edwards is work by world-renowned Alabama folk artist Charlie Lucas and local emerging artist Kerrigan Casey. Paintings and sculptures by Lucas have been curated from the museum's permanent collection as well as private collectors of his work over recent decades.

Casey is an emerging Florence artist who uses her "own life, music, and culture" to challenge "the Shoals' perceptions of art" and to explore "beauty and blackness in modern art and the expression." free expression.'

The Tennessee Valley Museum of Art is open Monday through Friday from 9am-5pm and will be open on Saturdays from 10am-3pm during these exhibitions. Entry is \$5 for adults, \$5 for children, and free for members of the Tennessee Valley Art Association. Masks are required to enter the museum, and distancing is

The Professor Meets Connie, the Concrete Confederate

He wondered if Amelia, the friendly ghost in his Victorian home, caused him to find the missing bill. He also wondered if maybe Amelia had hidden it in the first place to play a trick on him.

"It's late," remarked the professor to himself, as he pulled out his time-worn pocket watch and tapped it to see if it were still running. He didn't want to worry his wife at home who probably awaited his arrival with a cup of hot tea. But a strange urge seemed to give his feet a mind of their own,


as he began strolling the sidewalk between the courthouse and the First Federal Building. The cold winter's night caused him to raise his coat collar and put his head down. That's when something strange happened.

"Psst-psst," a voice whispered, so soft that the professor thought it the whimsical sound of a breeze. But there it was again, causing him to look up at the courthouse Confederate monument. The statue's lips seemed to move, making him wonder if he should have had that second glass of sherry before leaving home.

"That's right, Professor. I

"That's right, Professor. I can speak, but didn't have the need for 117 years until now."

"Oh, my God," replied the frightened professor, "the Book of Revelations is coming true."



"Oh, calm down, Professor. Amelia said that she would get you here." "Amelia, my house

"Amelia, my hous ghost?" "Yes, that Amelia

"Yes, that Amelia, Professor. Now put your fears aside and duck under the police barriers. Come close. We need to talk." With curiosity outweighing his urge to run, the professor did as he was told.

"Now, I've got something to say," the statue emphasized. "When I stood on this pedestal for the first

time in 1903, there was a racist fanfare stirred by Dr. Moody's speech. Many in his audience agreed with his views. But that symbol attached to me then has faded into obscurity with each passing generation's demand for social justice. But there is another symbol, powerful in 1903, and even more powerful today. It is the symbol of peace. Both Union and Confederate veterans attended my unveiling, school children sang America, and former Johnny Reb and a former Billy Yank shook hands over a Confederate grave. You don't truly know the value of peace until you've

been to war.'

"Well, let's see, Professor. I've never had one. But a white marble company in Atlanta shaped me into what you see. The ravages of time have weathered me into a gray appearance. One of my recent viewers even said that I looked like a concrete Confederate. So why don't you call me 'Connie, the Concrete Confederate.' Actually I

prefer just 'Connie.'"

"Professor, do you know how the Civil War ripped Florence apart?"

"I know some of it, Connie."

"Well, let me tell you all of it. From the beginning, it was awful: riverboats sunk by Union gunboats at our docks, wounded Confederates from the fall of Fort Donelson arriving at Pope's Tavern for treatment, local residents standing on the banks of the Tennessee to listen to the roar of the big guns coming downriver from Shiloh. And this was just the beginning. Florence changed hands over forty times, and with each new occupation came new privations and tragedies for Florence. Food grew short, and local humor believed that a bag of potatoes made a man rich.

And there was all that killing. A band of Confederate youth calling themselves the LaGrange Rifles marched to the battlefield. Few ever came home. The progression of the war made tensions and intolerance grow. One victim was Reverend Robin Lightfoot, a slave

preacher, who Confederate authorities lynched in 1864 for his expression of joy about the outcome of the war.


Banditry became a major feature of the war as well. It bred Tom Clark who fought for and deserted both sides and became a menacing devil to the residents of Florence. Not until 1872 did local authorities catch and hang him.

Florence even played a part in the end of the war. Not far from Florence, General 'Fighting Joe' Hood assembled his army in a desperate attempt to drive Union forces out of Nashville. His counterattack failed."

"Say, Connie, I don't think that I could have told Florence's Civil War story any better in one of my lectures."

"But I am just now getting to my argument, Professor. Mrs. Amelia Camper headed a ladies' society pushing for a Confederate statue. All the heartbreak that I just described forged her strong demand. She wanted a statue that represented peace."

ON THE JOB **INJURIES CAUSED BY** THIRD PARTIES

Often clients who are injured on the job have both workers compensation and personal injury claims. Examples include, a truck driver injured in a motor vehicle accident, a factory worker injured by a defective product or construction workers injured by another contractor's employee.

In those cases the injured employee has the absolute right to workers compensation benefits. That includes the right to have their medical bills paid and to have

temporary total disability payments while they can't work paid by their employer.

Alabama Code §25-5-11 requires that the money received be used to pay back the employer. Even if the employee who is injured does not seek to sue or recover benefits from the party who caused the injury, the worker compensation carrier may sue that third party and is given an additional six months to do so.

If the money recovered exceeds the amount of the workers compensation claim, the employer shall owe no further benefits.

This does not apply to uninsured motorist coverage. If you have uninsured motorist coverage, you are entitled to keep that. If you live with your grandmother and she has uninsured motor coverage, you can collect that and keep that too.

Remember that these are two different types of damages. Workers compensation is very specific in that it pays 2/3 of your average weekly wages while a person can't work and will pay for a permanent injury, but workers compensation does not pay for the loss of enjoyment of life. That means that if you can't go see your children play ball or bowl or golf and because you are injured on the job, you don't get a dime for it. On the other hand, if somebody runs a red light, a jury can and will take into account the things the injured person liked to do before and how the injury affects their ability to enjoy life both in general and the specific things that they no longer can do as a result of their injury.





"Wait a minute, Connie! Amelia Camper and her husband, Moncure, lived in my Victorian home at the beginning of last century. She's the ghost that I see in my hallways sometime. In a sort of strange way, we have become friends, even though she can be a bit manipulative."

That's right, Professor, we both connived to get you here. But let me continue. Amelia wanted and got a statue symbolizing peace. My rifle is at rest, my bayonet sheathed, and my knapsack of food and ammo rests beneath my feet. I symbolize a soldier coming home and not going to war. In my eyes is a soldier longing to see his family."

Nice summation, Connie, but what are you trying to conclude?"

"It's this, Professor.
America now is approaching America then: a summer of burning cities, the Capital building stormed, and tempers near the flashpoint. Diversity shouldn't mean division in a country known for its unity. And this brings me to my opinion about my removal from the

courthouse."

"Well, go on, Connie, I'm listening."

"I don't mind leaving the courthouse. Lord knows that my feet have gone flat from standing on this pedestal for the last 117 years. I'm ready for a change."

"A change to where, Connie?"

"I don't want to stand in the City Cemetery. Id soon be forgotten if not vandalized. No, I want to move to Pope's Tavern. I'd be happy with a much lower pedestal with no bombastic inscriptions, just something simple to commemorate both sides in the Civil War. It was at Pope's Tavern that so many fighting the war died. You probably don't know this Professor, but the spirits of 600,000 young men that the war killed pulse through my veins. I want the public to see me, and maybe a few will regard me as a lighthouse, warning them about the dangerous shores of a civil war."

compared the newly conservative-majority House to "the Duma and the Reichstag," referring to the legislature set up by Czar Nicholas II of Russia and the parliament of the German Weimar Republic that brought Hitler to power.

About President George Herbert Walker Bush, Rep. Maxine Waters, D-Calif., said, "I believe [Bush] is a racist for many, many reasons. ... [He's] a mean-spirited man who has no care or concern about what happens to the African American community. ... I truly believe that."

About the Republican-controlled House, longtime Harlem Democratic Rep. Charlie Rangel, said in 1994, "It's not 's—' or 'n—-' anymore. [Republicans] say, 'Let's cut taxes.'"

say, 'Let's cut taxes.'"
A decade later, Rangel said, "George [W.] Bush is our Bull Connor," referring to the Birmingham Democrat segregationist superintendent of public safety who sicced dogs and turned fire hoses on civil rights workers.

rights workers.

Donna Brazile, former Vice President Al Gore's presidential campaign manager, said in 1999, "Republicans have a "white boy attitude, [which means,] 'I must exclude, denigrate, and leave behind.' They don't see it or think about it. It's a culture."

The following year Brazile said, "The Republicans bring out Colin Powell and [Rep.] J.C. Watts, [R-Okla.], because they have no program, no policy. ... They'd rather take pictures with black children than feed them."

About President George W. Bush, Gore said: "[Bush's] executive branch has made it a practice to try and control and intimidate news organizations, from PBS to CBS to Newsweek. ... And every day, they unleash squadrons of digital brownshirts to harass and hector any journalist who is critical of the president." Digital "brownshirts"?

About George W. Bush, George Soros, the billionaire Democratic donor, said, "The Bush administration and the Nazi and communist regimes all engaged in the politics of fear. ... Indeed, the Bush administration has been able to improve on the techniques used by the Nazi and communist

propaganda machines."

Former NAACP Chairman Julian Bond, in a 2006 speech at historically black Fayetteville State University said, "The Republican Party would have the American flag and the swastika flying side by side."

Former Gov. Howard Dean, chairman of the Democratic National Committee in 2005, described the contest between Democrats and Republicans as "a struggle between good and evil. And we're the good." Three years later, Dean referred to the GOP as "the white party."

After Hurricane Katrina, Democratic Missouri Senate candidate, Claire McCaskill, said George W. Bush "let people die on rooftops in New Orleans because they were poor and because they were black."

Feminist super-lawyer Gloria Allred referred to Colin Powell and Condoleezza Rice in 2001 as "Uncle Tom types."

Medicare Minute

"Medicare Part A Part 1"

On a Medicare card Part A will have the word "Hospital" beside it. Because of that Medicare Part A is most commonly known as the inpatient or hospitalization part of Medicare. This means when a Medicare beneficiary is admitted into the hospital most of the services that are received are filed under Medicare Part A. This sounds simple but sometimes it's not.

Medicare Part A has a deductible of \$1,484 per benefit period. Notice two things here. First is the deductible of \$1,484. If you are admitted into the hospital and had Original Medicare only, you would owe the first \$1,484 of your stay. This deductible covers hospital services, including semiprivate rooms, meals, general nursing, drugs as part of your inpatient treatment, and other hospital services and supplies.

The second thing to notice is the term "benefit period". This tells you the deductible is not an annual deductible but could hit you more than once in a calendar year. A "benefit period" begins when you are discharged from a hospital or skilled nursing facility and ends when you haven't received any inpatient care for 60 consecutive days. If you are admitted as an inpatient after the 60 days of no inpatient care a new benefit period begins, meaning another \$1,484 deductible. Also if you are confined to the hospital for 60 consecutive days your deductible will cover you but on the 61st day you will begin paying a coinsurance.

The good news is for most Medicare beneficiaries Part A is free. Free meaning you don't pay a premium for it. The reason for this is while you are working you pay 1.45% of your pay check into Medicare. If you did that for 40 quarters you're entitled to Part A for free. Next week will discuss the other benefits of Medicare Part A.
