

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue in week four of our study of our United States Constitution.

This week we continue with Article I - Section 2 - Clause 3 which reads "The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand, but each State shall have at Least one Representative; and until such enumeration shall be made, the State of New Hampshire shall be entitled to chuse three, Massachusetts eight, Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations one, Connecticut five, New-York six, New Jersey four, Pennsylvania eight, Delaware one, Maryland six, Virginia ten, North Carolina five, South Carolina five, and Georgia three."

The population of the United States of America in the 1790 Federal Census was 3,929,214. The population of the United States of America in the 2010 Federal Census was 308,401,808. The 2020 Federal Census has not been fully tabulated but is thought to be about 332,600,000.

Therefore, because of the tremendous increase of our population, today a congressional district is comprised of approximately 700,000 people. Because the population in each individual state changes over time, federal law automatically reapportions each district as a result of each ten year federal census. This often means a congressional district's demographic size and borders must be change over time.

Because the House of Representatives wanted a manageable number of members, Congress twice set the size of the House at 435 voting members and later permanently set the maximum number of representatives at 435. Article I - Section 2 - Clause 4 reads "When vacancies happen in the Representation from any State, the Executive Authority thereof shall issue Writs of Election to fill such Vacancies."

As we have become very aware in the recent past, some representatives decide not to run for reelection and some die and must be replaced. Article I - Section 2 - Clause 5 reads "The House of Representatives shall chuse their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment."

The representatives in the House of Representatives have the authority to chose who will be the Speaker of the House and the leaders of both the majority and the minority. We have recently become very aware that the House has the sole power of impeachment. This power does not only control impeachments of sitting presidents but also controls impeachment of sitting judges and other officials in our federal government.

The founding fathers established that although the House has the power to impeach, there are checks and balances where the Senate controls impeachment trials and can convict or acquit. Our Constitution has many checks and balances which prevent one branch of government from gaining too much power as did the government in England from which we did not wish to duplicate. Article I - Section 3 - Clause 1 reads "The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six Years; and each Senator shall have one Vote."

As I mentioned earlier United States Senators are elected for six year terms of office and one third are reelected every two years so all one hundred will be reelected during six years. The concept of two senators for each state began when the small states during the Constitutional Convention objected to the idea that the larger states would have more influence in the House of Representatives who are elected by the number of citizens.

Lord willing, we will continue our study next week. Ron Powell Nunda




