SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

I have one question for Ron Powell... How many times have you given birth?

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week two of our study of our United States Constitution. Last week we learned how our Constitution was created and several opinions of our founding fathers. We will now study the Preamble:

We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America '

The Preamble begins with "We the People of the United States" to emphasize that the citizens of the United States are in control of their government. The phrase "in Order to form a more perfect Union" referred to the Articles of Confederation which were very weak and did not unify all the colonies into one country. The phrase "establish Justice" referred to the injustice which we suffered from England and that we wanted a country in which justice prevailed. In the phrase "insure domestic Tranquility" we emphasized that we wanted to live in a peaceful country. The words "provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare" expressed that we wanted a government which would provide a military to protect us against foreign aggression and to provide well-being for all its citizens. The words "secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity" voiced our strong desire to have freedom for ourselves and for future generations. I have expressed before in previous articles that we should leave our country in better condition than when we arrived on the scene.

Unfortunately this is not happening as we are not solving many of the social, economic and spiritual problems which are tearing our country apart. The Preamble concludes with the words "do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America" affirming that all the delegates possessed a mutual agreement and a desire to create one nation under God. The Merriam–Webster Dictionary specifically refers to our Constitution when it says "2a: to establish or order by appointment, decree, or law: enact we the people ...do ordain and establish this Constitution — U.S. Constitution.

Article I includes the duties and responsibilities of the Legislative Branch of our government. Section 1 states "All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives." Again, unfortunately, both the Executive Branch and the Supreme Court have interfered with the duties and responsibilities of the Legislative Branch.

The Executive Branch has often in the past few years, by a multitude of executive orders, established unauthorized laws, for which only the Legislative Branch is responsible. Various presidents have viewed that the Legislative Branch is not proceeding in a manner quickly enough and might enact legislation with which they may disagree.

These presidents often use executive orders to get their own way. A perfect example is the sending of federal troops into our cities without the consent of the Legislative Branch when that branch was in session and able to deliberate on that issue.

The Supreme Court has been for decades legislating laws rather than interpreting the Constitution as they are authorized to do. We will study these two other branches of our government in upcoming articles.

We will, Lord willing, continue with Section 2 next week. I would very much enjoy any and all comments, both positive and negative, from any readers of the "Speakout"



Medicare Coverage and Coronavirus



Original Medicare-covered services related to coronavirus include:

COVID-19 testing

• Your doctor can bill Medicare for testing provided after February 4, 2020. Medicare covers your first coronavirus test without an order from a doctor other qualified health care provider. After your first test, Medicare requires you to get an order from your provider for any further coronavirus tests you receive. You will owe nothing for the laboratory test and related provider visits (no deductible, coinsurance, or copayment). This applies to both Original Medicare and Medicare Advantage Plans.

COVID-19 antibody treatment

• Medicare covers monoclonal antibodies to treat COVID-19. You will owe no cost-sharing (deducible, coinsurance, or copayment).

Telehealth benefits

 A telehealth service is a full visit with your doctor using video technology. During the public health emergency, Medicare covers hospital and doctors' office visits, mental health counseling, preventive health screenings, and other visits via telehealth for all people with Medicare. You can access these benefits at home or in health care settings. You may owe standard cost-sharing (like a coinsurance or copayment) for these services, but contact your provider to learn more. If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan, contact your plan to learn about its costs and coverage.

COVID-19 vaccine

A COVID-19 vaccine has been authorized for limited emergency use, meaning that the vaccine is not yet approved for or available to everyone. Speak with your doctor to learn more about your eligibility to receive the vaccine and its availability in your state. Original Medicare Part B covers the vaccine, regardless of whether you have Original Medicare or a Medicare Advantage Plan. You will owe no cost- sharing (deductibles, copayments, or coinsurance).

Prescription refills

 If you want to refill your prescriptions early so that you have extra medication on hand, contact your Part D drug plan. Your plan should remove restrictions that stop you from refilling most prescriptions too soon. During the emergency, plans must cover up to a 90-day supply of a drug when you ask for it. However, plans cannot provide a 90-day supply of a drug if it has certain restrictions on the amount that can be safely provided. These restrictions are called safety edits, and they commonly apply to opioids.

Medicare Advantage Plans must cover everything that Original Medicare does, but they can do so with different costs and restrictions.

During the coronavirus pandemic, our youngest children and their families are facing unprecedented challenges and managing household stress. Amidst COVID-19, more than 40 percent of households with young children are worried about paying for basic needs like food or rent, according to the University of Oregon. Additionally, nearly two-thirds of caregivers feel they have lost emotional support since the start of the pandemic. Young children and families in Livingston County are facing loss of family income due to a surge in unemployment, isolation due to social distancing precautions, and disruption or limited services. This in turn affects physical and emotional well-being, especially in young children.

Research also tells us that the most rapid period of brain development occurs within the first three years of life, laying the foundation for all future learning, behavior and health. Now is the time to support young children and ensure they have access to high-quality services during these critical years. By investing in young children early and focusing on the prenatal to three years, counties can see higher returns and reduce the need for more expensive supports later in life.

Livingston County continues to prioritize and support young children in response to the pandemic. These COV-ID-19-related services include organizing food distribution events during the Spring and Summer of 2020, conducting COVID-19 testing, and implementing contact tracing to include local school districts and day care centers. Benefits and service provision for young families, which include WIC and Mental Health, continue to be offered over the phone or virtually to provide better access. These efforts play a vital role in protecting the health and safety of young children and their families in our community now and years to come.

This is why Livingston County is joining Counties for Kids, a public awareness campaign for county leaders who are committed to making investments in young children. We encourage all counties to join Livingston County and the National Association of Counties Research Foundation in growing the network of champions advancing prenatal to three policies, programs and systems.
