





It is also important to remember that the law never gives clear ownership rights to an individual who has found an animal and decides to keep it.

In this day of social media and taking strays out of localities, public animal shelters remain the best hope of reuniting a lost pet.

We have a large notebook at the shelter that is filled with reports of lost dogs and cats. If you spend any time at all on social media, you will know that many pictures of lost dogs and cats are posted.

A dog will sometimes just follow a scent his nose has picked up, sometimes they have been scared by other animals, and sometimes they just wander away. Cats who are allowed outside can also become frightened by other animals or loud noises and run away in fear. In addition, cats do get into car engines and are given a very dangerous ride to destinations far away.

There are many reasons why dogs and cats become strays and chances are you have seen many.

If you have picked up a stray animal and have chosen not to take it to the public animal shelter in the locality it was found, there are legal requirements to consider.

Virginia Code 3.2-6551 requires any individual who finds a companion animal and retains it to contact the public animal shelter that serves the locality where the companion animal was found. Specific information is required, including the location where the companion animal was found, a description, and contact information. The same requirements are in effect for rescue groups and other

HOLLYWOOD — "The Social Network" Oscar-winning director/ screenwriter Aaron Sorkin is helming a new Amazon film about Lucy and Desi (from his screenplay). It takes place during a production meeting of "I Love Lucy" when both faced a crisis that could end their careers and marriage. Oscar-winner Cate Blanchett was first choice as Lucy, but when she bowed out. Sorkin cast Oscar-winners Nicole Kidman and Javier Bardem to play Lucy and Desi.

While everyone loves Nicole, when she took on Elizabeth Montgomery's "Bewitched" role in the 2005 film reboot (which also starred Will Farrell, Shirley MacLaine, Michael Caine and Kristin Chenoweth), it flopped, costing \$85 million while grossing just \$131 million. Written and directed by the late Nora Efron (of "When Harry Met Sally," "Sleepless in Seattle" and "You've Got Mail"), critics said "Bewitched" "was haunted by scattered laughs and a lack of direction.

Of note: Lucy was 43 and Desi 40 when they did "I Love Lucy" in 1951, and Nicole is 53 and Javier 51. Maybe for insurance, two of the executive producers Sorkin hired are Lucy's children, Lucie and Desi Arnaz.

When the pandemic is done, will movie fans return to theaters? "Earnings are down more than 80% from previous years, making this the worst year in three decades," according to the market-research firm Statista. Streaming services proved with "Roma," "The Irishman," "Trolls World Tour," "The Invisible Man" and, just recently, "Wonder Woman 1984" that opening films on streaming services and theaters at the same time works well.

In the 1960s studios fought TVs popularity with Cinemascope, etc.; in the '90s they used IMAX and 3D. Now streaming services are offering staggering sums, such as Amazon's \$200 million bid for the Chris Pratt starrer



DANVILLE - The Danville Life Saving Crew Community Paramedicine team is on the road serving Danville citizens. The team now has a vehicle to support both Johnny Mills, program director, and Keith Carroll, community paramedic, in reaching those who need medical services.

"The Community Paramedicine program is designed to assist those individuals who have multiple chronic health conditions and frequently call 911," said Johnny Mills, program director. "The team monitors over 200 cases at any one time and provides intense monthly intervention to at least 30 to 40 patients who are the most critical and medically unstable."

Keith Carroll reported that the program carries a master list of 353 patients who are monitored weekly and a supplemental archive list of over 960 patients. "Each person is provided the support needed at the time it is needed," said Carroll.

"Our Community Paramedicine program works in collaboration with the Community Healthcare Worker program," said Mills. "Our partnership has enabled our at-risk patients to receive home-based services even during this pandemic using the CP telemedicine technology."

As a result of the interventions, our Community Paramedicine team discovered and coordinate the response that addressed conditions that did not offer an environment for healthy living. CP and its partners have worked with homeless patients who lived in a facilities with no running water, or electricity. In one instance, one patient lived in a utility building and human waste was found everywhere within the building. The team responds and connects the patients with the resources needed to address the medical health.

The Community Paramedicine program is just one service the Danville Life Saving Crew provided to the citizens of Danville. This program along with many of the services provided by the Danville Life Saving Crew is funded through the generosity of our community members and the support of our grant funders.

Having launched its service to this community in 1945, the Danville Life Saving Crew and Danville Area Training Center are comprised of dedicated men and women who make a difference in the lives of the members of our community. The members come from all walks of life and share one common goal: To render Emergency pre-hospital care to the sick and injured, and perform rescue operations on a continuous basis, as needed, 24 hours a day, 365/366 days a year.

Every day this team delivers for our community and is the bridge between personal desperation and the hope that medical care delivers.



Black history bus wrap



In observance of Black History Month, the Danville Transit System today placed in service a bus wrap that celebrates Black history over a 150-year period.

The wrap features the images of 12 African Americans. They are Ralph Bunche; Bishop Lawrence Campbell Sr. and Gloria Campbell; W.E.B. Du Bois; Terrell, Tremaine and Trey Edmunds; Fannie Lou Hamer; Rep. John Lewis; Maggie Walker; Booker T. Washington; and Carter Godwin Woodson.

Danville Transit last fall received public input for the bus wrap via the City of Danville's Facebook page. Members of the Transportation Advisory Committee selected the images for the bus wrap, which is shown on both sides of a transit vehicle.

The vehicle with the new Black history bus wrap will be placed on different fixed-route bus runs. This bus can be viewed at Danville's Transfer Center, which is located at 515 Spring St., during scheduled service breaks at 10 a.m. and 3:15 $\,$ p.m., Monday through Saturday.





Red Velvet Oreo Balls



Ingredients

1 package Red Velvet OREO Cookies finely crushed (12.2 oz. pkg)

8 oz. brick cream cheese softened

2 1/2 cups melting chocolate

DRIZZLE: 10 red melting chocolate wafers + 5 semi sweet chocolate chips

Instructions

Crush the OREO cookies. I used a small food processor, but you can use a blender, or you can place the cookies in a sealed plastic bag and smash them with a meat mallet! I found that the blender worked best when I did half the cookies at a time, rather than trying to crush all 36 at once. Use a fork to stir the mixture up between blends to get the finest consistency.

Mix the crumbs with the cream cheese until well blended.

Use a cookie scoop to measure out about 1.5 TBSP of the cookie mixture and roll each scoop into a ball. Place Oreo balls on a parchment or wax paper lined

*Freeze the balls for about 20-30 minutes before dipping.

Melt the candy coating or baking chocolate in the microwave for about 1 minute 20 seconds. Stir gently until smooth, returning to the microwave in 15 second increments, if needed.

Dip each ball in the chocolate and place back on lined pan.

Place red melting wafers + semi sweet chocolate chips in a sandwich bag. Microwave for 40 seconds. Gently massage the bag to combine the colors. Snip a tiny corner of the bag and drizzle chocolate onto each Oreo ball. Sprinkle with Valentine's sprinkles, if you'd like.

Notes

*Don't skip this step! The balls need to be chilled before you dip them in the melted chocolate. If they aren't chilled, you will end up with a lot of crumbs in your melting chocolate and they won't look quite as pretty! You're welcome to divide the directions into 2 parts and make the truffles the day or night before, then dip them in chocolate the next day.
